BID ON \$13,000.00 SCHOOL TRANSPORTATION
NOTES ACCEPTED

WHEREAS, pursuant to advertisement for bids on the sale of \$13,000.00 transportation notes of the Picayune Municipal Separate School District, a joint bid of the First National Bank of Picayune and of the Bank of Picayune was found to be the highest and best bid therefor at interest rate of 3½% per annum from date, with said notes to be validated by the Chancery Court of Pearl River County, Mississippi,

NOW, THEREFORE, Be It Ordered by the Mayor and Council of the City of Picayune that the bid filed by the First National Bank of Picayune and the Bank of Picayune for the purchase of \$13,000.00 issue of School Transportation Equipment Notes of the Picayune Municipal Separate School District as advertised by order adopted at the regular September, 1961 meeting of the Mayor and Council of said City, at an interest rate of 3½% per annum from date, be and it is hereby accepted, and the said notes are hereby sold to the First National Bank of Picayune and Bank of Picayune to be issued in accordance with the said notice of sale and with resolution of Mayor and Council of said City.

ORDER OF THE GOVERNING AUTHORITIES OF THE CITY OF
PICAYUNE, MISSISSIPPI TO BORROW \$13,000.00 WITH
WHICH TO PURCHASE SCHOOL TRANSPORTATION EQUIPMENT
FOR THE PICAYUNE MUNICIPAL SEPARATE SCHOOL DISTRICT
TO PROVIDE FOR THE SERVICING OF SAME, AND OTHER
PURPOSES

The governing authorities of the City of Picayune, Mississippi, then took up for consideration the matter of issuing notes or bonds for the purchase of motor vehicles and other school transportation equipment, and the servicing of same, and other purposes, and Councilman A. H. Knight offered the following resolution and order, which was duly seconded by Councilman H. H. Pepper:

RESOLUTION

"WHEREAS, there came on for hearing this day at the regular meeting of the governing authorities of the City of Picayune, Mississippi, the petition of the Board of Trustees of the Picayune Municipal Separate School District of said City of Picayune, Mississippi, dated the 25th day of July, 1961, petitioning and requesting this Board to borrow the sum of \$13,000.00 to be used by said board of trustees in purchasing three new motor vehicles and other school transportation equipment in which to transport to and from the public schools of said municipal separate school District the school children attending said schools, and to provide for the servicing and repair of such district-owned motor vehicles, or other school transportation equipment, and to establish, erect, and equip school bus shops or garages, and purchase land therefor, and to issue negotiable notes or bonds for said municipal separate school district in evidence of said sum, said notes or bonds to be payable in six annual installments over a period of six years from the date of their issuance and to bear not exceeding four per cent (4%) interest per annum, principal and interest to be paid from the transportation funds of said district, all as provided by Chapter 15 and Chapter 18, Laws of Extraordinary Session of 1953.

"WHEREAS, the Board finds that on the 25th day of July, 1961, at a special meeting of said Board of Trustees of said municipal separate school district, duly and legally called and held, the said Board of

Trustees, by a majority vote of all its members, duly adopted an order or resolution finding and adjudging that it is necessary and advisable to purchase and operate for said district three motor vehicles or other school transportation equipment, and to provide for the servicing and repair of such district-owned motor vehicles or other school transportation equipment, and to employ drivers for the operation thereof, and to establish, erect, and equip school bus shops or garages, and purchase land therefor, in order to provide satisfactory school transportation service at a reasonable cost for the school children of said school district attending said public schools and that it is necessary to borrow said sum of \$13,000.00 with which to pay the purchase price of said motor vehicles, other equipment, shops or garages, or construction costs, and land, as shown by a certified copy of said resolution of the Board of Trustees attached to said petition; that said petition, with said resolution attached, was first submitted to the State Board of Education for its approval or disapproval, and that on the 28th day of August, 1961 the State Board of Education adopted and spread upon its minutes an order approving the said resolution and petition of said Board of Trustees of said municipal separate school district, as shown by a certified copy of said order of the State Board of Education attached to the said petition and resolution of the Board of Trustees; and

