Public Notice is hereby given that the Mayor and Council of the City of Picayune, Pearl River County, Mississippi, will receive sealed bids up to 7:30 P.M. Tuesday, February 7, 1956, from suppliers and/or dealers to furnish the City with supplies as listed below for the calendar year 1956:

1. Prices on washed gravel, washed pea gravel, washed sand and pit run gravel, all to be delivered as and when needed by the City either in trucks to job sites or delivered in freight cars to Picayune, Mississippi. Local bidders are requested to show prices at the pit separate from prices delivered to the job sites.
2. For usual City supplies such as tile, shovels, picks and general hardware; also cement, mortar mix, bricks and other miscellaneous supplies for public works maintenance.
3. For pipe, both steel and cast iron, pipe fittings, valves, curb stops, corporation cocks and other miscellaneous supplies common to the maintenance of a municipal water works and municipal natural gas distribution system.
4. For ordinary office supplies such as letterheads, envelopes, paperclips, adding machine paper and other supplies common to the office of the City Clerk.

5. To furnish the City with gasoline to be delivered in bulk quantities in the City's 550 gallon underground storage tank at the City Hall; also kerosene, motor oil, and grease in bulk or case lots to be delivered to the City Barn or job site as and when needed by the City.

6. To furnish the City with asphalt, both prime and heavy grades commonly used in the construction of surface treatment blacktop streets; also plant mix asphalt equal in quality to Inslag Colmix, to be delivered in carload lots or via motor transport as and when needed by the City.



Note No. 2 for \$2,500.00 payable May 1, 1957

Note No. 3 for \$2,500.00 payable May 1, 1958

Note No. 4 for \$2,500.00 payable May 1, 1958

Note No. 5 for \$2,500.00 payable May 1, 1959

Note No. 6 for \$2,500.00 payable May 1, 1959

and by which resolution it is declared that no funds are available from any other source with which to purchase the said real property, and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council of the City of Picayune have maturely considered said resolution and do now find and adjudicate that all facts set forth therein are true and correct as therein stated,

NOW, THEREFORE, Be It Resolved that the Mayor and Council of the City of Picayune Pearl River County, Mississippi, do hereby declare their intention and purpose at a meeting to be held on March 13, 1956, at 7:30 P. M., to authorize said loan to Picayune Separate School District and to issue the negotiable notes of said school district to evidence said loan, the proceeds of said loan to be used for the purpose of purchasing land and improvements in the City of Picayune described as Lots 7 and 8 in Block 55 of the Williams-Goodyear Addition to the City of Picayune, Pearl River County, Mississippi, as per official plat of said addition now on file in the office of the Chancery Clerk of Pearl River County, Mississippi, and for no other purpose, the said notes to be dated May 1, 1956, to be in the total sum of Fifteen (\$15,000.00) Thousand Dollars, and to be in denominations of Two Thousand Five Hundred (\$2,500.00) Dollars each, and numbered 1 to 6, both inclusive, said notes to bear interest from date at the rate of not to exceed four (4%) per centum per annum payable annually, said notes to mature at the rate of Five Thousand (\$5,000.00) Dollars annually, over a period of three (3) years.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this resolution shall be published in a legal newspaper having general circulation in said Picayune Municipal Separate School District in accordance with the provisions of Section 3, Chapter 30, of the General Laws of the State of Mississippi for the Extraordinary Session of 1953 and other applicable statutes, and that if twenty (20%) per cent or more of the qualified electors of the said school district shall file a petition requesting an election in accordance with law on the question of incurring said indebtedness, then an election shall be called on such question as provided by law; but that if such petition shall not be presented within the time as aforesaid, then the said notes shall be issued as herein provided.

ACTION TAKEN ON PURCHASE OF ELECTRIC TYPEWRITER AND ASPHALT MIX PLANT

In accordance with motion passed by the Mayor and Council at their recessed meeting of February 21, 1956, whereby action on the purchase of an asphalt mix plant and an electric typewriter was deferred until this date, upon motion of J. B. Calvin, seconded by P. W. Polk, and unanimously carried, it is ordered that the bid of Bogalusa Business Machines Company to furnish the City with two new electric typewriters, 1955 model, for the total sum of \$545.00 be accepted, with the understanding that said Bogalusa Business Machines Company will accept as trade-in an older Underwood typewriter than the one originally specified, with a resulting net price to the City for the two new electric typewriters of \$580.00; and it is further ordered that all bids on asphalt plant be rejected.

MAYOR AND COUNCIL RECEIVE OBJECTIONS OF NO&NE RAILROAD TO PROPOSED RAILROAD CROSSING AT GOODYEAR BOULEVARD

The New Orleans and Northeastern Railroad Company, through counsel, submitted to the Mayor and Council objections to City Ordinance No. 247, being the ordinance concerning the proposed railroad crossing at Goodyear Boulevard, which said objections were fully received and filed.

ORDER WITH REFERENCE TO OBJECTIONS BY THE NEW ORLEANS AND  
NORTHEASTERN RAILROAD COMPANY TO ORDINANCE NO. 247 OF THE  
CITY OF PICAYUNE

There came on for hearing before the Mayor and Council of the City of Picayune the matter of the objections filed in writing by the New Orleans and Northeastern Railroad to Ordinance Number 247 of the City of Picayune and the Mayor and Council having heard and considered same, finds, adjudicates and orders as follows, to-wit:

I

That there is a need for a crossing across the right of way of the New Orleans and Northeastern Railroad at the eastern end of an extension of Third Avenue as laid out through the Williams-Goodyear Addition and through the Picayune Realty and Improvement Company Addition in the City of Picayune, Pearl River County, Mississippi, and that no election has been made by the Mayor and Council of the City of Picayune not to press said Third Avenue crossing, but that said crossing will be constructed in the very near future. That a proposed crossing at Third Avenue in said City will not take care of the traffic need and the traffic situation in the City of Picayune, but that it is necessary that there be a crossing at Third Avenue and at Goodyear Boulevard.

II

That a railroad crossing has heretofore been constructed across the New Orleans and Northeastern Railroad Company right of way at the Eastern end of Bruce Street and joining Bruce Street with United States-Mississippi Highway No. 11, also known as South Harvey Street, but there was never any agreement made by the City of Picayune through its governing authorities that no other crossing would be put in if same was needed. That it was not in contemplation of the Mayor and Council of the City of Picayune that no other crossing would be constructed prior to a crossing at the Third Avenue location, but that it was always in contemplation of the authorities of the City of Picayune that any crossings needed would be demanded and condemned if necessary. That the proposed crossing contemplated under Ordinance No. 247 of the City of Picayune is situated at the end of a main artery of traffic of the said City of Picayune and will join the same, being Goodyear Boulevard, to the main street in said City situated on the East side of the track, thereby relieving a congested traffic situation and making it possible for Mississippi Highway No. 43 to cross directly across to Highway No. 11 and thus avoid a congested situation within the business section of the City of Picayune by reason of forcing all highway traffic to be routed around through a circuitous route within the said city. That the proposed railroad crossing as contemplated under Ordinance No. 247 does not interfere with any of the facilities of the railroad now in use to any appreciable extent. That contrary to the objection filed by the New Orleans and Northeastern Railroad, there are no industrial tracks in use within the area proposed to be crossed, and that the industrial tracks are situated south of the present crossing. That the proposed railroad crossing is necessary and is for the public convenience and necessity of the general public in the City of Picayune, as well as surrounding territory.

III

That the City of Picayune does not have sufficient crossings over the railroad right of way of the New Orleans and Northeastern Railroad south of the Hobolochitto River within said City, the great majority of the population of the said City living within said area and being forced to converge upon three railroad crossings, when there is need for several more. That traffic stays bottlenecked in the area between Fifth Avenue and Canal Street, and that a large part of the congestion is caused by the fact that the main travel street known and designated as Goodyear Boulevard dead ends at the railroad property, forcing the traffic to turn to the north and to the south and to go into Fifth Avenue and Canal Street and to join the heavy traffic on those two streets at the railroad crossings.

That a crossing is needed at Third Avenue to take care of that portion of the western and eastern sides of the City of Picayune situated north of Fifth Avenue, but that said crossing will not alleviate appreciably the condition now existing on Goodyear Boulevard.

## IV

That the Police Department and Fire Department and the only hospital in the City of Picayune and most of the industrial plants in the City of Picayune are located in the general direction of the western end of Goodyear Boulevard, requiring all traffic to leave this route and to take a circuitous route in either a northern or southerly direction to converge upon the existing railroad crossings and to jam up traffic in such a manner as to leave the City in a dangerous position with reference to the traffic of ambulances, policemen, and fire fighting equipment. That for these and other reasons the said Ordinance No. 247 correctly states that it is for the immediate and temporary preservation of the public peace, health and safety, the traffic situation at Picayune having increased alarmingly over the period of the past several months.

## V

That an easterly extension of Goodyear Boulevard would necessarily extend this street over and across the right of way of the New Orleans and Northeastern Railroad.

## VI

That Goodyear Boulevard is an old and established street in the City of Picayune and has been gained by usage as well as the filing of the official plat in the office of the Chancery Clerk of Pearl River County, Mississippi, in accordance with all applicable statutes of the City of Picayune. That an extension of Goodyear Boulevard across the property of the New Orleans and Northeastern Railroad will not interfere with the operation of the depot and other facilities around the depot in the City of Picayune and will not interfere with the commerce in the area, the only damage being done to the depot being the taking off of a useless and unused open end of a loading platform.

## VII

That the Constitution and Laws of the State of Mississippi grant to the City of Picayune the right to take and to use property for the public use, including streets and other public ways and that no right of the New Orleans and Northeastern Railroad Company or any other railroad company are superior to the rights of the general public within the City of Picayune, insofar as traffic within said City is concerned.

## VIII

That there is no merit in the eighth contention of the New Orleans and Northeastern Railroad and that the proposed extension of Goodyear Boulevard will not seriously affect commerce on the New Orleans and Northeastern Railroad nor will it seriously affect the use and operation of the depot, passing tracks, loading tracks, and freight yard of the said railroad.

## IX

That the Ordinance No. 247 is constitutional.

## X

That Ordinance No. 247 is not in violation of any of the provisions of the Constitution of the United States or any amendments thereto, and that its enforcement would not deny the said railroad company of due process of law.

## XI

That Ordinance No. 247 violates no Articles or Sections of the Constitution of the United States and does not interfere with interstate commerce.

## XII

Generally that the objections of the New Orleans and Northeastern Railroad to the said Ordinance 247 as filed in writing before the Mayor and Council of the City of Picayune are not well taken and same are hereby denied and rejected by the Mayor and Council of the City of Picayune.

ORDER DECLARING NECESSITY FOR TAKING PROPERTY FOR THE  
 EXTENSION OF GOODYEAR BOULEVARD ACROSS THE NEW ORLEANS  
 AND NORTHEASTERN RAILROAD PROPERTY TO SOUTH HARVEY  
 AVENUE

The question of the necessity for the taking for public use of the property hereinafter described having been duly considered, and the Mayor and Council of the City of Picayune, Mississippi, being of the opinion that it is for the public convenience and necessity and that it is necessary to take for public use the following described property, it is hereby ordered that the property of the New Orleans and Northeastern Railroad Company more particularly described as:

Commencing at the Southwest corner of Block B in the Original Plat of the Town, now City, of Picayune, Pearl River County, Mississippi, as per official plat now on file in the office of the Chancery Clerk of Pearl River County, Mississippi, thence run North 81 degrees 43 minutes West 50.2 feet to the point of beginning the description of the land herein condemned, which is the point where the center line of the proposed street extension crosses the East right of way line of the New Orleans and Northeastern Railroad, thence run North 12 degrees 30 minutes East, 35.92 feet, thence run North 64 degrees 30 minutes West 328.56 feet to the Western boundary of the right of way of the New Orleans and Northeastern Railroad where same strikes Main Street or West Railroad Steeet, thence run South 13 degrees 2 minutes West along said right of way line and said street line 71.70 feet, thence run South 64 degrees 30 minutes East 329.24 feet to the Eastern line of the right of way of the said railroad where same strikes South Harvey Avenue, also known and designated as U. S. Highway No. 11, thence run North 12 degrees 30 minutes East 35.92 feet to the point of beginning, being a parcel of land crossing the New Orleans and Northeastern Railroad right of way and containing approximately 0.529 acres,

## ORDINANCE NO. 248

ORDINANCE OF THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PICAYUNE, MISSISSIPPI,  
 AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF NEGOTIABLE NOTES OF THE PICAYUNE MUNICIPAL  
 SEPARATE SCHOOL DISTRICT IN PEARL RIVER COUNTY, MISSISSIPPI, IN THE SUM  
 OF FIFTEEN THOUSAND DOLLARS FOR THE PURPOSE OF PURCHASING LAND FOR  
 SCHOOL PURPOSES

WHEREAS, on February 20, 1956, there was duly filed with the Mayor and Council of the City of Picayune, Pearl River County, Mississippi, a duly certified copy of a resolution of the Board of Trustees of the Picayune Municipal Separate School District in Pearl River County, Mississippi, duly passed and adopted by said Board of Trustees on February 20, 1956, declaring the necessity for said school district to borrow the sum of Fifteen Thousand (\$15,000.00) Dollars for the purpose of purchasing land and improvements in the City of Picayune, for school purposes and for no other purposes, which said resolution is now on file with the City Clerk of the City of Picayune, and

WHEREAS, at a lawfully assembled meeting of said Mayor and Council held on Tuesday, February 21, 1956, said meeting being recessed from the regular meeting, said Mayor and Council of said City did, by virtue of the authority vested in, conferred upon said Mayor and Council by the Constitution and statutes of the State of Mississippi, adopt a resolution declaring the intention of said Mayor and Council at a meeting to be held on March 13, 1956, to authorize the said loan to said Picayune Municipal Separate School District and to issue the negotiable notes of said school district to evidence said loan, the proceeds of said loan to be used for the purpose of purchasing the aforesaid land and improvements and for no other purpose, and

WHEREAS, the aforesaid resolution of said Mayor and Council was duly published in the way and manner provided by law in THE PICAYUNE ITEM, a public and legal newspaper published in Picayune, Pearl River County, Mississippi, and having a general circulation in said school district and in Pearl River County, Mississippi, which said newspaper has been in existence and in publication and generally circulated for more than one year next preceding the date of publication of said resolution as shown by sworn proof of publication now on file with the City Clerk of the City of Picayune, Mississippi, a copy of which resolution with proof of publication thereof being as follows, to-wit:

and,

WHEREAS, after due investigation, the Mayor and Council of said City do hereby find, adjudge and determine as follows, to-wit:

(a) That the Picayune Municipal Separate School District in Pearl River County, Mississippi, is a duly and lawfully created, organized and existing municipal separate school district under the laws of the State of Mississippi, whose territorial limits include all the territory comprising the City of Picayune, Pearl River County, Mississippi, together with additional adjacent territory in Pearl River County, Mississippi, and lying and being wholly within Pearl River County, Mississippi.

(b) That the total assessment of all taxable property in said Picayune Municipal Separate School District according to the last completed assessment roll, being for the year 1955, is the sum of \$8,041,573.00

(c) That the total bonded indebtedness of said Picayune Municipal Separate School District, exclusive of the amount of the proposed negotiable notes herein provided for, is the sum of \$127,000.00.

(d) That the issuance of negotiable notes of the Picayune Municipal Separate School District in the principal sum of Fifteen Thousand (\$15,000.00) Dollars, when added to its present bonded indebtedness will not result in the imposition on any of the property in such district of an indebtedness for school purposes of more than fifteen (15%) per centum of the assessed value of the taxable property within such district according to the last completed assessment for taxation and that the issuance of said notes will not require an annual tax levy in excess of two (2) mills on the dollar for the payment of all notes issued under the provisions of Chapter 30, Laws of the State of Mississippi for the Extraordinary Session of 1953, and all notes issued under the statutes repealed by said Chapter 30 of the Laws of 1953 and any amendments thereto.

(e) That it is necessary for the proper support, maintenance and operation of the public school system within the Picayune Municipal Separate School District that the aforesaid land be purchased.

(f) That there are no other funds available to said district from any source other than such notes with which to purchase said land and improvements.

(g) That no petition has been filed with the said Mayor and Council by the twenty (20%) per centum or more of the qualified electors of said district requesting an election in accordance with law and, in fact, no protest or petition of any kind or character in opposition to the issuance of the said negotiable notes has been filed with or made to said Mayor and Council, and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council of the City of Picayune, Pearl River County, Mississippi, is authorized under the Constitution and Statutes of the State of Mississippi to issue the said negotiable notes of said Picayune Municipal Separate School District for the purposes aforesaid in the total principal sum of Fifteen Thousand (\$15,000.00) Dollars, and

WHEREAS, the said Mayor and Council of said City do find, determine and adjudicate that it is necessary and for the best interest of the Picayune Municipal Separate School District that said negotiable notes in the amount of Fifteen Thousand (\$15,000.00) Dollars for the purposes aforesaid be issued and sold;

NOW, THEREFORE, Be It Ordained by the Mayor and Council of the City of Picayune, Pearl River County, Mississippi, as follows, to-wit:

Section 1. That for the purpose of purchasing land and improvements in the City of Picayune, Pearl River County, Mississippi, known and described as Lots 7 and 8 in Block 55 of the Williams-Goodyear Addition to the City of Picayune, Pearl River County, Mississippi, and for no other purpose, there shall be issued and sold the negotiable notes of the said Picayune Municipal Separate School District in the principal amount of Fifteen Thousand (\$15,000.00) Dollars.

Section 2. 





RESOLUTION APPROVING APPLICATION FOR PRELIMINARY LOAN FOR  
 LOW-RENT PUBLIC HOUSING

The following resolution was introduced by P. W. Polk, read in full and considered:

WHEREAS, it is the policy of this locality to eliminate substandard and other inadequate housing, to prevent the spread of slums and blight, and to realize as soon as feasible the goal of a decent home in a suitable living environment for all of its citizens; and

WHEREAS, under the provisions of the United States Housing Act of 1936, as amended, the Public Housing Administration is authorized to provide financial assistance to local public housing agencies for undertaking and carrying out preliminary planning of low-rent housing projects that will assist in meeting this goal; and

WHEREAS, the Act provides that there shall be local determination of need for low-rent housing to meet needs not being adequately met by private enterprise and that the Public Housing Administration shall not make any contract with a public housing agency for preliminary loans for surveys and planning in respect to any low-rent housing projects unless the governing body of the locality involved has by resolution approved the application of the public housing agency for such preliminary loan; and

WHEREAS, the Housing Authority of City of Picayune, Mississippi, ( herein called the "Local Authority" ) is a public housing agency and is applying to the Public Housing Administration for a preliminary loan to cover the costs of surveys and planning in connection with the development of low-rent housing;

NOW, THEREFORE, be it resolved by the Mayor and Council of the City of Picayune, Mississippi, as follows:

1. There exists in the City of Picayune, Mississippi, a need for such low-rent housing at rents within the means of low-income families;
2. The application of the Local Authority to the Public Housing Administration for a preliminary loan in an amount not to exceed \$35,750.00 for surveys and planning in connection with low-rent housing projects of not to exceed approximately 205 dwelling units is hereby approved.







AN ORDINANCE MAKING IT UNLAWFUL FOR CONNECTIONS TO BE MADE WITH ANY NATURAL GAS SYSTEM, WATER SYSTEM, SEWERAGE SYSTEM, ELECTRICAL TRANSMISSION SYSTEM OR TELEPHONE SYSTEM OTHER THAN BY THE OWNERS OF SUCH SYSTEM OR SYSTEMS AND PROVIDING PENALTIES FOR VIOLATIONS

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PICAYUNE THAT:

Section 1. It shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation to use the products or services from any natural gas system, water system, sewerage system, telephone system, or electrical transmission system, owned by the City of Picayune or any other person, firm or corporation, when the premises or place of use shall have been actually connected with such system by a person, firm or corporation other than the owner of such system, and each day of such use shall constitute a separate violation and offense hereunder.

Section 2. It shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation to connect, or disconnect any meter, or other fitting or appliance from or to, any such natural gas system, water system, sewerage system, electrical transmission system or telephone system as hereinabove described, except for the owner of such system.

Section 3. Any person, firm or corporation who shall violate any of the terms or provisions of this ordinance as hereinabove outlined shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction shall be fined not less than Five (\$5.00) Dollars; nor more than One Hundred (\$100.00) Dollars, for each offense.



NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED AND ADJUDGED by the Mayor and Council of the City of Picayune, Pearl River County, Mississippi, that in accordance with the Budgets of Expenditures and the assessments of taxable property within the City of Picayune and Picayune Municipal Separate School District, the following ad valorem tax rates or levies be and the same are hereby imposed and levied for the fiscal year 1956-57, upon the assessed value of all taxable property in the City of Picayune, and the Picayune Municipal Separate School District, Pearl River County, Mississippi, as the property is now assessed and listed or as may hereafter be assessed and listed upon the assessment rolls of said City and District as of January 1, 1956, except the exempt value of homes to the extent exempt by the Homestead Exemption Act for Municipal Separate School District, the said rates expressed in mills or a decimal fraction of a mill, being levied and imposed upon each dollar of assessed valuation appearing upon the assessment rolls of said City and Municipal Separate School District, according to the provisions of Section 23, Chapter 492, of Mississippi Laws of 1950, and said rates or levies are for the following funds or purposes:

1. For the purpose of raising a fund to support the Minimum School Program as requested by the State Board of Education and as provided by Section 2 of Chapter 261, House Bill No. 46 of the Mississippi Laws of 1954 (6518-02 of the Code of 1942) - - - - - 7.5 mills on the dollar to be levied upon property within the City Limits and upon Picayune Municipal Separate School District property outside the City Limits.
2. For the purpose of raising a fund for general district school maintenance purposes as provided by Section 6 of Chapter 261, House Bill No. 46 of the Mississippi Laws of 1954, (6518-06 of the Code of 1942 ) - - - - - -13.5 mills on the dollar to be levied upon property both within the City limits and upon Picayune Municipal Separate School District property outside the City Limits.
3. For the purpose of raising a fund for the retirement of bonds issued for construction of Picayune Memorial High School, for the retirement of bonds issued for an addition to West Side Grammar School, for the retirement of School District Notes issued to purchase the Fernandez property, for the retirement of School District Notes issued for the purchase of land and for general improvements, for the retirement of School District Notes issued for the purchase of a superintendent's home; and for the purpose of paying interest thereon - - 4.5 mills on the dollar to be levied upon property both within the City Limits and upon Picayune Municipal Separate School District property outside the City limits.
4. For the purpose of raising funds for the retirement of bonds issued for general street improvement purposes and of paying interest due thereon - - - - - 3.5 mills on the dollar to be levied only against property within the City limits.
5. For the purpose of raising a fund for general city expense, as fixed and limited by Chapter 496 of Mississippi Laws of 1950 - - - - - 14 mills on the dollar to be levied only against property within the City limits. This levy of 14 mills is for the following municipal purposes: Supervision and Finance, Protection of Life & Property, Care and Maintenance of Public Property, Maintenance of Streets and Structures, Recreation and Instruction, and Public Health and Sanitation.
6. For the purpose of raising a fund for general hospital maintenance and operation - - - - - 3 mills on the dollar to be levied only against property within the City limits. This levy of 3 mills is to supplement the regular receipts from patients and from Pearl River County for Picayune Municipal Hospital, known as Lucius Olen Crosby Memorial Hospital.

BE IT FURTHER ORDERED AND ADJUDGED that said ad valorem tax levies shall apply to the various funds as follows:
