RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING ACCEPTANCE OF LEASE FROM MARGARET REED CROSBY MEMORIAL FOUNDATION, A MISSISSIPPI CORPORATION, COVERING THE MARGARET REED CROSBY MEMORIAL LIBRARY AND CULTURAL CENTER, AND AUTHORIZING AND EMPOWERING THE MAYOR AND CITY CLERK TO JOIN IN EXECUTING SAID LEASE FOR AND ON BEHALF OF THE CITY OF PICAYUNE, MISSISSIPPI

BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor and Council of the City of Picayune, Mississippi:

Section 1. That the Mayor and City Clerk of the City of Picayune, Mississippi, be and they are hereby authorized and empowered, for and on behalf of said City, to accept a lease from Margaret Reed Crosby Memorial Foundation, a Mississippi corporation, leasing unto the City of Picayune, Mississippi, the Margaret Reed Crosby Memorial Library and Cultural Center, and all furniture, fixtures, equipment and appliances therewith, said lease to be in substantially the following form, to-wit:

LEASE AGREEMENT

THIS LEASE AGREEMENT made and entered into by and between Margaret Reed Crosby Memorial Foundation, a Mississippi corporation, herein represented by Lynn Crosby Gammill, Chairman of its Board of Trustees, and Thomas L. Crosby, its Secretary, hereinafter referred to as "Lessor", and City of Picayune, Mississippi, a municipal corporation under the laws of the State of Mississippi, herein represented by Granville H. Williams, Mayor, and A. L. Franklin, City Clerk, hereinafter referred to as "Lessee", witnesseth:

THAT, subject to all the terms, reservations, conditions and provisions hereinafter set out, Lessor does hereby let, lease and rent unto Lessee the following described real estate and personal property situated in the City of Picayune, Pearl River County, Mississippi, to-wit:

Entire Block Fifty-Two (52), in Williams-Goodyear Addition to the Town (now City) of Picayune, Mississippi, as per plat thereof now on file in the office of the Chancery Clerk of Pearl River County, Mississippi;

Together with all improvements thereon situated including particularly the building recently constructed thereon and established by Lessor as Margaret Reed Crosby Memorial Library and Cultural Center, and including,

also, all furniture, fixtures, equipment, appliances and other personal property now installed and/or situated in said building or upon said premises, a detailed inventory of which is on file with Lessor.

It is expressly understood and agreed that this lease is granted by Lessor, and accepted by Lessee, upon the following terms, conditions, covenants and agreements, to-wit:

- (1) This lease shall be for a term of five (5) years from and after February 22, 1963; but Lessor shall have, and hereby expressly reserves, the right and privilege to cancel and terminate this lease at any time during the term hereof, by giving Lessee written notice of termination not less than thirty (30) days prior to the effective date of such termination. Such written notice, if given by Lessor, may be delivered in person to the Mayor of the City of Picayune, Mississippi, or such notice may be sent by United States Mail, addressed to City of Picayune, City Hall, Picayune, Mississippi.
- (2) The consideration for this lease shall be the sum of One Dollar (\$1.00), to be paid by Lessee to Lessor, and other good and valuable considerations, it being understood and agreed that the principal consideration moving to Lessor for the granting of this lease is Lessor's desire that there be maintained and operated in the City of Picayune, Mississippi, a modern library and cultural center for the benefit, use and enjoyment of the inhabitants of the City of Picayune, Mississippi.
- (3) The property herein leased shall be used, occupied, maintained and operated as a municipal library and cultural center under the name, "MARGARET REED CROSBY MEMORIAL LIBRARY AND CULTURAL CENTER", and the name of said institution shall never be changed, and said property shall not be occupied or used for any other purposes.
- (4) Lessee shall immediately place the property herein leased in the possession and charge of the Board of Trustees of the Municipal Library of the City of Picayune, Mississippi, and said Board of Trustees shall immediately assume the operation and management of said library and cultural center and shall operate the same in all respects in strict compliance with all applicable statutes of the State of Mississippi governing the operation of such facilities. Said Board of Trustees shall immediately formulate, promulgate and adopt suitable and appropriate rules and regulations for the operation and administration of said library and cultural center, satisfactory to Lessor, and shall deliver to Lessor a certified copy of such rules and regulations; and after the adoption of such rules and regulations in a manner satisfactory to Lessor, the same shall not be modified, amended or repealed without the consent of Lessor. It is agreed that during the term of this lease Lessee shall consult with Lessor's Board of Trustees before making appointment or appointments to fill any vacancy or vacancies in the office of Trustee upon said Board of Trustees of the Municipal Library of the City of Picayune, Mississippi.
- (5) Lessor, for its own account, shall carry and maintain fire and extended coverage insurance upon the buildings herein leased in the sum of \$_____, and upon the furniture, fixtures, equipment and other personal property herein leased in the sum of \$_____; and as a part of the consideration for this lease, Lessee binds and obligates itself to promptly reimburse Lessor for all premiums paid by Lessor upon such insurance during the life of this lease.
- (6) Lessee, for its account, shall carry and maintain at all times during the life of this lease adequate public liability insurance coverage upon said Margaret Reed Crosby Memorial Library and Cultural Center, and upon all phases of its operation thereof, and Lessee shall bear the cost of all such liability insurance.
- (7) As a part of the consideration for this lease, Lessee binds and obligates itself to indemnify Lessor and save it harmless from any and all liability of every kind and character arising from or in anywise growing out of Lessee's use and occupancy of said premises, and the operation and maintenance of said library and cultural center.
- (8) Lessee shall bear the entire cost and expense of operating and maintaining said Margaret Reed Crosby Memorial Library and Cultural Center, including the salaries and wages of all personnel employed in such operation, all bills for water, gas, electric and telephone service, and any and all other costs and expenses of every kind and character incident to the operation and maintenance of said library and cultural center; and it is expressly understood and agreed that Lessor shall not be liable or responsible for any of such costs or expenses.
- (9) Lessee shall, at its own cost and expense, keep all of the property herein leased in good repair, and shall from time to time replace any furniture, fixtures, equipment or appliances which may be destroyed or damaged during the life of this lease, and upon termination of this lease, Lessee shall return said premises and all of the property herein leased to Lessor in as good condition as at present, ordinary wear and tear from normal use excepted.

A RESOLUTION OF THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PICAYUNE, MISSISSIPPI, PROCEEDING UNDER THE PROVISIONS OF CHAPTER 495 OF THE MISSISSIPPI LAWS OF 1950, AND ALL AMENDMENTS, FINDING AND DECLARING NECESSARY SPECIAL IMPROVEMENTS, CONSISTING OF SEWERAGE AND SEWAGE DISPOSAL SYSTEM, DRAINAGE AND OTHER WORKS INCIDENTAL THERETO ON CERTAIN STREETS AND AVENUES OF SAID CITY, AND PROPOSING TO ISSUE AND NEGOTIATE THE BONDS, NOTES OR CERTIFICATES OF INDEBTEDNESS OF SAID CITY FOR THE PURPOSE OF PAYING ALL COSTS OF SUCH IMPROVEMENTS, INCLUDING THE SAID CITY'S PORTION OF SUCH COST, AND DIRECTING NOTICE TO PROPERTY OWNERS.