"WHEREAS, the governing authorities further find and adjudge that there is no money at the present time in the transportation funds of said district, available for the purpose of paying any part of the purchase price of said motor vehicles and to provide for the servicing and repair of such district-owned motor vehicles, or other school transportation equipment, and to establish, erect, and equip school bus shops or garages, and purchase land therefor, and that it is necessary to borrow \$13,000.00 required to pay the said costs, and that all the facts and recitals contained in said resolution of the Board of Trustees of said municipal separate school district are true and correct:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED AND ORDERED BY THE GOVERNING AUTHORITIES OF THE CITY OF PICAYUNE, MISSISSIPPI, as follows:

SECTION 1. That, for the purpose of providing money for the purchase of motor vehicles and other school transportation equipment and to provide for the servicing and repair of such district owned motor vehicles or other school transportation equipment, and to establish, erect, and equip school bus shops or garages, and purchase land therefor, as requested in the resolution and petition of the Board of Trustees of the Municipal Separate School District of the City of Picayune, Mississippi, there shall be, and there are hereby authorized, ordered, and directed to be issued the negotiable notes of the Picayune Municipal Separate School District of the City of Picayune, Mississippi, in the principal sum of \$13,000.00. The said notes shall bear date of October 1, 1961, and shall be numbered from one to twelve, both inclusive, payable two on each October 1, in the years 1962, 1963, 1964, 1965, 1966 and 1967 and shall be payable, both as to principal and interest in lawful money of the United States of America at the office of the Municipal Clerk of the City of Picayune, Mississippi. The said notes shall bear interest from date thereof, at a rate not exceeding four per cent (4%) per annum, such rate to be determined pursuant to the sale of the notes, payable annually on October 1 in each year at the office of the Municipal Clerk of the City of Picayune, Mississippi. The said notes shall be executed by the signature of the Mayor of the City of Picayune, Mississippi, and shall be countersigned and attested by the Municipal Clerk of the said municipality, who shall affix the seal of the municipality upon each note, and the said Clerk shall register all of the said notes in a book kept for that purpose by him in the said Municipal Clerk's office. The said notes shall mature, without option or prior payment, on October 1 in each of the following years, and in the following amounts, to-wit:

It is further ordered that the principal and interest of said notes or bonds shall be paid out of such transportation funds of the said municipal separate school district, and it shall be the duty of the Board of Trustees of said municipal separate school district to set aside each year out of such transportation funds of said district an amount sufficient to pay the principal and interest upon the said notes or bonds as and when the same shall respectively mature and accrue. The Board of Trustees of said municipal separate school district shall include in the school budget each year separate items showing the amount required for the payment of the principal of, and the interest upon, all notes or bonds issued.

SECTION 5. Said notes or bonds shall in all respects be issued as provided in Chapter 18, Laws of Extraordinary Session of 1953, and any bonds issued shall be issued in all respects in the manner provided by Chapter 493, Laws of 1950, as now or hereafter amended, and all the provisions of such statute shall be fully applicable thereto."

SECTION 6. That the City Clerk shall prepare a transcript of all proceedings relative to the issuance of said notes and forward to the State's Bond Attorney for his approval and certificate, and that said notes shall be validated according to law.

ORDINANCE NO. 285

AN ORDINANCE REGULATING THE OWNERSHIP AND KEEPING OF DOGS WITHIN THE CITY OF PICAYUNE AND REQUIRING REGISTRATION AND LICENSING THEREOF

WHEREAS, dogs have been running at large unattended within the City of Picayune, damaging property of the citizens of said city, and creating a hazard to the safety and general health and welfare of the citizens of said city, being positive carriers of rabies, so that it is necessary that action be taken to protect the property, persons and lives of the citizens of said city, and

WHEREAS, dogs themselves cannot be held legally responsible for their actions, so that the owners thereof must bear the full responsibility therefor,

NOW, THEREFORE, Be It Ordained by the Mayor and Council of the City of Picayune as follows:

SECTION 1. It shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation who is the owner of a dog

to permit such dog to run at large within said city unless such dog is muzzled, or is in company with and under the control of a human being. Each day that such dog runs at large shall constitute a separate offense hereunder.

SECTION 2. All female dogs shall be kept in confinement within pens so constructed as to bar access to any other dogs, at all times during the mating season of such dogs, and it shall be unlawful for the owner of any female dog to permit any such dog, during its mating season, to run at large under any circumstances. Each day that such dog shall run at large or shall fail to be confined during such season as herein provided, shall constitute a separate offense hereunder.

