ORDINANCES ADOPTED

The following Ordinances were submitted by the City Attorney and after each Ordinance was considered separately, section by section, they were unanimously adopted, as follows:

ORDINANCE NO 123

AN ORDINANCE TO REGULATE THE PARKING OF ALL MOTOR VEHICLES WITHIN THE MUNICIPAL LIMITS, AND TO FIX A PENALTY FOR THE VIOLATIONS OF ANY OF THE PROVISIONS THEREOF.

SECTION ONE. BE IT ORDAINED, by the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the City of Picayune that the term Motor Vehicle in this Ordinance shall include all vehicles propelled by any other power than animal whether the same be used for pleasure or commercial purposes, except Road Machines, Road Rollers, Street Sprinklers, Fire Department Apparatuses, Police Patrol Wagons, Ambulances and such vehicles as run on rails or tracks.

SECTION TWO. BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that no Motor Vehicles shall be parked or left standing on any street within the City Limits unless both the right front wheel and the right rear wheel of such vehicle be not more than eighteen inches from the curb or outside line of the traveled portion of such roadway or street on the right side of such street in which such vehicle is headed. Any vehicle parked or left on left hand side of any street or road-way in the direction in which such vehicle is headed shall be deemed so parked or left in violation of this section. No Motor Vehicle shall be parked on either the North or South side of the street or continuation of First street and Canal street between the intersection of Harvey Avenue and First Street, and the main line of N. O. & H. E. Railroad Company.

SECTION THREE. The violation of provisions of this ordinance shall be punished upon conviction thereof, before the Police Court, by fine of not exceeding \$100.00 or by imprisonment in discretion of the Court.

SECTION FOUR. That any Ordinance or part of any Ordinance that is in conflict with the above and foregoing provisions is hereby repealed.


SECTION FIVE. That for good cause to the Board this Ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage, January 2nd, 1934.

ORDINANCE NO. 124

AN ORDINANCE REGULATING THE SPEED OF MOTOR VEHICLES OR GASOLINE CARS OR MOTORCYCLES OR ELECTRICAL PROPELLED CONTRIVANCES OR STEAM CARS UPON THE STREETS AND AVENUES WITHIN CORPORATE LIMITS OF THE CITY OF PICAYUNE, MISSISSIPPI.

SECTION ONE. BE IT ORDAINED, by the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the City of Picayune, Mississippi, that it shall be unlawful for any person to run or operate any motor vehicle, steam car, gasoline car, motorcycle, or other motor or electrical propelled contrivance or vehicle at a greater rate of speed than thirty miles per hour while on the streets, avenues, or roadways of the City of Picayune, Mississippi, except public schools in school days when school is held at hours of 8:00 O'Clock Anti Meridian and 4:00 O'Clock Post Meridian or passing buildings of public worship on Sabbath Days during the usual hours of services at a greater rate of speed than twenty miles per hour, having due regard to travel, and use of streets, avenues, highways or roadways, so as not to endanger the life and limbs of any person, or safety of any property on said streets, avenues, highways or roadways.

SECTION TWO. BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that any person violating section one of this Ordinance shall upon conviction be fined not more than \$50.00 and not less than \$1.00

SECTION THREE. That any Ordinance or part of any Ordinance that is in conflict with the above and foregoing provisions is hereby repealed.

SECTION FOUR. BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that this Ordinance be in full force and effect after its passage for a good cause shown to the Board.

The foregoing Ordinance was first reduced to writing, was read and considered Section by Section at a regular meeting of the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the City of Picayune, Mississippi, this the 2nd day of January, 1934, and vote on the passage was taken, as follows:

ORDINANCE NO 125

AN ORDINANCE TO REGULATE THE RUNNING AND OPERATION OF MOTOR VEHICLES, ANIMAL DRAWN VEHICLES, AND PEDESTRIAN TRAFFIC AT THE INTERSECTION OF FIRST STREET AND HARVEY AVENUE AT THE AUTOMATIC SIGNAL LIGHT OR CONTROL AND DESIGNATING TURNS AND FIXING A PENALTY FOR THE VIOLATION THEREOF.

SECTION ONE. BE IT ORDAINED, by the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the City of Picayune, Mississippi, that all motor vehicles, Animal Drawn Vehicles, and Pedestrian Traffic facing the Automatic Signal located at the intersection of Harvey Avenue and First Street in the City of Picayune, Miss., may proceed when the light in said signal is green except that vehicular traffic shall yield the right of way to Pedestrians and Vehicles lawfully within the section or cross walk or the intersection at the time such signal was exhibited.

Traffic facing the signal shall stop on the yellow light or signal before entering the intersection unless so close to the intersection that a stop cannot be made in safety.

Traffic facing the signal when the light or signal is red shall stop before entering the intersection and remain standing until green is shown alone.

All turns shall be made on the green signal or light with due regard to the safety of others, and no "U" turns shall be made.

SECTION TWO. BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, That any person or persons violating section one of this Ordinance shall be guilty, upon conviction thereof, of misdemeanor and shall be fined not more than \$75.00 and not less than \$1.00.

SECTION THREE. BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, That for good cause shown this Ordinance be in full force and effect from and after its passage.

The foregoing Ordinance was first reduced to writing, was read and considered Section by Section at a regular meeting of the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the City of Picayune, Miss., this the 2nd day of January, 1934, and vote on the passage was taken as follows:

ORDINANCE No. 126

AN ORDINANCE REGULATING THE OPERATION OF ALL CIRCUSES, SHOWS, THEATRICAL EXHIBITIONS, VAUDEVILLES, OR SHOWS OF ANY KIND OR DESCRIPTION WITHIN THE CITY LIMITS OF THE CITY OF PICAYUNE, MISSISSIPPI, AND FIXING A PENALTY FOR THE VIOLATION THEREOF.

SECTION ONE. BE IT ORDAINED, by the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the City of Picayune, Miss., that the operation or performance of traveling or road circuses, shows, theatrical exhibitions, vaudevilles, or shows of any kind or description, not exhibiting in a licensed hall or theatre, shall be prohibited unless written permission is given by the Mayor and Board of Aldermen at a regular or special meeting of said Mayor and Board of Aldermen, for the performances or operation of any shows or engagements,

SECTION TWO. BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that any person or persons or firms or corporations who violates the provisions of section one of this Ordinance shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall be fined for each offense not to exceed \$100.00, and each day's operation shall constitute a separate offense.

SECTION THREE. BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, That this Ordinance take effect and be in force from and after its passage for a good cause shown.

ORDINANCE NO. 127

AN ORDINANCE FIXING THE COMMISSION OR FEE TO BE PAID TO THE CITY TAX COLLECTOR ON ALL TAXES COLLECTED WITHIN THE CITY OF PICAYUNE AND THE PICAYUNE MUNICIPAL SEPARATE SCHOOL DISTRICT.

SECTION ONE. BE IT ORDAINED, by the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the City of Picayune, Mississippi, that the City Tax Collector's fee or commission on the collection of all Ad Valorem Taxes in the City of Picayune and the Picayune Municipal Separate School District, be and is hereby fixed at two and one-half per cent (2½%) on the Dollar, and the said Tax Collector shall be allowed no other fees for the collection of Ad Valorem Taxes, nor shall he be allowed any fee other than his regular 2½% commissions on Taxes advertised and sold by distress, and the said Tax Collector shall be allowed no fee on Real or Personal Property sold to the City for Taxes

SECTION TWO. BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that the City Tax Collector shall be

allowed a fee or commission of five per cent (5%) on the Dollar on the collection of all Privilege Taxes and Street Taxes.

SECTION THREE. BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that the City Tax Collector shall be allowed to deduct, for his services in making Tax Collections, the said Commissions as his compensation and shall make his reports as required by law and render a report of all collections showing the amount of commissions deducted by him.

SECTION FOUR. BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that this ordinance shall hereby repeal any previous Ordinance or Ordinances that are inconsistent with the provisions hereof, specifically Ordinance Numbers 90, 117 and 121.

SECTION FIVE. BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that for good cause shown this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after the date of its passage, January 19th, 1934, applying on Tax Collections beginning with the taxable year 1933.



PERMISSION FOR STEAMPIPE LINE



The said Mayor and Board of Aldermen are now familiar with said pipe line and the said pipe line as now constructed does not interfere with the public use of said streets or public travel thereover and the said Goodyear Yellow Pine Company is authorized to maintain the pipe line across said streets and they are required to continue to maintain the same as long as it crosses said streets so that the said pipe line will not interfere with the public use of said two streets; and the City shall be saved harmless from all damages or liability in the event of any accidents or injuries.

ORDINANCE NO. 128

AN ORDINANCE REQUIRING MALE INHABITANTS BETWEEN THE AGES FIXED BY LAW, TO PERFORM THE LABOR REQUIRED ON THE PUBLIC STREETS, AND ALLIES IN THE MUNICIPALITY AND FIXING THE COMMUTATION TO BE PAID IN LIEU OF SUCH LABOR, AND REQUIRING THREE DAYS LABOR TOTALING THIRTY HOURS INSTEAD OF SIX DAYS LABOR OF TEN HOURS EACH DAY.

SECTION ONE: BE IT ORDAINED, by the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the City of Picayune, that the male residents of the Municipality between the ages of eighteen and fifty-five years are hereby required to perform annually four days labor totaling thirty hours for each person, on the streets, allies, or avenues; or in lieu thereof to pay \$3.00 each year as commutation tax; or such annual commutation tax as shall be fixed hereafter on each person subject to read and statute of the State of Mississippi.

SECTION TWO: The Board shall have the right to exempt fire Companies who serve free, whose limit of membership is fifty men, from the payment of such street tax and to grant exemption to persons that are maim, lame, or blind, as well as other classes who are entitled to exemption from road duties under the general laws of the State.

SECTION THREE: The duty imposed in section one of this Ordinance on each male person may be required by the proper summons to appear at a given time and place in the municipality to perform the labor under the direction of the street Commissioner at any time from the first day of February, 1934, and on said date of each year thereafter; and the Street Commissioner shall have the power to summon each person subject to duty, to appear upon the streets, to perform said duty for one or more days during each month following the above said date until each person shall have performed his four days labor totaling thirty hours, or so much thereof as is required to keep all the streets, Allies and Avenues in said Municipality constructed and in repair as required by the Mayor and Board of Aldermen. The Street Commissioner shall summon such persons as are subject to duty so that all labor shall have been performed before the first of December of each year.

SECTION FOUR: That all persons who subject to street duty and not exempt by law who are duly summoned to appear and meet the Street Commissioner at the time and place fixed for such meeting to perform their labor and who shall fail or refuse to do so; or fail or refuse, then and there to pay the Commutation Street Tax fixed by this Ordinance, shall then be subject to prosecution for failure and refusal to perform said duty, or to pay said Tax. The said prosecution shall be in the manner and form prescribed by law for other misdemeanors, and identical with the method of prosecution by the State for persons who refuse to perform road duty; and upon conviction, such persons shall be fined three times the Commutation Tax; and taxed with the cost.


SECTION FIVE: That this Ordinance take effect and be in force from and as its enactment and publication.



WHEREAS, The McNeill Experiment Station has been and continues to be in-



ORDINANCE NO. 129

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND AN ORDINANCE, "AN ORDINANCE TO REGULATE THE PARKING OF ALL MOTOR VEHICLES WITHIN THE MUNICIPAL LIMITS, AND TO FIX A PENALTY FOR VIOLATION OF ANY OF THE PROVISIONS THEREOF".

SECTION ONE: BE IT ORDAINED, by the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the City of Picayune, Miss., that Ordinance No. 125, entitled, "An Ordinance to regulate the parking of all Motor Vehicles within the Municipal limits, and to fix penalty for the violation of any provisions thereof." Be and the same is hereby amended to read, "BE IT ORDAINED, by the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the City of Picayune, that the term Motor Vehicle in this Ordinance shall include all Vehicles propelled by any other power than animal, whether the same be used for pleasure or commercial purposes, except road machines, Road Rollers, Street Sprinklers, Fire Depart-

ment Apparatuses, Police Patrol Wagons, Ambulances and such Vehicles as run on rails or tracks.

SECTION TWO: BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that no Motor Vehicle or other Vehicle not excepted above shall be parked or left standing within the City Limits unless both right front wheel and right rear wheel of such Vehicle be not more than eighteen inches from the curb or outside line of the traveled portion of such roadway or street on the right side of such street in which such Vehicle is headed except on the East side of Harvey Avenue from Mitchell Street to third Street, and on the South side of Canal Street from West Railroad Street to second Street.

The same shall be parked on a line drawn ^{through} the tread of right front and rear wheel to a thirty degree angle with the curb or street and with line of ditch next to sidewalk; on streets not curbed on right hand side of the street in the direction in which such Motor Vehicle is headed. Any Vehicle parked or left standing on left hand side of any street or roadway in the direction in which Vehicle is headed shall be termed so parked or left in violation of this section. No Motor Vehicle shall be parked on either the North or South side of the Street or Continuation of First and Canal Street between the intersection of Harvey Avenue and First Street, and the main line of N. O. & N. E. Railroad Company.

SECTION THREE: the violation of the provisions of this Ordinance shall be punished upon conviction thereof before the Police Court and shall be fined not exceeding \$100.00, or by imprisonment in discretion of the Court.

SECTION FOUR: That any Ordinance or part of any Ordinance that is in conflict with the above and foregoing provisions is hereby repealed.

SECTION FIVE: That for good cause shown to the Board, this Ordinance shall ^{effect} take and be in force from and after its passage, this the 7th day of March, 1934.





ORDINANCE NO. 130

AN ORDINANCE TO PROHIBIT DOGS, AND CATTLE, OXEN, HORSES, MULES, ASSES, HOGS, SHEEP GOATS, OR OTHER LIKE ANIMALS AND LIVE STOCK FROM RUNNING AT LARGE WITHIN THE CORPORATE LIMITS OF THE CITY OF PICAYUNE, AND PROVIDING FOR THE TAKING UP, IMPOUNDING AND SALE OF SUCH ANIMALS FOUND RUNNING AT LARGE IN VIOLATION OF THIS ORDINANCE.

SECTION ONE: BE IT ORDAINED, by the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the City of Picayune, Miss., that it shall be unlawful for any dog, Cow, Ox, Horse or Mare, Mule, Ass, Hog, Sheep, Goat or other animals of like kind and character to run at large or on any unenclosed place within the corporate limits of the City of Picayune, Miss., and it is hereby made the duty of the City Pound Keeper to immediately take up and impound, in the City Pound Pen, all such animals found running at large in violation of this Ordinance, and to deal with and dispose of all such animals in the manner hereinafter provided.

SECTION TWO: BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that when any animal shall be taken up in violation of section one hereof, the City Pound Keeper shall at once notify the owner of such animal to appear and pay to the City Clerk all charges incident to the taking up and impounding of such animal, and upon the payment of such charges as hereinafter imposed, the animal shall be released to the owner thereof, on an order from the City Clerk to the City Pound Keeper, without any further procedure. Should the owner fail or refuse to pay the charges within twelve hours after notification, the City Pound Keeper shall file with the City Clerk, a complete description of the animal impounded and held with the name of the owner, if known, and the City Clerk shall enter such description of the animal and the name of the owner thereof in a book to be kept for that purpose, and shall immediately issue a summons to the owner of such animal, commanding him to appear before the Police Justice on a day to be named in the summons, to pay the charges incident to taking up and impounding and feeding such animal, or to show cause why such animal should not be sold to satisfy such cost and expense. Should the owner, after five days from the date of the summons, fail or refuse to appear before the Police Justice, or having appeared, fail to show cause why such animal in question should not be held in violation of this Ordinance, and shall fail to pay the costs of the proceedings hereunder, The Police Justice shall cause an order to be issued directing the Pound Keeper to advertise such animal for sale, by posting notices of such sale in three public places (one at the East front door of the City Hall, one at the City Pound Pen and another in a public and conspicuous place within the corporate limits of the City) for two days, and to sell such animal at public auction to the highest and best bidder for cash, unless the owner of such animal shall appear before the time of the sale and pay all cost and expense incident thereto.

When any animal shall be taken up and the owner thereof cannot be found, the City Pound Keeper shall immediately file with the City Clerk, a complete description of such animal, giving the name of the owner as "Unknown". The City Clerk shall enter such animal, with its description in the book to be kept for that purpose, listing the owner as "Unknown", and he shall forthwith issue a summons to "Unknown Owner", and said summons shall be posted by the City Pound Keeper, for five days, in three public places as shown above. Should no owner appear after five days from the date of the summons, the Police Justice shall cause an order to be issued for the advertisement and sale of such animal, in the same manner and form as shown above.

All public sales of animals and livestock shall be made at the City Pound Pen by the City Pound Keeper, in the presence of the City Marshall, and the proceeds of any and all such sales shall be reported and paid to the City Clerk, and shall be entered by him as a permanent record. The proceeds of any such sale shall be applied, first to the payment of all costs due the City Pound Keeper as hereinafter provided, second to the payment of all costs due the City, and any balance remaining shall be paid to the owner of such animal, if known and present to receive same, otherwise such balance belonging to the owner of such animal, shall be paid into the General Fund of the City, subject to payment thereafter, on allowance of the Mayor and Board of Aldermen, to the owner of such animal, should he afterwards appear and establish his legal claim thereto.

SECTION THREE: BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that the charges and fees for taking up, impounding and selling animals found running at large in violation of this Ordinance, shall be as follows:

All full grown Cattle, Oxen, Horses, Mules, Asses - - - - -	\$1.00 each
All Calves one year & under, Hogs, Sheep and Goats - - - - -	.50 each
All Dogs - - - - -	.50 each

The said fees shall be paid to the City Clerk, who shall deposit same to the credit of the General Fund, and the City Clerk shall cause a list of all fees collected by him to be entered Monthly upon the claim Docket, and upon approval

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of the Mayor and Board of Aldermen, a Warrent shall be issued to the City Pound Keeper for the total amount of said fees collected for the Month specified therein. The actual expense of feeding and watering each animal while impounded shall be charged and allowed to the City Pound Keeper, providing he shall keep an itemized list of said expense and present same to the City Clerk before claiming his fees and expense for the impounding, keeping and/or sale of any animals or live-stock.

SECTION FOUR: BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that it shall be the duty of the City Pound Keeper to properly feed and water any and all animals while impounded and kept confined in the City Pound Pen, and for his failure to do so, he may be proceeded against by law for the prevention of cruelty to animals.

SECTION FIVE: BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that all Ordinances or parts of all Ordinances in conflict with any of the provisions hereof, specifically Ordinance Nos. 60, 79, 80, 91, 101 and 108, are hereby repealed.

SECTION SIX: BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that for good cause shown, this Ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the date of its passage.



ORDINANCE NO. 131

AN ORDINANCE PROHIBITING ELECTRICAL INTERFERENCE WITH RADIO RECEPTION, AND PROVIDING FOR PUNISHMENT FOR THE VIOLATION THEREOF.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF PICAYUNE, and the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the City of Picayune, Mississippi,

SECTION 1. That it shall be unlawful for any person, firm, copartnership, association, or corporation knowingly, to operate or cause to be operated, any machine, device, apparatus, or instrument of any kind whatsoever, within the corporate limits of the City of Picayune, Mississippi, between the hours 12 O'Clock Noon and 12 O'Clock Midnight, the operation of which will cause reasonably preventable electrical interference with Radio reception, within said Municipal limits.

PROVIDED, HOWEVER, That X-ray pictures, examinations, or treatments may be made at any time if the machines or apparatus used therefor are properly equiped to avoid all unnecessary or reasonably preventable interference with Radio reception and are not negligently operated.

SECTION 2. That this Ordinance shall not be held or construed to embrace or cover the regulation of any transmitting, broadcasting or receiving instrument, apparatus, or device used or useful in interstate commerce, or the operation of which instrument, apparatus, or device is licensed or authorized by or under the provisions of any act of the Congress of the United States.

SECTION THREE. That every person, copartnership, association, firm or corporation violating any of the provisions of this Ordinance shall, upon conviction, be punished by fine of not less than five Dollars, nor more than One Hundred Dollars, and that each day during which such violation continues, shall constitute a separate offense.

SECTION 4. That for good cause shown, this Ordinance shall take effect from and after the date of its passage.
