RECREATIONAL AMOUNT OF 1964 BUDGET INCREASED




CEMETERY TRUSTEE APPOINTED

ORDINANCE EXTENDING AND ENLARGING THE BOUNDARIES OF THE CITY OF PICAYUNE, DEFINING THE ADDITIONAL TERRITORY, SETTING FORTH THE PROPOSED BOUNDARIES OF SAID CITY AND DESCRIBING THE PROPOSED IMPROVEMENTS TO BE MADE IN AND THE PUBLIC SERVICES TO BE RENDERED IN THE TERRITORY PROPOSED TO BE ANNEXED

WHEREAS, the recent establishment of the Mississippi Test Facility to the National Aeronautics and Space Administration of the United States adjacent to the Corporate Limits of the City of Picayune has resulted in the recent purchase by various individuals, firms and corporations of proposed sites for subdivisions, housing, commercial and industrial developments of all kinds, so that already subdivisions have been laid out and lots sold in areas near to said City, that thus an unusual situation has been created, with an unprecedented and imminently rapid growth for said city requiring that something be immediately done to provide for the orderly future development and growth of said City to prevent the accrual and creation of tremendous problems that are necessarily attendant upon such development and growth were it allowed to proceed unregulated and uncontrolled, and

WHEREAS, the City of Picayune has heretofore employed City Planning Consultants to plan the future development and growth of the said City in an orderly manner, with such planning continuing presently as to outlying and adjacent areas, as a result of which the Planning Commission of the City of Picayune has recommended the annexation of the areas hereinafter described, and

WHEREAS, it is for the best interest and welfare of said City and the property owners in the areas hereinafter described that the boundaries of said City be extended and enlarged so as to include the area hereinafter described within said city,

NOW, THEREFORE, Be It Ordained by the Mayor and Council of the City of Picayune, Pearl River County, Mississippi, as follows, to-wit:

SECTION 1. That, in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 491 of the Laws of the State of Mississippi for the year 1950 and other applicable statutes and subject to the provisions thereof, the boundaries of the City of Picayune, Pearl River County, Mississippi, shall be, and are hereby enlarged so as to include the following described adjacent territory, to-wit:

Beginning at the Northwest corner of $S\frac{1}{2}$ of $NW\frac{1}{4}$ of $NW\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 21, Township 6 South, Range 17 West in Pearl River County, Mississippi, thence run South $\frac{5}{8}$ of a mile to the Southwest corner of $NW\frac{1}{4}$ of $SW\frac{1}{4}$ of said Section 21, thence run East $\frac{1}{4}$ mile to the Southeast corner of $NW\frac{1}{4}$ of $SW\frac{1}{4}$ of said Section 21, thence run North $\frac{5}{8}$ of a mile to the Northeast corner of $S\frac{1}{2}$ of $NW\frac{1}{4}$ of $NW\frac{1}{4}$ of said Section 21, thence run West $\frac{1}{4}$ mile to the place of beginning, and being the $S\frac{1}{2}$ of $NW\frac{1}{4}$ of $NW\frac{1}{4}$, the $SW\frac{1}{4}$ of $NW\frac{1}{4}$ and the $NW\frac{1}{4}$ of $SW\frac{1}{4}$ of said Section 21, Township 6 South, Range 17 West.

and it is hereby adjudicated that the extension and enlargement so as to include the said property is reasonable and the public convenience and necessity requires that it be done. It is further hereby adjudicated that said property does not lie within three miles of any other municipality.

SECTION 2. That, including the property described in Section 1 hereof, the new boundaries of the City of Picayune are hereby defined as follows, to-wit:

Beginning at the Southwest corner of the $SE\frac{1}{4}$ of $SW\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 21, Township 6 South, Range 17 West, in Pearl River County, Mississippi, thence run East along the South line of sections 21, 22, 23 and 24 in said Township a Range a distance of $3\frac{3}{4}$ miles to the Southeast corner of said Section 24, thence run North along East line of Sections 24, 13 and 12 in said Township and Range 3 miles to the Northeast corner of said Section 12, thence run West along the North line of Section 12 in said Township and Range $\frac{1}{2}$ mile to a point 75 feet west of the Southeast corner of $SW\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 1, Township 6 South, Range 17 West, thence run North 1 mile more or less to the North line of said Section 1, thence run West along said Section line a distance of $\frac{7}{8}$ mile more or less to a point which is 660 feet East of Northwest corner of said Section 1, thence run South 330 feet, thence run West 660 feet to the West line of said Section 1, thence run North along Section line $\frac{3}{8}$ mile more or less to the center of the stream bed of Mill Creek, thence follow the meanderings of said stream bed of said Mill Creek Easterly 1 mile more or less to the Range line between Ranges 16 and 17, thence run South $\frac{1}{8}$ mile more or less to the Northwest corner of $SW\frac{1}{4}$ of $SW\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 31, Township 5 South, Range 16 West, thence run East $\frac{1}{4}$ mile to the Northeast corner of $SW\frac{1}{4}$ of $SW\frac{1}{4}$ of said Section 31, thence run South $\frac{1}{4}$ mile to the South line of said Section 31, thence run West along Section line $\frac{3}{4}$ mile more or less to the Northeast corner of $NW\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 1, Township 6 South, Range 17 West, thence run South 1 mile more or less to the North line said Section 11, thence run West $\frac{1}{8}$ mile more or less to a point that is 1690 feet East of the Southwest corner of Section 1, Township 6 South, Range 17 West, thence run North 432 feet, thence run Westerly along center line of Mississippi Power Company easement (as secured and constructed in 1962) 765 feet, thence run South 80 feet more or less to the intersection of said Power Company easement with the centerline of an additional