SECTION 3. All dogs within the said City shall be vaccinated at least once each calendar year for rabies, such vaccination to be performed by a qualified veterinarian or a person approved by the Mayor and Council of the City of Picayune, and it shall be unlawful for any person to own, to bring, or to keep, within said City any dog that has not been so vaccinated within a period of twelve months. Each day that a dog shall remain unvaccinated as provided herein shall constitute a separate offense hereunder.

SECTION 4. All dogs within the said City of Picayune shall be registered with the Clerk of said City in January, and prior to February first, of each calendar year. An annual registration fee of \$3.00 for each dog shall be paid and the owner of each such dog shall be furnished with a registration tag which shall be worn on the collar or harness of the dog for which it is secured. Puppies shall not be required to be registered until they are three months of age, and the burden of proof as to the age of any such dogs shall be on the owner thereof. As to any dogs brought into the said City, the owners thereof shall have a period of ten days after the arrival of such dogs in said City within which to register them. As to any newly born dogs or dogs newly brought into said City, the registration fee shall be prorated for the remainder of the year of such registration. It shall be unlawful for any person to own, or to keep within said City any dog which has not been so registered and/or which does not have fastened to its collar or harness such registration tag. Each day during which any such dog shall remain in said City without being so registered shall constitute a separate offense hereunder.

SECTION 5. The owner of any dog which may be caught and impounded by the City of Picayune for violation of this ordinance shall be liable to the said City for, and shall pay to said City a fee of \$3.00 plus the cost of feeding said dog during the time that the said dog remains in the custody of said City. Any dog remaining unclaimed after 5 days will be disposed of by the City.

SECTION 6. Any person, firm or corporation who shall violate or fail to carry out any of the terms or provisions of this ordinance as hereinabove outlined shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof, shall be fined not more than One Hundred (\$100.00) Dollars for each such offense.

SECTION 7. In the event any section or part of section of this ordinance shall be held invalid for any reason whatsoever, same shall not affect the validity of the remainder of the ordinance.

SECTION 8. This ordinance shall be in effect from and after its passage.

ORDINANCE NO. 286

ORDINANCE EXTENDING AND ENLARGING THE BOUNDARIES OF THE CITY OF PICAYUNE, DEFINING THE ADDITIONAL TERRITORY, SETTING FORTH THE PROPOSED BOUNDARIES OF SAID CITY AND DESCRIBING THE PROPOSED IMPROVEMENTS TO BE MADE IN AND THE PUBLIC SERVICES TO BE RENDERED IN THE TERRITORY PROPOSED TO BE ANNEXED

WHEREAS, there has not been a major extension of the boundaries of the City of Picayune in many years, so that there are area adjacent to the City of Picayune that are being occupied by persons dependent upon said City of Picayune for labor, customers and services, and

WHEREAS, it is for the best interest and welfare of the City of Picayune and the property owners in the area immediately adjacent to said City that the boundaries of said City be extended and enlarged so as to include the area hereinafter described within the said City,

NOW, THEREFORE, Be It Ordained by the Mayor and Council of the City of Picayune, Pearl River County, Mississippi, as follows, to-wit:

SECTION 1. That in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 491 of the Laws of the State of Mississippi for the year 1950 and other applicable statutes and subject to the provisions thereof, the boundaries of the City of Picayune, Pearl River County, Mississippi, shall be, and are hereby enlarged so as to include the following described adjacent territory, to-wit:

Beginning at the Southwest corner of SE $\frac{1}{4}$ of SW $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 16, Township 6 South, Range 17 West, in Pearl River County, Mississippi, thence run South along the West line of the East $\frac{3}{4}$ of Section 21 in said Township and Range a distance of one mile to South line of said Section 21, thence run East along South line of Sections 21, 22, 23 and 24 in said Township and Range $3\frac{3}{4}$ miles to Southeast corner of said Section 24, thence run North along the East line of Sections 24, 13 and 12 in said Township and Range to the Northeast corner of said Section 12, thence run West along the North line of said Section 12 One mile to the Northwest corner of said Section 12, thence run South $\frac{1}{4}$ mile, thence run East $\frac{1}{8}$ mile, thence run South $\frac{1}{4}$ mile, thence run West $\frac{1}{8}$ mile to the line between Sections 11 and 12 in said Township and Range, thence run South along East line of Sections 11, 14 and 23 in said Township and Range $1\frac{5}{8}$ miles to a point which is 660 feet South of Northeast corner of said Section 23, thence run West along the South line of the North 660 feet of Sections 23 and 22 a distance of 5780 feet more or less to a point on the Western margin of the right of way of the New Orleans and Northeastern Railroad, thence run Northerly along Western Boundary of said right of way approximately North 12 degrees 30 minutes East a distance of 270 feet more or less to point which is 390.52 feet South of the North line of said Section 22, thence run West 533.96 feet, thence run North 390.52 feet to the North line of said Section 22, thence run West along said line of said Section 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ miles more or less to the place of beginning, all in Township 6 South, Range 17 West in Pearl River County, Mississippi. ALSO: Beginning at the point where the Hobolochitto River intersects the line between the East Half and the West Half of Section 9, Township 6 South, Range 17 West (said line being also the West line of Stephen Jarrell Claim No. 40 in said Township and Range), thence run South along said line to a point on the South side of Palestine Road which point is 4318.1 feet North of the Southwest corner of SE $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 16 in said Township and Range, thence run North 66 degrees 40 minutes West along South side of said road 1440.66 feet to the West line of NE $\frac{1}{4}$ of NW $\frac{1}{4}$ of said Section 16, thence run North along the West line of the East $\frac{3}{4}$ of said Section 16, a distance of approximately $\frac{1}{2}$

mile to the South bank of said Hoblochitto River, thence run Southeasterly along said bank of said River approximately 1/4 mile to the place of beginning, and being that part of West 1/4 of the East 3/4 of said Section 9 lying South of Hoblochitto River, and that part of the West 1/4 of East 3/4 of Section 16 in said Township and Range lying North of Palestine Road;

and it is hereby adjudicated that the extension and enlargement so as to include the said property is reasonable and the public convenience and necessity requires that it be done. It is further hereby adjudicated that said property does not lie within three miles of any other municipality.

SECTION 2. That, including the property described in Section 1 hereof, the new boundaries of the City of Picayune are hereby defined and described as follows, to-wit:

Beginning at the Southwest corner of the SE $\frac{1}{4}$ of SW $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 21, Township 6 South, Range 17 West, in Pearl River County, Mississippi, thence run East along the South line of Sections 21, 22, 23 and 24 in said Township and Range a distance of 3 $\frac{3}{4}$ miles to the Southeast corner of said Section 24, thence run North along East line of Sections 24, 13 and 12 in said Township and Range 3 miles to the Northeast corner of said Section 12, thence run West along the North line of Sections 11 and 12 in said Township and Range 2 miles to the Northwest corner of said Section 11, thence run South 1/2 mile more or less to the North bank of Hoblochitto River, thence follow the meanderings of said River in a Westerly direction to where the West line of the East 3/4 of Section 9 in said Township and Range intersects same, thence run South along the West line of the East 3/4 of Sections 9, 16 and 21 in said Township and Range 3 miles to the place of beginning.

SECTION 3. That the improvements proposed to be made by said City in the new territory included in this ordinance, and as described in Section 1 hereof, are as follows, to-wit:

- (1) Maintenance and construction of any necessary streets within said territory, such improvement to be completed as speedily as is practicable and economically feasible; installation where necessary and maintenance of existing water lines and installation of any street lighting where and when necessary; these improvements to be completed within two years from the effective date and final approval of this ordinance.
- (2) Construction of any and all necessary drainage facilities within the annexed territory, when and where necessary.
- (3) Construction of Sewage disposal facilities and any and all other improvements as generally furnished in similar areas within said City when and where necessary and economically feasible.

SECTION 4. That the public services which shall be rendered by the City of Picayune within the new territory as described in Section 1 hereof, are as follows, to-wit:

Police protection, fire protection, maintenance of any existing streets and roadways, beginning on the effective date of this ordinance.

Furnishing of services of Municipal Natural Gas Distribution System at municipal rates, as speedily as can be economically installed.

Furnishing of Waste and Garbage Disposal Service on the same basis as for similar property within the present boundaries of the City of Picayune within a period of approximately six months from date of final approval of this ordinance.

Furnishing of street lighting where necessary, on same basis as similar areas now within the City.

Furnishing of services of fogging machine for insect extermination on same basis as now furnished in similar area within said City.

Furnishing of other services offered by the City of Picayune in similar areas now within said City when and where necessary and economically feasible.

Furnishing of services of Municipal Water System as speedily as can be installed.

SECTION 5. That the Attorney for the City of Picayune shall, and he is hereby, ordered to file a petition in the Chancery Court of Pearl River County, Mississippi, which petition shall recite the fact of the adoption of this ordinance, and shall pray that the enlargement of the municipal boundaries of the City of Picayune as herein set out shall be ratified and approved by said court, attaching to said petition, as exhibits thereto, a certified copy of this ordinance, and a map or plat of the municipal boundaries as they will exist in accordance with this ordinance.

SECTION 6. That this ordinance shall be effective as provided by law and that effective upon expiration of ten days from and after the final ratification, approval and confirmation of this ordinance by the Chancery Court of Pearl River County, Mississippi, in accordance with the terms and provisions of Chapter 491 of the laws of Mississippi for the year 1950 and other statutes applicable thereto, all ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 257 OF THE CITY OF PICAYUNE SO AS TO PROVIDE THAT THE CURRENT EDITION OF THE NATIONAL ELECTRICAL CODE AS APPROVED BY THE AMERICAN STANDARDS ASSOCIATION SHALL BE EFFECTIVE IN THE CITY OF PICAYUNE

BE IT ORDAINED By the Mayor and Council of the City of Picayune, Mississippi, as follows, to-wit:

SECTION 1. That Section 5 of Ordinance No. 257 of the City of Picayune be, and it is hereby, amended to read as follows:

"Section 5. The rules and requirements of the edition of the National Electrical Code as approved by the American Standards Association, a copy of which is filed with and made a part of this ordinance, are hereby adopted as a minimum standard for electrical wiring; and all electrical wiring hereafter installed; and additions to or alterations made in existing electrical wiring in or on any building or structure within the corporate limits of the City of Picayune, Mississippi, must be installed and maintained as specified by these rules and requirements. Any amendments to, or revisions of, the said National Electrical Code which shall be approved by the American Standards Association shall be effective in said City and are hereby adopted, so that the successive current editions of said National Electrical Code shall be in full force and effect in said City."

SECTION 2. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.



(a) That the Picayune Municipal Separate School District in Pearl River County, Mississippi, and in Hancock County, Mississippi, is a duly and lawfully created, organized and existing Municipal Separate School District under the laws of the State of Mississippi, whose territorial limits include all of the territory comprising the City of Picayune, Pearl River County, Mississippi, together with additional adjacent territory lying in Pearl River and Hancock Counties, Mississippi.

(b) That the total assessment of all taxable property in said Picayune Municipal Separate School District according to the last completed assessment rolls, being for the taxable year 1961, is the sum of \$9,110,142.02, exclusive of motor vehicles.





CITY PLANNING STUDIES

Upon motion of A. H. Knight, seconded by O. V. Lewis and unanimously carried, it is hereby ordered that the Mayor and City Council do hereby approve the written proposal of Dan S. Martin for further city planning work, said proposal being in the following words and figures, to-wit:

Picayune City Council
City Hall
Picayune, Mississippi

Gentlemen:

In accordance with your request, we are pleased to submit our proposal for continuing planning services in the City of Picayune. The work involved includes the following studies and services:

1. Neighborhood Analysis and Renewal (\$2,000.00)

This study and report will consist of a delineation of neighborhood areas and boundaries, and the collection and recording of information on existing conditions within the neighborhoods. Information collected will deal with the physical conditions affecting the neighborhoods, land use, physical condition of structures, and visual appearance.

Using this data as a base, areas where blight or potential blight exists will be mapped, the adequacy of community facilities will be evaluated, and the causes of existing or potential blight will be determined.

A program for neighborhood improvement will be presented. It will identify steps needed to eliminate present blight and prevent the occurrence of future blight. Neighborhood areas will be rated and classified, and areas where renewal is indicated will be shown.

2. Capital Improvement Budget (\$1,950.00)

This study and report deals with an examination of the sources and kinds of city revenues and expenditures, the factors which influence their change, projection of revenues and expenditures for a six year period, and listing of proposed capital improvements. In order to make such projections, consideration will be given to expected changes in property assessment, population increase, and any foreseeable change in the comprehensive financial picture. The objective of the financial analysis, in addition to providing meaningful information and data, will be to indicate the amount of funds expected to be available in future years for capital improvements.

