MINUTES APPROVED

RESIGNATION BY CITY MARSHAL

City Marshal Weston Lott appeared before the Board, tendering his written resignation, which is in the following words and figures, to-wit:

Gentlemen:

As a result of a vacancy in the City Fire Department, I have talked with Mr. Read and Mayor McDonald and have agreed with them to take the job as one of the City Firemen providing that I could remain thereon as long as my services were satisfactory. This will of course necessitate my resigning as City Marshall prior to the expiration of my regular term in June of 1953.

If it is agreeable with you gentlemen that I take the job as City Fireman as outlined above then I respectfully request that you consider this as my resignation from the office of City Marshal.

I have enjoyed working as Marshal of the City of Picayune and sincerely thank you gentlemen and all the citizens who helped perform my duties in said capacity. While I will be not directly connected with the law enforcement department of the City, as a fireman will be in position to co-operate with the other City officers, all of which I pledge myself to do.

If agreeable to your honorable body, I would like to have you act upon my resignation herein, to-night.

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BUILDING PERMITS

Mr. Ferris E. Tate now comes before the Mayor and Board of Aldermen seeking a permit for his mother, Mrs. Polly A. Tate, to erect a building in the fire zone, to be situated on Lot 4 and $\frac{1}{2}$ of Lot 5, Block D, of the Original Plat of the City of Picayune, said proposed building to be constructed of hollow clay tile and brick, with one partition going all the way from floor to roof, and to conform to City regulations on buildings within the fire zone. Whereupon, a motion was made, seconded and unanimously carried granting said permit as requested.

Mr. W. H. Smith presented a drawing of a proposed addition to his residence situated on Lots 5 and 6, Block 3, R. J. Williams Subdivision, and after having determined that the said proposed addition does not violate any City regulations, a motion was made and carried granting a permit therefor.

ALLOWANCE

Upon motion made and carried, the bill of the American Printing Company, Ltd., in the amount of \$22.37, is hereby approved for payment, said bill covering the printing cost of the brief of City of Picayune vs. Mississippi Power Company, in the U.S. Circuit Court of Appeals.

MAYOR AUTHORIZED TO SIGN RAILROAD AGREEMENT

BE AND IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED BY THE MAYOR AND BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE CITY OF PICAYUNE, that the action of the Mayor of the City of Picayune, Mississippi, in executing for and on behalf of the City of Picayune, that certain agreement, in writing, dated October 30, 1951, between the New Orleans and Northeastern Railroad Company and the City of Picayune, concerning the construction and maintenance of four (4) water pipe lines upon certain property of said Railroad Company at Picayune, as described in said agreement, as well as that certain other agreement, in writing, dated October 30, 1951, between the same parties, concerning the construction and maintenance of a sewer pipe upon certain property of said Railroad Company at said Picayune, as described in said agreement, is hereby ratified, affirmed and approved by the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of said City of Picayune.

APPOINTMENT OF OFFICERS & TRUSTEES

It being known that this is the usual time for electing City officers and trustees, the Mayor asked for nominations for Tax Assessor, whereupon Mr. E. W. Hollingsworth was nominated and unanimously elected.

The Mayor then advised that the term of Mrs. Trinity Williams as School Trustee expired January 1, 1952, and asked for nominations, whereupon Mrs. J. P. Bilbo was nominated and

was elected unanimously to serve as Trustee of Picayune Municipal Separate School District from January 1, 19~~55~~⁵⁶ until January 1, 1957.

The Mayor stated that the term of H. L. Carr, Trustee of Picayune Municipal Hospital expired January 1, 1952; whereupon Mr. H. L. Carr was nominated and re-elected by acclamation to serve in said capacity from January 1952 until January 1957.

Mayor McDonald then stated that the term of Mrs. Christine Cooper, as Library Trustee, expired with this meeting; whereupon she was nominated and re-elected by acclamation to serve in said capacity from January 1952 until January 1957.

Mr. O. N. Stevenson, stating that it was the usual custom for the Mayor and Board of Aldermen to rotate the office of Street Commissioner, tendered his resignation and nominated Mr. A. A. Foster to serve in said capacity for the year 1952. Mr. Foster was unanimously elected.

CONTRACTOR NOTIFIED ABOUT WATER PLUGS

Upon motion made and seconded, it is hereby ordered that A. J. Read, City Clerk, notify the Viking Construction Company to keep water in the pipe lines and fire hydrants as same are installed throughout the City, and that in the event it becomes necessary to cut off water in any particular section, said contractor is hereby requested to notify the City Fire Department accordingly.

ORDINANCE 209

AN ORDINANCE ADOPTING CHAPTER 131, LAWS OF 1944, AS AMENDED BY CHAPTERS 453 AND 462, LAWS OF 1948, LEVYING A PRIVILEGE TAX UPON COIN OPERATED MUSICAL BOXES, GAME MACHINES AND VENDING MACHINES

SECTION 1. BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the City of Picayune, Pearl River County, Mississippi, that Chapter 131, Laws of 1944, as amended by Chapters 453 and 462, Laws of 1948, is hereby adopted by the City of Picayune as though written at full herein, so as to provide for the collection of privilege tax upon coin operated musical boxes, game machines and vending machines.

