On motion duly made and carried it is ordered that the following opinion of Honorably George H. Ethridge concerning a petition for an injunction on building concrete sidewalks in the City, be spread on the Official minutes of the Mayor and Board of Aldermen:

July 14, 1933.

Dear Kelly:

After considering the application for an injunction In Re Steen, et al, vs City of Picayune, and your brief in connection with the bill and answer I think it is not a proper case for the granting of a preliminary injunction.

It appears from the answer, and that is not disputed by affidavit, that the funds used in constructing the sidewalks were funds which the City received from the ad Valorem road assessment of the County for street purposes. It therefore appears that the petitioners for injunction would not be called on to pay any taxes for the proposed improvements and there would be no personal burden upon them. This seems to bring the case within the principles announced in McKee vs. Hogan, 145 Miss. 747, wherein it was held that in a case where there was no tax or burden imposed upon the tax payer he would not have a right to challenge the City Authorities in administering public funds unless and until the proper officer or officers having power to act for the public had been given opportunity to take action. In other words, the mere taxpayers of the City have no right to control the disbursements of funds in the City treasury or to interfere with it where no personal burden or tax is imposed or will be imposed upon such taxpayers.