BE IT RESOLVED By the Mayor and Council of the City of Picayune, Pearl River County, Mississippi, acting under the provisions of Chapter 495 of the Mississippi Laws of 1950, and all statutes amendatory thereof and in harmony therewith, that:

SECTION 1. Improvements, consisting of the construction of sewerage lines and a sewage disposal system along and to serve the following streets and avenues in the City of Picayune, Pearl River County, Mississippi, to-wit:

Commencing at the Northwest corner of Section 23, Township 6 South, Range 17 West, Pearl River County, Mississippi; thence East 628 feet, thence South 49 degrees 30 minutes East 450 feet

along the South margin of Ridge Road to the point of beginning, thence North 40 degrees 30 minutes East 240 feet to a point 200 feet from and perpendicular to the North margin of Ridge Road, thence South 49 degrees 30 minutes East 4270 feet parallel to the North margin of Ridge Road to the West right of way of Interstate Highway No. 59, thence South 15 degrees 22 minutes West along the West right of way 486 feet, thence North 49 degrees 30 minutes West 1105 feet parallel to the South margin of Ridge Road to the half-section line, thence West along half-section line 955 feet, thence North 49 degrees 26 minutes West 2648 feet, thence North 40 degrees 30 minutes East 842 feet to the South margin of Ridge Road and the point of beginning, being a part of Section 23, Township 6 South, Range 17 West, Pearl River County, Mississippi,

including all streets therein as follows:

(1) RIDGE ROAD: Commencing at its junction with Interstate Highway #59, and thence running Northerly to a point which is described as commencing 628 feet East of Northwest corner of Section 23, Township 6 South, Range 17 West, thence run South 49 degrees 30 minutes East 450 feet along the South margin of Ridge Road.

(2) CEDAR GROVE AVENUE: Which street runs parallel with Ridge Road, and situated 282 feet Southwesterly from said Ridge Road - Commencing at the junction of an extension of this street with Interstate Highway #59, thence run Northerly parallel with Ridge Road and 282 feet therefrom to the Northwesterly line of the above metes and bounds description of the entire area to be served.

(3) FLAT TOP AVENUE: Which street runs parallel with Ridge Road, and situated 572 feet Southwesterly from said Ridge Road - Commencing at the junction of this street with the South line of North Half of Section 23, Township 6 South, Range 17 West, thence run Northerly parallel with Ridge Road and 572 feet therefrom to the Northwesterly line of the above metes and bounds description of the entire area to be served.

(4) UNNAMED STREET: Which street is described as Commencing about 668 feet East of the Northwest corner of Section 23, Township 6 South, Range 17 West at point where North line of said Section intersects the North margin of Ridge Road, thence run South 49 degrees 30 minutes East 1390 feet more or less to Southeast corner of Ben Frierson lot described in Land Deed Record 93, page 98 in the Land Deed Records of Pearl River County, Mississippi, for place of beginning, thence run North 51 degrees 30 minutes East 200 feet, thence run South 38 degrees 30 minutes East 50 feet, thence run South 51 degrees 30 minutes West 200 feet to the North margin of Ridge Road, thence run North 59 degrees 30 minutes West 50 feet along North margin of said road to the point of beginning.

SECTION 2. Such improvements as hereinabove described in Section 1 are hereby declared to be necessary.

SECTION 3. The plans and specifications heretofore prepared by Broadway and Seal, Consulting Engineers, and submitted at this meeting and now on file in the office of the City Clerk of said City, covering the proposed construction of the improvements enumerated and referred to in Section 1 hereof, are hereby approved and adopted.

SECTION 4. The grades and materials and manner of construction with which said improvements are to be made are those set forth in the aforementioned plans and specifications, prepared by said Engineer, which have been adopted, as aforesaid, and which are now on file in the office of the City Clerk of said City of Picayune, and as provided in such plans and specifications.

SECTION 5. The cost of making such improvements requires an unusual outlay of expense for which the General Improvement Funds of the City of Picayune are not sufficient and for which purpose the said General Improvement Funds should not be used. Therefore, the expense and cost of such improvements, including all of the items of cost referred to in Chapter 495 of the Mississippi Laws of 1950, and amendments thereof, shall be assessed and paid as follows:

The entire cost and expense of planning for and construction of sewage disposal system to cover the areas described above, including the laying of sewerage lines and construction of pumping or lift station, and all costs of administrative engineering, and legal expenses, shall be assessed against the property abutting upon the streets and avenues as hereinabove described, to be determined by dividing the entire cost thereof by the total number of front feet fronting on all the streets embraced within said improvement area, and multiplying the quotient by the number of feet frontage in any particular lot or parcel of land, with the result thereof to be assessed as the amount of special tax against each lot or piece of ground within such area for the respective owner's part of the cost of the entire improvement.

SECTION 6. It is hereby found and determined by the Mayor and Council of said City that the cost to be so assessed against each of the respective abutting lots abutting upon the part of the said streets and avenues to be so improved, as hereinabove described in Section 1, is less than the benefits that will accrue to each of said respective abutting lots.

SECTION 7. The proportionate share of the total cost to be assessed against the abutting property and paid by the abutting property owners, of the streets and avenues described in Section 1, above, may be paid in either of the alternative methods provided for by Chapter 495 of the Mississippi Laws of 1950, and amendments thereof.

SECTION 8. The City of Picayune proposes to issue its bonds, notes, or certificates of indebtedness under the provisions of said Chapter 495 of the Mississippi Laws of 1950, and all amendments thereof, and other general laws in harmony therewith, and from the proceeds of the same to pay the total costs of such improvements, as such costs are determined in the manner provided by law, including both the proportionate share of the said City of Picayune, and the proportionate share of the abutting property and abutting property owners. The full faith, credit and resources of the said City of Picayune shall be pledged for the payment of both the principal of and the interest on the said obligations to be issued as aforesaid, all as provided by law, and in addition thereto, the special assessments to be made against the said abutting property, as hereinabove described in Section 1 hereof, and the lien of such special assessments, shall be pledged for the payment of such of said obligations as shall be issued to pay the abutting property owner's share of the cost of said improvements. The said bonds, notes, or certificates of indebtedness shall mature within ten years and shall draw interest on the principal thereof, not to exceed the rate of six per centum per annum.

SECTION 9. All other things, acts, requirements, conditions and precedents made and provided by the said Chapter 495 of the Mississippi Laws of 1950, and all amendments thereof, and by the general laws applicable to such matters, be done and performed for the purpose of making said improvements, for the making and levying of the special assessments on the abutting property involved as hereinabove described in Section 1, for the providing of funds for the payment of the cost of the same, and for the assessment and collection of taxes to pay said obligations and the interest thereon, and all other expenses, charges and costs connected therewith,

SECTION 10. A meeting of the Mayor and Council of the City of Picayune be, and the same will be held at the City Hall of said City at 7:00 O'Clock P. M. on the 2nd day of April, 1963 for the purpose of hearing any and all objections or remonstrances that may be made or interposed to said improvements by persons entitled by law to make and interpose such objections and remonstrances, and at the said meeting any such person aggrieved may appear in person, or by attorney, or by petition, and give or make any objection or exception to or protest against, said improvements or any part thereof, or any part or all of this resolution. At said meeting this Board will take such further action regarding said proposed improvements as are authorized by law.



AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 291 OF THE CITY OF PICAYUNE SO AS TO RECLASSIFY CERTAIN AREAS WITHIN SAID CITY

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council of the City of Picayune, by order adopted at the regular January, 1963 meeting of said Mayor and Council, the intention was declared to rezone or reclassify certain areas of said City as therein described from R-1 Residential and Industrial, respectively, to R-2 Residential areas, and

WHEREAS, notice was given for a public hearing on the question of such re-zoning or reclassification according to law and according to said order, proof of publication of such notice now being on file in the office

of the Clerk of said City, to be held on February 5, 1963 at which hearing no objection was made to such rezoning or reclassification of the said areas, and

WHEREAS, it has been heretofore, and is hereby, adjudicated and determined by the Mayor and Council of said City that such rezoning and reclassification of the said areas is not detrimental to the general welfare of said City and that all things required to be done as conditions precedent to such rezoning and reclassification have done.

