ORDINANCE NO. 146

AN ORDINANCE ADOPTING A LAND ASSESSMENT ROLL FORM FOR THE CITY OF PICAYUNE AND PICAYUNE SEPARATE SCHOOL DISTRICT OUTSIDE OF THE CORPORATE LIMITS.

SECTION ONE:- Be it ordained by the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the City of Picayune that in compliance with Section 6, of House Bill No. 3 of the Acts of the Special Session of the Mississippi Legislature of 1938, that a form for a Land Assessment Roll for the City of Picayune and of Picayune Separate School District out side the corporate limits, be and the same is hereby adopted as follows:-

SECTION TWO:- Said Assessment Roll Form shall be printed on the same size sheets as prescribed for Counties and shall conform to the provisions of Section 6 of House Bill No. 3 of the Acts of the Mississippi Special Session of the Legislature of 1938, and may contain such additional columns as is found to be necessary or convenient.

SECTION THREE:- Be it further ordained that for good cause shown the foregoing ordinance be in force from and after its passage.

The foregoing ordinance was first reduced to writing, read, considered and passed by the sections at a recess meeting of the Mayor and Board of Aldermen held at the City Hall, September 8, 1938.

ORDINANCE NO. 147.


