After the proclamation of the opening of said meeting by E.R.Dean Marshal the following proceedings were had and entered of record, to-wit;

The minutes of the preceding regular and adjourned meetings were read and on motion duly made and carried, approved.

It appearing to the Board that there are insufficient funds in the various City Accounts for the immediate needs of the City, motion was duly made and carried that the Mayor and Clerk be and are hereby authorized to borrow from a local Bank at the legal rate of interest to following amounts in anticipation of incoming Taxes in process of collection, same to be due and payable Feb. 10th 1929. or sooner if funds are available. viz.

ORDINANCE NO. 113.

AN ORDINANCE prohibiting owners, dealers, agents, and/or other persons driving or operating a motor Cycle, electric motor vehicle, commercial motor vehicle or any other motor vehicle within the City of Piasune, without State license tags thereon, as required by state law, and providing a penalty for violation thereof.

Section 1, BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the City of Picayune, that it shall be unlawful for any owner, dealer, agent or other person to drive or operate a motorcycle, electric motor vehicle, commercial motor vehicle, or any other motor vehicle within the City of Picayune, Mississippi without a state license tag thereon, as required by the laws of the State of Mississippi, and in the manner as required by law.

Section 2, Any person convicted of the violation of Section 1 hereof shall be fined in a sum not to exceed six Dollars;

Section 3, For good cause shown to the Board this Ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.







B. Whitfield, Mayor, H.K.McKee, Clerk, V.B.Martin, Edward Rowlands, L.C. Puyper, G.H.Williams, and S.B.Whitfield, Aldermen; E.R.Dean, Marshal, Grayson B. Keaton, City Attorney, and E.A.Stockstill, City Engineer,

After the proclamation of the opening of said meeting by E.R.Dean, Marshal, the following proceedings were had and entered of record, to-wit;

The minutes of the preceeding regular and adjourned meetings were read and on motion duly made and carried approved.

On motion duly made and carried it is ordered that the Mayor enter into contract with Burroughs Adding Machine for upkeep of Machine in City Clerk's office at a price of twelve Dollars per year.

On motion duly made and carried it is ordered that Dr. V.B.Martin, and E.R.Dean be appointed a committee to have the roof of the City Hall repaired and to build a flue in back part of same near Jail.

On motion duly made and carried it is ordered that the question of repealing the City Ordinance relative to Pool Rooms be laid over until the next regular meeting.

It appearing to the Board that the law in regard to the imposition of penalties on delinquent Privilege Tax has not been strictly adhered to in the past, it is on motion duly made and carried, ordered that the City Clerk and Tax Collector Strictly enforce said provision from this date. That is, that any person firm or corporation owing the City a Privilege Tax who shall fail to pay same in the month in which same is due, said Tax must be doubled as the law provides. and under the same laws and regulations as the State provides.



This being the day and hour to receive bids to furnish the City with feed for three months for three months, and the bid of E.M. Walker being read and being the only bid, not being satisfactory, was on motion duly made and carried rejected, and the Engineer was ordered to buy on the open market until further notice.

The City Attorney presented the following ordinance which was read and considered to-wit:

Ordinance No. 115

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF PICAYUNE PROHIBITING ALL PERSONS OTHER THAN THE EMPLOYEES OF ANY INDIVIDUAL, COMPANY, OR CORPORATION, FURNISHING GAS, WATER, AND/OR ELECTRICITY, IN THE CITY OF PICAYUNE FROM TAMPERING WITH THE WIRES, PIPES AND METERS, OF SUCH INDIVIDUALS, COMPANIES OR CORPORATIONS, AND FROM TAKING GAS, WATER OR ELECTRICITY, WITHOUT THE WHOLE QUANTITY TAKEN OR USED, HAVING PASSED THROUGH AND BEING MEASURED BY THE METERS PROVIDED FOR THE PURPOSE, OF MEASURING SAME. AND PROVIDING PENALTIES, FOR THE VIOLATION OF THIS ORDINANCE, AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE CITY OF PICAYUNE,

SECTION, I, - Every person who shall in any way tamper with any electric wires gas pipes, water pipes, or any gas electric or water meters, owned by any individual, company or corporation, supplying gas, water, or electric current, to the city of Picayune, or its inhabitants, or who shall attach thereto any contrivance mechanism or device, whatsoever, so as to prevent, or which may be designed, or intended to prevent, the whole quantity of gas, water or electric current, supplied to any consumer, at meter rates, from passing through or being measured by, the meter provided for such purpose, and every consumer of gas, water or electric current at meter rates, who shall knowingly permit the same to be done for his or her benefit, or for the benefit of any association or corporation, in which he or she may have any interest, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor.

SECTION, II, Every consumer of electric current, or gas or water at meter rates, who shall by means of any contrivance, mechanism or device whatsoever, knowingly take or use, any gas, water, or electric current, without the whole quantity so taken, or used having passed through, and been measured by, the meter provided for such purpose, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor.

SECTION III. Proof of the existance of any contrivance, mechanism or device, which prevents, or which may be designed or intended to prevent the whole quantity of gas, water or electric current supplied to any customer at meter rates from passing through, and being measured by the meter provided for such purpose, on the premises of any consumer, of gas water, or electric current at meter rates shall be prima faciea evdence that such consumer knew of the existance thereof and that he was knowingly taking and using, gas, water, or electric current, as the case may be, without the same having wholly passed through and been measured by the meter provided for such purpose.

SECTION IV. That the servants and employees of every company or corporation, supplying gas, water or electric current, to the City of Picayune or its inhabitants, shall have the right at all reasonable times to enter the premises of any consumer of gas, water, or electric current at meter rates, for the purpose of inspecting its wires, pipes and meters to ascertain whether or not the meters are registering the whole quantity of gas, water or electric current supplies to such consumer, and a wilful denial of such right of inspection, when duly requested during reasonable hours, by any consumer at meter rates, shall be prima facio evi- dence that such consumer is taking and using gas, water or electric current, as the case may be, without the whole quantity thereof passing through, and being measured by the meter provided for that purpose,

SECTION V. Every person who shall knowingly and wilfully violate Sec- tions #1, and 2, of this Ordinance shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, and on convict- ion thereof shall be fined in any sum not exceeding fifty Dollars, and in addition thereto, the individual company or corporation so suppling gas, water, or electric current, shall not be bound thereafter to furnish either gas, water or electric cur- rent, to any person so convicted of fraudulently taking or using either gas, water or electric current.

SECTION VI. The public interest demanding or requiring in the judgment of the Board of Mayor and Aldermen of the City of Picayune, that this ordinance take effect at once, it is further ordered that this Ordinance take effect and be in force from and after its passage and approval according to law.

The within and foregoing Ordinance was first reduced to writing, read and considered by Sections, at a public meeting of the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the City of Picayune, Mississippi, held in the City Hall at 7.00 o'clock P.M. P Friday November 15th 1929, and upon motion of Mr. L.C.Puyper, duly seconded by Mr. G.H.Williams, that it be adopted a final yea and nay vote was taken which resulted as follows,

Aldermen absent not voting, Edward Rowlands, and S.B.Whitfield.