SECTION II. That the rate of tax to be levied by the City of Picayune upon said coin operated musical boxes, game machines and vending machines shall be one-half of the tax to be charged by the State of Mississippi, as provided in said Chapter 131, Laws of 1944, as amended by Chapters 453 and 462, Laws of 1948.

ORDINANCE 210

AN ORDINANCE PROHIBITING THE BURNING OF AUTOMOBILES, TAR, FEATHERS, RUBBER AND OTHER SUBSTANCES CREATING OFFENSIVE ODORS AND CREATING EXCESSIVE SOOT AND SMOKE

BE IT ORDAINED By the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the City of Picayune, Mississippi:

SECTION 1. That it shall be unlawful within the corporate limits of the City of Picayune, Mississippi, for any person, persons, corporation or association to burn or cause to be burned, or procure to be burned, any automobile, or other article containing tar, feathers, rubber or any other substance which when burned creates offensive odors and excessive soot and smoke, within 600 feet of the residence of any person in said City.

SECTION. 2. Any person, persons, corporation or association violating Section 1 of this Ordinance, upon conviction thereof, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and shall be fined not less

than \$10.00 nor more than \$100.00 or by imprisonment not to exceed 30 days or by both fine and imprisonment.

SECTION 3. Any act prohibited by Section 1 above is deemed by this body to be a public nuisance and subject to correction as such.

SECTION 4. And for the good causes shown and for the preservation of good order and peace and safety this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

This ordinance was reduced to writing, considered by the Mayor and Board of Aldermen, Section by Section and each member of the Board voted YEA or NAY on each Section of the ordinance and then on the ordinance as a whole, which resulted as follows:

Those voting YEA: O. N. Stevenson, H. R. McIntosh, R. Fred Moore, G. H. Williams, and A. A. Foster.

Those voting NAY: None.

Adopted and passed on at this a regular meeting of the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the City of Picayune on this the 4th day of March, 1952.

PENALTY REMOVED FROM GAS, WATER AND SEWERAGE COLLECTIONS

It being known that Section 4 of the order fixing the charges and penalties on utility service in the City of Picayune provides for a 10% penalty to be added on all delinquent accounts, and it being further known that said 10% penalty has become burdensome to both the consumer and the billing department of the City, upon motion made, seconded and unanimously carried, it is hereby ordered that said 10% penalty be discontinued commencing with the next billing month, which will be the month of March 1952.

It is further ordered that hereafter, when a consumer fails to pay the City utility bill on or before the 15th of the month following rendition of said bill, the Manager of City Utilities shall cause all utility services affected by said delinquent bill, to be cut off on or before the next meter reading date, and said service shall not be again turned on except upon payment in full of the delinquent bill, in addition to the payment of a \$1.00 service charge.

It is further ordered that whenever any consumer is continuously delinquent in the payment of regular monthly utility billing, the Manager of Utilities may require an increase in the deposit to be held by the City to secure payment of bills. The amount of increase when added to consumer's present deposit must be not less than the total of any two months maximum billings of the consumer in question.

Gentlemen:

The above mentioned contract under which we are supplying you with gas provides that the rates to be paid by you for gas during the 5-year period of the contract which commences on July 25, 1952, shall be agreed upon prior to March 25, 1952.

As you know, all costs have risen tremendously in the last few years. The prices which we are paying for gas and all of our other operating costs are far above those that prevailed when the

existing rates in our city gate sales contracts were established, so that these rates are no longer adequate and are not commensurate with our greatly increased cost of service. It is therefore necessary that our overall revenues be increased materially.

We are now designing new rates for all our sales of gas for resale and, in this connection, we intend in the near future to apply to the Federal Power Commission for approval of new rates for those sales over which said Commission has jurisdiction. As soon as possible we will submit to you our proposed new rates for gas to be delivered to you during the next succeeding period of the contract.

We propose that our said contract with you be modified to provide that:

- (1) The next succeeding period of said contract, instead of commencing on July 25, 1952, shall commence on October 1, 1952, or the date which is 120 days after we have submitted our proposed new rates to you, whichever date is the later, and shall end on July 25, 1957.
- (2) Instead of agreeing on new rates prior to March 25, 1952, the new rates for said next succeeding period shall be determined in accordance with the provision of said contract, not less than 90 days prior to the commencement date of said succeeding period as set forth in (1) above.
- (3) The presently existing rates in our contract with you shall continue in effect until the commencement date of the next succeeding period of the contract, as set forth in (1) above; with the understanding, however, that any consent letters between us waiving the minimum contract price for industrial gas shall not be extended beyond their specified termination dates.

