ORDINANCE NO. 148

AN ORDINANCE PROHIBITING THE PARKING OF MOTOR VEHICLES OR OTHER VEHICLES ON THE WEST SIDE OF HARVEY AVENUE OR HIGHWAY NO. 11, AND ON EITHER SIDE OF A TRIANGLE SEPERATING SAID AVENUE AND SAID HIGHWAY ON THE NORTH, AND FIXING A PENALTY FOR THE VIOLATION THEREOF.

Section 1. Be it Ordained by the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the City of Picayune, Mississippi, that hereafter it shall be unlawful for any person to park a motor vehicle, trailer or other vehicles along the West side of Federal Highway No. Eleven or on either side of a neutral ground tri-angle separating Federal Highway 11 and Harvey Avenue, situated immediately South of Byrd's Service Station, in the Corporate Limits of the City of Picayune.

Section 2. Be it further Ordained that any person violating Section 1 of this Ordinance shall upon conviction be fined in any sum not exceeding Twenty-Five Dollars or 10 days in the City Jail, or both said fine and imprisonment.

Section 3. Be it further ordained that for good cause shown, this ordinance shall be in effect from and after the date of its passage.



AN ORDINANCE EXTENDING THE CITY LIMITS OF THE CITY OF PICAYUNE, MISSISSIPPI, SO AS TO ENCLUDE WITHIN THE CORPORATE LIMITS OF SAID CITY, CERTAIN TERRITORY NOW OUTSIDE OF THE CITY LIMITS, AND DEFINING WITH CERTAINTY THE CORPORATE LIMITS OF SAID CITY AS FIXED BY THIS ORDINANCE.

SECTION 1. BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND BOARD OF ALDERMEN of the City of Picayune, Miss., that the following territory be, and the same is hereby, added to the corporate limits of the City of Picayune:

Beginning at the SW Cor. of the SE $\frac{1}{4}$ of SE $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 11, Township 6 South, Range 17 West, and run North $\frac{1}{4}$ mile; thence run West $\frac{1}{2}$ mile; thence run North $\frac{1}{4}$ mile; thence run East $\frac{1}{4}$ mile; thence run North $\frac{1}{4}$ mile; thence run East $\frac{1}{4}$ mile to the N. E. Corner of Section 11, Township 6 South, Range 17 West; thence run South 1 mile to the S. E. Corner of Section 11, Township 6, South, Range 17 West; thence run West $\frac{1}{4}$ mile to the place of beginning; which territory includes the NE $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 11, the NE $\frac{1}{4}$ of SW $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 11, the W $\frac{1}{2}$ of SE $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 11, and the SE $\frac{1}{4}$ of SE $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 11, all in Township 6 South, Range 17 West, situated in Pearl River County, Mississippi.

SECTION 2. BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED that the entire boundary of the corporate limits of the City of Picayune, Miss., as fixed by this Ordinance, shall be as follows:

Beginning at the S. E. Corner of Section 14, Township 6 South, Range 17 West, and run North 2 miles to the N. E. Corner of Section 11, said Township and Range; thence

West 1 mile to the N. W. Corner of said Section, Township and Range; thence South to the Southern Bank of East Hobolochitto Creek; thence Westernly following the meanderings of the Southern Bank of East Hobolochitto Creek and Hobolochitto Creek to where the North and South half Section line divides Section 9, Township 6 South, Range 17 West; thence South to the S. W. Corner of the SW $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 16, Township 6 South, Range 17 West; thence East 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ miles to the place of beginning. Said incorporated territory as fixed by this Ordinance includes all that part of Section 9 and 10 South of Hobolochitto Creek; All of Section 11; Section 14; Section 15; and the East One-half of Section 16, all in Township 6 South, Range 17 West, and situated in Pearl River County, Mississippi.

SECTION 3. BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED that this Ordinance be in effect within 30 days after it's passage and publication.

CONSULTING ENGINEER FOR GAS

A RESOLUTION PROVIDING FOR THE EMPLOYMENT OF A CONSULTING ENGINEER FOR THE CITY OF PICAYUNE, FIXING HIS FEE, PROVIDING A SCHEDULE OF PAYMENTS, DESIGNATING HIS DUTIES AND PASSING UPON AND AUTHORIZING A WRITTEN CONTRACT FOR ALL SUCH TO BE EXECUTED: - -

The following resolution was introduced by H. E. Jordan, duly seconded by G. H. Williams and unanimously adopted and passed by the Mayor and Board of Aldermen:

WHEREAS the City of Picayune, Pearl River County, State of Mississippi, acting through it's duly authorized officers, had heretofore expressed it's intention to, or of, employing a consulting engineer to make survey of the said City of Picayune for the purpose of determining the detailed facts in connection with the installation, or construction of a natural gas transmission or distribution system in said City of Picayune, to design the necessary improvements consisting of such said natural gas transmission, or distribution system.

THEREFORE be it resolved by the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the City of Picayune, State of Mississippi, in adjourned or recessed session legally convened on this the 20th day of July, 1939, that Mr. S. Logan McConnell, consulting engineer of Monroe, Louisiana, be and he is hereby employed as consulting engineer for the said City of Picayune, with respect to the making of the detailed survey and designs of the proposed improvements consisting of a natural gas transmission and distribution system within the said City of Picayune; that the consulting engineer receive a fee for such said services on the conditions, in the amounts and at the times; likewise that said consulting engineer obligates to perform and shall perform in consideration of such fees so to be paid unto him, the duties, acts and things at the times and in the manner, all as specifically set out in a written contract and agreement which has been heretofore prepared, has been at this meeting of the Mayor and Board of Aldermen submitted to the Mayor and Board of Aldermen and agreed upon and executed by the said S. Logan McConnell, consulting engineer, and the City of Picayune acting by and through L. O. Crosby, its Mayor, all of which is in the exact words and figures as follows, to-wit:

WHEREAS, the City of Picayune, Pearl River County, State of Mississippi, was and is authorized under Chapter 316 of the Laws of Mississippi of 1934 as amended by Chapter 318 of the laws of the State of Mississippi of 1936, to purchase or construct gas producing, gas generating, or gas transmission, or gas distribution system, and

WHEREAS, in order for the City of Picayune to avail itself of the benefits provided and authorized by said laws it will become necessary for it to take the necessary steps to issue and sell revenue bonds provided and authorized by said laws, and

WHEREAS, to determine the size, or extent of the gas distribution, or gas selling system suitable or necessary to meet the needs of said City of Picayune, it will be and is necessary for the City of Picayune to have a complete survey of said City of Picayune made by some experienced engineer, and

WHEREAS, it will be necessary for the said City of Picayune to have the necessary plans and specifications properly made showing the character and size plant, or system necessary to be installed, or constructed for the purpose of receiving and distributing natural gas in said City of Picayune to its inhabitants, and to this end it will likewise be necessary to have an experienced, trained consultant engineer prepare such plans and specifications, and

WHEREAS, it will be necessary for the said City of Picayune to provide and have properly filed in the City Hall in the office of the Board of Aldermen of said City, such proper plans and specifications for the benefit of the voters in determining the will of the voters as to whether such gas distribution system shall be authorized by said voters, and

WHEREAS, at a meeting of the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the City of Picayune, duly called and duly held in the office of the Mayor of said City on the 20th day of July, 1939, the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of said City of Picayune passed a resolution authorizing and directing the Mayor of said City of Picayune to enter into the necessary contract with some suitable, experienced consulting engineer for the purpose of making the preliminary survey and drawing the necessary plans and specifications for the acquisition, or the construction of a suitable natural gas distribution system in said City of Picayune, which said resolution now appears in record in Minute Book No. 7, Page 233, of the minutes of the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of said City, and

WHEREAS, L. O. Crosby, Mayor of the City of Picayune, pursuant to the authority vested in him under and by the above mentioned resolution of the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of said

City, has entered into negotiations with one S. Logan McConnell, Consulting Engineer, resident of Monroe, Louisiana, with the view of contracting with said Logan McConnell for the services and work hereinbefore recited, for and on behalf of said City of Picayune, and for the purposes above specified, and

WHEREAS, the said L. O. Crosby, Mayor of the City of Picayune, acting for and on behalf of said City, and the said S. Logan McConnell, have for the considerations moving from and to said parties have agreed and do hereby agree as follows:

That the City of Picayune shall be known for convenience hereinafter as the owner, and the engineer, S. Logan McConnell, shall be known and referred to for convenience as the engineer.

ENGINEER'S DUTIES

SECTION 1: The work to be performed or services to be rendered by the engineer are as follows:

1. To the end that prospective purchasers of bonds to be issued for the purposes hereinbefore specified as well as all other persons may have available from time to time the probable number and class of prospective users or consumers of gas in said City of Picayune, he shall make a preliminary estimate or survey showing all such, including all necessary data suitable or required, shall prepare preliminary estimates and layouts whenever necessary; attend and participate in any and all necessary conferences, the preparation and filing of preliminary studies, estimates and layouts whenever necessary; shall make an estimate of the cost of a suitable gas distribution system; shall prepare plans and specifications for the proposed system; to the end that the City of Picayune may present a comprehensive layout of the proposed gas system; and when an election shall be carried authorizing the issuance of bonds or the issuance of certificates or other evidence of indebtedness or obligation of said City with which to construct such natural gas distribution system; he shall make any and all necessary engineering surveys, plans, maps, ground lay-outs, placement of equipment prints, conduct quantity surveys and investigations, be present and assist the Mayor and Board of Aldermen in the receiving, tabulation and interpretation of proposals and bids and assist in the securing of reputable bidders and the contractor's bond and forms to thoroughly protect the owner as far as engineering skill and science may be required or may direct; to assist the owner in the keeping of accounts, administration of business, and assist with the sale of the bonds, receiving and accepting of bids, making and carrying contracts for the construction and in the supervision of the work in the construction of said gas distribution system. (The above services are not to be construed as requiring the assistance of the engineer in securing rights of way) The engineer to do any and all of the above enumerated things from time to time as the best interests of the owner may require.

1-A. It is mutually agreed that the duties and services to be performed by the engineer as hereinbefore enumerated as to supervising shall not require engineer's continuous or full time, shall not be in lieu or take the place of personal supervision of the work in detail by a superintendent of the works.

1-B. In addition to the above duties to be performed and hereby contracted to be performed by the engineer, he shall prepare monthly estimates as the work progresses in connection with the construction of said natural gas distribution system to the end that payment and satisfaction of contracted obligations may be intelligently made by the owners, and the engineer shall supervise the general construction of said system to such an extent as to assure to the owner a first class job in every respect. And to do any and all things necessary to assure such first class construction of said system.

PAYMENTS TO ENGINEER

SECTION 2: The payments to the engineer on account of or for services by him herein contracted shall be made as follows:

2. The owner agrees to pay unto the engineer for the services hereinbefore set out to be performed by said engineer on the conditions and at the times as hereafter specified, the fee of (5%) five per-cent of the amount of bonds voted and sold or certificates of indebtedness issued and sold for the construction of natural gas distribution system herein described.

2-A. Upon the completion of the engineer of the detailed list or inventory of prospective consumers of natural gas and the making of the necessary preliminary study and survey and the filing with the Mayor and Board of Aldermen or owner the necessary documents, plans and specifications upon which an election may be legally and validly for the issuance of bonds for the purposes herein contemplated, or other certificates of indebtedness to be issued by said owner the engineer is to be paid by the owner the sum of \$500.00. In the event the election for the issuance of bonds as contemplated herein should fail to carry or in the event no funds are raised for the purposes herein set out, the \$500.00 in this paragraph mentioned shall be payment in full for the services rendered the owner by the engineer. In the event funds for the construction of the proposed natural gas distribution system shall be raised either by sale of bonds or other certificates of indebtedness, then the \$500.00 in this paragraph mentioned shall be charged against the commissions to be received by the engineer for services rendered by him under the terms hereof.

2-B. The owner receiving funds for the construction of the proposed natural gas distribution system, either from the issuance and sale of the bonds, or from the issuance and sale of other certificates of indebtedness, then upon the completion of the construction plans and specifications by the engineer and the filing thereof in the office of the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the owner a sum sufficient to increase payments on the fee to eighty (80%) per cent of the commissions herein contracted to be paid to the engineer, shall be paid unto him.

2-C. From time to time during the execution and progress of the work herein contemplated, other payments shall be made on the remainder of the commission to be paid the engineer in proportion to the completed work, on the basis of contractor's estimates, until the aggregate of all payments made on account of the fee under this agreement shall equal the 5% commissions to be paid under the terms hereof.

MUTUAL COVENANTS**SECTION 3: Rights of way, Property Corners, City Maps, Etc.:**

The owner shall furnish all necessary rights of way, locate property lines where required, and furnish the engineer with requested copies of City maps, and such other available information or records which will assist him in the execution of this project.

SECTION 4: Supervision of the Work:

The engineer will endeavor to guard the owner against defects and deficiencies in the work of contractors, but he does not guarantee the performance of their contracts. The supervision of the engineer is to be distinguished from the continuous personal superintendance to be obtained by the employment of a superintendant of the works. Such a Superintendent or inspector shall be employed, said superintendant or inspector, to be selected by the engineer, and paid a salary of \$200.00 per month by the owner, from project costs.

SECTION 5: Preliminary Estimates:

When requested to do so, the engineer will furnish preliminary estimates on the cost of the work, but he does not guarantee the accuracy of such estimates.

SECTION 6: Ownership of Documents:

All drawings, plans and specifications, blue prints or maps furnished the owner by the engineer under the requirements hereof, are, of course, after the filing thereof, the property of the owner, and shall be kept and retained on file as public documents as by law required but none of such documents shall be by the owner used in connection with the construction of any other projects or furnished to any other municipality or owner for use in connection with the construction of any other project.

SECTION 7: Successors and Assignments:

The owner and the engineer each binds himself, his partners, successors, executors, administrators and assigns to the other party to this agreement, and to the partners, successors, executors, administrators, and assigns of such other party in respect of all covenants of this agreement. Except as above, neither the owner or the engineer shall assign sublet or transfer his interest in this agreement without the written consent of the other.

SECTION 8: Funds and Disbursements:

After the issuance and sale of bonds or other certificates of indebtedness, the engineer is to receive his fee from funds derived from such sale of bonds or other certificates of indebtedness at the time and in the amounts as is provided in Section 2 hereof. All payments to the engineer so provided to be made by warrant on the treasury of the owner, issued in the manner authorized and provided by law for the issuance of warrants in satisfaction of legal obligations of said owner.

IN TESTIMONY WHEREOF, the owner has caused these presents to be executed and delivered by L. O. Crosby, its Mayor, its officer duly authorized in the premises, and the engineer acting personally, on this the 20th day of July, 1939.





Calvin, Election Commissioners for said City of Picayune, of the giving of the notice of said election to be held on October 31st, 1939, and the holding of said election on said date, as now on file in the office of the Clerk of the City of Picayune, all of which has been thoroughly examined, including the proof of publication of notice of said election, the report of the Commissioners on the result of said election and after due consideration the same is hereby finally approved and this Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the said City of Picayune does hereby find and affirmatively adjudicate as follows, to-wit:

First: that the notice of the time and place and purpose of the holding of said election was published in the Picayune Item, a weekly newspaper published in said City of Picayune and having a general circulation therein, and which had been so published and had a general circulation in said City of Picayune for more than twelve months next before September 28th, 1939, and that due proof of such notice being so published in said Weekly newspaper was made by the editor of said paper and filed with the Clerk of said City of Picayune and now remains on file with the Clerk of said City.
