

Crosby, its President and Chairman of Board of Trustees, and Thomas L. Crosby, its Secretary, hereinafter referred to as "Lessor", and City of Picayune, Mississippi, a municipal corporation under the laws of the State of Mississippi, herein represented by L. O. Crosby, Jr., Mayor, and A. L. Franklin, City Clerk, hereinafter referred to as "Lessee", witnesseth:

THAT, subject to all the terms, reservations, conditions and provisions hereinafter set out, Lessor does hereby let, lease and rent unto Lessee the following described real and personal property situated in the City of Picayune, Pearl River County, Mississippi, to-wit:

Entire Blocks 68 and 69 in Williams Goodyear Addition to the Town(now City) of Picayune, Mississippi, as per plat thereof now on file in the office of the Chancery Clerk of Pearl River County, Mississippi; also

The certain strip of land formerly occupied by "I" Street, extending Northerly from Sixth Avenue for a distance of 300 feet to Goodyear Boulevard, between said Blocks 68 and 69 of said Williams Goodyear Addition to the Town (now City) of Picayune, Mississippi, according to plat thereof heretofore filed and now on file in the office of the Chancery Clerk of Pearl River County, Mississippi, said portion of said "I" Street having been heretofore vacated and closed by ordinance adopted by the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the City of Picayune, Mississippi;

Together with all improvements thereon situated, including particularly the building constructed thereon and established by Lessor as LUCIUS OLEN CROSBY MEMORIAL HOSPITAL, and including, also, all hospital furniture, equipment, fixtures, appliances and other personal property now installed and/or situated in said building or upon said premises a detailed inventory of which is on file with Lessor.

It is expressly understood and agreed that this lease is granted by Lessor, and accepted by Lessee, upon the following terms, conditions and provisions, to-wit:

(a) This lease shall be for a term of five (5) years from and after April 1, 1960; but Lessor shall have, and hereby expressly reserves, the right and privilege to cancel and terminate this lease at any time during the term hereof, by giving Lessee written notice of termination not less than thirty (30) days prior to the effective date of such termination. Such written notice, if given by Lessor, may be delivered in person to the Mayor of the City of Picayune, Mississippi, or such notice may be sent by United States Mail, addressed to City of Picayune, City Hall, Picayune, Mississippi.

(b) The consideration for this lease shall be the sum of One Dollar (\$1.00), to be paid by Lessee to Lessor, and other good and valuable considerations, it being understood and agreed that the principal consideration moving to Lessor for the granting of this lease is Lessor's desire that there be maintained and operated in the City of Picayune, Mississippi, a modern and efficient hospital for the treatment of illness and disease and for the alleviation of human suffering.

(c) The property herein leased shall be used, occupied, maintained and operated as a hospital under the name, "LUCIUS OLEN CROSBY MEMORIAL HOSPITAL," and the name of said hospital shall never be changed, and said property shall not be occupied or used for any other purpose.

(d) The property herein leased has heretofore been held by Lessee pursuant to a former lease from Lessor to Lessee, and said property has heretofore been placed by Lessee in charge of the Hospital Board of Trustees of the City of Picayune, Mississippi. It is agreed that said Hospital Board of Trustees shall continue the operation and management of said LUCIUS OLEN CROSBY MEMORIAL HOSPITAL throughout the term of this lease, and shall operate said hospital in all respects in strict compliance with all applicable statutes of the State of Mississippi. Said Board of Trustees shall maintain in force and effect, and shall require compliance with, the certain rules and regulations heretofore adopted by said Board; and it is agreed that said rules and regulations shall not be modified, amended or repealed during the term of this lease without the consent of Lessor first obtained. It is agreed that during the term of this lease Lessee shall consult with Lessor's Board of Trustees before making appointment or appointments to fill any vacancy or vacancies in the office of Trustee upon said Hospital Board of Trustees of the City of Picayune, Mississippi.

(e) Lessor, for its own account, shall carry and maintain fire and extended coverage insurance upon the building herein leased in the sum of \$750,000.00, and upon the furnishings, furniture, fixtures, equipment and other personal property herein leased in the sum of \$75,000.00; and as a part of the consideration for this lease, Lessee binds and obligates itself to reimburse Lessor for the premiums paid upon such insurance during the life of this lease.