NOW, THEREFORE, Be It Ordained by the Mayor and Council of the City of Picayune as follows:

Section 1. That the following areas in the City of Picayune be, and they are hereby reclassified and zoned as R-2 Residential Areas to-wit:

1. Commencing at the Northwest corner of Section 15, Township 6 South, Range 17 West, thence run South on Section line 1980 feet, thence run East 295.7 feet, thence run North 300 feet for a place of beginning, thence run East 150 feet, thence run North 300 feet, thence run West 150 feet to the East side of Clark Street, thence run South along said side of said Clark Street 300 feet to the place of beginning, and being part of SW $\frac{1}{4}$ of NE $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 15, Township 6 South, Range 17 West.

2. Beginning at a point 30 feet West and 30 feet South of the common corner between Sections 16, 15, 10 and 9, thence run West 272.4 feet, thence South 3 degrees 46 minutes East 1352.92 feet, thence run East 183.5 feet to West margin of Beech Street, thence North along West margin of said Beech Street 1350 feet to the place of beginning, containing 5.814 acres more or less and being a part of the NE $\frac{1}{4}$ of the NE $\frac{1}{4}$ and a part of the SE $\frac{1}{4}$ of the NE $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 16, Township 6 South, Range 17 West, in Pearl River County, Mississippi.



AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE NO.
281 OF THE CITY OF PICAYUNE SO AS
TO RECLASSIFY CERTAIN AREAS WITHIN
SAID CITY

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council of the City of Picayune, by order adopted at the regular May 7, 1963 meeting of said Mayor and Council, the intention was declared to rezone or reclassify certain areas of said City as therein described from R-2 Residential to B-3 Central Business District, and

WHEREAS, notice was given for a public hearing on the question of such re-zoning or reclassification according to law and according to said order, proof of publication of such notice now being on file in the office of the Clerk of said City, to be held on May 7, 1963, at which hearing no objection was made to such rezoning or reclassification of the said area, and

WHEREAS, it has been heretofore, and is hereby, adjudicated and determined by the Mayor and Council of said City that such rezoning and reclassification of the said area is not detrimental to the general welfare of said City and that all things required to be done as conditions precedent to such rezoning and reclassification have done.

NOW, THEREFORE, Be It Ordained by the Mayor and Council of the City of Picayune as follows:

Section 1. That the following area in the City of Picayune be, and it is hereby reclassified and zoned as B-3 Central Business District to-wit:

Commencing at the intersection of West Canal Street with Oak Street, or extension thereof, and extending Westerly therefrom and at a depth of 150 feet from West Canal Street on each side thereof to the intersection of West Canal Street with Kirkwood Street.

and that the Official Zoning Map of said City be, and it is hereby, amended to show said described areas as B-3 Central Business District.





RAILROAD AGREEMENT

WHEREAS, it is necessary that a portion of Canal Street in the City of Picayune be widened and improved across the property of the New Orleans and Northeastern Railroad Company, and

WHEREAS, the said corporation has agreed to such improvement of said street on the terms and conditions as outlined in a proposed contract, copy of which is as follows, to-wit:

THIS AGREEMENT, entered into by and between

NEW ORLEANS AND NORTHEASTERN RAILROAD COMPANY, A Mississippi corporation, hereinafter styled Railroad, party of the first part; and

WITNESSETH: That

WHEREAS, City proposes to widen, pave and improve a portion of Canal Street located upon and across the right of way or property of Railroad and across, at grade, its tracks at PICAYUNE, MISSISSIPPI, and Railroad is willing to permit such improvement, construction and maintenance upon and across said right of way or property and track 149-4, but upon the following terms and conditions;

NOW, THEREFORE, the parties hereto agree as follows:

(1) Railroad hereby grants unto City, in so far as its title enables it so to do, but without warranty, the right or license to widen, pave and otherwise improve and maintain in accordance with this agreement and the aforesaid Canal Street for public highway purposes upon said right of way or property and track of Railroad, as aforesaid, at PICAYUNE, Mississippi, the portion of property of Railroad to be used for said improvement being located substantially as shown in red on print of Drawing No. N-1072, dated March 4, 1963, hereto annexed and made a part of this agreement, and to be improved in accordance with the plans shown on said print and such specifications as may be prescribed by Railroad; SUBJECT, however, to such rights as Sinclair Refining Company and Pure Oil Company may have to maintain the gasoline filling stations located as shown on said annexed print; RESERVING, however, unto Railroad the right to continue to maintain, repair, renew and operate said track and appurtenances across said street, and to construct such additional tracks and other railroad facilities across said street and to maintain, repair, renew and operate the same as in the judgment of Railroad may be requisite.

(2) City will pave and otherwise improve said street, in so far as the same may be located upon said right of way or property of Railroad, to conform with the present grade of said track of Railroad and provide proper and adequate drainage for the road crossing as well as proper clearance for wires and other structures on the property of Railroad.

(3) The work of widening and paving of the aforementioned portion of Canal Street on said property of Railroad shall be performed at the sole expense of City. Upon the completion of the widening and paving of said Canal Street, City will maintain said Canal Street, improved as aforesaid, including any drainage facilities installed in connection therewith, at its own expense, and in no event shall Railroad be charged or assessed, now or hereafter, for any expense involved in the construction or maintenance of said street within the limits of the right of way or property of Railroad; said street to be improved and maintained in such manner that the same, or the use thereof by City shall not be or become an obstruction to or interfere with any use made or to be made of said right of way or property for railroad purposes or the safe and proper operation and maintenance of the roadbed or the tracks, wires, lines or appurtenances or structures upon the said right of way or property or the proper drainage of the roadbed and property of said Railroad, or endanger life or limb of employees of Railroad or other persons on the property of Railroad.







ORDINANCE NO. 296
REGULATING MOBILE HOME PARKS

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE Mayor and Council of the City of Picayune,

Section 1. Definitions

As used in this ordinance

- (a) "Mobile Home" means any vehicle or similar portable structure having no foundation other than wheels, jacks or skirtings and so designed or constructed as to permit occupancy for dwelling or sleeping purposes.
- (b) "Mobile home park" means any plot of ground upon which two or more mobile homes, occupied for dwelling or sleeping purposes, are located, regardless of whether or not a charge is made for such accommodation.
- (c) "Mobile home space" means a plot of ground within a mobile home park designed for the accommodation of one mobile home.
- (d) "Multiple dwelling" means any structure designed and intended to accommodate more than one family and includes but is not limited to duplex buildings, group houses and apartment buildings.
- (e) "Natural or artificial barrier" means any river, pond, canal, railroad, levee, embankment, fence or hedge.
- (f) "Park" means mobile home park.
- (g) "Permittee" means any person to whom a temporary permit is issued to maintain or operate a mobile home park under the provisions of this ordinance.
- (h) "Person" means any natural individual, firm, trust, partnership, association or corporation.

Section 2. License and Temporary Permit.