WHEREAS, said Mayor and Board of Aldermen further find and adjudicate that all things necessary to exist precedent to a declaration by them of their intention to issue bonds of said School District in the amount and for the purpose aforesaid, do exist, and that this Mayor and Board of Aldermen are authorized by the Constitution and laws of the State of Mississippi, including among others Title 16, Division 10, of the Mississippi Code of 1942, to declare their intention to issue said bonds and to publish notice thereof as provided in Section 7, Chapter 493, of the Laws of 1950,

SECTION 1. SKATING RINK

Now comes Messrs. Frank Asher, A. S. Slatten, Harry E. Milligan, Zeal Stockstill, and Mrs. Birdie Keaton, together with the City Officers, making complaint against the skating rink being operated on Third Street in the City of Picayune, and in a residential section of said City, with complainants emphatically stating that said skating rink was creating a disturbance and a nuisance to those residing nearby, to such an extent that the peace of their homes was being disturbed each night said skating rink was operated, and the Officers explained that there was unlawful parking of automobiles along the streets nearby and that evidence of drinking beer and whisky was predominant by empty beer cans and whisky bottles being discarded along the streets. The Mayor and Board of Aldermen, after a full discussion, and at the recommendation of the City Attorney, upon motion made, seconded and unanimously carried, hereby orders that no further privilege license shall be renewed or granted to Mr. Benton Pigott, the operator thereof, and the City Tax Collector is hereby ordered to refuse to renew said privilege license, or to grant a privilege license to any other person or concern for the operation of a skating rink in a residential area. It is further ordered that a copy of this resolution shall be sent to the said Benton Pigott, operator of the skating rink in question.

TAXI PERMITS

Upon motion made and seconded, it is ordered that Sam Hutto be hereby granted a permit to drive the taxi of James B. Hutto, and Ernest E. Davis be granted a permit to drive the taxi of Elbert E. Mitchell, providing they furnish the necessary bond according to law.

Upon motion made and seconded, it is hereby ordered that Louis Smith be granted a permit to operate a 1949 2-door Mercury sedan as a taxi in said City, provided he does all things necessary to comply with the laws governing the operation of taxis.

BUSINESS PLACES TO KEEP REFUSE IN CONTAINERS

Upon motion made and seconded, it is hereby ordered that all business places in the City of Picayune shall be required to keep refuse in containers, so that the same shall not be scattered on the streets and alleys, and on adjacent property.

AUDITORS OF CITY BOOKS ENGAGED

Upon motion made and seconded, it is hereby ordered that A. A. Harmon & Company, of New Orleans, Louisiana, be hereby employed to audit the City books for the fiscal year beginning October 1, 1950 and ending September 30, 1951; remuneration for their services to be based upon their proposal dated January 24, 1952, and to apply only to the audit of the City books proper and the City Natural Gas Division.

REDEMPTION OF NATURAL GAS BONDS

It being known that a surplus now exists in the Natural Gas Fund of said City, upon motion made and seconded, it is hereby ordered that Twenty Thousand (\$20,000.00) Dollars of said surplus be used to call in and redeem an equal amount of Natural Gas System Refunding Revenue Bonds, Series of 1946, said bonds to be called as of July 1, 1952, in the inverse order of their number, and to be redeemed in addition to the \$6,000.00 maturing July 1, 1952.

A RESOLUTION EMPLOYING RATEONICS CORPORATION TO
MAKE AN AUDIT AND ANALYSIS OF THE GAS AND ELECTRIC
ACCOUNTS OF THE CITY OF PICAYUNE, MISSISSIPPI

The Board took up for consideration the matter of an audit and analysis of the gas and electric utility requirements of the City of Picayune and after due consideration, G. H. Williams introduced the following resolution:

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the City of Picayune do not have readily available all of the information, as well as all of the technical skill and training required to make a judgment of the use of electric and gas utilities by the City of Picayune and Municipal Separate School District, of which the City of Picayune is a fiscal agent, and

WHEREAS, Rateonics Corporation is an organization having many skilled auditors and technicians whose advice is readily available and would be helpful to the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the City of Picayune in making a judgment as to whether the City of Picayune, Mississippi, is getting a proper return from the money it is presently investing in purchasing gas and electric power for the use of the City, and

WHEREAS, in the past they have paid to the gas and electric utilities a sum amounting to approximately \$75,000.00 per year, which amounts have been efficiently audited by the City Auditor, but which amounts have not been audited by a person skilled in the application of rates and technical information necessary to determine the correctness thereof, and

WHEREAS, it is in the best interest of the City of Picayune and the taxpayers thereof that the Mayor and Board of Aldermen be furnished with information concerning these rates and with advice that will better assist them in carrying out their duties with reference to the spending of the taxpayers money for gas and electric power,

NOW, THEREFORE, be it resolved that the Mayor and City Clerk be, and they are hereby authorized, empowered and directed to sign, seal, and execute a contract with Rateonics Corporation substantially as follows, to-wit:

STATE OF MISSISSIPPI

COUNTY OF PEARL RIVER

To be assured of obtaining our utility services at the lowest possible cost, we hereby employ Rateonics Corporation of Dallas, Texas, to make an audit and analysis of our electric and gas costs, to analyze our utility bills, and to advise us of any overcharges during the term of this agreement.

You agree to make an audit and analysis of our utility bills covering a period of fifteen months (three current months' billing and twelve months' past billing).

You agree to furnish us, within four (4) months from date of your employment, a complete and detailed report of the results of your audit and analysis based on the information furnished by us, together with your recommendations.

THE SERVICES TO BE FURNISHED BY YOU ARE AS FOLLOWS:

You are to make a technical audit of our electric and gas bills and furnish

us a report of any overcharges or discrepancies.

Advise us if there are available to us any rate schedules, published, secret or special - or riders, concessions or supplementary provisions, any of which will reduce our utility costs .. and instruct us how to benefit from them.

You agree to render us full consultation and advisory service during any negotiations with utility companies on rates, new schedules or any matters pertaining to our utility costs.

You are to analyze our operations and advise us whenever power factor or load factor characteristics may be controlled or regulated by us to bring about a reduction in our utility costs without interfering with our operations.

YOUR GUARANTEE TO US

You agree to advise us, during the period of this agreement, of the following:

- any overcharge in our current utility billing;
- the lowest cost producing rate applicable to our business;
- any incorrect billing methods.

In order to assist you in rendering the above services and enable you to fulfill your guarantee, we agree to:

- submit to you for your analysis, our utility contract and schedules;
- furnish such further utility data and correspondence as you may require;
- forward our utility bills to you each month to be audited;
- submit to you any new proposals regarding our utility rates or our operations;
- notify you of any contemplated or actual operational changes.

You agree that we may have the privilege, without additional cost, of submitting to you three additional months' utility bills each year for a period of four years from date of delivery of our Audit and Analysis Report... and that you will audit and analyze these bills at that time and advise us if variations in our consumption or usage (or the filing of any new or revised rate schedule by our utility companies) will make additional changes advantageous to us.

During the term of this agreement, we also have the privilege of submitting for your analysis, past paid bills for a period not exceeding ten years. You agree to analyze any such bills we submit provided in your opinion the possibility of overcharge of a recoverable nature exists.

There is no charge for this additional service and we need not follow your recommendations unless we so elect.

As full payment for the above services, we agree to pay you the sum of 40% of all refunds recovered from utilities serving the City of Picayune, Mississippi.

This represents our entire agreement, subject to your acceptance.



ORDINANCE NO. 211

AN ORDINANCE REGULATING AND RESTRICTING THE USE OF BUILDINGS, STRUCTURES AND LAND IN THE CITY OF PICAYUNE, MISSISSIPPI, LOCATED WITHIN THE BOUNDARIES OF A CERTAIN AREA DESCRIBED HEREIN TO RESIDENTIAL PURPOSES; SAID HEREIN DESCRIBED AREA TO BE IN ADDITION TO THAT PROVIDED BY CITY ORDINANCE NO. 187

SECTION I. BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the City of Picayune, Mississippi, that the use of buildings, structures, and land located within that section of said City enclosed within the following boundaries be restricted to residential purposes only:

Beginning 650 feet East of the Southwest corner of the Southeast Quarter of the Southeast Quarter of Section 16, Township 6 South, Range 17 West, thence run North 1980 feet to the Southeast corner of Lot 11, Block C of Mrs. J. A. Harris Addition to Picayune, thence run West 1320 feet, thence run South 1980 feet, thence run East 1320 feet to the place of beginning, being a part of the SW $\frac{1}{4}$ of SW $\frac{1}{4}$ and NW $\frac{1}{4}$ of SW $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 15, Township 6 South, Range 17 West, also a part of the NE $\frac{1}{4}$ of SE $\frac{1}{4}$ and SE $\frac{1}{4}$ of SE $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 16, Township 6 South, Range 17 West.

SECTION II. That no buildings, structures, or land within the above described area, except those buildings and lands now used for other than residential purposes, shall hereafter be constructed or used for any purpose other than residential as "Residential Purposes are hereinafter defined.

SECTION III. "Residential purposes" as the term is used in this Ordinance shall mean the usual use of property as a residence but shall not prohibit the occupants of said premises from operating a boarding house or apartment house thereon, and the use of said premises for the carrying on of educational activities or activities of the medical profession where such medical activities are limited to the operation of clinics.

SECTION IV. That no buildings or structures of any kind shall be constructed within the boundaries of the area above described without first having a Permit issued therefor by the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the City of Picayune and that all applications for Permits shall be in writing stating the purpose for which said building and structure is to be used and no permit shall be granted until said application shall have been on file with the Mayor and Board of Aldermen for at least one week.

SECTION V. Any violation of the provisions of this Ordinance shall be a misdemeanor, and shall be punishable by a fine not to exceed \$100.00 and each day's violation of the provisions of this Ordinance shall be considered a separate offense and punishable as such.

SECTION VI. The public necessity requiring it, this Ordinance shall be in full force and

effect from and after its passage.

The foregoing Ordinance, having first been reduced to writing, was read, considered and adopted, section by section and then as a whole. The vote on its final passage being as follows:

ORDINANCE NO. 212

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE REGISTRATION OF BICYCLES IN THE CITY OF PICAYUNE AND PROVIDING PENALTY FOR THE VIOLATION THEREOF

SECTION I. It shall be unlawful for any person to operate or use a bicycle propelled wholly or in part by muscular power upon any of the street, alleys or public highway of the City of Picayune, without first obtaining from the Police Department a license therefor.

SECTION II. The Police Department is hereby authorized and directed to issue upon written application, bicycle licenses which shall be effective for each calendar year, commencing on the first day of January of each said calendar years and ending on the thirty-first day of December of said calendar year. Said licenses when issued shall entitle the licensee to operate such bicycle for which said license has been issued, upon all the streets, alleys and public highways, exclusive of the sidewalks thereof, in the City of Picayune.

SECTION III. The City of Picayune shall provide each year metallic license plates and seals, together with registration cards and isinglass holders therefor, said metallic license plates and registration cards having numbers stamped thereon in numerical order, beginning with Number 1, and indicating the year for which the same are issued, and the letters PICAYUNE stamped thereon; such metallic license plates shall be suitable for attachment upon the frames of bicycles, and it shall be the duty of the Police Department to attach one such metallic license plate to the frame of each bicycle and to issue a corresponding registration card to the licensee upon the payment of the license fee herein provided for. Such metallic license plate shall remain attached during the existence of such license. The Police Department shall also keep a record of the date of issue of each license, to whom issued, and the number thereof.

SECTION IV. All persons engaged in the business of buying second-hand bicycles are hereby required to make daily report to the Police Department, giving a list of all sales made by such dealers which list shall include the name and address of each person to whom sold, the kind of bicycle sold, together with a description and frame number thereof, and the number of the metallic license plate attached thereto, if any.

SECTION V. It shall be the duty of every person who sells or transfers ownership of any bicycle, to report such sale or transfer by returning to the Police Department the registration card issued to such person as licensee thereof, together with the name and address of the person to whom said bicycle was sold or transferred, and such report shall be made within five days of the date of said sale or transfer. It shall be the duty of the purchaser or transferee of such bicycle to apply for a transfer or registration therefor within five days of said sale or transfer.

SECTION VI. It shall be unlawful for any person to willfully or maliciously remove, destroy, mutilate or alter the number of any bicycle frame licensed pursuant to this ordinance. It shall also be unlawful for any person to remove, destroy, mutilate or alter any license plate, seal or registration card during the time in which such license plate, seal or registration card during the time in which such license plate, seal or registration card is operative. Provided, however, that nothing in this ordinance shall prohibit the Police Department from stamping numbers on the frames of bicycles on which no serial number can be found, or on which said number is illegible or insufficient for identification purposes.

SECTION VII. The annual license fee to be paid for each bicycle shall be 50¢, and shall be paid in advance; and pursuant to Section V of this ordinance, such license may be transferred, and a fee of 50¢ shall be paid for the registration of such transfer. All license fees collected under this ordinance shall be paid unto the General Fund of the City of Picayune

SECTION VIII. Every person, firm or corporation violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction shall be punishable by a fine of not more than five hundred (\$500.00) Dollars, or by imprisonment in the City Jail for a period of not more than six (6) months, or by both such fine and imprisonment. In addition to the penalty hereinabove set forth, the Police Department of the City of Picayune or any of the members thereof, may impound and retain possession of any bicycle operated in violation of any of the provisions of this ordinance, and retain possession of the same until the license provided for herein is obtained by the owner of said bicycle.

SECTION IX. This ordinance shall be published in full at least once at least three days prior to its final adoption in the Picayune Item, the official newspaper of the City of Picayune.

The foregoing ordinance was introduced at a regular meeting of the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the City of Picayune, held on the 5th day of August, 1952, was reduced to writing, considered by the Mayor and Board of Aldermen, Section by Section, and each member of the Board voted YEA or NAY on each Section of the ordinance and then on the ordinance as a whole, which resulted as follows:

RESOLUTION FIXING LEVIES FOR 1952 TAXES

WHEREAS, Section 23 of Chapter 492 of "Mississippi Laws of 1950" provides that the governing authorities of each municipality in the State of Mississippi shall levy the municipal ad valorem taxes for each taxable year, said levy or levies to be expressed in mills or decimal fractions of a mill, and such levy or levies shall determine the ad valorem taxes to be collected upon each dollar of valuation upon the assessment rolls of the municipality; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the City of Picayune, Pearl River County, Mississippi, have completed the revision and equalization of the assessment of taxes for the taxable year 1952, and have approved the assessment rolls of said City by a resolution duly adopted at a public meeting held on this the 12th day of September, 1952, which said resolution is contained in these minutes on pages 222-223; and

WHEREAS, the assessment of public utilities has been approximated at \$350,000; and

WHEREAS, the Budget of Expenditures of Picayune Municipal Separate School District for the current fiscal year was filed on July 1, 1952 by the Board of Trustees of said School District and approved by said Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the City of Picayune, which said Budget of Expenditures is recorded in these minutes on pages 208/9; and

WHEREAS, the current fiscal budget of Picayune Municipal Hospital was filed on September 12, 1952, by the Trustees of said Hospital, and recorded in these minutes on page 221; and

WHEREAS, the Budget of Expenditures of the City of Picayune for the fiscal year beginning October 1, 1952 and ending September 30, 1953, was adopted by said Mayor and Board of Aldermen on September 12, 1952 and recorded in these minutes on page 222;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED AND ADJUDGED by the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the City of Picayune, Pearl River County, Mississippi, that in accordance with the Budgets of Expenditures and the assessment of taxable property within the City of Picayune, the following ad valorem tax rates or levies be and the same are hereby imposed and levied for the fiscal year 1952-3 upon the assessed value of all taxable property in the City of Picayune, Pearl River County, Mississippi, as the property is now assessed and listed or as may hereafter be assessed and listed upon the assessment rolls of said City as of January 1, 1952, except the exempt value of homes to the extent exempt by the Homestead Exemption Act for Municipal Separate School Districts, the said rates expressed in mills or a decimal fraction of a mill, being levied and imposed upon each dollar of assessed valuation appearing upon the assessment rolls of said City and Municipal Separate School District, according to the provisions of Section 23, Chapter 492, of "Mississippi Laws of 1950", and said rates or levies are for the following funds or purposes:

1. For the purpose of raising a fund for general school maintenance purposes, as fixed and limited by House Bill 77 of "Mississippi Laws of 1950" - - - - - 20 mills on the dollar to be levied upon property both within the City limits and upon Picayune Municipal Separate School District property outside the City limits. This levy of 20 mills includes the regular 15 mill school maintenance levy as limited by House Bill 77 of "Mississippi Laws of 1950", together with an extra 5 mill school maintenance levy as authorized by a petition filed by a majority of the qualified electors of the Picayune Municipal Separate School District, requesting the Mayor and Board of Aldermen to make said additional levy for the purpose of supplementing salaries of teachers, buying furniture, repairing school buildings, and other incidental expenses of the school district.

2. For the purpose of raising a fund for the retirement of bonds issued for construction of Picayune Memorial High School and George Washington Carver Colored High School, and for the retirement of Loan Warrants or Notes issued for the purpose of renovating Picayune Junior High School; and for the purpose of paying interest due thereon - - - - - 4 mills on the dollar to be levied upon property both within the City limits and upon Picayune Municipal Separate School District property outside the City Limits.

3. For the purpose of raising a fund for general city expense, as fixed and limited by House Bill 77 of "Mississippi Laws of 1950" - - - 13 mills on the dollar, to be levied only against property within the City limits. This levy of 13 mills is for the following municipal purposes: Supervision and Finance, Protection of Life and Property, Care and Maintenance of Public Property, Maintenance of Streets and Structures, and Public Health and Welfare.

4. For the purpose of raising a fund to retire Hospital Bonds, - - - - - 1 mill on the dollar, to be levied only against property within the City Limits.

5. For the purpose of raising a fund for general hospital maintenance and operation - - - - - 1 mill on the dollar, to be levied only against property within the City limits. This levy of 1 mill is to supplement the regular receipts from patients and from Pearl River County for Picayune Municipal Hospital, known as Martin's Sanatorium.

BE IT FURTHER ORDERED AND ADJUDGED that said ad valorem tax levies shall apply to the various funds as follows:

INSIDE THE CITY LIMITS:

School Fund - - - - -	20 mills
Bond and Interest Fund - - - - -	5 mills
General Fund - - - - -	13 mills
Hospital Fund - - - - -	1 mill
TOTAL LEVY INSIDE CITY LIMITS - - - - -	39 mills

OUTSIDE THE CITY LIMITS:

School Fund - - - - -	20 mills
Bond and Interest Fund - - - - -	4 mills
TOTAL LEVY OUTSIDE CITY LIMITS - - - - -	24 mills

BE IT FURTHER ORDERED AND ADJUDGED that 15 mills of the 20 mills levied for school maintenance shall be that part exempt on all homesteads for which application has been properly filed and approved by this Mayor and Board of Aldermen, it being known that 15 mills is the maximum amount of school maintenance levy that can be exempt as provided by House Bill 77, Chapter 496, of the "Mississippi Laws of 1950."

A RESOLUTION TRANSFERRING THE RECEIPT AND DISBURSEMENT
OF HOSPITAL FUNDS TO THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF MARTIN'S
SANATORIUM

WHEREAS, the City of Picayune is owner of Martin's Sanatorium, which said hospital is operated under the direction of a Board of Trustees appointed by the Mayor and Board of Aldermen as provided by law, and

WHEREAS, the receipt and disbursement of funds on the operation of said Martin's Sanatorium has heretofore been handled by requisitions issued by the Board of Trustees, with deposits and warrants being made through the office of the City Clerk, and

WHEREAS, upon recommendation of the City Auditors, it is deemed advantageous and to the best interest of all concerned that Martin's Sanatorium shall so arrange their accounting system to conform to the uniform accounting system for hospitals in the State of Mississippi, and

WHEREAS, the law provides that the Board of Trustees of any municipal hospital is empowered with the authority to direct the handling of funds and keeping of accounts thereof, NOW THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED, by the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the City of Picayune, Pearl River County, Mississippi, that all hospital funds be and the same are hereby transferred to the Trustees of Martin's Sanatorium for their management, collection and disbursement, as authorized under Chapter 518 of the Mississippi Laws of 1950, and that said Board of Trustees shall designate either the Bank of Picayune or the First National Bank of Picayune as depository to receive and keep on deposit all such hospital monies, which said monies shall be covered by securities furnished by said depository in the same manner as other City funds are so secured.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that all such funds shall be expended and paid out upon the allowance of the Board of Trustees of said Hospital by checks or vouchers signed by such person, officer or officers as may be designated by such Board of Trustees, any officer or person who shall be so designated to execute such checks shall furnish to such Board of Trustees a good and sufficient surety bond in such amount as such Board of Trustees deems necessary to protect the City Hospital funds, and to insure the faithful discharge of the duties of such person or officer; the premium of such bond to be paid from the funds available for the support and maintenance of such Hospital.

The foregoing resolution was first reduced to writing, read and considered section by section and adopted at a public meeting of the Mayor and Board of Aldermen held October 7, 1952, the vote on its passage being as follows:

ORDINANCE NO. 213

AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING RATES AND CHARGES FOR THE SERVICES OF THE WATERWORKS, THE SEWER SYSTEM, AND THE COMBINED WATERWORKS AND SEWER SYSTEM OF THE CITY OF PICAYUNE, PEARL RIVER COUNTY, MISS.

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the City of Picayune, Pearl River County, Mississippi, as follows:

SECTION I. That the following rates and charges for the use and services of the waterworks, sewer system, and the combined waterworks and sewer system of the City of Picayune, Pearl River County, Mississippi, are hereby established as follows:

- A. FOR WATER ONLY: For the first 10,000 gallons or less,
 per month - - - - - 2.50
 For the next 10,000 gallons - - - - 25¢ per M gallons
 For the next 10,000 gallons - - - - 20¢ per M gallons
 For the next 10,000 gallons - - - - 15¢ per M gallons
 For the next 10,000 gallons - - - - 10¢ per M gallons
 For all over 50,000 gallons - - - - 5¢ per M gallons

B. FOR SEWER SERVICE ONLY: Where sewer service is used without the use of City water, a flat monthly rate for each building or dwelling, or each living unit in each building or dwelling, as follows:

4" connections - - -	2.50
6" connections - - -	5.00
8" connections - - -	7.50


In cases of hotels, motels, and tourist camps, charges shall be based only on the size and number of connections.

C. FOR COMBINED WATER & SEWER SERVICES: The rates for water as listed in Paragraph A above, plus 50% of the monthly water billing.

SECTION II. Charges for the use and services of the combined system shall be made and collected against each lot, parcel of land or premises to which water is supplied by the City waterworks system and which may have any active sewer connection with the sewer system of the City or which may actively discharge sewage or industrial waste either directly or indirectly into said system or any part thereof.

Charges for sewer services only shall be made and collected against each such lot, parcel of land or premises which shall not in addition receive water from the City. Charges for waterworks services only shall be made and collected against each lot, parcel of land or premises receiving water from the City which shall not be connected with the sewer system of the City and which shall not be required under City ordinance to be so connected.

SECTION III. Bills for the rates and charges herein established shall be made out by the last day of each month and shall be sent out monthly. The bills shall be payable between the first and tenth day of the month following the monthly reading of the water meters. All bills shall be payable at the office of City Clerk or Manager of City Utilities.



SECTION IV. Whenever any lot, parcel of land or premises shall become connected to the combined system, either for water services or sewer services, a deposit of \$5.00 shall be made, such deposit to be held by the City of Picayune to secure payment of any bill for services not paid by the 20th of the month in which it is due. Wherever a customer has previously made a \$5.00 gas deposit with the City for natural gas service, and has established a good paying record of twelve (12) months or longer, this extra \$5.00 deposit for water and sewer services may be waived, at the discretion of the Manager of Utilities, in which event the \$5.00 deposit already made shall apply to securing the payment of either water service or natural gas service.

SECTION V. If any bills for the services of the waterworks or for the services of the combined system shall remain unpaid after fifteen (15) days following the rendition of the bill therefor, the water supply for the lot, parcel of land or premises affected shall be cut off and shall not be again turned on except on payment in full of the delinquent charges therefor, in addition to the payment of a charge of One Dollar (\$1.00)

SECTION VI. The owner of any lot, parcel of land or premises receiving any of the services of the combined water and sewer system of the City, the occupant of such premises and the user of the services shall be jointly and severally liable for the payment for the services to such lot, parcel of land or premises and all services are rendered to the premises by the City of Picayune only on the condition that such owner, occupant and user shall be jointly and severally liable therefor to the City of Picayune.

SECTION VII. Whenever any lot, parcel of land or premises shall, after the effective date of this ordinance, become connected to the combined waterworks and sewer system of the City, the following connection charges shall be imposed:

For running the sewer line from the main to applicant's property line, a charge of \$1.50 per lineal foot with a minimum payment of \$30.00

For running the water line from the main to applicant's property line, a charge of 20¢ per lineal foot with a minimum payment of \$5.00

SECTION VIII. All revenues derived from the operation of the combined waterworks and sewer system shall be set aside as collected and deposited in the Waterworks and Sewer Fund established by Ordinance 202, creating such combined system, and shall be held and disbursed in accordance with said ordinance, and such revenues shall be kept in a bank account separate and distinct from all other funds or bank accounts of the City, and proper records and accounts, separate and apart from all other records and accounts, shall be maintained as provided by the abovementioned ordinance.

SECTION IX. The rates and charges established by this ordinance shall not affect any special contracts for the furnishing of water heretofore made by the City of Picayune and now in force. The Board of Aldermen reserves the right to impose special rates and charges where the rates hereby established are not just or equitable.

SECTION X. All ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.

SECTION XI. The rates established by this ordinance shall go into effect on October 1, 1952.

PERMIT TO PICAYUNE HOUSING AUTHORITY

H. Williams has signed a statement to the effect that he had no objections to the closing of said street, which said statement is in the following words and figures to-wit:

BE IT KNOWN, that I, G. H. Williams, the present owner of Block 83 and the West-Half (W $\frac{1}{2}$) of Block 82, according to the plat of Williams Goodyear Addition to Picayune, am the only abutting owner to that section of the street lying between said Block 83, and the West-Half (W $\frac{1}{2}$) of Block 82, and I hereby waive all notice required as an abutting owner to the action and proceedings of the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the City of Picayune, to pass an Ordinance to close said segment of street, being a segment of "E" Street 300 feet North and South and 70 feet East and West lying between said Block 83 and the West-Half (W $\frac{1}{2}$) of Block 82, and I hereby waive any and all claim for damages as an abutting owner to said street on account of the closing of said street for the purpose of adding the street area to a site for the erection of low-rent residence buildings by the Public Housing Authority of the United States and the Local Housing Authority of the City of Picayune, Mississippi; and I hereby relinquish and convey and quit-claim any and all claims of title or ownership to the said section of "E" Street above described that lies between Block 83 and the West-Half (W $\frac{1}{2}$) of Block 82, unto the Housing Authority of the City of Picayune, Mississippi, to be vested in said Authority perpetually for said use.

ORDINANCE NO. 214

An Ordinance Closing, Vacating, and Annulling a portion of "E" Street that extends North & South between Block 83 and the W $\frac{1}{2}$ of Block 82, in the Williams-Goodyear Addition to the City of Picayune

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the City of Picayune, Mississippi;

SECTION 1: That a portion or link of "E" Street extending North and South and lying exactly between Block 83, and the W $\frac{1}{2}$ of Block 82, according to the Plat of Williams-Goodyear Addition to Picayune, as shown by the plat duly recorded in the Chancery Clerk's Office of Pearl River County, be, and is hereby vacated, annulled and closed as a public street. The said Street is more particularly described as follows:

That portion of "E" Street as shown in the Plat of Williams-Goodyear Addition, lying between Block 83, for the Western boundary of said street, and the West line of Block 82, according to said plat, a distance of 300 feet, and being 70 feet East and West, and connecting by 70 feet wide with Sixth Street on the North end, and connecting with Seventh Street on the South end, being 70 feet, making a segment of said Street herein closed, 70 feet East and West by 300 feet North and South, and lying exactly between Block 83, and Block 82, in the said Williams-Goodyear Plat.

It is the intention and purpose of the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the City of Picayune, to close said Street to become a part of the site for the erection of low-rent residence buildings by the Public Housing Authority of the United States, and the Housing Authority of the City of Picayune, Mississippi, a duly and legally constituted body politic under the laws of the State of Mississippi, and of the Act of Congress of the United States; and the Mayor and Board of Aldermen, after hearing the evidence as to the use of the said segment of Street as described, hereby finds and adjudicates that the closing of said Street is for public good and promotes the best interest of the citizens of Picayune and municipality of Picayune.

SECTION 2. It is therefore, ORDERED and ADJUDGED by the Mayor and Board of Aldermen, that the segment of "E" Street as above described, is hereby closed, vacated and annulled, with the

SECTION 3. It is further determined and adjudicated that no other land owners have any land abutting on the segment of #E# Street herein closed; and further adjudicated that no other person will be damaged by the closing and vacating of said portion of "E" Street.

SECTION 4. It is further determined and adjudicated by the Board that G.H. Williams, the owner of the segment of "E" Street herein described, has filed in writing, a waiver of any and all claims for damage as an abutting owner to the said segment of "E" Street; and further adjudicates and determines that he has relinquished, conveyed and quit-claimed the said Section or segment of "E" Street above described, lying between Block 83 and the W $\frac{1}{2}$ of Block 82, unto the Housing Authority of the City of Picayune, Mississippi, and to be vested in said Authority perpetually for use as a site for Low-Rent Housing Project; said waiver and conveyance duly signed, acknowledged and proven as will appear from the original of said instrument made a part of this Ordinance and incorporated in the Minutes of this Board.