(f) Lessee, for its account, shall carry and maintain at all times during the life of this lease adequate public liability insurance coverage upon said LUCIUS OLEN CROSBY MEMORIAL HOSPITAL, and upon all phases of its operation thereof, and Lessee shall bear the cost of all such liability insurance.

(g) As a part of the consideration for this lease, Lessee binds and obligates itself to indemnify Lessor and save it harmless from any and all liability of every kind and character arising from or in anywise growing out of Lessee's occupancy of said premises, and operation and maintenance of said hospital.

(h) Lessee shall bear the entire cost and expense of operating and maintaining said hospital, including the salaries and wages of all personnel employed in such operation, all bills for water, gas, electric and telephone service, and any and all other costs and expenses of every kind and character incident to the operation and maintenance of said hospital; and it is expressly understood and agreed that Lessor shall not be liable or responsible for any of such cost or expense.



ORDINANCE NO. 270

AN ORDINANCE PROHIBITING CERTAIN POSTING AND  
ADVERTISING IN THE CITY OF PICAYUNE, PEARL  
RIVER COUNTY, MISSISSIPPI

Be it ordained by the Mayor and Council of the City of Picayune, Mississippi, in regular session assembled, that:

## MUNICIPAL MINUTES, CITY OF PICAYUNE

SECTION I: It shall be unlawful for any person to place or allow to be placed any advertising cards or posters or any other like material, or any signs or advertising matter, either on, or suspended by ropes or wires on any telegraph, telephone, power, or other utility poles within the corporate limits of the City of Picayune.

SECTION II: That any person, firm, or corporation violating any of the provisions of this Ordinance shall be guilty of a mis-demeanor and, upon a conviction thereof, shall be punished by a fine of not less than Ten Dollars (\$10.00) nor more than One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00); or be imprisoned not exceeding thirty (30) days, or both fine and imprisonment and each day of continuance of any violation of this Ordinance shall constitute a separate offense, punishable as such.

SECTION III: That all Ordinances or parts of Ordinances in conflict herewith be, and they are hereby repealed, and the public good requiring it, this Ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and approval.

OBJECTION TO HOMESTEAD EXEMPTION DISALLOWANCE

WHEREAS, The State Tax Commission has undertaken to disallow homestead exemption allowed by the City of Picayune on the 1959 Land Assessment Roll of the City of Picayune and the Picayune Municipal Separate School District, as to the property and assessments hereinbelow described, and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council of the City of Picayune have investigated both of these cases thoroughly, and has found and does hereby adjudicate that both are fully entitled to be allowed homestead exemption, there being no basis for such disallowance,

NOW, THEREFORE, Be It Resolved by the Mayor and Council of the City of Picayune, Mississippi that the disallowance of the homestead exemption on the 1959 Land Assessments Roll of the said City and of the Picayune Municipal Separate School District, on the property of Durwood Davis listed on said roll on page 144, line 20 thereof, and on the property of George Frierson listed on said roll on page 284, line 33, page 289, line 22, and page 303, line 5, thereof is hereby refused and protested and the Clerk of said City is hereby instructed to furnish certified copy of this resolution to the State Tax Commission, and to take any and all steps to prevent the proposed adjustments by said State Tax Commission from becoming effective.

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, following a movement created by former Mayor C. McDonald, Sr., the City of Picayune did erect and now has in operation a new and modern Fire Station at the intersection of Mitchell Street with South Haugh Avenue, said station equipped with a new 750 gallon triple combination fire engine together with the most recent fire fighting equipment. Also on the grounds at said new station is a new eight-inch water well connected to the water distribution system of our City, and

WHEREAS, as a result of former Mayor C. McDonald, Sr.'s efforts, the creation of said Fire Station and the equipment thereof, after being fully inspected and approved by the Mississippi State Rating Bureau, resulted in the City of Picayune being changed from Class 8 to Class 7, which change brought about a substantial reduction in insurance rates throughout the City and a savings of thousands of dollars to the citizens thereof, and

WHEREAS it is the desire of this Mayor and Council to name said Fire Station in honor of former Mayor C. ORDINANCE NO. 272

AN ORDINANCE PROHIBITING THE OPERATION ON THE STREETS AND ALLEYS OF THE CITY OF PICAYUNE OF ANY VEHICLES EQUIPPED WITH TRACKS OR METAL TIRES.

Be It Ordained by the Mayor and Council of the City of Picayune, Mississippi as follows:

Section 1. That it shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation to operate or move on the streets and alleys of the City of Picayune, Mississippi any motor vehicle, trailer, semitrailer, tractor or other vehicle having any metal tire or track or portion thereof in contact with the surface of any such street or alley.

Section 2. That it shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation to operate or move on any street or alley of the City of Picayune, Mississippi a vehicle on which any tire or track shall have on its periphery any block, stud, flange, cleat or spike or any other protuberances of any materials other than rubber which projects beyond the tread of the traction surfact of the tire, except that it shall be permissible only to use tire chains of reasonable proportions upon any vehicle only when required for safety because of snow, ice, or other conditions tending to cause a vehicle to skid.

Section 3. That it shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation to operate or move on any street or alley of the City of Picayune, Mississippi a vehicle equipped with solid rubber tires or tracks unless such tires or tracks shall have rubber on the entire traction surfact thereof at least one inch thick above the edge of the flange of the entire periphery.

Section 4. That the movement or operation of any vehicle in violation of the terms of this ordinance shall constitute a separate violation and offense hereunder for each minute of movement or operation thereof, and shall be punishable as such.

Section 5. That each violation of this ordinance or of any of the terms thereof shall be a misdemeanor and punishable by fine not exceeding One Hundred (\$100.00) Dollars, or by imprisonment not exceeding thirty days, or by both such fine and imprisonment for each such offense.

Section 6. That it is hereby adjudicated that this ordinance is necessary for the immediate and temporary preservation of the public peace, health or safety, further that the irreparable damage

being done to some of the streets of said City by such vehicles as are prohibited from movement thereon by this ordinance has required this ordinance to be passed and have made urgent its immediate effective date, and that, therefore, this ordinance shall be in effect from and after its passage and approval by the Mayor and Council of said City.

The foregoing ordinance, pursuant to motion made by O. L. Harris, and seconded by J. M. Howell, was adopted by the Mayor and Council of the City of Picayune, Pearl River County, Mississippi, at a regular meeting held on August 2, 1960, with the vote on its passage being as follows, to-wit:



RESOLUTION FIXING LEVIES FOR 1960 TAXES

WHEREAS, Section 23 of Chapter 492 of Mississippi Laws of 1950, Section 3, Chapter 497 of Mississippi Laws of 1950, And Section 4 of House Bill No. 6 of Mississippi Laws of 1958, all as amended, provide that the governing authorities of each municipality in the State of Mississippi shall levy the municipal ad valorem taxes for each taxable year, said levy or levies to be expressed in mills or decimal fractions of a mill, and such levy or levies shall determine the ad valorem taxes to be collected upon each dollar of valuation on the assessment rolls of the municipality; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council of the City of Picayune, Pearl River County, Mississippi, have completed the revision and equalization of the assessment rolls for taxes for the taxable year 1960, have approved the assessments of motor vehicles in said City and in the Picayune Municipal Separate School District by resolution adopted at a public meeting held on August 2, 1960, and have approved the real property and personal property assessment rolls of said City and of said Municipal Separate School District for said year by a resolution adopted at a public meeting held on August 2, 1960, these resolutions being in Minute Book 10 on pages 372, 373 and 374, respectively, and

WHEREAS, the assessment of public utilities has been approximated at \$750,000; and

WHEREAS, the Budget of Expenditures of Picayune Municipal Separate School District for the current fiscal year was filed on September 6, 1960, by the Board of Trustees of said school district and approved by said Mayor and Council of the City of Picayune, which said Budget of Revenues and Expenditures is recorded in these minutes on pages 379, 380 and 381; and

WHEREAS, the current fiscal budget of Crosby Memorial Hospital was filed on September 6, 1960, by the Trustees of said Hospital, which said budget was approved by the Mayor and Council and is recorded in these minutes on page 375, and

WHEREAS, the Budget of Revenues and Expenditures of the City of Picayune for the fiscal year beginning October 1, 1960, and ending September 30, 1961, was adopted by said Mayor and Council on August 2, 1960, and is recorded in these minutes on pages 366, 367 and 368; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED AND ADJUDGED by the Mayor and Council of the City of Picayune, Pearl River County, Mississippi, that in accordance with the Budgets of Expenditures and the assessments of taxable property within the City of Picayune and Picayune Municipal Separate School District, the following ad valorem tax rates or levies be and the same are hereby imposed and levied for the fiscal year 1960-61, upon the assessed value of all taxable property in the City of Picayune, and the Picayune Municipal Separate School District, Pearl River County, Mississippi, as the property is now assessed and listed or as may hereafter be assessed and listed upon the assessment rolls of said City and District as of January 1, 1960, except the exempt value of homes to the extent exempt by the Homestead Exemption Act for Municipal Separate School District, the said rates expressed in mills or a decimal fraction of a mill, being levied and imposed upon each dollar of assessed valuation appearing upon the assessment rolls of said City and Municipal Separate School District in accordance with the provisions of the statutes of the State of Mississippi to which reference is made hereinabove, the said rates or levies are for the following funds or purposes:

1. For the purpose of raising a fund to support the Minimum School Program as requested by the State Board of Education and as provided by Section of Chapter 261, House Bill No. 46 of the Mississippi Laws of 1954 (6518-02 of the Code of 1942) - - - - - 7.00 mills on the dollar to be levied upon property within the City Limits and upon Picayune Municipal Separate School District property outside the City limits.
2. For the purpose of raising a fund for general district school maintenance purposes as provided by Section 6 of Chapter 261, House Bill No. 46 of the Mississippi Laws of 1954 (6518-06 of the Code of 1942) - - - - - 18.00 mills on the dollar to be levied upon property both within the City limits and upon Picayune Municipal Separate School District property outside the City limits.

3. For the purpose of raising a fund for the retirement of bonds issued for construction of an addition to Picayune Memorial High School, for the retirement of bonds issued for construction of Roseland Park Grammar School, for the retirement of school district bonds for general improvement and for the purpose of paying interest thereon - - - - - 4 mills on the dollar to be levied upon property both within the City limits and upon Picayune Municipal Separate School District property outside the City limits.
4. For the purpose of raising funds for the retirement of bonds issued for general street improvement purposes, for the retirement of bonds issued for the acquisition of new fire station and additional fire protection, and for paying interest due thereon - - - - - 7.00 mills on the dollar to be levied only against property within the City limits.
5. For the purpose of raising a fund for general city expense, as fixed and limited by Chapter 496 of Mississippi Laws of 1950 - - - - - 8.00 mills on the dollar to be levied only against property within the City limits. This levy of 8 mills is for the following municipal purposes: Supervision and Finance, Protection of Life and Property, Care & Maintenance of Public Property, Maintenance of Streets & Structures, Recreation and Instruction, and Public Health and Sanitation.
6. For the purpose of raising a fund for general hospital maintenance and operation - - - - - 3.00 mills on the dollar to be levied only against property within the City limits. This levy of 3 mills is to supplement the regular receipts from patients and from Pearl River County for Picayune Municipal Hospital, know as Lucius Olen Crosby Memorial Hospital.

BE IT FURTHER ORDERED AND ADJUDGED that said ad valorem tax levies shall apply to the various funds as follows:

V. Carr offered and moved the adoption of the following resolution:

That the good faith checks filed by all unsuccessful bidders shall forthwith be returned to them upon their respective receipts therefor, and that the good faith check filed by the successful bidders be retained by the Mayor and Council as a guarantee that the bidders will carry out their contract and purchase the bonds. If said successful bidders should fail to purchase the bonds pursuant to the aforesaid bid and contract, the amount of such good faith check shall be retained by the Mayor and Council, on behalf of the School District, as liquidated damages for such failure.


Whereas, Ada McGovern has offered to the City of Picayune the sum of \$467.01 for said land, which said sum represents the fair market value of a tax title to said land,

WHEREAS, the said resolution did direct that the aforesaid election be held at the polling places therein set out; and

WHEREAS, due and regular notice of said election was given as directed by said resolution and as required by law, by publication in the Picayune Item on the 14th, 21st and 28th days of April, 1960, and on the 5th day of May, 1960; the said Picayune Item being a newspaper published and of general circulation in the City of Picayune, Mississippi, and in said District, and said newspaper being a qualified newspaper under the provisions of Chapter 427, Laws of Mississippi, 1948; and

WHEREAS, said notice was published in said newspaper once a week for at least three consecutive weeks next preceding the date of said election, the first of said publications having occurred at least twenty-one (21) days before and the last one within seven (7) days prior to the date of said election; and

WHEREAS, the said District at this time has outstanding bonded indebtedness aggregating the principal amount and sum of Forty-six Thousand, Five Hundred Dollars (\$46,500), including any bonds which heretofore may have been issued for school purposes by the City of Picayune; and

WHEREAS, the amount of bonds authorized at the aforesaid special election, when added to the aforesaid outstanding bonded indebtedness, will not, in the aggregate exceed any limit of indebtedness prescribed by any statute of the State of Mississippi; and

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 187 (AS PREVIOUSLY AMENDED) BY DELETING FROM AREA 1, SECTION I LOTS 1, 2, 3, 10 AND 11 IN BLOCK 78 OF THE WILLIAMS-GOODYEAR ADDITION TO THE CITY OF PICAYUNE.

WHEREAS, notice has been given according to law, with no objection filed, that Lots 1, 2, 3, 10 and 11 in Block 78 of the Williams-Goodyear Addition to the City of Picayune, Pearl River County, Mississippi shall be deleted from the residential zoned area designated as Area 1, Section 1 of Ordinance #187 of the said City,

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Now, Therefore, Be It Ordained by the Mayor and Council of the City of Picayune, Mississippi as follows, to-wit:

Section 1. That Area 1, Section 1 of Ordinance #187 (as previously amended) of the City of Picayune be amended so as to delete therefrom that portion thereof described as Lots 1, 2, 3, 10 and 11 in Block 78 of the Williams-Goodyear Addition to the City of Picayune, Pearl River County, Mississippi, and that said Area 1, Section I of said Ordinance #187 shall be described as inclosed within the following boundaries, to-wit:

Beginning at the point where the section line between Sections 10 and 11 in Township 6 South, Range 17 West intersects the South margin or bank of Hobolochitto River, thence run South along said Section line to the common corner of Sections 10, 11, 14 and 15 in Township 6 South, Range 17 West in Pearl River County, Mississippi, thence run East along Section line between Sections 11 and 14 in Township and Range aforesaid to Main Street, thence Southerly along West line of said Main Street to its intersection with Fifth Avenue, thence Westerly along said Fifth Avenue to Northeast corner of Lot 2 in Block 45 of Williams-Goodyear Addition to the City of Picayune, thence Southerly along the East line of said Lot 2 to the Southeast corner thereof, thence Westerly along a line through the center of said Block 45 to Q Street, thence Southerly along said Q street to its intersection with Williams Avenue, thence Westerly along said Williams Avenue to Southeast corner of  $W\frac{1}{2}$  of Lot 4 in Block 76 of said Williams-Goodyear Addition, thence Northerly to the Northeast corner of  $W\frac{1}{2}$  of said Lot 4, thence North 62 degrees 39 minutes West along South margin of Sixth Avenue to Northwest corner of Lot 5 in said Block 76 of said Addition, thence Southerly along West line of said Lot 5 in said Block to the North margin of said Williams Avenue, thence Westerly along said Williams Avenue to its Western end, thence Northerly along K (or Kirkwood) Street to Northeast corner of Block 78 in said Williams-Goodyear Addition, thence run Westerly along North line of said Block 78 to the West line of Lot 3 thereof, thence run Southerly along West line of said Lot 3 in said Block 78 and the West line of Lot 10 in said Block 78 to the South line of said Block 78, thence run Westerly along the South line of Blocks 78 and 79 in said Williams Goodyear Addition to the East line of Block 1 in the Midway Addition to said City, thence south the North line of Lot 10 in Block 1 of P. S. Dozier's 2nd Addition to said City, thence Northerly along D Street to Goodyear Boulevard, thence Westerly along said Goodyear Boulevard to C Street, thence Northerly along C Street and on a line in continuation of said C Street to the South Bank of the Hobolochitto River, thence Easterly along the meanderings of said Hobolochitto River to the place of beginning.


WHEREAS, said Population and Economy Survey had been examined by the City Planning Commission and recommended by them for adoption, and