- (a) It shall be unlawful for any person to maintain or operate a mobile home park within the limits of the city, unless such person shall first obtain a license therefor, except that the maintenance or operation of a mobile home park in existence on the effective date of this ordinance may be continued under a temporary permit for such period of time and under such conditions as are hereinafter prescribed.
- (b) A temporary permit, upon written request therefor, shall be issued by the Mayor and Council for every mobile home park in existence upon the effective date of this ordinance, permitting the park to be maintained and operated during the period ending 180 days after the effective date of this ordinance, without being subject to the provisions of this ordinance, except such of the provisions as are made expressly applicable to permittees.
- (c) The term of the temporary permit shall be extended, upon written request, for not to exceed one additional period of 180 days, if (1) the permittee shall have filed application for a license in conformity with section 4 of this ordinance within 90 days after the effective date of this ordinance, (2) the permittee is of good moral character, and the park plans and specifications accompanying the application for license comply with all provisions of this ordinance and all other applicable ordinance and statutes, (3) the permittee shall have diligently endeavored to make the existing park conform fully to the plans and specifications submitted with the applications, and (4) failure to make the existing park conform fully to such plans and specifications shall have been due to causes beyond the control of the permittee.

Section 3. License Fees and Temporary Permit Fees.

- (a) The annual license fee for each mobile home park shall be that prescribed by the Mississippi Local Privilege Tax Laws.
- (b) The fee for transfer of a license shall be \$5.00.
- (c) The temporary permit fee for each 180 day period shall be one-half of the annual license fee prescribed in subsection (a) of this section.

Section 4. Application for License.

- (a) Application for initial license.

Application for an initial mobile home park license shall be filed with the Mayor and Council and issued by the City Clerk. The application shall be in writing, signed by the applicant and shall include the following:

- (1) The name and address of the applicant;
- (2) The location and legal description of the mobile home park;
- (3) A complete plan of the park in conformity with the requirements of section 6 of this ordinance;
- (4) Plans and specifications of all buildings, improvements and facilities constructed or to be constructed within the mobile home park;

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(5) Such further information as may be requested by the Mayor and Council to enable it to determine if the proposed park will comply with legal requirements.

The application and all accompanying plans and specifications shall be filed in duplicate. The City Manager or City Clerk shall investigate the applicant and inspect the applications and the proposed plans and specifications. If the applicant is of good moral character, and the proposed mobile home park will, when constructed or altered in accordance with such plans and specifications, be in compliance with all provisions of this ordinance and all other applicable ordinances and statutes, the Mayor and Council shall approve the applications, and upon completion of the park according to the plans the City Clerk shall issue the license.

(b) Application for renewal license.

Upon applications in writing by a licensee for renewal of a license and upon payment of the annual license fee, the City Clerk shall issue a certificate renewing such license for another year.

(c) Application for transfer of license.

Upon applications in writing for transfer of a license and payment of the transfer fee, the City Clerk shall issue a transfer if the transferee is of good moral character.

Section 5. Location.

Mobile home parks may be located in any business district and in which multiple dwelling are permitted. Each boundary of the park must be at least 200 feet from any permanent residential building located outside the park, unless separated therefrom by a natural or artificial barrier, or unless a majority of the property owners according to area within said 200 feet, consent in writing to the establishment of the park.

Section 6. Mobile Home Park Plan.

The mobile home park shall conform to the following requirements:

(a) The park shall be located on a well-drained site, properly graded to insure rapid drainage and freedom from stagnant pools of water.

(b) Mobile Home spaces shall be provided consisting of a minimum of 1500 square feet for each space which shall be at least 30 feet wide and clearly defined; provided, however, that mobile home parks in existence on the effective date of this ordinance which provide mobile home spaces having a width or area less than that hereinabove prescribed may continue to operate with spaces of the existing width and area, but in no event, shall any mobile home space be less than 25 feet wide and have an area of less than 1000 square feet.

(c) Mobile homes shall be so harbored on each space that there shall be at least a 15 foot clearance between mobile homes, provided, however, that with respect to mobile homes parked end-to-end, the end-to-end clearance may be less than 15 feet but shall not be less than 10 feet. No mobile home shall be located closer than 10 feet from any building within the park or from any property line bounding the park.

(d) All mobile home spaces shall abut upon a driveway of not less than 20 feet in width, which shall have unobstructed access to a public street, alley or highway.

(e) All driveways within the park shall be hard surfaced and lighted at night with electric lamps of not less than 25 watts each, spaced at intervals of not more than 100 feet.

(f) An electrical outlet supplying at least 110 volts shall be provided for each mobile home space.

Section 7. Water Supply.

An adequate supply of pure water for drinking and domestic purposes shall be supplied by pipes to all buildings and mobile home spaces within the park to meet the requirement of the park. Each mobile home space shall be provided with a cold water tap at least four inches above the ground.

Section 8. Sewage and Refuse Disposal.

(a) Waste from showers, bath tubs, flush toilets, urinals, lavatories, slop sinks and laundries in service and other buildings within the park shall be discharged into a public sewer system in compliance with applicable ordinances or into a private sewer and disposal plant or septic tank system of such construction and in such manner as will present no health hazard.

(b) Each mobile home space shall be provided with a trapped sewer at least four inches in diameter, which shall be connected to receive the waste from the shower, bath tub, flush toilet, lavatory and kitchen sink of the mobile home harbored in such space and having any or all of such facilities. The trapped sewer in each space shall be connected to discharge the mobile home waste into a public sewer system in compliance with applicable ordinances or into a private sewer disposal plant or septic tank system of such construction and in such manner as will present no health hazard.

Section 9. Garbage Receptacles.

Metal garbage cans with tight fitting covers shall be provided in quantities adequate to permit disposal of all garbage and rubbish. Garbage cans shall be located not farther than 300 feet from any mobile home space. The cans shall be kept in sanitary condition at all times. Garbage and rubbish shall be collected and disposed of as frequently as may be necessary to insure that the garbage cans shall not overflow.

Section 10. Fire Protection.

Every park shall be equipped at all times with fire extinguishing equipment in good working order, of such type, size and number and so located within the park as to satisfy applicable reasonable regulations of the fire department. No open fires shall be permitted at any place which may endanger life or property. No fires shall be left unattended at any time.

Section 11. Animals and Pets.

No owner or person in charge of any dog, cat or other pet animal shall permit it to run at large or commit any nuisance within the limits of any mobile home park.

Section 12. Register of Occupants.

It shall be the duty of each licensee and permittee to keep a register containing a record of all mobile home owners and occupants located within the park. The register shall contain the following information:

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- (a) The name and address of each mobile home occupant;
- (b) The name and address of the owner of each mobile home and motor vehicle by which it is towed;
- (c) The make, model, year and license number of each mobile home and motor vehicle;
- (d) The state, territory or country issuing such licenses;
- (e) The date of arrival and of departure of each mobile home.

The park shall keep the register available for inspection at all times by law enforcement officers, public health officials and other officials whose duties necessitate acquisition of the information contained in the register. The register record for each occupant registered shall not be destroyed for a period of three years following the date of departure of the registrant from the park.

Section 13. Supervision.

The licensee or permittee, or a duly authorized attendant or caretaker, shall be in charge at all times to keep the mobile home park, its facilities and equipment, in a clean, orderly and sanitary condition. The attendant or caretaker shall be answerable, with the licensee or permittee, for the violation of any provision of this ordinance to which the licensee or permittee is subject.

Section 14. Revocation of License.

The Mayor and Council may revoke any license to maintain and operate a park when the licensee has been found guilty by a court of competent jurisdiction of violating any provision of this ordinance. After such conviction, the license may be reissued if the circumstances leading to conviction have been remedied and the park is being maintained and operated in full compliance with law.

Section 15. Posting of License and Temporary Permit.

The license certificate or temporary permit shall be conspicuously posted in the office of or on the premises of the mobile park at all times.

Section 16. Separability of Provisions.

Should any section or provision of this ordinance be declared invalid, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this ordinance.

Section 17. Penalty.

Any person violating this ordinance shall be fined not less than \$5.00 nor more than \$100.00 for each offense.

Section 18. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force as provided by law.

ORDINANCE EXTENDING AND ENLARGING THE BOUNDARIES OF THE CITY OF PICAYUNE, DEFINING THE ADDITIONAL TERRITORY, SETTING FORTH THE PROPOSED BOUNDARIES OF SAID CITY AND DESCRIBING THE PROPOSED IMPROVEMENTS TO BE MADE IN AND THE PUBLIC SERVICES TO BE RENDERED IN THE TERRITORY PROPOSED TO BE ANNEKED

WHEREAS, the recent establishment of the Mississippi Test Facility of the National Aeronautics and Space Administration of the United States adjacent to the Corporate Limits of the City of Picayune has resulted in the recent purchase by various individuals, firms and corporations of proposed sites for subdivisions, housing, commercial and industrial developments of all kinds, so that already subdivisions have been laid out and lots sold in areas near to said City, that thus an unusual situation has been created, with an unprecedented and imminently rapid growth for said city and said area to the South and West thereof impending requiring that something be immediately done to provide for the orderly future development and growth of the area to the South and West of said City to prevent the accrual and creation of tremendous problems that are necessarily attendant upon such development and growth were it allowed to proceed unregulated and uncontrolled, and

SECTION 3. That the improvements proposed to be made by said City in the new territory included in this ordinance, and as described in Section 1 hereof, are as follows, to-wit:

- (1) Maintenance and construction of any necessary streets within said territory, such improvement to be completed as speedily as is practicable and economically feasible; installation where necessary and maintenance of existing water lines and installation of any street lighting where and when necessary; these improvements to be completed within two years from the effective date and final approval of this ordinance,
- (2) Construction of any and all necessary drainage facilities within the annexed territory, when and where necessary.
- (3) Construction of Sewage disposal facilities and any and all other improvements as generally furnished in similar areas within said City when and where necessary and economically feasible.

SECTION 4. That the public services which shall be rendered by the City of Picayune within the new territory as described in Section 1 hereof, are as follows, to-wit:

Police protection, fire protection, maintenance of any existing streets and roadways, beginning on the effective date of this ordinance.

Furnishing of services of Municipal Natural Gas Distribution System at municipal rates, as speedily as can be economically installed.

Furnishing of Waste and Garbage Disposal Service on the same basis as for similar property within the present boundaries of the City of Picayune within a period of approximately six months from date of final approval of this ordinance.

Furnishing street lighting where necessary, on same basis as similar areas now within the City.

Furnishing of services of fogging machine for insect extermination on same basis as now furnished in similar areas within said City.

Furnishing of other services offered by the City of Picayune in similar areas now within said City when and where necessary and economically feasible.

Furnishing of services of Municipal Water System as speedily as can be installed.

SECTION 5. That the Attorney for the City of Picayune shall, and he is hereby, ordered to file a petition in the Chancery Court of Pearl River County, Mississippi, which petition shall recite the fact of the adoption of this ordinance, and shall pray that the enlargement of the municipal boundaries of the City of Picayune as herein set out shall be ratified and approved by said court, attaching to said petition, as exhibits thereto, a certified copy of this ordinance, and a map or plat of the municipal boundaries as they will exist in accordance with this ordinance.

SECTION 6. That this ordinance shall be effective as provided by law and that effective upon expiration of ten days from and after the final ratification, approval and confirmation of this ordinance by the Chancery Court of Pearl River County, Mississippi, in accordance with the terms and provisions of Chapter 491 of the Laws of Mississippi for the year 1950 and other statutes applicable thereto, all ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

ORDINANCE NO. 303

AN ORDINANCE MAKING IT UNLAWFUL TO CURSE, INSULT, DERIDE, RIDICULE OR USE ABUSIVE LANGUAGE TOWARD POLICEMEN, AUXILIARY POLICEMEN, AND FIREMEN ENGAGED IN PROPER PERFORMANCE OF OFFICIAL DUTIES; AND FIXING A PENALTY FOR THE VIOLATION THEREOF

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PICAYUNE, PEARL RIVER COUNTY, MISSISSIPPI:

Section 1. It shall be unlawful for any person to curse, insult deride, ridicule, or use abusive language toward a member of the Police Department of the City of Picayune, Mississippi, or a member of the auxiliary police force of said City, or a member of the Fire Department of said City, while said member of the Police Department, or member of the auxiliary police force, or member of the Fire Department is properly performing his official duties.

Section 2. Every person convicted of a violation of any provision of this ordinance shall be punished by a fine of not more than \$100.00 or by imprisonment for not more than 30 days or by both such fine and imprisonment.

Section 3. Policemen of said City have been, and are being, impeded in the proper performance of their duties by conduct made unlawful by this ordinance and this ordinance being for the immediate, temporary and permanent preservation of the public peace, health and safety, shall be in effect from and after its passage and approval by the Mayor and Council.

ORDINANCE NO. 304

AN ORDINANCE SETTING FORTH THE PURPOSES FOR WHICH STREETS AND SIDEWALKS ARE MAINTAINED AND MAKING IT UNLAWFUL FOR ANY PERSON WITH CERTAIN EXCEPTIONS TO PARADE OR MARCH OR TO SIT, KNEEL, OR RECLINE, OR TO ENGAGE IN PUBLIC SPEAKING, GROUP SHOUTING OR GROUP SINGING OR TO ASSEMBLE IN ORGANIZED GROUPS ON THE SIDEWALKS, STREETS AND OTHER PUBLIC WAYS OF THE CITY OF PICAYUNE, MISSISSIPPI, OR TO INTERFERE WITH THE NORMAL USE OF SUCH SIDEWALKS, STREETS AND OTHER PUBLIC WAYS WITHOUT WRITTEN PERMIT PRESCRIBING REGULATIONS FOR PICAYUNE AND MAKING IT UNLAWFUL TO PLACE DEBRIS ON SUCH STREETS, SIDEWALKS AND OTHER PUBLIC WAYS, AND PROVIDING THAT THIS ORDINANCE BE EFFECTIVE ON THE DATE OF ITS PASSAGE

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PICAYUNE, MISSISSIPPI:

Section 1. THE PURPOSES OF STREETS, SIDEWALKS AND OTHER PUBLIC WAYS. The City of Picayune, Mississippi has constructed and maintains its streets, sidewalks, alleys and other public ways for the purpose of affording pedestrians comfortable, safe and convenient means of going from place to place in said City for the purpose of carrying out the normal, customary and usual pursuits of every day life. Said City has constructed and maintains the vehicular portions of its streets for the additional purpose of affording the general public comfortable, safe and convenient means for transporting persons and property from place to place in said City, principally by vehicles, for the purpose of carrying out the normal, customary and usual pursuits of everyday life. Use of the said streets, sidewalks, alleys and other public ways by any person or persons for purposes other than those above set out interferes with the right of the public in general to use said sidewalks and streets for the purposes for which they were built and are maintained, and is, therefore, contrary to public convenience, is conducive to public disorder, is dangerous to public safety, and is calculated to cause breaches of the peace. Therefore, the provisions of this ordinance relative to the use of the sidewalks and streets in said City shall be construed against the person or persons violating same.

