Order In Regard Drainage Project.

The City Engineer having presented complete profile on Drainage Project, as per orders of this Board, meeting of January 5th, 1932, page # 121 of these Minutes and it appearing that the City does not have the authority to do this work without a special authorization from the Legislature, of the State of Mississippi, motion was duly made and carried, that the City Attorney, prepare and present to State Legislature, a Bill, authorizing the appropriation of not exceeding Six Thousand Dollars for the purpose of excavating such ditches, or Canals, as may be necessary for the proper Drainage of the City as per plans and profile, submitted by the City Engineer. This work to be done both inside and outside of the Corporate limits of the City of Picayune, and that the expenses of the City Attorney be paid to Jackson, to present this matter to the State Legislature.

Order To Reduce Assessment.

It appearing to the Board, from certified copy of an order by the Board of Supervisors, passed the 5th. day of November 1931, that the County Assessment, of Two Thousand, Three Hundred Dollars on personality assessment against the Jitney Jungle or Self Service Store's Co., page # 97, line # 27, on County Assessment Rolls, is erroneous and excessive and that relief was given in the amount of Three Hundred Dollars by the Board of Supervisors, and application having been made to this Board, for Similar reduction and it appearing to the Board of Aldermen from the evidence, both oral and documentary offered in said application that the circumstances alleged, in said petition, as grounds for relief are true, and that the assessment on Store fixtures is an error and in excess of the correct amount subject to assessment.



ORDER FOR BUILDING PERMIT.

On motion duly made and carried it is ordered that E.H. Stevens, he and is hereby given a PERMIT to erect or construct a small building on the Eastern Part of Lot I, Block "H" J.R. Simmons Sub-Div. of Picayune, as per Plans and specifications now on file with this Board.

ORDER TO ACCEPT COMPROMISE WITH PEARL RIVER COUNTY.

It appearing to the Board that the Board of Supervisors of Pearl River County are willing to compromise with the City of Picayune on its claim for \$26,674.80, alleged by the City to be due to the City, for one half of Loan Warrants issued by said County for Road purposes, as disclosed by "SPECIAL INVESTIGATION COVERING LOAN WARRANT ISSUES AND RECEIPTS, AS AUTHORIZED BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF PEARL RIVER COUNTY, SHOWING PORTION COLLECTED ON CITY OF PICAYUNE PROPERTIES, AND DUE TO CITY OF PICAYUNE THEREFROM, for the period beginning January the 1st 1920, and ending June 30th 1931, conducted by A.C. McGuirk, C.P.A. and H.K. McKee, City Clerk, representing, R.V. Whitaker and Co., Certified Public Accountants and Auditors, and the City of Picayune, by paying to the City of Picayune a lump sum of \$20,000.00, and the Board being of the opinion that it is to the best interest interests of the City and of the County, that this compromise be accepted, if by so doing the City may come into possession of this amount and save the expense of further litigation, motion was therefore duly made and carried that the City agree to accept said compromise on condition that said amount be placed in the 1932 County Levy of Taxes, and be paid to the City out of said Taxes; it being understood and agreed however that by accepting this offer in compromise the City does not forfeit any of its rights in action should the Board of Supervisors fail or refuse to make said levy or collect and pay to said City said amount of \$20,000.00.

ORDER TO REMIT 25% DAMAGES, T.J. WEAVER.

On motion duly made and carried it is ordered that the City Clerk and Tax Collector be and is hereby authorized and directed to remit the 25% damages on Taxes and cost on Lots 7-8-8, Block "J" of the Original Plat of Picayune, which lands were adjudicated to the City in the Tax Sale held in said City on July 7th 1931, same having been assessed to T.J. Weaver.

ORDER TO SUSPEND FINE.

Otis Barrett appeared before the Board and made a statement with reference to the suspension of a fine of \$25.00 wherein he was tried, convicted, and sentenced in the Police Court of the City of Picayune, and by him appealed to the

Circuit Court of Pearl River County, stating that if the Board would suspend same he would not again be guilty of offending against the Ordinances of the City, whereupon the Mayor submitted the following recommendation to the Board, to-wit;

TO THE BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE CITY OF PICAYUNE,
Gentlemen;

Otis Barrett having appeared before the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the City of Picayune, asking that the sentence of \$25.00 in a case wherein he was tried and convicted in the Police Court and appealed to the Circuit Court, where said appeal is now pending, be suspended on good behavior, and on his assurance that he would not again violate any of the City Ordinances, now therefore,

In view of the promises made by the said Barrett, and on the conditions herein before mentioned, I recommend that the Board of Aldermen suspend the said fine, such suspension to be in effect so long as the said Otis Barrett shall not in the opinion of the Board violate any City Ordinance, and I further recommend that when the said Barrett shall pay to the Circuit Clerk of Pearl River County all costs which have accrued, in said appeal that the City Attorney be and is hereby directed to consent to the withdrawal of said appeal. also that said order of suspension provide that if the said Barrett shall fail to pay on or before the opening of the next term of said Circuit Court all costs accrued in this case then this order shall be null and void and of no effect. and/or if the said Barrett shall be guilty of violating any of the Ordinances of the City then in either such event this suspension shall stand revoked, and said judgment shall be in full force and effect.