The second phase of the study will be the compilation of a comprehensive list of necessary and desirable capital improvements. This list will be prepared in cooperation with the planning commission, the city council, and city department heads, or agency heads. In preparing this list, consideration will be given to the need and desire to implement certain phases of the master plan recommendations. Finally, the comprehensive list of capital improvements will be refined to arrive at a list of capital improvements feasible within the forthcoming six year period.

3. Revision and Extension of Zoning (\$1,000.00)

Existing land use in the newly annexed areas will be recorded and analyzed. Zoning recommendations will be prepared for the annexed area. New Zoning maps will be prepared to include all area within the city limits and to present the zoning districts recommendations. If zoning text revisions are necessary, such text revisions will be made.

4. Master Plan Report (\$3,250.00)

This report is a summary of six master plan reports published in one single volume. The master plan reports to be summarized are --

Population and Economy
Land Use
Major Street Plan
Traffic and Parking
Capital Improvements Budget
Neighborhood Analysis and Renewal

The objective of this publication is to present the essential elements of the comprehensive plan in a single volume, with the plans and maps presented in multi-color - all to be printed on high grade paper for attractiveness and durability. Such presentation will facilitate implementation of the plans and encourage citizen participation in planning.

Services Provided by Consultant

1. A principal of the consulting firm will meet with the planning commission and, when necessary, with the city council to explain plan proposals and to review reports.

2. The consultants will attend public hearings called for the purpose of presenting planning reports to the public.

MUNICIPAL MINUTES, CITY OF PICAYUNE

3. The consultants will assume all expenses involved in fulfilling their obligations under the contract. However, the cost of publishing public notices of public hearings and publication of ordinances will not be borne by the consultant.

4. During the contract period the consultants will assist the commission in carrying out its administrative duties such as reviewing subdivision plans, petitions for zoning amendments, and similar matters.

5. The consultants will work with the commission and the council to implement portions of the master plan when opportunities for such implementation present themselves.

Period of Service

The planning work and planning services will be accomplished within a period of 20 to 24 months after the date of the contract executed between the consultants and the Mississippi Agriculture and Industrial Board.

Printed Reports Furnished

Each planning study and report will be presented in the form of a printed report and will include all maps, charts, graphs, and other documents necessary to explain the plans. Seventy-five copies of the Capital Improvements Budget, and the Neighborhood Analysis and Renewal reports will be furnished to the planning commission. Five hundred copies of the summary master plan report will be provided. Five hundred copies of the new zoning map (printed) will be furnished.

Fees

The consultants proposed to accomplish the work set forth in this proposal for a fee of \$8,200.00. Under the state planning program, one-third of this amount (\$2733.33) will be the financial responsibility of the City of Picayune.

ORDINANCE NO. 289

AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING A CEMETERY TRUST FUND FOR THE CITY OF PICAYUNE

WHEREAS, the City of Picayune has heretofore established a municipal cemetery, with a Board of Trustees, all being in compliance with provisions of Housebill No. 718 adopted at the 1962 session of the Legislature of the State of Mississippi, and

MUNICIPAL MINUTES, CITY OF PICAYUNE

WHEREAS, it has been proposed that the proceeds of sales of lots from the cemetery owned by said City shall be placed in a trust fund, the income from which shall be used for the upkeep and maintenance of such cemetery,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PICAYUNE, MISSISSIPPI, as follows, to-wit:

Section 1. That a trust fund is hereby established to be known and designated as the Palestine Cemetery Trust Fund of the City of Picayune, into which shall be paid the proceeds of sales of Cemetery Lots.

Section 2. That the principal of said trust fund shall not be used for operation or maintenance of the cemeteries administered and operated by the said City, but may only be used for the purpose of purchasing any needed additional land for cemetery purposes.

Section 3. That the principal of said trust fund shall be invested by the said Board.

(A) Savings account in Bank and Savings & Loan Association.

(B) Bonds, notes and certificates and other valid general obligations of the State of Mississippi (including State Highway Bonds), or of a county, city supervisor's district or school district in the State of Mississippi.

(C) Bonds, notes, certificates and other valid obligations of the United States.