MUNICIPAL MINUTES, CITY OF PICAYUNE

Section 2. It shall be unlawful for any person or persons without the written permission of the Chief of Police of the City of Picayune, Mississippi to encourage, organize, promote, conduct, or participate in, any parade or marching on the sidewalks, streets and public ways of the said City, or to walk, ride or stand in organized groups on said sidewalks or streets while carrying banners, placards, signs or the like, or to sit, kneel, or recline on the sidewalks or streets of said City, or to engage in public speaking, group shouting, group singing or any other similar distracting activity on any of the sidewalks, streets or public ways of said City, or to assemble in groups on any sidewalk or street in such numbers or manner as to block or interfere with the customary and normal use thereof by the public unless the persons so assembled in such groups are engaged in watching a march or parade authorized by the provisions hereof; provided, however, that no written permission of the Chief of Police of said City shall be required for a bona fide funeral procession en route to a cemetery or for any parade or march by any unit of the Mississippi National Guard or the United States Army, Navy, Air Force, or Marine Corps, or personnel of the Police or Fire Department of said City of Picayune, Mississippi.

Section 3. In the event of any picketing of any particular place of business in said City, all such pickets shall walk singly, with no pairs or more abreast of each other, and shall follow other pickets at a distance of no closer than six feet, to the end that no sidewalks or public ways shall be blocked or impeded.

Section 4. It shall be unlawful for any person or persons to throw or place nails, tacks, bottles, rocks, bricks, paper, trash or other debris of any kind on any sidewalk or street of the City of Picayune, Mississippi.

Section 5. Every person convicted of a violation of any provisions of this ordinance shall be punished by a fine of not more than \$100.00 or by imprisonment for not more than 30 days or by both such fine and imprisonment.

Section 6. Conduct made unlawful by this ordinance has been threatened in said City, and in order to preserve the public peace, safety and order and to promote the public welfare, it is necessary that this ordinance being for the immediate and temporary preservation of the public peace, health and safety of said City shall be effective immediately, and, therefore, by unanimous vote of all members of the Mayor and Council of said City, it is ordered that this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the date of its passage.

RESOLUTION FIXING LEVIES FOR 1963 TAXES

WHEREAS, Section 23 of Chapter 492 of Mississippi Laws of 1950, Section 3, Chapter 497 of Mississippi Laws of 1950, and Section 4 of House Bill No. 6 of Mississippi Laws of 1958, all as amended, provide that the governing authorities of each municipality in the State of Mississippi shall levy the municipal ad valorem taxes for each taxable year, said levy or levies to be expressed in mills or decimal fractions of a mill, and such levy or levies shall determine the ad valorem taxes to be collected upon each dollar of valuation on the assessment rolls of the municipality; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council of the City of Picayune, Pearl River County, Mississippi, have completed the revision and equalization of the assessment rolls for taxes for the taxable year 1963, have approved the assessments of motor vehicles in said City and in the Picayune Municipal Separate School District by resolution adopted at a public meeting held on July 2, 1963, and have approved the real property and personal property assessment rolls of said City and of said Municipal Separate School District for said year by a resolution adopted at a public meeting held on September 12, 1963, these resolutions being in Minute Book 11 on pages 96, 97, 98, 99, 100, 101, 102, 103, 104, 105, 106, 107, 108 and 109, respectively, and

WHEREAS, the assessment of public utilities has been approximated at \$950,000; and

WHEREAS, the Budget of Expenditures of Picayune Municipal Separate School District for the current fiscal year was filed on August 6, 1963 by the Board of Trustees of said School District, and which said Budget of Revenues and Expenditures is recorded in these minutes on pages 85 and 86; and

WHEREAS, the Current fiscal budget of Crosby Memorial Hospital was filed on August 20, 1963, by the Trustees of said Hospital, which said budget was approved by the Mayor and Council and is now on file in the office of the City Clerk; and

WHEREAS, the Budget of Revenues and Expenditures of the City of Picayune for the fiscal year beginning October 1, 1963 and ending September 30, 1964, was adopted by said Mayor and Council on August 19, 1963, and is recorded in these minutes on pages 74, 75, and 76; and

WHEREAS, the Budget of Revenues and Expenditures of the Margaret Reed Crosby Memorial Library for the current fiscal year was filed on August 20, 1963, by the Trustees of said Library, which said budget was approved by the Mayor and Council and is now on file in the office of the City Clerk; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED AND ADJUDGED by the Mayor and Council of the City of Picayune, Pearl River County, Mississippi, that in accordance with the Budgets of Expenditures and the assessments of taxable property within the City of Picayune and Picayune Municipal Separate School District, the following ad valorem tax rates or levies be and the same are hereby imposed and levied for the fiscal year 1963-64, upon the assessed value of all taxable property in the City of Picayune, and the Picayune Municipal Separate School District, Pearl River County, Mississippi, as the property is now assessed and listed or as may hereafter be assessed and listed upon the

assessment rolls of said City and District as of January 1, 1963, subject to the exempt value of homes to the extent exempt by the Homestead Exemption Act for Municipal Separate School District, the said rates expressed in mills or a decimal fraction of a mill, being levied and imposed upon each dollar of assessed valuation appearing upon the assessment rolls of said City and Municipal Separate School District in accordance with the provisions of the statutes of the State of Mississippi to which reference is made hereinabove, the said rates or levies are for the following funds or purposes:

1. For the purpose of raising a fund to support the Minimum School Program as requested by the State Board of Education and as provided by Section 2 of Chapter 261, of the Mississippi Laws of 1954, as amended (6518-02) 3.50 mills on the dollar to be levied upon property within the City Limits and upon Picayune Municipal Separate School District property outside the City Limits.
2. For the purpose of raising a fund for general school district maintenance purposes as provided by Section 6 of Chapter 261 of the Mississippi Laws of 1954, as amended (6518-06) and other amendatory statutes 20.50 mills on the dollar to be levied upon property both within the City Limits and upon Picayune Municipal Separate School District property outside the City Limits.
3. For the purpose of raising a fund for the retirement of bonds issued to finance alterations and additions to Bertie Rouse Grammar School, to Carver High School, and to purchase fixtures and equipment and for the payment of interest thereon as provided by Chapter 30 of the Mississippi Laws of 1953 Extraordinary Session50 mills on the dollar to be levied upon property both within the City Limits and upon Picayune Municipal Separate School District property outside the City Limits.
4. For the purpose of raising a fund for the retirement of bonds issued for the purpose of financing construction and equipping of an annex to the Picayune Memorial High School building and making alterations of said high school building and also of construction and equipping of an auditorium and class rooms as provided by Chapter 231 of the Mississippi Laws of 1950 and amended and for the payment of interest thereon 2.00 mills on the dollar to be levied upon property both within the City Limits and upon Picayune Municipal Separate School District property outside the City Limits.
5. For the purpose of raising a fund for the retirement of notes issued for the purpose of financing alterations and additions to West Side Elementary School and to purchase land adjacent to Carver High School for school purposes and to purchase heating plants, fixtures and equipment for the buildings of said district and for the payment of interest thereon as provided by Chapter 30 of Mississippi Laws of 1953, extraordinary session75 mills on the dollar to be levied upon property both within the City Limits and upon Picayune Municipal Separate School District property, outside the City Limits.
6. For the purpose of raising a fund for the retirement of notes and interest thereon of the Nicholson Consolidated School District, liability assumed by Picayune Municipal Separate School District, as annexed territory under Chapter 16 of the Mississippi Laws of 195225 mills on the dollar to be levied upon property both within the City Limits and upon Picayune Municipal Separate School District property outside the City Limits.
7. For the purpose of raising funds for the retirement of bonds issued for general street improvement purposes, and for the payment of interest thereon as provided by Chapter 493 of the Mississippi Laws of 1950, as amended 4.00 mills on the dollar to be levied only against property within the City Limits.
8. For the purpose of raising funds for the retirement of bonds issued for the acquisition of new fire station and additional fire protection, and for paying interest due thereon as provided by Chapter 493 of the Mississippi Laws of 1950, as amended50 mills on the dollar to be levied only against property within the City Limits.
9. For the purpose of raising funds for the retirement of bonds issued for the purpose of financing repairs, improvements, and air conditioning on the City Hall building of said City and for the payment of interest thereon as provided by Chapter 472 of the Mississippi Laws of 1950, as amended50 mills on the dollar to be levied only against property within the City Limits.
10. For the purpose of raising funds for general city expense, as fixed and limited by Chapter 496 of Mississippi Laws of 1950 3.85 mills on the dollar to be levied only against property within the City Limits.
11. For the purpose of raising a fund for library support, upkeep and maintenance as provided by Section 2, Chapter 213 of the Mississippi Laws of 1944 1.00 mill on the dollar to be levied only against property within the City Limits.
12. For the purpose of raising a fund to establish and equip library as provided by Section 6201 of the Mississippi Code of 1942, as amended by Chapter 479 of the Mississippi Laws of 195815 mill on the dollar to be levied only against property within the City Limits.
13. For the purpose of raising a fund for general hospital maintenance and operation as provided by Chapter 277, Section 3 of the Mississippi Laws of 1944; Chapter 294, Section 3 of the Mississippi Laws of 1954; Chapter 550 of the Laws of Mississippi of 1958 (Section 7129-52, Mississippi Code of 1942.) 1.50 Mills on the dollar to be levied only against property within the City Limits. This levy of 1.50 mills is to supplement the regular receipts from patients and from Pearl River County for Picayune Municipal Hospital, known as Lucious Olen Crosby Memorial Hospital.





WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council of the City of Picayune, by order adopted at their recessed regular September, 1963 meeting, declared their intention to rezone or reclassify certain areas of said City as therein described, and

WHEREAS, notice was given for public hearing on the question of such rezoning or reclassification according to law and according to said order, proof of publication of said notice now being on file in the office of the Clerk of said City, to be held on October 15, 1963 at which hearing no objection was made to such rezoning or reclassification of said areas, and

WHEREAS, it has been heretofore, and is hereby, adjudicated and determined by the Mayor and Council of said City that such rezoning and reclassification of said areas is not detrimental to the general welfare of said City and that all things required to be done as conditions precedent to such rezoning and reclassification have been done,

NOW, THEREFORE, Be It Ordained by the Mayor and Council of the City of Picayune that Ordinance No. 281 of said City be amended as follows:

1. WHEREAS, the recent establishment of the Mississippi Test Facility to the National Aeronautics and Space Administration of the United States adjacent to the Corporate Limits of the City of Picayune has resulted in the recent purchase by various individuals, firms and corporations of proposed sites for subdivisions, housing, commercial and industrial developments of all kinds, so that already subdivisions have been laid out and lots sold in areas near to said City, that thus an unusual situation has been created, with an unprecedented and imminently rapid growth for said city requiring that something be immediately done to provide for the orderly future development and growth of said City to prevent the accrual and creation of tremendous problems that are necessarily attendant upon such development and growth were it allowed to proceed unregulated and uncontrolled, and

WHEREAS, the City of Picayune has heretofore employed City Planning Consultants to plan the future development and growth of the said City in an orderly manner, with such planning continuing presently as to outlying and adjacent areas, as a result of which the Planning Commission of the City of Picayune has recommended the annexation of the areas hereinafter described, and

WHEREAS, it is for the best interest and welfare of said City and the property owners in the areas hereinafter described that the boundaries of said City be extended and enlarged so as to include the area hereinafter described within said City,

NOW, THEREFORE, Be It Ordained by the Mayor and Council of the City of Picayune, Pearl River County, Mississippi, as follows, to-wit:

SECTION 1. That, in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 491 of the Laws of the State of Mississippi for the year 1950 and other applicable statutes and subject to the provisions thereof, the boundaries of the City of Picayune, Pearl River County, Mississippi, shall be, and are hereby enlarged so as to include the following described adjacent territory, to-wit:

Beginning at the Southwest corner of Section 1, Township 6 South, Range 17 West, thence South 89 degrees 55 minutes West 1485.25 feet, thence North 17 degrees 53 minutes 50 seconds East 296.53 feet; thence South 72 degrees 06 minutes 10 seconds East 300 feet; Thence North 17 degrees 53 minutes 50 seconds East 148.72 feet more or less to the centerline of Mississippi Power Company easement; thence North 89 degrees 28 minutes 15 seconds East along said centerline 1985 feet more or less to the intersection of the centerline of the Mississippi Power Company easement which runs Southeast; thence North 80 feet more or less to the centerline of Mississippi Power Company easement (secured and constructed 1962); thence Easterly along said centerline 765 feet; thence South 432 feet more or less to the Section line; thence West along the Section line 1690 feet more or less to the point of beginning, containing 20 acres more or less

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and being a part of the SE $\frac{1}{2}$ of Section 2, Township 6 South, Range 17 West, and the SW $\frac{1}{2}$ of Section 1, Township 6 South, Range 17 West, Pearl River County, Mississippi.

and it is hereby adjudicated that the extension and enlargement so as to include the said property is reasonable and the public convenience and necessity requires that it be done. It is further hereby adjudicated that said property does not lie within three miles of any other municipality.

SECTION 2. That, including the property described in Section 1 hereof, the new boundaries of the City of Picayune are hereby defined and described as follows, to-wit:

Beginning at the Southwest corner of the SE $\frac{1}{2}$ of SW $\frac{1}{2}$ of Section 21, Township 6 South, Range 17 West, in Pearl River County, Mississippi, thence run East along the South line of Sections 21, 22, 23, and 24 in said Township and Range a distance of 3 $\frac{3}{4}$ miles to the Southeast corner of said Section 24, thence run North along East line of Sections 24, 13 and 12, in said township and Range 3 miles to the Northeast corner of said Section 12, thence run West along the North line of Section 12 in said Township and Range 1/2 mile to the Southeast corner of SW $\frac{1}{2}$ of Section 1, Township 6 South, Range 17 West, thence run North 1 mile more or less to the North line of said Section 1, thence run West along said Section line a distance of 7/8 mile more or less to a point which is 660 feet East of Northwest corner of said Section 1, thence run South 330 feet, thence run West 660 feet to the West line of said Section 1, thence run North along Section line 3/8 mile more or less to the center of the stream bed of Mill Creek, thence follow the meanderings of said stream bed of said Mill Creek Easterly 1 mile more or less to the Range line between Ranges 16 and 17, thence run South 1/8 mile more or less to the Northwest corner of SW $\frac{1}{2}$ of SW $\frac{1}{2}$ of Section 31, Township 5 South, Range 16 West, thence run East 1/4 mile to Northeast corner of SW $\frac{1}{2}$ of SW $\frac{1}{2}$ of said Section 31, thence run South 1/4 mile to the South line of said Section 31, thence run West along Section line 3/4 mile more or less to Northeast corner of NW $\frac{1}{2}$ of Section 1, Township 6 South, Range 17 West, thence run South 1 mile more or less to the North line said Section 11, thence run West 1/8 mile more or less to a point that is 1690 feet East of the Southwest corner of Section 1, Township 6 South, Range 17 West, thence run North 432 feet, thence run Westerly along center line of Mississippi Power Company easement (as secured and constructed in 1962) 765 feet, thence run South 80 feet more or less to the intersection of said Power Company easement with the centerline of an additional Mississippi Power Company easement which runs West, thence run South 89 degrees 28 minutes 15 seconds West along center line of that Power Company easement 1985 feet along said easement, thence run South 17 degrees 53 minutes 50 seconds West 148.72 feet, thence run North 72 degrees 6 minutes 10 seconds West 300 feet, thence run South 17 degrees 53 minutes 50 seconds West 296.53 feet to the North line of Section 11, Township 6 South, Range 17 West at a point 1483.25 feet West of the Southwest corner of Section 1, Township 6 South, Range 17 West, thence run West along the North line of said Section 11 3/4 mile more or less to the Northwest corner of said Section 11, thence run South 1/2 mile more or less to the North bank of Hobolochitto River, thence follow the meanderings of said River in a westerly direction to where the West line of the East 3/4 of Section 9 in said Township and Range intersects same, thence run South along the West line of the East 3/4 of Sections 9, 16 and 21 in said Township and Range 3 miles to the place of beginning.

SECTION 3. That the improvements proposed to be made by said City in the new territory included in this ordinance, and as described in Section 1 hereof, are as follows, to-wit:

- (1) Maintenance and construction of any necessary streets within said territory, such improvement to be completed as speedily as is practicable and economically feasible; installation where necessary and maintenance of existing water lines and installation of any street lighting where and when necessary; these improvements to be completed within two years from the effective date and final approval of this ordinance.
- (2) Construction of any and all necessary drainage facilities within the annexed territory, when and where necessary.
- (3) Construction of Sewage disposal facilities and any and all other improvements as generally furnished in similar areas within said City and or when and where necessary and economically feasible.

SECTION 4. That the public services which shall be rendered by the City of Picayune within the new territory described in Section 1 hereof, are as follows, to-wit:

- Police protection, fire protection, maintenance of any existing streets and roadways, beginning on the effective date of this ordinance.
- Furnishing of services of Municipal Natural Gas Distribution System at municipal rates, as speedily as can be economically installed.
- Furnishing of Waste and Garbage Disposal Service on the same basis as for similar property within the present boundaries of the City of Picayune within a period of approximately six months from date of final approval of this ordinance.
- Furnish in street lighting where necessary, on same basis as similar areas now within the City.
- Furnishing of services of fogging machine for insect extermination on same basis as now furnished in similar area within said City.
- Furnishing of other services offered by the City of Picayune in similar areas now within said City when and where necessary and economically feasible.
- Furnishing of services of Municipal Water System as speedily as can be installed.

SECTION 5. That the Attorney for the City of Picayune shall, and he is hereby, ordered to file a petition in the Chancery Court of Pearl River County, Mississippi, which petition shall recite the fact of the

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adoption of this ordinance, and shall pray that the enlargement of the municipal boundaries of the City of Picayune as herein set out shall be ratified and approved by said court, attaching to said petition, as exhibits thereto, a certified copy of this ordinance, and a map or plat of the municipal boundaries as they will exist in accordance with this ordinance.

SECTION 6. That this ordinance shall be effective as provided by law and that effective upon expiration of ten days from and after the final ratification, approval and confirmation of this ordinance by the Chancery Court of Pearl River County, Mississippi, in accordance with the terms and provisions of Chapter 491 of the Laws of Mississippi for the year 1950 and other statutes applicable thereto, all ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

AN ORDINANCE MAKING IT UNLAWFUL FOR ANY PERSON TO MISTREAT, INJURE, KILL OR MOLEST ANY POLICE DOG OR TO INTERFERE WITH THE FUNCTIONS OF SAID POLICE DOG AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES HEREINAFTER SET FORTH, MAKING THE PROVISIONS HEREOF EMERGENCY BY NATURE; AND REPEALING ALL ORDINANCES OR PARTS OF ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT HEREWITH

BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of the City of Picayune, Mississippi, in regular session convened, as follows, to-wit:

SECTION 1. It shall be unlawful for any person to willfully or maliciously torture, torment, beat, kick, strike, mutilate, injure, disable or kill any dog used by the Picayune City Police Department of the City of Picayune, State of Mississippi, in the performance of the functions of the duties of such department, or to interfere with or meddle with any such dog while being used by said department or any officer or member thereof in the performance of any of the duties or functions of said department or of such officer or member.

SECTION 2. Any person violating any provision of this ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor.

SECTION 3. Be it further ordained that the provisions hereof be and the same are hereby made emergency by nature in the public interest, and the provisions hereof shall become effective upon adoption hereof.

SECTION 4. Be it further ordained that all ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith be and the same are hereby repealed.

SECTION 5. That this ordinance shall be in effect from and after its passage.







ORDINANCE NO. 308

AN ORDINANCE GRANTING PERMIT TO ESTABLISH COMMUNITY ANTENNA
TELEVISION SYSTEM IN THE CITY OF PICAYUNE

WHEREAS, Cable Video, Inc., a Mississippi Corporation, proposes to furnish to the people of the City of Picayune, Mississippi, perfect television reception by means of a community antenna and cable system, offering to the City of Picayune for a permit to operate such system a sum equal to three per cent of the gross revenue collected for such service in said City, with accountings to be made monthly, and

WHEREAS, it has been determined, and is hereby adjudicated, that such service is of benefit to the citizens of said City,

NOW, THEREFORE, Be It Ordained by the Mayor and Council of the City of Picayune as follows:

SECTION 1. That Cable Video, Inc. is hereby granted a permit to operate a community antenna and cable system for connections to television sets in the City of Picayune for a period of twenty-five years from and after December 1, 1963, on the condition that construction on such system shall commence without avoidable delay and that the system shall be substantially completed within a period of six months from and after this date.

SECTION 2. That nothing contained in this ordinance shall be construed to grant to Cable Video, Inc. a franchise or unrestricted easement or right to the use of the streets and public ways of the City of Picayune, and Cable Video, Inc. shall make no use of such streets and public ways of said City other than as is specifically granted to it by the City Engineer from time to time on application of Cable Video, Inc., and Cable Video, Inc. shall save said City harmless from claims for bodily injury and property damage resulting from, or arising out of, its operations within said City, and shall provide liability insurance, satisfactory to, and approved by, said City, protecting said City and said Company from such liability in an amount of not less than \$25,000.00 as to any one person and \$100,000.00 as to any one accident for property damage, and \$10,000.00 as to any one person and \$300,000.00 as to any one accident for personal injury or death and shall pay the premium thereon.

SECTION 3. The Consideration to be paid said City by said company for the permit granted hereby shall be three per cent (3%) of the gross monthly revenue of said company from the service to be furnished to the public, such payments to be paid to said City on the tenth day of the month after three months of operation hereunder and every three months thereafter.

SECTION 4. The exercise of the rights granted hereunder, and the commencement of construction of the said system by Cable Video, Inc. shall be construed to be an acceptance by it of the terms of this ordinance.

SECTION 5. In the event, in the construction or operation of the said system by Cable Video, Inc., any damage is done by Cable Video, Inc., its agents, employees, contractors, or subcontractors, to the streets, sidewalks, or any other property of said City, then any such damages shall be promptly repaired by the City, and Cable Video, Inc. shall immediately reimburse said City for the expense thereof.

SECTION 6. This ordinance shall be in effect from and after its passage.

The foregoing ordinance was first reduced to writing, considered and passed section by section, then as a whole with the vote on each section and upon said ordinance as a whole resulting as follows:




