An itemized report from Martin's Sanitorium was received and read and on motion duly made and carried it is ordered that the Sum of \$480.00 of the appropriation made to said Sanitorium for Charity purposes be paid.

On motion duly made and carried it is ordered that the sum of \$172.74, charged against various persons for Sidewalks laid in the year 1921, the sum of \$1,837.18 charged against various persons for Sidewalks laid in the year 1923, together with the sum of \$642.95 charged against J.M.B.Spence, a former City Tax Collector, as being short in his accounts with the City, be and the same are hereby charged off as out of date and uncollectable, and that the City Clerk and Tax Collector be and is hereby credited with these amounts, that same may not appear on his books as assets of the City.

FOR THE PURPOSE OF RAISING MONEY TO ERECT OR LAY AND CONSTRUCT, AND EQUIP, A WATER LINE, AND FIRE PROTECTION SYSTEM, AND TO PURCHASE SUCH FIRE FIGHTING APPARATUS TO BE USED IN CONNECTION THEREWITH, FOR THE SAID CITY OF PICAYUNE, AND PROVIDING FOR THE FORM OF THE SAID BONDS, AND INTEREST COUPONS, ATTACHED THERETO.

Section, 1, For the purpose of raising funds to erect, or lay and construct, and equip, a water line and Fire Protection System, and to purchase such fire fighting apparatus to be used in connection therewith, bonds of the said City of Picayune in the sum of Fourteen Thousand Dollars, (\$14,000.00) shall be issued, said bonds bearing date of March 1st, 1930, and running through a series of three years from date of their issuance, Said bonds bearing interest at the rate of six per cent (6%) per annum, represented by coupons, which shall be payable on the first day of September, and first day of March of each and every year. Said bonds to be known as, "CITY OF PICAYUNE FIRE PROTECTION SIX PER CENT BONDS"

Section, 2, Said bonds shall be numbered from one to fourteen inclusive, and said bonds shall be of the denomination of One Thousand Dollars, (\$1,000.00) each, and bonds numbered 1-2-3-4 and 5 shall be due and payable on the first day of March 1931, and bonds numbered 6-7-8-9-10, shall become due and payable on the

first day of March 1932, and bonds numbered 11-12-13-4-14, shall become due and payable on the first day of March 1933.

WHEREAS, it appears to this Board that section 2526, of the Code of 1930, will work a hardship on the small Municipalities of the State in that they can not afford to pay enough to secure a competent Attorney, under the conditions laid down by this Section, and,

WHEREAS, it is the sense of this Board that the clause in said Section 2526, reading as follows, " Or for any offense committed against the penal statutes of the State within the corporate limits of the Municipality for which he is Municipal Attorney," should be repealed.

Be it therefore resolved by the Mayor and Board of Aldermen, of the City of Picayune, in open session convened this the 19th, day of December 1930, that the Legislature of the State of Mississippi, be and is hereby petitioned to repeal said clause so that said Section 2526, shall read as follows,

"2526. CITY ATTORNEY NOT TO DEFEND CERTAIN CRIMINALS.-- It shall be unlawful for any City Attorney to defend any criminal in any municipal "

court of which municipality he is Attorney. Any party violating the provisions of this Section shall forfeit his office and City Attorney, and be fined in the sum of twenty-five dollars, and cost.

Be it further resolved that Hon. John Lumpkins, Representative, in and for Pearl River County, and Hon. H.C. Yawn, Senator; and the Mississippi Municipal Officers Association, be furnished with a copy of this resolution.