Mississippi Power Company easement which runs West, thence run South 89 degrees 28 minutes 15 seconds West along center line of that Power Company easement 1985 feet along said easement, thence run South 17 degrees 53 minutes 50 seconds West 148.72 feet, thence run North 72 degrees 6 minutes 10 seconds West 300 feet, thence run South 17 degrees 53 minutes 50 seconds West 296.53 feet to the North line of Section 11, Township 6 South, Range 17 West at a point 1483.25 feet West of the Southwest corner of Section 1, Township 6 South, Range 17 West, thence run West along the North line of said Section 11 3/4 mile more or less to the Northwest corner of said Section 11, thence run South 1/2 mile more or less to the North bank of Hobolochitto River thence follow the meanderings of said River in a Westerly direction to where the West line of the East 3/4 of Section 9 in said Township and Range intersects same, thence run South along the West line of the East 3/4 of sections 9, 16 and 21 in said Township and Range 2 1/8 miles to the Northeast corner of $S\frac{1}{2}$ of $NW\frac{1}{4}$ of $NW\frac{1}{4}$ of said Section 21, Township 6 South, Range 17 West, thence run West 1/4 mile to the West line of said Section 21, thence run South 5/8 of a mile to the Southwest corner of $NW\frac{1}{4}$ of $SW\frac{1}{4}$ of said Section 21, thence run East 1/4 mile to the Southeast corner of $NW\frac{1}{4}$ of $SW\frac{1}{4}$ of said Section 21, thence run South 1/4 mile to the place of beginning.

SECTION 3. That the improvements proposed to be made by said City in the new territory included in this ordinance, and as described in Section 1 hereof, are as follows, to-wit:

- (1) Maintenance and construction of any necessary streets within said territory, such improvements to be completed as speedily as is practicable and economically feasible; installation where necessary and maintenance of existing water lines and installation of any street lighting where and when necessary; these improvements to be completed within two years from the effective date and final approval of this ordinance.
- (2) Construction of any and all necessary drainage facilities within the annexed territory, when and where necessary.
- (3) Construction of Sewage disposal facilities and any and all other improvements as generally furnished in similar areas within said City and or when and where necessary and economically feasible.

SECTION 4. That the public services which shall be rendered by the City of Picayune within the new territory described in Section 1 hereof, are as follows, to-wit:

Police protection, fire protection, maintenance of any existing streets and roadways, beginning on the effective of this ordinance.

Furnishing of services of Municipal Natural Gas Distribution System at municipal rates, as speedily as can be economically installed.

Furnishing of Waste and Garbage Disposal Service on the same basis as for similar property within the present boundaries of the City of Picayune within a period of approximately six months from date of final approval of this ordinance.

Furnish in street lighting where necessary, on same basis as similar areas now within the city.

Furnishing of services of fogging machine for insect extermination on same basis as now furnished in similar area within said City.

Furnishing of other services offered by the City of Picayune in similar areas now within said City when and where necessary and economically feasible.

Furnishing of services of Municipal Water System as speedily as can be installed.

SECTION 5. That the Attorney for the City of Picayune shall, and he is hereby, ordered to file a petition in the Chancery Court of Pearl River County, Mississippi, which petition shall recite the fact of the adoption of this ordinance, and shall pray that the enlargement of the municipal boundaries of the City of Picayune as herein set out shall be ratified and approved by said court, attaching to said petition, as exhibits thereto, a certified copy of this ordinance, and a map or plat of the municipal boundaries as they will exist in accordance with this ordinance.

SECTION 6. That this ordinance shall be effective as provided by law and that effective upon expiration of ten days from and after the final ratification, approval and confirmation of this ordinance by the Chancery Court of Pearl River County, Mississippi, in accordance with the terms and provisions of Chapter 491 of the Laws of Mississippi for the year 1950 and other statutes applicable thereto, all ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

The foregoing ordinance was first reduced to writing, considered and passed section by section, then as a whole with the vote on each section and upon said ordinance as a whole resulting as follows:

WHEREAS, a duly certified copy of resolution of the Board of Trustees of Picayune Municipal Separate School District, adopted by said Board on January 28, 1964, declaring the necessity of a loan to said district in the amount of \$66,000.00 to finance alterations and additions to the Nicholson Elementary School in said District, and to purchase heating plants, fixtures and equipment for the buildings of said district, all of said work and purchases being necessary, said resolution certifying that there are no funds available for such purposes from the school funds of said district or from any other source, that amount being necessary in addition to funds being secured from the State Educational Finance Commission, said loan to be evidenced by negotiable notes of said school district bearing interest from date at a rate not to exceed four per centum per annum payable annually and falling due at the rate of \$13,200.00 per year for a period of five years on the principal, and

(a) That the Picayune Municipal Separate School District in Pearl River County, Mississippi, and in Hancock County, Mississippi, is a duly and lawfully created, organized and existing Municipal Separate School District under the laws of the State of Mississippi, whose territorial limits include all of the territory comprising the City of Picayune, Pearl River County, Mississippi, together with additional adjacent territory lying in Pearl River and Hancock Counties, Mississippi.

Come now, Ponderosa Builders, Inc., a Mississippi Corporation and Builders Investment Company, Inc., a Mississippi Corporation, and herewith respectfully object to the proposed expansion of the present Picayune Airport as recommended by the Pearl River County Airport Commission, and assign as reasons therefore, the following, to-wit:

1. That the objectors own property, which lies to the South, west of the present airport and the proposed extension or expansion of the present airport would take a part or portion of said property. That said property was purchased at a cost of Three Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$300,000.00), and that an additional Two Hundred Thirty Five Thousand Dollars (\$235,000.00), has either been spent, or contracted to be spent, upon the development of said property as a subdivision designed for the construction of homes. That each day an additional One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) will be spent on land development alone, upon said property over the next eighteen (18) months.
2. That the taking of said property as proposed by the said Airport Commission would damage the Objectors up to one-half ($\frac{1}{2}$) of said amounts and would make an expansion of the present airport in its present location economically unfeasible.
3. The present plan likewise would close the Union Road, which is the most direct route into the City from the property of the Objectors, and likewise for many other people who reside in the Southwest area of Picayune the closing of said Union Road would necessitate constructing an alternative route for this area, which alternative route would be less satisfactory and would cost a large sum of money to build, and the cost of such alternative route was not considered in the plan as proposed.

The Objectors, therefore, respectfully request this honorable body to reject the plan as presented for the reasons set forth above and further urge this rejection at the earliest opportunity since the threat of the expansion of the airport as proposed constitutes a sale barrier to the Objectors in their efforts to develop their property.

The scope of the project is hereby increased by adding thereto the plan preparation work for the aforesaid newly annexed areas as shown on the executed plan preparation work heretofore submitted to the Government for approval under the terms of the said Agreement for Public Works Plan Preparation, and the Applicant hereby gives further assurances that it will construct and finance the work as planned for the enlarged project area in accordance with the aforesaid executed and submitted plan preparation.



RESOLUTION FIXING LEVIES FOR 1964 TAXES

WHEREAS, Section 23 of Chapter 492 of Mississippi Laws of 1950, Section 3, Chapter 497 of Mississippi Laws of 1950, and Section 4 of House Bill No. 6 of Mississippi Laws of 1958, all as amended, provide that the governing authorities of each municipality in the State of Mississippi shall levy the municipal ad valorem taxes for each taxable year, said levy or levies to be expressed in mills or decimal fractions of a mill, and such levy or levies shall determine the ad valorem taxes to be collected upon each dollar of valuation on the assessment rolls of the Municipality; and

For the purpose of raising a fund for the retirement of bonds issued for the purpose of financing construction and equipping of an annex to the Picayune Memorial High School building and making alterations of said high school building and also of construction and equipping of an auditorium and class rooms as provided by Chapter 231 of the Mississippi Laws of 1950 and amended and for the payment of interest thereon 1.85 Mills on the dollar to be levied upon property both within the City limits and upon Picayune Municipal Separate School District property outside the City limits.

For the purpose of raising a fund for the retirement of notes issued for the purpose of financing alterations and additions to West Side Elementary School and to purchase land adjacent to Carver High School for school purposes and to purchase heating plants, fixtures and equipment for the buildings of said district and for the payment of interest thereon as provided by Chapter 30 of Mississippi Laws of 1953, extraordinary session65 Mills on the dollar to be levied upon property both within the City Limits and upon Picayune Municipal Separate School District property, outside the City limits.
6. For the purpose of raising a fund for the retirement of notes and interest thereon of the Nicholson Consolidated School District, liability assumed by Picayune Municipal Separate School District, as annexed territory under Chapter 16 of the Mississippi Laws of 195325 Mills on the dollar to be levied upon property both within the City Limits and upon Picayune Municipal Separate School District property outside the City Limits.
7. For the purpose of raising funds for the retirement of bonds issued for the acquisition of new fire station and additional fire protection, and for paying interest due thereon as provided by Chapter 493 of the Mississippi Laws of 1950, as amended25 Mills on the dollar to be levied only against property within the City Limits.





The City Council took up for consideration the matter of extending and improving the combined waterworks, sewer and natural gas system of the City of Picayune and in connection therewith refunding the outstanding Combined Waterworks and Sewer System Revenue Bonds of said City dated April 1, 1951. After a full discussion of the subject, Councilman F. G. Macdonald, Jr. offered and moved the adoption of the following ordinance:

ORDINANCE NO. 313
 AN ORDINANCE CALLING AND PROVIDING FOR THE HOLDING OF AN ELECTION WITHIN THE CITY OF PICAYUNE, MISSISSIPPI, FOR THE PURPOSE OF SUBMITTING TO THE QUALIFIED ELECTORS OF SAID CITY A PROPOSITION TO AUTHORIZE THE ISSUANCE OF COMBINED WATERWORKS, SEWER AND NATURAL GAS SYSTEM REVENUE BONDS OF SAID CITY IN THE MAXIMUM PRINCIPAL AMOUNT OF TWO MILLION TEN THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$2,010,000.00) FOR THE PURPOSE OF EXTENDING AND IMPROVING THE COMBINED WATERWORKS, SEWER AND NATURAL GAS SYSTEM OF THE CITY OF PICAYUNE; PROVIDING FOR THE GIVING OF NOTICE OF SAID ELECTION; PRESCRIBING THE FORM OF THE BALLOT AND THE MANNER OF HOLDING SAID ELECTION; AND PROVIDING FOR OTHER MATTERS IN CONNECTION
THEREWITH

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WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Picayune, Mississippi, has previously determined, and does now hereby find and adjudicate that it is necessary and advisable and in the best interests of the said City and the inhabitants thereof to extend and improve the combined waterworks, sewer and natural gas system of said City and to pay the cost of said extensions and improvements through the issuance of combined waterworks, sewer and natural gas system revenue bonds of said City in the maximum principal amount of Two Million Ten Thousand Dollars (\$2,010,000.00); and

WHEREAS, this City Council has caused a preliminary engineering survey to be made by Barnard and Burk of Mississippi, Inc., Consulting Engineers, Markham Hotel, Gulfport, Mississippi, a reliable, competent and experienced firm of engineers; that said firm of engineers has made its preliminary engineering report wherein it is estimated that the cost to the City of the extensions and improvements necessary, desirable and expedient for the said combined system, including the payment of all costs incidental to said construction and the issuance of such bonds will not exceed the principal amount of Two Million Ten Thousand Dollars (\$2,010,000.00); and that in the opinion of said firm of engineers, the financing of the construction of the said improvements and extensions to the combined waterworks, sewer and natural gas system is economically feasible through the issuance of combined waterworks, sewer and natural gas system revenue bonds to be payable solely from the revenues of the combined waterworks, sewer and natural gas system of said City; and

WHEREAS, sufficient funds are not now available in the City Treasury for the payment of the aforesaid costs; that under Chapter 494 of the Laws of Mississippi for the year 1950, as amended (being Sections 3519-01 to 3519-31, inclusive, of the Mississippi Code of 1942) and other constitutional and statutory authority supplemental thereto, the City of Picayune is authorized to make extensions and improvements to the said combined system and to issue the bonds as hereinafter proposed, provided that the issuance thereof be assented to by a requisite majority of the qualified electors of said City voting thereon, and the City Council does hereby determine that a special election shall be held in the City of Picayune for the purpose of submitting to the qualified electors thereof the question of the construction of such extensions and improvements to the said combined waterworks, sewer and natural gas system and the issuance of bonds for said purpose;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PICAYUNE, MISSISSIPPI, AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. That the City Council of the City of Picayune, Mississippi, hereby declares its intention to issue bonds of the said City in the maximum principal amount of Two Million Ten Thousand Dollars (\$2,010,000.00) for the purpose of constructing extensions and improvements to the combined waterworks, sewer and natural gas system of said City.

SECTION 2. That a special election shall be and the same is hereby called and ordered to be held within the City of Picayune, Mississippi, on Tuesday, the 15th day of December 1964, between the hours of seven (7:00) o'clock a.m. and six (6:00) o'clock p.m. for the purpose of submitting to the qualified electors of the said City the following proposition, viz:

SHALL THE CITY OF PICAYUNE, MISSISSIPPI, ISSUE ITS COMBINED WATERWORKS, SEWER AND NATURAL GAS SYSTEM REVENUE BONDS IN THE MAXIMUM PRINCIPAL AMOUNT OF TWO MILLION TEN THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$2,010,000.00) FOR THE PURPOSE OF CONSTRUCTING EXTENSIONS AND IMPROVEMENTS TO THE SAID COMBINED SYSTEM, SAID BONDS TO BE PAYABLE AS TO PRINCIPAL AND INTEREST SOLELY FROM THE INCOME AND REVENUES TO BE DERIVED FROM THE OPERATION OF THE SAID COMBINED SYSTEM?

SECTION 3. That all qualified electors who are properly registered shall be permitted to vote in the said election and that the said special election shall be held at the following regular polling places in the City of Picayune, viz:

1. POLLING PLACE: Picayune East Side, James L. Byrd Post No. 3804 Veterans of Foreign Wars, East side of S. Naugh Avenue

That the City Clerk shall give not less than three (3) weeks notice of said election by publishing notice thereof in "The Picayune Item", a newspaper published in and having a general circulation in the City of Picayune, Mississippi, and being duly qualified under Chapter 427 of the Laws of Mississippi for the year 1948. The said notice shall be published once a week for at least three (3) consecutive weeks preceding the date of said election, the first publication to be made not less than twenty-one (21) days prior to the date of the

ORDINANCE NO. 314

AN ORDINANCE TO REGULATE THE SALE OF MEAT, MEAT-FOOD, AND MEAT-PRODUCTS INTENDED TO BE USED FOR HUMAN FOOD WITHIN THE CORPORATE OR CITY LIMITS OF THE CITY OF PICAYUNE, PEARL RIVER COUNTY, MISSISSIPPI, OR WITHIN ITS POLICE JURISDICTION AND PROHIBITING THE SALE THEREIN OF MEAT AND MEAT-PRODUCTS NOT CONFORMING WITH THIS ORDINANCE AND PROVIDING PENALTIES FOR VIOLATIONS THEREOF

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND COUNCILMEN OF THE CITY OF PICAYUNE, MISSISSIPPI:

SECTION 1. That the term "Health Officer" as used in this Ordinance shall mean the Health Officer or his official representative in Pearl River County.

SECTION 2. Definition of terms for the purpose of this Ordinance. The words and terms used herein shall have ascribed to them the following meaning:

(a) The word "Person" shall include individuals, partnerships, corporations, associations and any other legal entity recognized by law.

(b) The term "meat and meat-food products" wherever used in this Ordinance shall include the carcasses, or parts thereof, of cattle, sheep, goats, other ruminants and swine and the meat and meat-food products of such animals.

(c) The word "establishment" as used in this Ordinance shall include retail dealers in meat, meat-food, meat-products, restaurants or other eating places and meat markets.

(d) "Official stamp" shall be that of the U. S. Department of Agriculture, Agricultural Research Service, or the Mississippi Department of Agriculture.

(e) The word "label" shall apply to a moisture-proof paper tag, plastic bag, or metal tag with identification of products and source.

SECTION 3. It shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation or their agent, employee, or servant dealing in or selling meat or meat products within the City of Picayune, or within its police jurisdiction to buy or sell, offer for sale, display, exhibit or possess any such meat or meat products unless the same shall have been processed and handled in an establishment approved by the U. S. Department of Agriculture, Agricultural Research Service, Meat Inspection Division, or by the Mississippi Department of Agriculture, Meat Inspection Division.

The animals and carcasses from which the meat and meat products are derived must have been slaughtered under supervision, inspected and approved for human consumption by either or both the foregoing agencies and evidenced by official stamp, label or other official identification substantiating sources and compliance provided herein. The meat and meat products shall conform to all inspection requirements and procedures in carrying out the foregoing provisions of this Ordinance.

SECTION 4. The Health Officer may at any time enter any establishment for the purpose of making official inspection as may be necessary at any time during which any such place is open for business to determine if the provisions of this Ordinance are being complied with.

SECTION 5. Any person found violating any part of Section 3 of this Ordinance shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall be fined in an amount not exceeding fifty dollars for each violation. Each day in which any such violation shall continue shall be deemed a separate offense.

SECTION 6. All ordinances of parts or ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

SECTION 7. The invalidity of any section, clause, sentence or provision of this Ordinance shall not affect the validity of any other part of the Ordinance which can be given effect without such invalid part or parts.

SECTION 8. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage. Approval, recording and publication as provided by law.

CONTRACT FOR PLANNING SERVICES

This Agreement made and entered into, this the 1st day of December, 1964, by and between the CITY OF PICAYUNE, MISSISSIPPI, hereinafter called the CITY, and SOUTHERN CONSULTANTS, INC., an engineering corporation organized and existing pursuant to the laws of the State of Mississippi, duly authorized and qualified to do business in the State of Mississippi, and maintaining an office at 265 East Pearl Street, Jackson, Mississippi, and hereinafter referred to as the PLANNER:

WITNESSETH:

THAT WHEREAS, THE CITY contemplates undertaking certain zoning studies, and WHEREAS, THE CITY desires to have the PLANNER furnish and perform the planning services necessary to prepare said zoning studies, and WHEREAS, THE PLANNER is desirous of performing said services on behalf of the CITY: NOW, THEREFORE, for and in consideration of the mutual and reciprocal covenants and agreements hereinafter set forth and other good and valuable considerations herein contained, the parties hereto mutually contract, covenant and agree as follows:

ARTICLE I
STATEMENT OF PLANNER'S SERVICES

The PLANNER is to furnish and perform planning services as follows, which shall be the scope of its responsibility, under the terms of this contract, viz:

DEFINITION OF AREA TO BE ZONED

The area to be zoned shall include all of the area incorporated into the City at the time of the most recent annexation, said area being five (5) square miles more or less in size and lying generally along the east, south and west corporate boundaries.

A. BASE MAP

A base map for use in recording land use data and presenting zoning recommendations shall be prepared. This map shall be prepared from existing city maps and shall utilize such existing aerial photographs, plats and data as may be required in performing the studies outlined herein.

The map shall be at a scale that is appropriate for clear, concise presentation of zoning proposals.

B. EXISTING LAND USE STUDY

1. Data Collection - A study of existing land uses shall be made in the area to be zoned. This study shall be a visual survey and each parcel of land shall be classified and recorded on a map. In addition, parcels shall be color coded according to current use and appropriate zoning category.
2. Analysis - The PLANNER shall make a determination of existing and probable future development trends in the area to be zoned. This analysis shall consider both existing development and the character of vacant land as guidelines for establishing appropriate zoning districts.

C. ZONING MAP

A zoning map, illustrating recommended zoning districts, shall be prepared. Recommended zoning districts shall be consistent with the various districts employed in the City's existing zoning ordinance.

1. COMMENCEMENT, PROSECUTION AND COMPLETION

The PLANNER shall diligently expedite and perform the services specified herein in accordance with the following schedule:

- (a) Work will commence within ten (10) days of the date of execution of this contract.
- (b) The PLANNER shall meet periodically with the CITY or its representatives to discuss progress of the work.
- (c) All work shall be completed with three (3) months from and after the date of the formal execution of this contract.
- (d) The CITY shall agree to such appropriate extensions of time to the contract as may be necessary because of delay occasioned by the CITY, acts of God, or acts beyond the control of the PLANNER.

2. SUBMISSIONS

At the time of completion of the work set forth in the aforesaid Article I (Statement of Planners Services), the PLANNER shall submit to the CITY the following:

- (a) A hand colored map illustrating existing land uses in the area to be zoned.
- (b) A hand colored zoning map illustrating proposed zoning districts..
- (c) A narrative summary report describing work procedures and the basis for zoning proposals.

ARTICLE III
FEE AND PAYMENT

1. FEE

The PLANNER'S basic fee for the services set forth hereinbefore shall be a lump sum amount of one thousand two hundred dollars (\$1,200.00).

2. PAYMENT

Payment by the CITY OF THE PLANNER'S fee shall be in accordance with the following schedule:

- (a) One-half of the basic fee (\$600.00) shall become due and payable upon completion of the Existing Land Use Study (Paragraph B, Article I.)
- (b) The remainder of the basic fee (\$600.00) shall become due and payable upon submission of completed work to the CITY as prescribed in Paragraph 2, Article II, hereof.

ARTICLE IV
TERMINATION

- 1. The CITY may terminate this contract after ten (10) days written notice upon failure of the PLANNER to perform the work and services specified herein.
- 2. The PLANNER may terminate this contract at any time upon failure of the CITY to pay compensation to the PLANNER as herein provided, reserving unto the PLANNER all rights of law or in equity which may accrue from a breach hereof.
- 3. In the event of termination of contract by the CITY for cause as hereinabove set forth before completion of the planning services, PLANNER shall be paid in proportion to the work in progress under Article I hereof and in accordance with the provisions of Article III pertaining to fees and payments.

ARTICLE V

The PLANNER shall comply with the pertinent provisions of all local, federal and state laws applicable to the work being performed; shall carry Workmen's Compensation Insurance as required by the Laws of Mississippi, and shall generally hold harmless the CITY from all liability resulting from casualty, accident or other event through acts of the PLANNER in performance of said work.

The CITY shall give all written notices and obtain necessary permits and sanctions of the proper authorities in respect to said work at no cost to the PLANNER.

The CITY, prior to the execution of this contract, shall pass appropriate resolutions, and cause the same to be spread upon the minutes of the CITY authorizing the execution of this contract. Copies of the appropriate resolutions of the CITY shall be furnished the PLANNER contemporaneously with the execution of this contract.

AGREEMENTS WITH COAST ELECTRIC POWER ASSOCIATION
AUTHORIZED

Upon motion of A. H. Knight, seconded by F. G. Macdonald, Jr., and unanimously carried, the Mayor and City Clerk are hereby authorized and directed to execute an Agreement With Coast Electric Power Association and Municipality of Picayune, Mississippi, and a Street Lighting Agreement With Coast Electric Power Association and Municipality of Picayune, Mississippi, the two instruments being in the following words and figures, to-wit:

AGREEMENT
Between
COAST ELECTRIC POWER ASSOCIATION
And
MUNICIPALITY OF PICAYUNE, MISSISSIPPI

This agreement made and entered into this day by and between the City of Picayune, Mississippi, a municipal corporation in Pearl River County, Mississippi, hereinafter called "Municipality", and Coast Electric Power Association, a Mississippi corporation, of Bay St. Louis, Mississippi, hereinafter called "Association", WITNESSETH:

1. Association agrees that it will at any time that Municipality desires enter into written agreement with Municipality to furnish all of Municipality's street lighting and other electric requirements in all areas now within the corporate limits of Municipality or hereafter incorporated therein for which the Association holds a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity from the Public Service Commission of Mississippi granted by order of said Commission rendered November 15, 1960, in Cause numbered U-131 on the docket of said Commission or for which the Association may hereafter obtain such certificate. Such electric service shall be furnished under Association's regular rate schedule and contract in effect at the time of making such agreement for the type of electric service so contracted for.
2. Association agrees that it will pay to Municipality quarterly of each year 2% of Association's gross revenues, excluding sales taxes, from sales of electricity to residential and commercial customers within the corporate boundaries of Municipality, as said corporate boundaries now exist or may hereafter be extended.
3. Association's electric distribution and transmission lines and electric substations and component parts thereof, hereinafter collectively referred to as an electric distribution system, are exempt from municipal ad valorem taxes. In lieu of municipal ad valorem taxes on that part of Association's electric distribution system within the corporate boundaries of Municipality as said boundaries now exist or may hereafter be extended, the Association agrees that it will annually for each calendar year that Association sells electricity in Municipality beginning with the year 1956 pay to Municipality a sum of money to be determined as follows: The parties hereto shall ascertain the gross revenue, excluding sales tax, received by Mississippi Power Company, a corporation, or its successor or assign, from all sales of electricity to residential and commercial customers and to the Municipality itself during that calendar year within the then corporate boundaries of Municipality and the total amount of municipal ad valorem taxes for that year paid by said Mississippi Power Company to Municipality on its electric distribution system within the corporate limits of Municipality, and shall then ascertain what percentage of the former the latter is. Association shall then pay Municipality this same percentage of the gross revenue, excluding sales taxes, received by Association from sales of electricity to residential and commercial customers and to the Municipality itself during said calendar year within the then corporate boundaries of Municipality. Such payment shall be made within 30 days following the payment of Mississippi Power Company's said ad valorem taxes for said year to Municipality.
4. Notwithstanding the provisions of paragraph numbered 3 hereof, Association shall not make the payment to Municipality therein set forth for any year for which Association's electric distribution system within the corporate limits of Municipality is subject to the payment of municipal ad valorem taxes, but in lieu thereof Association shall pay such ad valorem tax.
5. All of Association's electric distribution system within the corporate limits of Municipality as they now exist or may hereafter be extended shall be maintained in a reasonably safe condition and state of repair. Association is required by the Public Utility Act of Mississippi to furnish reasonably adequate electric service within said corporate limits of Municipality.
6. Municipality does hereby grant unto Association the right to construct and maintain electric lines on and over any street, alley or way of Municipality within the certificated area of Association; however, Association agrees that any electric distribution system, including poles, wires and other parts thereof, hereafter constructed by Association within the corporate boundaries of Municipality shall be constructed so as not to unreasonably interfere with the proper use of the streets, alleys and ways of Municipality. When any municipal work on any street, alley or way of the Municipality, including the surfacing or widening thereof, shall reasonably require any portion of Association's distribution system to be relocated, then same shall be promptly relocated by Association at its expense.
7. The term of this Agreement shall be for five years from and after the date hereof and shall be automatically extended for a period of five years from each expiration date unless and until either party shall have notified the other in writing not less than 90 days nor more than 180 days prior to any expiration date of its intention to terminate this Agreement.

STREET LIGHTING AGREEMENT

BETWEEN

COAST ELECTRIC POWER ASSOCIATION
AND
MUNICIPALITY OF PICAYUNE, MISSISSIPPI

THIS AGREEMENT made and entered into this the 1st day of December, 1964, by and between Coast Electric Power Association, hereinafter called "Association", and the Municipality of Picayune, Mississippi, a municipal corporation, hereinafter called "Municipality", WITNESSETH:

In consideration of the mutual covenants contained herein, it is agreed as follows:

1. During the term of this agreement Association shall supply as a public utility, and Municipality shall pay for its entire street lighting service in the area of the Municipality, for which Association holds a certificate from the Public Service Commission of Mississippi, in accordance with Rate Schedule LS-1, attached hereto and made a part hereof, or any effective superseding rate schedule as may be authorized by duly constituted regulatory authority, or as may become effective in the manner provided by law, and in accordance with Association's Service Policy as from time to time filed with Mississippi Public Service Commission.

2. The service to be furnished as of the date of this Agreement consists of the following equipment owned and to be maintained by Association:

NUMBER	SIZE
0	4,000 Lumens-Mercury Vapor Lamps
7	8,000 Lumens-Mercury Vapor Lamps

Location of the above seven lights shall be furnished Coast Electric Power Association by the City Manager.

Authorization for future street lighting shall be done by a simple order of the Mayor and Council from time to time as same are needed.

3. The per fixture rate as set forth in Rate Schedule LS-1 attached and made a part of this Agreement is based on fixture being placed on existing pole or structure owned by Association, and where said installation will not interfere with distribution facilities of Association. Per fixture rate includes cost of fixture, installation of fixture, maintenance of fixture and lamp, and electric energy to operate fixture. Other types of street lighting can and will be furnished on a cost basis negotiated by Municipality and Association.

Association reserves the right to remove fixtures from locations where maintenance cost is prohibitive because of acts of vandalism which municipality is unable to control.

4. Additional street lighting service other than as provided for in Part #2 of this Agreement shall be provided for by a supplementary letter or other written agreement approved by an authorized official of the Municipality and an authorized official of the Association. From time to time as additional lighting is requested and installed, then all such lights and fixtures shall become subject to the terms and conditions of this Agreement. The Association shall not be obligated to install additional light fixtures unless all of those previously installed are in use. The Association will relocate any fixture at the request of the Municipality provided the cost of such relocation is borne by Municipality.

5. In the event of interruption of service, the Association will restore the service as soon as it reasonably can do so and will at all times use its best effort in supplying as nearly constant service as is reasonably practicable to the end that all lamps supplied under this contract, whether a part of the initial installation or added subsequently, shall be kept burning in accordance with the hours prescribed in the attached rate schedule during the term of this contract or any renewal thereof. It is agreed, however, that should the supply of electric energy be interrupted or fail for any reason, such interruption or failure shall not constitute a breach of this contract, unless unreasonably continued, nor shall the Association be liable for damages by reason of such interruption or failure. The Municipality agrees to notify the Association promptly of any lamp or lamps not burning, and the Association agrees to replace such lamp or lamps within twenty-four hours of time of notice, or to credit Municipality with pro-rata hours lamp was, or lamps were, inoperative after the expiration of said twenty-four hours.

6. This Agreement is exclusively between Association and Municipality and confers no right on any third party whatsoever, irrespective of the relationship between Municipality and such party.

7. The term of this Agreement shall be for five years from and after the date hereof and shall be automatically extended for a period of five years from each expiration date unless and until either party shall have notified the other in writing not less than 90 days nor more than 180 days prior to any expiration date of its intention to terminate this Agreement.

8. This Agreement is subject to the order of duly constituted regulatory authority. The rendition of service hereunder is subject to Association's securing any requisite regulatory approvals incident to rendering such service.

AVAILABILITY

Service under this Rate Schedule is applicable and available to Cities, Towns, Villages and Subdivisions within the Association's certificated service area; provided, however, such service can be furnished without the extension of the Association's distribution facilities solely for the purpose of street lighting.

This rate is applicable only where five or more fixtures located in contiguous area are contracted for by customer and applies only to fixtures installed on existing poles of the Association.

TYPE OF SERVICE

Service is to be from dusk to dawn. The Association will own, operate and maintain the street lighting system, including fixtures, lamps and globes, with required controls. Such service is to be for exclusive use of customer and shall not be shared with or sold to a third party.

MONTHLY CHARGES FOR SERVICE

4,000 Lumens (nominal)	\$ 3.00

Each unit will include bracket, fixture, globe and lamp, together with control or control circuit. Association will furnish overhead supply circuits, but in no case, unless otherwise agreed upon, will Association furnish underground energy supply lines.

TAXES

To the total of all of the above charges for electric service under this rate schedule shall be added the applicable existing Mississippi State and municipal sales taxes, and any new or additional tax or taxes, or increases in the rates of existing taxes, imposed after the effective date of this rate schedule by a governmental authority upon the service rendered by the Association hereunder.

PAYMENT

Bills rendered under this rate schedule are net, payable monthly. If not paid within ten days of date of bill the gross rate shall apply, such gross rate being five percent (5%) higher than the net rate.

TERM OF CONTRACT

Contract period shall be not less than five (5) years.

ORDINANCE NO. 315

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 257 SO AS TO PROVIDE FOR THE
INCLUSION OF ALL PERSONS ENGAGED OR ENGAGING IN THE INSTALLATION
OF AIR CONDITIONING OF BUILDINGS

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PICAYUNE, MISSISSIPPI that Ordinance #257 as recorded in the official Ordinance Book of said City on Pages 1, 2, 3 and 4 thereof shall be amended so as to include for the licensing of all persons engaged or engaging in the business of installing air conditioning equipment. Section 6 and 7 of said Ordinance #257 is hereby amended to read as follows:

SECTION 6. All persons, firms or corporations (except public utility companies operating under a franchise) before doing any electrical wiring or installing any air conditioning equipment, shall furnish the City a good surety bond in the sum of Two Thousand Dollars, as a guarantee that electrical wiring and air conditioning installed by them or by their employees, shall be in accordance with the requirements of this ordinance, and it is further conditioned that such persons, firms or corporations shall, without further cost to the person for whom the work was done, remedy any defective or faulty work and to replace any inferior or sub-standard material installed by them or by their employees and found by the Electrical Inspector as not conforming with the requirements of this ordinance, and such bond as is furnished shall be liable for the correction of the faulty work or for the replacement of the inferior or sub-standard material and any additional cost arising from above mentioned causes.

SECTION 7. After the effective date of this ordinance, any person, firm or corporation engaged or hereafter engaging in the business of installing electrical wiring and air conditioning shall apply to the City Manager for and obtain a license for installing either electrical wiring or air conditioning, and for which he shall pay twenty five dollars; such license shall be for a term of twelve months, and shall entitle the person, firm or corporation to whom the license was issued to install electrical wiring and air conditioning after all other provisions of this ordinance have been complied with.

All other sections and parts of said Ordinance #257 shall remain in full force and effect as recorded herein.

Pepper, Councilmen; A. J. Read, City Manager; A. L. Franklin, City Clerk; and M. T. Thigpen, City Attorney.

It being determined that a quorum was present, the Mayor proclaimed the meeting open and the following proceedings were had and done:

The City Council having seen, read and considered the report of the Election Commissioners, Councilman A. H. Knight offered and moved the adoption of the following resolution:

A RESOLUTION APPROVING THE REPORT OF THE ELECTION COMMISSIONERS WITHIN AND FOR THE CITY OF PICAYUNE, MISSISSIPPI, IN RELATION TO A SPECIAL ELECTION HELD IN SAID CITY ON DECEMBER 15, 1964, FOR THE PURPOSE OF DETERMINING WHETHER COMBINED WATERWORKS, SEWER AND NATURAL GAS SYSTEM REVENUE BONDS OF SAID CITY IN AN AMOUNT NOT EXCEEDING TWO MILLION TEN THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$2,010,000.00) SHALL BE ISSUED FOR THE PURPOSE OF CONSTRUCTING EXTENSIONS AND IMPROVEMENTS TO THE SAID COMBINED SYSTEM, AND DECLARING THE RESULTS OF SAID ELECTION

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Picayune, Mississippi, on the 3rd day of November, 1964, declared the intention of the City of Picayune, Mississippi, to construct extensions and improvements to the combined waterworks, sewer and natural gas system of said City and to issue revenue bonds of said City in the maximum principal amount of Two Million Ten Thousand Dollars (\$2,010,000.00) to provide funds for the construction of said extensions and improvements with said bonds to be payable as to principal and interest solely from the income and revenues to be derived from the operation of the said combined system under the authority of Chapter 494 of the Laws of Mississippi for the year 1950, as amended, said ordinance being entitled as follows:

"AN ORDINANCE CALLING AND PROVIDING FOR THE HOLDING OF AN ELECTION WITHIN THE CITY OF PICAYUNE, MISSISSIPPI, FOR THE PURPOSE OF SUBMITTING TO THE QUALIFIED ELECTORS OF SAID CITY A PROPOSITION TO AUTHORIZE THE ISSUANCE OF COMBINED WATERWORKS, SEWER AND NATURAL GAS SYSTEM REVENUE BONDS OF SAID CITY IN THE MAXIMUM PRINCIPAL AMOUNT OF TWO MILLION TEN THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$2,010,000.00) FOR THE PURPOSE OF EXTENDING AND IMPROVING THE COMBINED WATERWORKS, SEWER AND NATURAL GAS SYSTEM OF THE CITY OF PICAYUNE; PROVIDING FOR THE GIVING OF NOTICE OF SAID ELECTION; PRESCRIBING THE FORM OF THE BALLOT AND THE MANNER OF HOLDING SAID ELECTION; AND PROVIDING FOR OTHER MATTERS IN CONNECTION THEREWITH."

and

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Picayune, Mississippi, by the aforesaid ordinance adopted on the 3rd day of November, 1964, directed the calling and holding of an election to determine whether or not the City of Picayune, Mississippi, should issue the aforesaid revenue bonds of said City under the aforesaid authority in said amount for said purpose; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to said ordinance the Election Commissioners of the City of Picayune, Mississippi, did cause notice of said special election to be given by publication once a week for at least three consecutive weeks in "The Picayune Item", a newspaper published in the City of Picayune, Mississippi, and having a general circulation therein, the first publication of said notice having been made not less than twenty-one days prior to December 15, 1964, the date fixed for such election and the last publication having been made not more than seven days prior to said date, said notice having been published in said newspaper on November 12, November 19, November 26, December 3 and December 10, 1964, in accordance with and as required by the Laws of the State of Mississippi and by the aforesaid ordinance of this City Council; and

WHEREAS, the said Election Commissioners did meet at the office of the Registrar in Picayune, Mississippi, and did revise the registration books of said City as required by law; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to said ordinance, the Election Commissioners of the City of Picayune, Mississippi, have held the special election as directed in said ordinance and in accordance with the Laws of the State of Mississippi, and have filed with this City Council their report of said election and this City Council now has before it for consideration the said report of the said Election Commissioners as to the result of the said special election held in the City of Picayune, Mississippi, on the 15th day of December, 1964, to determine if said City should issue revenue bonds in an amount not to exceed \$2,010,000.00 to provide funds for the aforesaid purposes, said bonds to be payable from the aforesaid revenues of the said combined system; and

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WHEREAS, the report of the said Election Commissioners shows that the proposition voted upon at said election was as follows:

"SHALL THE CITY OF PICAYUNE, MISSISSIPPI, ISSUE ITS COMBINED WATERWORKS, SEWER AND NATURAL GAS SYSTEM REVENUE BONDS IN THE MAXIMUM PRINCIPAL AMOUNT OF TWO MILLION TEN THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$2,010,000.00) FOR THE PURPOSE OF CONSTRUCTING EXTENSIONS AND IMPROVEMENTS TO THE SAID COMBINED SYSTEM, SAID BONDS TO BE PAYABLE AS TO PRINCIPAL AND INTEREST SOLELY FROM THE INCOME AND REVENUES TO BE DERIVED FROM THE OPERATION OF THE SAID COMBINED SYSTEM?"

and

WHEREAS, it appears from the aforesaid report of the Election Commissioners, which report the City Council hereby finds to be true and correct in every respect, that 684 votes were cast on the aforesaid proposition at said election, of which 514 votes were cast for the bond issue and 167 votes were cast against the bond issue, and three votes were rejected; and

WHEREAS, it appears that said proposition was assented to at said election by more than a majority of the qualified electors of the City of Picayune, Mississippi, voting on said proposition in said election; and

WHEREAS, this City Council should now receive, accept and adopt said report and have the same spread upon the minutes of this City Council;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PICAYUNE, MISSISSIPPI, AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. That the aforesaid report of the Election Commissioners of the City of Picayune, Mississippi, relating to the special election held in said City on Tuesday, the 15th day of December, 1964, to determine if revenue bonds of the City of Picayune, Mississippi should be issued in an amount not to exceed Two Million Ten Thousand Dollars (\$2,010,000.00) for the aforesaid purposes, is hereby received, accepted, approved, confirmed and adopted and ordered spread at large upon the minutes of this City Council.

SECTION 2. That the City Council has ascertained and does now adjudge that the special election of December 15, 1964, was duly and legally held after publication of the notice to the qualified electors of said City in "The Picayune Item", a newspaper published in and having general circulation in said City as shown by proof of publication of said notice which is attached to the foregoing report of the Election Commissioners of said City and which is now on file with the City Clerk, said notice having been published in said newspaper on November 12, November 19, November 26, December 3 and December 10, 1964, and that the following proposition submitted to the qualified electors of said City at the aforesaid special election, to-wit:

"SHALL THE CITY OF PICAYUNE, MISSISSIPPI, ISSUE ITS COMBINED WATERWORKS, SEWER AND NATURAL GAS SYSTEM REVENUE BONDS IN THE MAXIMUM PRINCIPAL AMOUNT OF TWO MILLION TEN THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$2,010,000.00) FOR THE PURPOSE OF CONSTRUCTING EXTENSIONS AND IMPROVEMENTS TO THE SAID COMBINED SYSTEM, SAID BONDS TO BE PAYABLE AS TO PRINCIPAL AND INTEREST SOLELY FROM THE INCOME AND REVENUES TO BE DERIVED FROM THE OPERATION OF THE SAID COMBINED SYSTEM?"

was assented to by more than a majority of the qualified electors of said City voting thereon at the said election.

SECTION 3. That the City Council of the City of Picayune, Mississippi, acting as the governing authority of said City, is now authorized and empowered to issue the bonds of said City in the amount and for the purpose aforesaid and that the said bonds shall be issued at such time or times in such amount or amounts as may hereafter be directed by this City Council.

Councilman O. V. Lewis seconded the motion to adopt the foregoing resolution which was first reduced to writing and was read, considered and voted on by sections and as a whole, with the vote thereon being as follows:
