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ORDINANCE NO. 265

AN ORDINANCE REPEALING ORDINANCE NUMBER 263 ADOPTED BY THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PICAYUNE, COUNTY OF PEARL RIVER, STATE OF MISSISSIPPI, ON THE 7TH DAY OF OCTOBER, 1958, FIXING MAXIMUM SPEED LIMITS OF RAILROAD LOCOMOTIVES AND TRAINS AT TWENTY MILES PER HOUR, AND MAKING A VIOLATION OF THE ORDINANCE A MISDEMEANOR AND PUNISHABLE AS SUCH, AND WHICH ORDINANCE HEREBY REPEALED WAS ADOPTED AT THE REGULAR MEETING OF THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PICAYUNE ON OCTOBER 7, 1958, AND SAME NOW APPEARS IN THE MINUTES OF SAID MEETING.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PICAYUNE, COUNTY OF PEARL RIVER, STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:

SECTION 1. That the aforementioned ordinance bearing number 263 and adopted by the Mayor and Council of the City of Picayune on October 7, 1958, providing that no railroad locomotive or train shall cross any public street of the City of Picayune at a greater speed than twenty miles per hour, and making the violation of the ordinance a misdemeanor and punishable as such, be and the same is hereby repealed.

SECTION 2. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage as provided by law.

The foregoing ordinance having been reduced to writing and read, same was introduced and read and then voted upon, first Section by Section and then upon the ordinance as a whole with the following results:

RESOLUTION OF THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PICAYUNE DECLARING THEIR INTENTION TO ISSUE AND SELL FORTY THOUSAND (\$40,000.00) DOLLARS NEGOTIABLE NOTES OF THE PICAYUNE MUNICIPAL SEPARATE SCHOOL DISTRICT TO FINANCE ALTERATIONS AND ADDITIONS TO BUILDINGS AND TO PURCHASE FIXTURES AND EQUIPMENT FOR BUILDINGS.

WHEREAS, a duly certified copy of resolution of Board of Trustees of Picayune Municipal Separate School District, adopted by said Board on December 19, 1958, and declaring the necessity of a loan to said district in the amount of \$40,000.00 to finance alterations and additions to Bertie Rouse Grammar School and to Carter High School in said District and to finance purchase of fixtures and equipment for buildings of said district, all of said work and purchases being necessary, said loan to be evidenced by negotiable notes of said school district bearing interest from date at a rate not to exceed four per centum per annum payable annually and falling due, at the rate of \$6,000.00 per year for a period of five years, on the principal, said resolution also declaring that no funds are available for said purposes

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from school funds or any other source, the said sum of \$40,000.00 being required in addition to the maximum allotment for said purposes from the State Educational Finance Commission, and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council of the City of Picayune have materially considered said resolution and do now find and adjudicate that all facts set forth therein are true and correct as herein set forth,

NOW, THEREFORE, Be It Resolved that the Mayor and Council of the City of Picayune, Pearl River County, Mississippi, do hereby declare their intention and purpose at the regular February, 1959 meeting of said Mayor and Council to be held on February 3, 1959 at 7:30 P. M. at the City Hall in said City to authorize said loan to the Picayune Municipal Separate School District and to issue the negotiable notes of said school district to evidence said loan, the proceeds of said loan to be used for the purpose of purchasing fixtures and equipment for the buildings of said school district and of making alterations and additions to the Bertie Rouse Grammar School and Carver High School in said district and for no other purposes adjudicating that such loan and the issuance of such negotiable notes will not require an annual tax levy on the property within said district in excess of two mills on the dollar for the repayment thereof nor for the payment of all notes issued under the provisions of Chapter 30 of the Laws of 1953 and of all notes issued under the statutes repealed by said statute, the said notes to be dated March 1, 1959, to be in the total sum of \$40,000.00, and to be in denominations of \$4,000.00 each, and numbered 1 to 10 both inclusive, said notes to bear interest from date at a rate not to exceed Four Per Centum per annum payable annually, and to mature at the rate of \$8,000.00 annually over a period of five years. It is further hereby adjudicated that the issuance of said negotiable notes will not, together with all outstanding notes and bonds of said school district, exceed 10% of the assessed valuation of said district, and that the issuance thereof will not result in the violation or exceeding of any statutory limitation on the issuance of notes and bonds by said District.

Be It Further Resolved that this resolution shall be published in a legal newspaper having a general circulation in said Picayune Municipal Separate School District in accordance with the provisions of Section 3, Chapter 30 of the General Laws of Mississippi for the Extraordinary Session of 1953 (to be published once each week for two consecutive weeks, with the first publication thereof to be made not less than fifteen days prior to said date of February 3, 1959), and that if 20% or more of the qualified electors of said School District shall file a petition requesting an election in accordance with law on the question of incurring said indebtedness, then an election shall be called on such question as provided by law; but that if such petition shall not be presented within the time as aforesaid, then the said notes shall be issued as herein provided.

The above and foregoing resolution was adopted by the Mayor and Council of the City of Picayune, Pearl River County, Mississippi, upon motion of J. M. Howell, seconded by Ocie L. Harris, and unanimously carried, the vote on its passage being as follows:

\$40,000 PICAYUNE MUNICIPAL SEPARATE SCHOOL DISTRICT NOTES

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PICAYUNE, MISSISSIPPI, AS FOLLOWS:

1. That \$40,000.00 of School Improvement Negotiable Notes be offered for sale to the highest bidder therefor on Tuesday, the 3rd day of February, 1959, that said notes shall be sold on sealed bids to be filed with City Clerk of said City at his office in said city at or before 7:30 P. M. on said date, each such bid to be accompanied by certified or cashier's check in the amount of Five Hundred (\$500.00) Dollars to guarantee that the bidder will carry out the contract and purchase said notes if the bid be accepted, and to be forfeited if the bidder does not. The right to reject any or all bids is to be reserved by the Mayor and Council of said City.

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2. That the said Negotiable Notes shall be obligations of the Picayune Municipal Separate School District to be payable as hereinafter set out.

3. That Bidders shall designate in the bids the price to be paid for said notes at rates of interest to be designated also, and, subject to approval of the Mayor and Council, to designate the place of payment of said notes, and the interest thereon.

4. That, as provided by law, the City Clerk is hereby authorized and directed to give notice of the sale of said notes by publication at least 2 successive times in the Picayune Item, a newspaper published in the City of Picayune, Mississippi, the first publication to be at least 10 days prior to date set for receipt of bids, and the notice to be in substantially the following form:

M. on Tuesday, February 3, 1959, for the purchase at not less than par and accrued interest of Negotiable Notes of the Picayune Municipal Separate School District to be dated March 1, 1959, in denominations of \$4,000.00 each, bearing interest at rate to be determined pursuant to sale thereof, payable on March 1st of each year, the principal and interest thereon to be payable at bank to be designated by purchaser, subject to approval of Mayor and Council of said City, said notes to mature on March 1st in each of the years as follows:



WHEREAS, on January 5, 1959, there was duly filed with the Mayor and Council of the City of Picayune, Mississippi, a copy of a resolution of the Board of Trustees of the Picayune Municipal Separate School District, duly certified by the President of said Board of Trustees and adopted by said Board on December 19, 1958, declaring necessity for said school district to borrow the sum of \$40,000.00 to finance alterations and additions to Bertie Rouse Grammar School, to Carver High School, and to finance purchase of fixtures and equipment for the buildings of said district, all of said work and purchases being necessary, and for no other purpose, said resolution being set out herein as follows, to-wit:

M. at the City Hall in said City to authorize said loan to the Picayune Municipal Separate School District and to issue the negotiable notes of said school district to evidence said loan, the proceeds of said loan to be used for the purpose of purchasing fixtures and equipment for the buildings of said school district and of making alterations and additions to the Bertie Rouse Grammar School and Carver High School in said district, and for no other purposes adjudicating that such loan and the issuance of such negotiable notes will not require an annual tax levy on the property within said district in excess of two mills on the dollar for the repayment thereof nor for the payment of all notes issued under the provisions of Chapter 30 of the Laws of 1953 and of all notes issued under the statutes repealed by said statute, the said notes to be dated March 1, 1959, to be in the total sum of \$40,000.00, and to be in denominations of \$4,000.00 each, and numbered 1 to 10 both inclusive, said notes to bear interest from date at a rate not to exceed Four per centum per annum payable annually, and to mature at the rate of \$8,000.00 annually over a period of five years. WHEREAS, after due investigation, the Mayor and Council of said City, at this regular February, 1959 meeting of said Mayor and Council, do find, adjudge and determine as follows, to-wit:

(a) That the Picayune Municipal Separate School District in Pearl River County, Mississippi and in Hancock County, Mississippi, is a duly and lawfully created, organized and existing Municipal Separate School District under the laws of the State of Mississippi, whose territorial limits include all of the territory comprising the City of Picayune, Pearl River County, Mississippi, together with additional adjacent territory lying in Pearl River and Hancock Counties, Mississippi.

(b) That the total assessment of all taxable property in said Picayune Municipal Separate School District according to the last completed assessment rolls, being for the year 1958, is the sum of \$7,904,786, exclusive of motor vehicles.





RESOLUTION DIRECTING THE ISSUANCE OF FORTY THOUSAND (\$40,000.00) DENYER NEGOTIABLE NOTES OF THE PICAYUNE MUNICIPAL SEPARATE SCHOOL DISTRICT TO FINANCE ALTERATIONS AND ADDITIONS TO BUILDINGS AND TO PURCHASE FIXTURES AND EQUIPMENT FOR BUILDINGS OF SAID DISTRICT

WHEREAS, on January 5, 1959, there was duly filed with the Mayor and Council of the City of Picayune, Mississippi, a copy of a resolution of the Board of Trustees of the Picayune Municipal Separate school District, duly certified by the President of said Board of Trustees and adopted by said Board on December 19, 1958, declaring necessity for said school district to borrow the sum of \$40,000.00 to finance alterations and additions to Bertie Rouse Grammar School, to Carver High School, and to finance purchase of fixtures and equipment for the buildings of said district, all of said work and purchases being necessary, and for no other purpose, said resolution being set out herein as follows, to-wit:

"WHEREAS, the crowded condition of the schools of the Picayune Municipal Separate School District make it necessary and require that alterations and additions be made to the Bertie Rouse Grammar School building and the Carver High School building and that fixtures and equipment for the buildings of said district be purchased, requiring an expenditure, to finance same, of Forty Thousand (\$40,000.00) Dollars, in addition to the funds allotted by the State Educational Finance Commission, which said sum is not available in the school funds of said district or from any other source which to make such alterations, additions and purchases as aforesaid, so that it is necessary that said sum be borrowed pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 30 of the Laws of Mississippi of 1953 as amended, the indebtedness to be evidenced by negotiable notes of the Picayune Municipal Separate School District payable at the rate of \$8,000.00 per year, plus interest from date not to exceed 4% per centum per annum, principal and interest payable annually over a period of five years,

That the Mayor and Council of the City of Picayune, Pearl River County, Mississippi, as the governing authority of the said Picayune Municipal Separate School District be, and they are hereby requested to take any and all necessary steps in order to issue negotiable notes of said District in the amounts, on the terms, and for the purposes, hereinabove set out, and that said issue of negotiable notes shall be completed at the earliest practicable date in order that said alterations and additions may be performed and said fixtures and equipment purchased, all in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 30 of the Laws of the State of Mississippi, Extraordinary Session 1953, and other statutes of the State of Mississippi applicable thereto.

M. at the City Hall in said City to authorize said loan to the Picayune Municipal Separate School District and to issue the negotiable notes of said school district to evidence said loan, the proceeds of said loan to be used for the purpose of purchasing fixtures and equipment for the buildings of said school district and of making alterations and additions to the Bertie Rouse Grammar School and Carver High School in said district, and for no other purposes adjudicating that such loan and the issuance of such negotiable notes will not require an annual tax levy on the property within said district in excess of two mills on the dollar for the repayment thereof nor for the payment of all notes issued under the provisions of Chapter 30 of the Laws of 1953 and of all notes issued under the statutes repealed by said statute, the said notes to be dated March 1, 1959, to be in the total sum of \$40,000.00, and to be in denominations of \$4,000.00 each, and numbered 1 to 10 both inclusive, said notes to bear interest from date at a rate not to exceed Four per centum per annum payable annually, and to mature at the rate of \$8,000.00 annually over a period of five years. WHEREAS, after due investigation, the Mayor and Council of said City, at this regular February, 1959 meeting of said Mayor and Council, do find, adjudge and determine as follows, to-wit:

(a) That the Picayune Municipal Separate School District in Pearl River County, Mississippi and in Hancock County, Mississippi, is a duly and lawfully created, organized and existing Municipal Separate School District under the laws of the State of Mississippi, whose territorial limits include all of the territory comprising the City of Picayune, Pearl River County, Mississippi, together with additional adjacent territory lying in Pearl River and Hancock Counties, Mississippi.

(b) That the total assessment of all taxable property in said Picayune Municipal Separate School District according to the last completed assessment rolls, being for the year 1958, is the sum of \$7,904,786.00, exclusive of motor vehicles.

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council of the City of Picayune, Mississippi, have, in accordance with Section 11 of Chapter 588 of the 1958 regular session of the Mississippi Legislature, examined and considered the motor vehicle assessment schedule adopted by the Mississippi State Tax Commission and desire to adopt same, and to cause notice thereof to be given in accordance with the requirements of the aforesaid Chapter 588 of the 1958 regular session of the Mississippi Legislature, and that a time be set for examination of said schedule by any interested taxpayer and that a time also be set for said taxpayers, desiring to do so, to file objections thereto, in writing, as provided by the aforesaid Chapter 588 of the 1958 regular session of the Mississippi Legislature:

IT IS, THEREFORE, HEREBY RESOLVED AND ORDERED, as follows, to-wit:

(1) The assessment schedule for motor vehicles prepared and adopted by the State Tax Commission on the 9th day of April, 1959, by minute record, appearing in Minute Book "S", at pages 403 to 517, both inclusive, of the minutes of the aforesaid State Tax Commission, is hereby adopted as the motor vehicle assessment schedule for the City of Picayune, Mississippi, and the City Clerk of the City of Picayune, Mississippi, is hereby ordered and directed to give notice thereof by newspaper publication in the Picayune Item, a newspaper having general circulation in the City of Picayune, Mississippi.

(2) That such motor vehicle assessment schedule is now ready and open for inspection and examination by any interested taxpayer and that within a period of fifteen days after such publication, to-wit, on the 2nd day of June, 1959, the Mayor and Council of Picayune, Mississippi, shall reconvene in adjourned meeting to hear and take action on any complaint filed, in writing, objecting to and petitioning for a specified reduction of any portion or portions of the assessment schedule affecting the complainant directly, and that the said Mayor and Council of the City of Picayune, Mississippi, shall continue in session from day to day until all such objections and petitions have been heard and action has been taken thereon.

(3) That any person objecting to any portion or portions of the aforesaid motor vehicle assessment schedule affecting him or her directly shall file a written objection and claim for adjustment, in triplicate, with the Mayor and Council of the City of Picayune, Mississippi, on forms designated therefor by the State Tax Commission. The aforesaid objecting motor vehicle owner shall set forth therein, in detail, the grounds for his objection and claim for adjustment with a full and complete identifying description of such motor vehicle.



Read, City Manager; M. T. Thigpen, City Attorney; and A. L. Franklin, City Clerk.

It being determined that a quorum was present, the Mayor proclaimed the meeting open, called the meeting to order, and the following proceedings were had and done:

ORDINANCE NO. 266

WHEREAS, the parking and locating of portable homes, in the form of rail vehicles, camp-cars, trailers on rails or on automotive-type wheels, or any other type of portable or movable habitation used as temporary or permanent sleeping quarters for human beings, without sewage disposal or other sanitary facilities has been a practice within the City of Picayune, Mississippi, so that it threatens to become a nuisance endangering the health and welfare of the citizens of said City, and

WHEREAS, said situation requires that the governing authorities take immediate steps to regulate, control and stop said practice within said City,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PICAYUNE, MISSISSIPPI, as follows, to-wit:

Section 1. That all portable homes, whether they be rail vehicles, camp-cars, trailers mounted on either rails or automotive-type wheels, or whether they be any other type of portable or movable habitation of any kind or character whatsoever, that are used as either temporary or permanent sleeping quarters for human beings shall not be located within the corporate limits of the City of Picayune or occupied by human beings within said City unless they have first been properly connected to the City Sewage Disposal System and Water System of said City, and approved by the Sanitary Inspector of said City for such location and such occupancy.

Section 2. That, upon payment of privilege tax according to law, and upon proper provision for the connection of each trailer to be accommodated therein to the Water System of said City, and to proper Sanitary Sewage Disposal facilities in accordance with the requirements of, and upon approval of the Sanitary Inspector of the City of Picayune, any person, firm or corporation owning or controlling a suitable site located outside the confines of areas within said City zoned, or to be zoned, as exclusively residential property by proper ordinance of said City, may make application to the Mayor and Council of said City of Picayune for permit to operate a trailer park, as defined by Section 9696-185 (b) in Recompiled Volume 7 of the Mississippi Code of 1942, as amended by Chapter 417 of the Laws of the State of Mississippi of 1956, and, upon approval by the Mayor and Council of said City of such application, a permit may be granted by the Mayor and Council of said City for the operation of such trailer park, to be used as a location or parking place for portable homes as described in Section 1 of this Ordinance.

Section 3. That no portable home, as defined and described in Section 1 of this ordinance, shall be located or placed within the City of Picayune outside the confines or boundaries of a trailer park operating under permit granted by the Mayor and Council of said City in compliance with, and by authority of, Section 2 of this ordinance.

Section 4. That any person, firm, or corporation owning real property within the City of Picayune, Mississippi, who permits any portable home as defined in Section 1 hereof to be placed, or to remain, on real property owned by such property owner in violation of the terms of any portion of this ordinance shall be guilty of a violation of this ordinance and each day that said violation continues shall be considered a separate offense, each such offense being punishable by a fine of not

more than One Hundred Dollars nor less than Five Dollars.

Section 5. That any person, firm, or corporation who places, maintains, or occupies any portable home as defined in Section 1 hereof in the City of Picayune, which said portable home is so placed, maintained or occupied in said City in violation of the terms of any portion of this ordinance shall be guilty of a violation of this ordinance and each day that said violation continues shall be considered a separate offense, each such offense being punishable by a fine of not more than One Hundred Dollars nor less than Five Dollars.

Section 6. That in the event any portion of this ordinance is held to be invalid, such holding shall not be construed to invalidate the remainder of this ordinance.

Section 7. That this ordinance being for the immediate and temporary preservation of the public peace, health and safety, shall take effect from and after the date of its passage.

ORDINANCE NO. 267

ORDINANCE EXTENDING AND ENLARGING THE BOUNDARIES OF THE CITY OF PICAYUNE, DEFINING THE ADDITIONAL TERRITORY, SETTING FORTH THE PROPOSED BOUNDARIES OF SAID CITY AND DESCRIBING THE PROPOSED IMPROVEMENTS TO BE MADE IN AND THE PUBLIC SERVICES TO BE RENDERED IN THE TERRITORY PROPOSED TO BE ANNEXED

WHEREAS, the boundaries of the City of Picayune have not been extended in many years, so that there are areas adjacent to the South boundary of the City of Picayune that are being occupied by persons dependent upon said City of Picayune for labor, customers and services, and

WHEREAS, there has been filed a written request on behalf of the property owners of the property hereinafter described to bring same within the City of Picayune, and

WHEREAS, it is for the best interest and welfare of the City of Picayune and the property owners in the area immediately adjacent to said City that the boundaries of said City be extended and enlarged so as to include the area hereinafter described within the said City,

NOW, THEREFORE, Be It Ordained by the Mayor and Council of the City of Picayune, Pearl River County, Mississippi as follows to-wit:

Section 1. That in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 491 of the Laws of the State of Mississippi for the year 1950 and other applicable statutes and subject to the provisions thereof, the boundaries of the City of Picayune, Pearl River County, Mississippi shall be, and are hereby enlarged so as to include the following described adjacent territory to-wit:

Beginning 673 feet West of the Northeast corner of Section 22, Township 6 South, Range 17 West in Pearl River County, Mississippi at the point of intersection of the North line of said Section with the Western boundary of the right of way of the New Orleans and Northeastern Railroad, thence run West along said Section line a distance of 620.50 feet to point where said Section line intersects the Eastern boundary of extension of Hunt Street, thence run South 390.52 feet, thence run East 533.96 feet to Western boundary of right of way of New Orleans and Northeastern Railroad, thence run North 12 degrees 30 minutes East along said right of way 400 feet to the place of beginning and being part of NE $\frac{1}{4}$ of NE $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 22, Township 6 South, Range 17 West, in Pearl River County, Mississippi,

and it is hereby adjudicated that the extension and enlargement so as to include the said property is reasonable and the public convenience and necessity requires that it be done. It is further hereby adjudicated that said property does not lie within three miles of any other municipality.

SECTION 2. That, including the property described in Section 1 hereof, the new boundaries of the City of Picayune are hereby defined and described as follows, to-wit:

MUNICIPAL MINUTES, CITY OF PICAYUNE

Beginning at Southwest corner of SE $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 16, Township 6 South, Range 17 West in Pearl River County, Mississippi, thence run East along the South line of said Section 16 and also of Section 15 in said Township and Range a distance of approximately 1 $\frac{1}{4}$ miles to a point on said Section line which is 1293.5 feet West of the Northeast corner of Section 22 in said Township and Range, thence run South 390.52 feet, thence run East 533.96 feet to Western boundary of right of way of New Orleans and Northeastern Railroad, thence run North 12 degrees 30 minutes East along said right of way 400 feet to the said Section line between said Sections 22 and 15, thence run East on said Section line approximately 1 $\frac{1}{4}$ miles to the Southeast corner of Section 14 in said Township and Range, thence run North along the East line of said Section 14 and of Section 11 in said Township and Range 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ miles, thence run East 1/8 mile, thence run North 1/4 mile, thence run West 1/8 mile to East line of said Section 11, thence run North 1/2 mile to Northeast corner of said Section 11, thence run West along Section line 1 mile to Northwest corner of said Section 11, thence run South 1/2 mile more or less to North bank of Hobolochitto River, thence follow the meanderings of said Hobolochitto River in a Westerly direction to where the center line of Section 9 (said line being also the Western boundary of Stephen Jarrell Claim No. 40, Township 6 South, Range 17 West) in said Township and Range crosses same, thence run South along said center line of Section 9 and of Section 16 in said Township and Range 1 3/4 miles more or less to Southwest corner of SE $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 16 in said Township and Range, same being the place of beginning.

SECTION 3. That the improvements proposed to be made by said City in the new territory included in this ordinance, and as described in Section 1 hereof, are as follows, to-wit;

(1) Maintenance and construction of any necessary streets within said territory, such improvement to be completed as speedily as is practicable and economically feasible; installation where necessary and maintenance of existing water lines and installation of any street lighting where and when necessary; these improvements to be completed within two years from the effective date and final approval of this ordinance.

(2) Construction of any and all necessary drainage facilities within the annexed territory, when and where necessary.

(3) Construction of any and all other improvements as generally furnished in similar areas within said City when and where necessary and economically feasible.

SECTION 4. That the public services which shall be rendered by the City of Picayune within the new territory as described in Section 1 hereof, are as follows, to-wit:

Police protection, fire protection, maintenance of any existing streets and roadways, beginning on the effective date of this ordinance.

Furnishing of services of Municipal Natural Gas Distribution System at municipal rates, as speedily as can be economically installed.

Furnishing of Waste and Garbage Disposal Service on the same basis as for similar property within the present boundaries of the City of Picayune within a period of approximately six months from date of final approval of this ordinance.

Furnishing of street lighting where necessary, on same basis as similar areas now within the City.

Furnishing of services of fogging machine for insect extermination on same basis as now furnished in similar areas within said City.

Furnishing of other services offered by the City of Picayune in similar areas now within said City when and where necessary and economically feasible.

Furnishing of services of Municipal Water System as speedily as can be installed.

SECTION 5. That the Attorney for the City of Picayune shall and he is hereby ordered to, file a petition in the Chancery Court of Pearl River County, Mississippi, which petition shall recite the fact of the adoption of this ordinance, and shall pray that the enlargement of the municipal boundaries of the City of Picayune as herein set out shall be ratified and approved by said court, attaching to said petition, as exhibits thereto, a certified copy of this ordinance, and a map or plat of the municipal boundaries as they will exist in accordance with this ordinance.

SECTION 6. That this ordinance shall be effective as provided by law and that effective upon expiration of ten days from and after the final ratification, approval and confirmation of this ordinance by the Chancery Court of Pearl River County, Mississippi, in accordance with the terms and provisions of Chapter 491 of the Laws of Mississippi for the year 1950 and other statutes applicable thereto, all ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

ORDINANCE NO. 255
 AN ORDINANCE OF THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PICAYUNE, PEARL RIVER COUNTY, MISSISSIPPI, IMPOSING AND LEVYING A ONE-HALF OF ONE PER CENT (1/2 OF 1%) CITY SALES TAX IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE CITY SALES TAX ENABLING ACT, CHAPTER 114, LAWS OF EXTRAORDINARY SESSION 1955

SECTION 1. Whereas, the Mayor and Council of the City of Picayune, Mississippi, in regular meeting assembled, did by resolution dated September 3, 1957, announce the intention of imposing and levying for the benefit of said municipality effective on October 1, 1957, upon persons engaged in any business as defined by Section 2(c), (d), and (e) of Chapter 119 of the Mississippi Laws of 1934, as amended, or as may hereafter be amended, an additional tax of one per cent (1%) on all sales or receipts, except in the case of electricity, which shall be one-fourth of one per cent (1/4 of 1%), but not to include that derived from sales taxed as wholesale under said Sales Tax Law of exemption and



ORDINANCE NO. 268

ORDINANCE EXTENDING AND ENLARGING THE BOUNDARIES OF THE CITY OF PICAYUNE, DEFINING THE ADDITIONAL TERRITORY, SETTING FORTH THE PROPOSED BOUNDARIES OF SAID CITY AND DESCRIBING THE PROPOSED IMPROVEMENTS TO BE MADE IN AND THE PUBLIC SERVICES TO BE RENDERED IN THE TERRITORY PROPOSED TO BE ANNEXED.