(D) First mortgage real estate loans; such loans are to be made for no more than 50% of value as determined by a qualified real estate appraiser, who shall have first been approved by the Mayor and Council of said City to act as such appraiser, and shall be made for such terms and on such interest rates as shall be approved by the said Board; no such real estate loan shall be made unless the security instrument securing said loan on said real estate shall be fully insured by a title insurance company doing business in the State of Mississippi; and the improvements on any such real estate given as security shall be covered for the full amount of the loan by fire and extended coverage insurance in an insurance company doing business in the State of Mississippi.

Any investments in securities named above shall be acquired by the Board at prices not exceeding the prevailing market values for such securities, and after prior approval by the Mayor and Council of said City.

Subject to the terms, conditions, limitations and restrictions herein contained, the Board shall have power to sell, assign, transfer and dispose of any of the securities and investments of the said trust fund; provided, that said sale, assignment or transfer has the majority approval of the entire board.

No Trustee and no employee of the Board shall have any direct or indirect interest in the income, gains, or profits of any investment made by the Board, nor shall any such person receive any pay or emolument for his services in connection with any investment made by the Board. No Trustee or employee of the Board shall become an endorser or surety or in any manner an obligor for money loaned by or borrowed from the said trust fund.

All interest derived from investments shall be used for operation, maintenance and upkeep of the said cemetery, and any such income from investment of said trust fund shall be credited to an income account of said fund.

All disbursements of loans and other expenses shall be made by warrants drawn on said fund, approved by said Board and executed by the Mayor and City Clerk of said City.

Section 4. The money and property of said Trust Fund shall be deposited in a Banking institution of the City of Picayune, Mississippi and shall be secured by such institution in the manner provided by law for securing public deposits.

Section 5. The City Clerk of the City of Picayune shall be custodian of the funds of said Trust Fund.

Section 6. That this trust shall be irrevocably and may only be terminated by a vote of the majority of the qualified electors of the City of Picayune voting in an election called by governing authori-

ties of said City for the purpose of determining whether said trust shall be terminated.

Section 7. Any violation of the terms of this ordinance shall be a misdemeanor, punishable as such.

Section 8. This ordinance being for the immediate and temporary preservation of the public peace, health or safety shall take effect upon its passage.

The foregoing ordinance was first reduced to writing, considered and passed section by section and then as a whole, with the vote on each section and on said ordinance as a whole, resulting as follows:

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council of the City of Picayune, Mississippi has heretofore, at its regular June, 1962 meeting determined that it is in the public interest to have The Housing Authority of the City of Picayune exercise the powers vested in the said City by virtue of Chapter 518 of the Mississippi Laws of 1958, as amended, and

WHEREAS, the aforesaid resolution was inadvertently omitted from the minutes of the said meeting, so that the Mayor and Council of said City do now, nunc pro tunc, enter such resolution in its minutes as of the date of its passage at its said June, 1962 meeting,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor and Council of the City of Picayune, Mississippi that the Housing Authority of the City of Picayune be and it is hereby vested with all the powers vested in the City of Picayune and its governing authorities by virtue of the provisions of Chapter 518 of the Laws of Mississippi of 1958, as amended, and said housing authority is hereby designated to act as the urban renewal agency of said City and vested with all of the urban renewal project powers in the same manner as though all such powers were conferred by law on such housing authority instead of on the municipality.

ORDINANCE NO. 290

AN ORDINANCE EXERCISING THE OPTION CONTAINED IN SECTION THREE OF HOUSE BILL NO. 470, REGULAR LEGISLATIVE SESSION OF 1962 OF THE MISSISSIPPI LEGISLATURE

WHEREAS, the City of Picayune has been operating under the Council-Manager plan of government since July 6, 1953 with governing authority consisting of a Mayor and four councilmen, and

WHEREAS, Section 3 of Housewill No. 470 adopted by the Legislature of the State of Mississippi at its regular 1962 Session, provides for five councilmen and a mayor, but given an option to municipalities already operating under the Council-Manager Plan of Government to retain the size council in effect in such municipalities prior to September 30, 1962, which option is proposed to be exercised,

NOW, THEREFORE, Be It Ordained by the Mayor and Council of the City of Picayune, Pearl River County, Mississippi, as follows:

Section 1. That the legislative power of the City of Picayune, Mississippi shall be and shall continue to be, vested in a council, consisting of a mayor and four (4) councilmen, all to be elected at large.

Section 2. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage according to law.

The foregoing ordinance was first reduced to writing, considered and passed section by section and then as a whole, with the vote on each section and on said ordinance as a whole resulting as follows:
