ORDINANCE NO. 136

AN ORDINANCE TO ENCOURAGE NEW FACTORIES AND NEW ENTERPRISES OF PUBLIC UTILITY HEREAFTER ESTABLISHED, EXCEPT RAILROADS, BY EXEMPTING SAME FROM MUNICIPAL TAXATION FOR A PERIOD OF FIVE YEARS AND PROVIDING THE METHOD OF PROCEDURE FOR OBTAINING SUCH EXEMPTION THROUGH APPLICATION TO THE MAYOR AND BOARD OF ALDERMEN.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the City of Picayune, Mississippi - That,

SECTION 1: In order to encourage the establishment of new factories and new enterprises of public utility, except railroads, hereafter established within the corporate limits of the City of Picayune that all new factories and new enterprises of public utility be and they are hereby granted exemption from all municipal taxes in the manner hereinafter provided on tangible property used in, or necessary to, the operation of the service or industry, for the period named, but not upon the products thereof. The time of such exemption to commence from the date of charter, if a corporation, and if an individual enterprise, from the commencement of work. Those enterprises exempted are limited to the enterprises stated in Section 3109 of the Mississippi Code of 1930 and all amendments thereto.

SECTION 2: Application For Exemption: Any person, firm or corporation claiming exemption from municipal taxation as a new factory or new enterprise of public utility, under the terms of this Ordinance, shall first file an application therefor, in triplicate, with the Mayor and Board of Aldermen. Each copy shall be subscribed and sworn to by the individual making the application, or if a firm or corporation, by an officer or person duly authorized so to do. In the application, full information shall be given as to the property to be exempted, the kind of articles to be manufactured and the date from which the exemption is claimed. Each application shall also show the actual true value of all such property sought to be exempted, whether proposed to be subsequently built, purchased, owned or in any manner acquired by applicant.

SECTION 3: Hearing On Application: At its next meeting, after the filing of said application, the Mayor and Board of Aldermen shall proceed to investigate the matter and determine whether the property is exempt. If the property is exempt, the Mayor and Board of Aldermen shall approve the application by a resolution or ordinance duly entered on its minutes, fully describing the property to be exempted and the date when such exemption begins and expires. The Clerk of the Municipality shall record the application together with the resolution or ordinance approving same, in

a book kept in his office for that purpose.

The above Ordinance, after having reduced to writing and read and considered section by section by the Mayor and Board of Aldermen, was adopted by the following vote: Aldermen voting "AYE" V. E. Martin, A. M. Martin, W. A. Kellar, L. N. Formby. Aldermen voting "NAY" None.

ORDER TO PUBLISH ORDINANCE NO. 136

It is ordered by the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the City of Picayune, that, in accordance with Section 3110 of the Mississippi Code of 1930, the above Ordinance, after having been duly and legally adopted by the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the City of Picayune, be published in two issues of the Picayune Item, a newspaper published in the City of Picayune and having a general circulation therein, notifying the general public that said Ordinance will become final and effective within 60 days after its passage, unless within 30 days after the publication of said Ordinance, 10% of the qualified electors of the City of Picayune petition the Mayor and Board of Aldermen for an election to determine whether or not the adoption of said Ordinance shall become effective or shall be annulled. If no such petition is presented within said time, the said Ordinance shall be valid and effective 60 days after its passage. If a petition is presented, an election will be called and if the adoption of such Ordinance is favored by a majority of those voting in said election, then the said Ordinance will become valid and effective. If less than a majority favor said Ordinance, then it will be annulled.

Read, Clerk of the City of Picayune, hereby certify that the foregoing Ordinance, together with the order for publication, was duly and legally adopted by the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the City of Picayune at a regular meeting held on the 4th day of February, 1936, and said Ordinance is published in accordance with the requirements of Section 3110 of the Mississippi Code of 1930.

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ORDINANCE NO. 137

AN ORDINANCE REQUIRING ALL MALE INHABITANTS OF THE CITY OF PICAYUNE, BETWEEN THE AGES OF TWENTY ONE AND FIFTY YEARS, TO PERFORM FOUR DAYS LABOR OF EIGHT HOURS EACH ON THE STREETS OF THE CITY, OR IN LIEU THEREOF TO PAY A STREET TAX OF \$3.00 ANNUALLY, AND FIXING THE PENALTY FOR FAILURE TO COMPLY WITH THE PROVISIONS HEREOF.

SECTION 1: BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the City of Picayune, Miss., that all male inhabitants of the municipality between the ages of twenty one and fifty years are hereby required to perform annually, four days labor of eight hours each, on the streets, allies, or avenues; or in lieu thereof to pay \$3.00 each year as commutation tax.

SECTION 2: The duty imposed in section one of this ordinance on each male person, may be required by the proper summons, to appear at a given time and place in the

municipality to perform the labor under the direction of the Street Commissioner, at any time from the date of passage hereof for the year 1936 and from the first day of January of each year thereafter; and the street commissioner shall have the power to summon each person subject to duty following the above said dates, until each person shall have performed his four days labor, or so much thereof as is required to keep all the streets, allies and avenues in said municipality constructed and in repair, as required by the Mayor and Board of Aldermen. The street commissioner shall summon such persons as are subject to duty so that all labor shall have been performed before the first day of December of each year.

SECTION 3: All persons liable for street duty or tax under this ordinance, who, having been duly summoned, shall fail or refuse to appear at the proper time and place or who shall fail or refuse to pay the required \$3.00 tax on or before the appearance date of said summons, shall be deemed to be delinquent and subject to a penalty therefor in the sum of \$1.00, in addition to said duty or tax.

SECTION 4: All persons who are subject to street duty and not exempt by law, who are duly summoned to appear and meet the street commissioner at the time and place fixed for said meeting to perform their labor, and who shall fail or refuse to do so; or fail or refuse then and there to pay the commutation street tax fixed by this ordinance, shall then be subject to prosecution for failure and refusal to perform said duty or to pay said tax. The said prosecution shall be in the manner and form prescribed by law for other misdemeanors, and upon conviction, such persons shall be fined, not less than \$4.00 and not more than \$12.00 and taxed with the cost.

SECTION 5: That for good cause shown this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

SECTION 6: All ordinances or parts of ordinances that are in conflict with any of the provisions hereof, are hereby repealed.

SECTION 2: Be it further ordained that the limits and boundaries of said City of Picayune, as so enlarged and fixed by this ordinance shall be and are as follows, Viz: "Begin at the SE corner of Section 14, Township 6 south, Range 17 west and run north of Section Line to the NE corner of Section 14, thence west on section line to the SE corner of the SW $\frac{1}{4}$ of the SE $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 11, Township 6 south, Range 17 west, thence north to the NE corner of said SW $\frac{1}{4}$ of the SE $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 11, Township 6 south, Range 17 west, thence west to the NW corner of said SW $\frac{1}{4}$ of the SE $\frac{1}{4}$ of said Section 11, said Township and Range, thence north to the NE corner of the NW $\frac{1}{4}$ of said Section 11; thence west on section line to the NW corner of said section 11; thence south on Section line to the south Bank of East Hobolochitto Creek, thence down said creek with its meanderings to its confluence with West Hobolochitto Creek, thence down the south bank of Hobolochitto Creek with its meanderings to the north and south half section line of section 9, Township 6 south, Range 17 west; thence south on half section line to the SW corner of the Southeast quarter of Section 16, Township 6 south, Range 17 west; thence east on section line to the NW corner of the East half of the NW $\frac{1}{4}$ of the NE $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 21, Township 6 south, Range 17 west; thence south to the SW corner of the East half of the NE $\frac{1}{4}$ of the NE $\frac{1}{4}$ of said Section 21; thence east to the SE corner of the NE $\frac{1}{4}$ of the NE $\frac{1}{4}$ of said Section 21; thence south to the SW corner of the Northwest quarter of Section 22, Township 6 south, Range 17 west; thence east on half section line to the SE corner of the Northeast quarter of said Section 22; thence north to the NE corner of said Section 22; thence east on the south line of section 14, Township 6 south, Range 17 west to place of beginning, and being all of Section 14 and 15; thence west half and the Southwest quarter of the Southeast quarter of Section 11; all that part of Section 10 south of south bank of East Hobolochitto Creek; all that part of the East half of Section 9 south of the south bank of East Hobolochitto Creek and Hobolochitto Creek; all the east half of Section 16; the east half of the NW $\frac{1}{4}$ of the NE $\frac{1}{4}$ and the NE $\frac{1}{4}$ of the NE $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 21; and all the north half of Section 22, all in Township 6 south, Range 17 west in Pearl River County, Mississippi".

ORDINANCE NO. 139-A

AN ORDINANCE GRANTING UNTO THE PEARL RIVER VALLEY RAILROAD COMPANY, A MISSISSIPPI CORPORATION, THE RIGHT TO BUILD A SPUR RAILROAD TRACK ACROSS AND ALONG CERTAIN STREETS IN THE CITY OF PICAYUNE.

WHEREAS, the Picayune Chamber of Commerce is engaged in erecting a garment factory on Blocks 66 and 67 in the Williams-Goodyear Addition to the City of Picayune, and it is necessary in laying a railroad to the said garment factory that it cross certain streets located in said Williams-Goodyear Addition to said city, and

WHEREAS, it is to the general interest of the public that said spur track be built so as to connect with the location and operation of said factory, and all of the abutting owners of lands on either side of said streets having conveyed a right-of-way for said purpose to the said Pearl River Valley Railroad Co., insofar as they have the right to so convey, and therefore, by the execution of said conveyance, or right to cross said streets the said abutting owners have waived all right to any damages that might accrue to them.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it ordained by the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the City of Picayune, that:

Section 1. The Pearl River Valley Railroad Company, a corporation under the laws of the State of Mississippi, operating a railroad through Picayune in said State be, and it is hereby granted a right-of-way to build a spur track from the present main line of said railroad across the old Columbia-Gainesville road which is the street that runs from C and R store No. 7 south towards the property of B. B. Moody and across 7th avenue between block 83 and block 85 of Williams-Goodyear Addition of said City, and across "E" street between Block 82 and Block 83 of said addition, and to enter Sixth Street and to run along Sixth Street from Block 82, and thence across said street into Block 65 and across "I" Street from Block 65 to Block 66, all of said streets and blocks as above described being located in the Williams-Goodyear Addition to the City of Picayune. Said railroad to be constructed along the lines of the plat attached to a deed from Mrs. Trinity Williams, et als to the said Pearl River Valley Railroad Company, and a copy of which plat has this day been filed with the Mayor and Board of Aldermen by filing the same with the City Clerk.

Section 2. The said right to construct and operate the said track is hereby granted for a period as long as said railroad is used and operated across said streets. Whenever the said railroad company or its assigns shall no longer operate the said tracks and takes up the railroad then all its right granted by this ordinance shall revert to the said City of Picayune.

Section 3. The said Pearl River Valley Railroad Company in using and constructing said road and using said streets shall do so in any manner so as not to unnecessarily endanger the general public, or interfere with the use of the said streets by the said general public.


Section 4. For good cause shown, the above ordinance shall be in force and effect from and after its passage and due publication according to law.


RESOLUTION CONCERNING POPULATION