WHEREAS, the boundaries of the City of Picayune have not been extended in many years, so that there are areas adjacent to the South boundary of the City of Picayune that are being occupied by persons dependent upon said City of Picayune for labor, customers and services, and

WHEREAS, there has been filed a written request on behalf of the property owners of the property hereinafter described to bring same within the City of Picayune, and

WHEREAS, it is for the best interest and welfare of the City of Picayune and the property owners in the area immediately adjacent to said City that the boundaries of said City be extended and enlarged so as to include the area hereinafter described within the said City,

NOW THEREFORE, Be It Ordained by the Mayor and Council of the City of Picayune, Pearl River County, Mississippi as follows to-wit:

SECTION 1. That in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 491 of the Laws of the State of Mississippi for the year 1950 and other applicable statutes and subject to the provisions thereof, the boundaries of the City of Picayune, Pearl River County, Mississippi shall be, and are hereby enlarged so as to include the following described adjacent territory to-wit:

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Beginning at Southwest corner of SE $\frac{1}{4}$ of SW $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 16, Township 6 South, Range 17 West in Pearl River County, Mississippi, thence run North 4318.1 feet more or less to Palestine Road, thence run South 66 degrees 40 minutes East along said road 1140.66 feet more or less to the Half Section line and West line of East Half of said Section 16, thence run South along said Half Section line 4318.1 feet more or less to the Southeast corner of SW $\frac{1}{4}$ of said Section 16, thence run West $\frac{1}{4}$ mile more or less to the place of beginning, said being that part of the East Half of West Half of said Section 16, which lies South of Palestine Road,

and it is hereby adjudicated that the extension and enlargement so as to include the said property is reasonable and the public convenience and necessity requires that it be done. It is further hereby adjudicated that said property does not lie within three miles of any other municipality.

SECTION 2. That, including the property described in Section 1 hereof, the new boundaries of the City of Picayune are hereby defined and described as follows, to-wit:

Beginning at Southwest corner of SE $\frac{1}{4}$ of SW $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 16, Township 6 South, Range 17 West in Pearl River County, Mississippi, thence run East along the South line of said Section 16 and also of Section 15 in said Township and Range a distance of approximately $1\frac{1}{2}$ miles to a point on said Section line which is 1222.5 feet West of the Northeast corner of Section 22 in said Township and Range, thence run South 290.52 feet, thence run East 533.96 feet to Western boundary of right of way of New Orleans and Northeastern Railroad, thence run North 12 degrees 30 minutes East along said right of way 400 feet to the said Section line between said Sections 22 and 15, thence run East on said Section line approximately $1\frac{1}{2}$ miles to the Southeast corner of Section 14 in said Township and Range, thence run North along the East line of said Section 14 and of Section 11 in said Township and Range $1\frac{1}{2}$ miles, thence run East $\frac{1}{8}$ mile, thence run North $\frac{1}{2}$ mile, thence run West $\frac{1}{8}$ mile to East line of said Section 11, thence run North $\frac{1}{2}$ mile to Northeast corner of said Section 11, thence run West along Section line $\frac{1}{2}$ mile to Northwest corner of said Section 11, thence run South $\frac{1}{2}$ mile more or less to North bank of Hobolochitto River, thence follow the meanderings of said Hobolochitto River in a westerly direction to where the center line of Section 9 (said line being also the Western boundary of Stephen Jarrell Claim No. 40, Township 6 South, Range 17 West) in said Township and Range crosses same, thence run South along said center line of Section 9 and of Section 16 in said Township and Range $\frac{3}{4}$ miles more or less to a point on the South side of Palestine Road which point is 4318.1 feet north of the Southwest corner of SE $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 16, Township 6 South, Range 17 West, thence run North 66 degrees 40 minutes West along the South side of said road 1140.66 feet to the West line of NE $\frac{1}{4}$ of SW $\frac{1}{4}$ of said Section 16, thence run South along said line 4889.1 feet more or less to the Southwest corner of SE $\frac{1}{4}$ of said Section 16, same being the place of beginning.

SECTION 3. That the improvements proposed to be made by said City in the new territory included in this ordinance, and as described in Section 1 hereof, are as follows, to wit:

- (1) Maintenance and construction of any necessary streets within said territory, such improvement to be completed as speedily as is practicable and economically feasible; installation where necessary and maintenance of existing water lines and installation of any street lighting where and when necessary.
- (2) Construction of any and all necessary drainage facilities within the annexed territory, when and where necessary.
- (3) Construction of any and all other improvements as generally furnished in similar areas within said City when and where necessary and economically feasible.

SECTION 4. That the public services which shall be rendered by the City of Picayune within the new territory as described in Section 1 hereof, are as follows, to-wit:

Police protection, fire protection, maintenance of any existing streets and roadways, beginning on the effective date of this ordinance.

Furnishing of services of Municipal Natural Gas Distribution System at Municipal rates, as specifically as can be economically installed.

Furnishing of Waste and Garbage Disposal Service on the same basis as for similar property within the present boundaries of the City of Picayune when needed.

Furnishing of street lighting where necessary, on same basis as similar areas now within the City.

Furnishing of services of fogging machine for insect extermination on same basis as now furnished in similar areas within said City.

Furnishing of other services offered by the City of Picayune in similar areas now within said City when and where necessary and economically feasible.

Furnishing of services of Municipal Water System when needed.

SECTION 5. That the Attorney for the City of Picayune shall and he is hereby ordered to, file a petition in the Chancery Court of Pearl River County, Mississippi, which petition shall recite the fact of the adoption of this ordinance, and shall pray that the enlargement of the municipal boundaries of the City of Picayune as herein set out shall be ratified and approved by said court, attaching to said petition, a exhibits thereto, a certified copy of this ordinance, and a map or plat of the municipal boundaries as the

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will exist in accordance with this ordinance.

SECTION 6. That this ordinance shall be effective as provided by law and that effective upon expiration of ten days from and after the final ratification, approval and confirmation of this ordinance by the Chancery Court of Pearl River County, Mississippi, in accordance with the terms and provisions of Chapter 491 of the Laws of Mississippi for the year 1950 and other statutes applicable thereto, all ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

NOW, THEREFORE, Be It Ordered by the Mayor and Council of the City of Picayune that the bid filed by the First National Bank of Picayune and Bank of Picayune for the purchase of the \$17,000.00 issue of School Transportation Equipment Notes of the Picayune Municipal Separate School District as advertised by order adopted at the regular September, 1959 meeting of Mayor and Council of said City, at an interest rate of $3\frac{1}{2}\%$ per annum from date, be and it is hereby accepted, and the said notes are hereby sold to the said First National Bank of Picayune and Bank of Picayune to be issued in accordance with the said notice of sale and with resolution of Mayor and Council of said City.

ORDER OF THE GOVERNING AUTHORITIES OF THE CITY OF
PICAYUNE, MISSISSIPPI, TO BORROW \$17,000.00 WITH
WHICH TO PURCHASE SCHOOL TRANSPORTATION EQUIPMENT
FOR THE PICAYUNE MUNICIPAL SEPARATE SCHOOL
DISTRICT, TO PROVIDE FOR THE SERVICING OF SAME,
AND OTHER PURPOSES.

The governing authorities of the City of Picayune, Mississippi, then took up for consideration the matter of issuing notes or bonds for the purchase of motor vehicles and other school transportation equipment, and the servicing of same, and other purposes, and Councilman H. V. Carr offered the following resolution and order, which was duly seconded by Councilman Ocie L. Harris:

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, there came on for hearing this day at the regular meeting of the governing authorities of the City of Picayune, Mississippi, the petition of the Board of Trustees of the Picayune Municipal Separate School District of said City of Picayune, Mississippi, dated 23rd day of June, 1959, petitioning and requesting this Board to borrow the sum of \$17,000.00 to be used by said board of Trustees in purchasing 4 new motor vehicles and other school transportation equipment in which to transport to and from the public schools of said municipal separate school district the school children attending said schools, and to provide for the servicing and repair of such district-owned motor vehicles, or other school transportation equipment, and to establish, erect, and equip school bus shops or garages, and purchase land therefor, and to issue negotiable notes or bonds for said municipal separate school district in evidence of said sum, said notes or bonds to be payable in 6 annual installments over a period of 6 years from the date of their issuance, and to bear not exceeding four per cent (4%) interest per annum, principal and

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interest to be paid from the transportation funds of said district, all as provided by Chapter 15 and Chapter 18, Laws of Extraordinary Session of 1953.

"WHEREAS, the Board finds that on the 9th day of June, 1959, at a regular meeting of said Board of Trustees of said municipal separate school district, duly and legally called and held, and said Board of Trustees, by a majority vote of all its members, duly adopted an order or resolution finding and adjudging that it is necessary and advisable to purchase and operate for said district Four motor vehicles or other school transportation equipment, and to provide for the servicing and repair of such district-owned motor vehicles or other school transportation equipment, and to employ drivers for the operation thereof, and to establish, erect, and equip school bus shops or garages, and purchase land therefor, in order to provide satisfactory school transportation service at a reasonable cost for the school children of said school district attending said public schools and that it is necessary to borrow said sum of \$17,000.00 with which to pay the purchase price of said motor vehicles, other equipment, shops, or garages, or construction costs, and land, as shown by a certified copy of said resolution of the Board of Trustees attached to said petition; that said petition, with said resolution attached, was first submitted to the State Board of Education for its approval or disapproval, and that on the 29th day of June, 1959, the State Board of Education adopted and spread upon its minutes an order approving the said resolution and petition of said Board of Trustees of said municipal separate school district, as shown by a certified copy of said order of the State Board of Education attached to the said petition and resolution of the Board of Trustees; and,

"WHEREAS, the governing authorities further find and adjudge that there is no money at the present time in the transportation funds of said district, available for the purpose of paying any part of the purchase price of said motor vehicles and to provide for the servicing and repair of such district-owned motor vehicles, or other school transportation equipment, and to establish, erect, and equip school bus shops or garages, and purchase land therefor, and that it is necessary to borrow \$17,000.00 required to pay the said costs, and that all the facts and recitals contained in said resolution of the Board of Trustees of said municipal school district are true and correct:

"NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED AND ORDERED BY THE GOVERNING AUTHORITIES OF THE CITY OF PICAYUNE, MISSISSIPPI, as follows:

SECTION 1. That, for the purpose of providing money for the purchase of motor vehicles and other school transportation equipment and to provide for the servicing and repair of such district-owned motor vehicles or other school transportation equipment, and to establish, erect, and equip school bus shops or garages, and purchase land therefor, as requested in the resolution and petition of the Board of Trustees of the Municipal Separate School District of the City of Picayune, Mississippi, there shall be, and there are hereby authorized, ordered, and directed to be issued the negotiable notes of the Picayune Municipal Separate School District of the City of Picayune, Mississippi, in the principal sum of \$17,000.00. The said notes shall bear date of October 1, 1959, and shall be numbered from one to six, inclusive, and shall be payable, both as to principal and interest in lawful money of the United States of America at the office of the Municipal Clerk of the City of Picayune, Mississippi. The said notes shall bear interest from date thereof, at a rate not exceeding four per cent (4%) per annum, such rate to be determined pursuant to the sale of the notes, payable annually on October 1 in each year at the office of the Municipal Clerk of the City of Picayune, Mississippi. The said notes shall be executed by the signature of the Mayor of the City of Picayune, Mississippi, and shall be countersigned and attested by the Municipal Clerk of the said municipality, who shall affix the seal of the municipality upon each note, and the said Clerk shall register all of the said notes in a book kept for that purpose by him in the said Municipal Clerk's office. The said notes shall mature, without option or prior payment, on \$2833.33 in each of the following years, and in the following amounts, to-wit:

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING AREA 3, SECTION 1, OF ORDINANCE #187 OF THE CITY OF PICAYUNE SO AS TO TAKE OUT OF AND DELETE THEREFROM CERTAIN TERRITORY

WHEREAS, at the regular September, 1959 meeting of the Mayor and Council of the City of Picayune, Mississippi, an order was adopted declaring intention to amend or change the boundaries of Area 3, in Section 1 of Ordinance #187 of said City by deleting or taking therefrom the real property situated therein and described as:

Beginning at the intersection of Mitchell Street and South Haugh Avenue and at Southwest corner thereof in said City, thence North 77 degrees 30 minutes West 150 feet, thence South 12 degrees 30 minutes West 150 feet, thence South 77 degrees 30 minutes East 150 feet, thence North 12 degrees 30 minutes West 150 feet to place of beginning and being part of NW $\frac{1}{4}$ of SW $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 14, Township 6 South, Range 17 West in said City,

said order directing the City Clerk of said City to publish in the Picayune Item, a newspaper of general circulation in said City, notice of said intention and notice of public hearing thereon to be held at the City Hall in said City at 7:30 P. M. on Tuesday, October, 6, 1959, and

WHEREAS, said notice was published in accordance with said order, the proof of publication of said notice being on file in the office of the City Clerk of said City, and

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WHEREAS, the time for hearing of said matter has arrived and no objection thereto has been filed and no person has objected to such action, and after mature consideration, the Mayor and Council of said City do find that the deletion and taking of said area from the said Area 3, Section 1 of said Ordinance #187 will promote the general welfare of the community,

NOW, THEREFORE, Be It Ordained by the Mayor and Council of the City of Picayune, Mississippi, as follows, to-wit:

Section 1. Area 3, Section 1 of Ordinance #187 of the said City of Picayune, be, and it is hereby, amended and changed to read as follows, to-wit:

AREA 3. Beginning at the intersection of South Curran Avenue and Tate Street, run Easterly along said Tate Street and on a line in continuation thereof to the line between the NE $\frac{1}{4}$ of SW $\frac{1}{4}$ and the NW $\frac{1}{4}$ of SE $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 14, Township 6 South, Range 17 West, thence run South along said line to a point which is 200 feet South of the South line of Mitchell Street (being the street which forms the South line of E. F. Tate's First Addition to said City) or continuation thereof; thence Westerly parallel with said Mitchell Street to street which is a continuation of South Haugh Avenue, thence run Southerly along said South Haugh Avenue, and the street which is a continuation thereof to its intersection with Ridge Road, thence run Westerly along the North line of said Ridge Road to line between Lots 5 and 6 in Block 3 of S. B. Whitfield's Addition to said City, thence run North through the center of Blocks 1, 2, and 3 in said Whitfield's Addition to the South line of NW $\frac{1}{4}$ of SW $\frac{1}{4}$ of said Section 14, thence run East along said line to its intersection with a street which is continuation of South Curran Avenue, thence run Northerly along said South Curran Avenue or continuation thereof to its intersection with street which runs parallel with and lies 300 feet South of Mitchell Street, thence run Easterly along said Street 150 feet, thence run Northerly 12 degrees 30 minutes East 150 feet, thence run South 77 degrees 30 minutes East 150 feet to South Haugh Avenue, thence run Northeasterly along South Haugh Avenue 150 feet to its intersection with Mitchell Street, thence run Westerly along said Mitchell Street to its intersection with continuation of South Curran Avenue, thence Northerly along said South Curran Avenue to the place of beginning.

Section 2. That all ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with this ordinance be and at the same time are hereby repealed; any parts of any ordinances not in conflict herewith, however, to remain in full force and effect. That, in the event any section, paragraph, sentence, clause, or phrase of this ordinance be declared unconstitutional or invalid for any reason the remainder of said ordinance shall not be affected thereby.

Section 3. That this ordinance being for the immediate and temporary preservation of the public welfare, shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.




