AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND AN ORDINANCE ENTITLED, " AN ORDINANCE REGULATING THE SPEED OF AUTOMOBILES, ETC," ADOPTED AT REGULAR MEETING HELD ON MAY 1st, 1917, BEING AN ORDINANCE # 67, SO AS TO REGULATE THE SPEED OF AUTOMOBILES AND MOTOR VEHICLES UPON THE STREETS AND AVENUES WITHIN THE CORPORATE LIMITS OF CITY OF PICAYUNE, MISSISSIPPI.

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SECOND 1, BE IT ORDERED, that Ordinance #67, entitled, "AN ORDINANCE regulating the speed of aut mobiles, etc., be and same is hereby amended to read, BE IT ORDERED, by the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the City of Picayune, Mississippi, that it shall be unlawful for any person to operate or run any automobile, motor vehicle, steam or gasoline car or Motor-cylce or other Motor or Electrical propelled contrivance or vehicle at greater rate of speed than twenty (20) miles per hour while on the Streets or Avenues of the City of Picayune, Mississippi, except Public Schools in Schhol days when School is held at the hours of 80'clock Ante Meridian or 40'clock Post Meridian or passing buildings of Public Worship on the Sabbath days during the usual hours of Service at greater rate of speed than ten (10) miles per hour, and except on Harvey Avenue or Jackson Highway in the City of Picayune South of Mitchell Street, and North of Fifth or Puyper Street, and Goodyear Boulevard West of M Street, and on First Street East of Back Street, at greater rate of speed than thirty (30) miles per hour, having due regard to traffic and use of streets, avenues, and hōghways, or so as not to endanger the life or limbs of any person or safety of any property on said Streets, avenues, or Highways.

SECTION 3, BE IT FURTHER ORDERED, that this Ordinance be in full force and effect its passage for good cause shown to the Board.

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND AN ORDINANCE ENTITLED, "AN ORDINANCE TO CHANGE THE COMMISSION ON TAXES COLLECTED BY THE CITY TAX COLLECTOR TO 2% OF THE DOLLAR FROM AND AFTER THE DATE OF MARCH 1st, 1931, ADOPTED AT THE REGULAR JANUARY MEETING HELD ON 6th, DAY OF JANUARY, 1931, AND BEING AN ORDINANCE NO. 117, SO AS TO CHANGE THE COMMISSION ON TAXES COLLECTED BY THE TAX COLLECTOR TO 2% ON THE DOLLAR FROM AND AFTER THE FIRST DAY OF MARCH, 1931.

SECTION 1: BE IT ORDAINED, that Ordinance No. 117, "Entitled An Ordinance to fix the commission of 2% to be allowed and paid the City Tax Collector, on all taxes collected within the Municipality, from and after the date of March 1st, 1931, be and the same is hereby amended to read, "BE IT ORDAINED, by the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the City of Picayune, that the Municipal Tax Collector's fee or commission for the collection of all municipal taxes, be and the same is hereby fixed as follows: 2% on the dollar on all Ad Valorem and Poll Taxes collected within the Municipality and 5% on all street and privilege taxes, and that there shall be no other or additional salary or remuneration as City Tax Collector.

SECTION 2: That the City Tax Collector shall be allowed to deduct for his service in making tax collections the said 2% on all Ad Valorem Taxes Poll Taxes, collected within the municipality and 5% on the dollar for all Street and privilege taxes collected within the Municipality.

SECTION 3: That the said City Tax Collector shall be allowed 3% on all taxes collected, that become due and payable on or before February 1st, 1932, and that is collected before September 1st, 1932.

SECTION 4: The said City Tax Collector shall make his report as required by law, and render report of all taxes of whatever kind showing the amount of commission deducted.

SECTION 5: Any or all Ordinances or orders in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

SECTION 6: For good cause shown to the board this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after the date of its passage.



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



AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF PICAYUNE, MISSISSIPPI, AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR AND CITY CLERK TO ENTER INTO A CONTRACT WITH MISSISSIPPI POWER COMPANY, FOR THE USE BY THE CITY OF CERTAIN POLES OF THE COMPANY FOR A FIRE ALARM CIRCUIT TO BE INSTALLED AND MAINTAINED THEREON BY THE CITY, FIXING THE RENT TO BE PAID, ON SUCH POLES, AND PROVIDING THE FORM OF SUCH CONTRACT AND AUTHORIZING ITS EXECUTION AND DELIVERY. #122

BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the City of Picayune, Mississippi,

Section, I, That the Mayor and the City Clerk of the City of Picayune, be and are hereby authorized to make and enter into and execute and deliver in duplicate a contract between the City of Picayune, Mississippi, on the one Part, and Mississippi Power Company, a corporation on the other part in the following form, to-wit-

THIS CONTRACT this day entered into by and between the City of Picayune, party of the first part, hereinafter for convenience referred to as the City, and Mississippi Power Company, a corporation, hereinafter referred to as the Company, WITNESSETH as follows.

In consideration of the mutual promises and obligations of the parties hereto, each to the other, they agree as follows,

(A) The Company is the owner of an electric distribution, circuit or system, in the City of Picayune, Mississippi, and of a line of poles used in connection therewith,

(B) The city desires to install and maintain a fire alarm circuit, to connect with its fire alarm signal in the fire station in the City of Picayune in the State of Mississippi,

(C) The Company hereby grants unto the City for the period of one year from the date hereof and thereafter until such time as either party to this

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shall have given the other notice in writing of the desire to terminate this arrangement, the right to maintain such fire alarm circuit on the poles of the Company, on the following streets in the City of Picayune state of Mississippi to-wit;

Beginning at the Southern Hotel on First Street, thence running Westernly across the N.O.& N.E. Railroad Right of Way, to the East end of Cahal Street, thence along Canal Street to the corner of Rester Street, thence along said Rester Street to the City Hall,

The parties to this contract have each caused a blue print showing the location of such poles to be identified by the signature of a representative of each and to be delivered to each party hereto, to be retained in the files of each to be referred to as often as may be necessary in connection with this contract, for the purpose of identification of the poles on which the Company grants the right to the City to install and maintain such fire alarm circuit.

(D) The City agrees in lieu of payment for rent, for the use of such poles, that it will hold the Company harmless against all cost, loss and expense or damage if any, that may accrue to the Company, by reason of the City's installing, and maintaining such fire alarm circuit, on such poles, and/or by reason of the neglect fault or omission, of the City, and/or of its agents servants and employees, in the installation maintenance, and repair of such fire alarm system, and/or by reason of the presence of such fire alarm system on the poles of the Company, no matter whether or not such loss cost expense or damage may have arisen by negligence or without negligence, and regardless of whether or not, such damage is to persons or property of the Company or of others,

The Company expressly agrees to accept this agreement on the part of the City to hold it harmless from such loss cost expense or damage in lieu of rent for the use of such poles for said fire alarm system by the City.

In the event of any claims for damages to person or property arising under the terms of this agreement, the Company will notify the City thereof, and shall cooperate with the City in the defense thereof, and the City shall have the right privilege and opportunity, to control and conduct the defense, of any such claims and the right to settle or compromise the same at the cost of the City, and the right to defend to the utmost any such claims, if the City finds or believes, that it is to its interest to do so.

The Company shall have the right to re-locate its poles, and, in the event the poles of the Company are re-located, by it, the City may, if it desires to do so, continue to use such poles, for such fire alarm circuit as re-located, and will pay such actual cost of removing and reconstructing, such fire alarm circuit,

It is also expressly agreed that if at any time the Company, should it necessary for any reason to discontinue its line of poles along the streets covered by this contract, so that it would not have any line of poles thereon, it may terminate the contract by giving notice thereof as herein provided, and either party may at any time for any reason terminate this contract, by giving written notice

of the desire to do so in accordance with the stipulation hereinbefore contained.

This contract shall be binding upon the successors or assigns of the parties hereto,


