



Pepper, Councilmen; A. J. Read, City Manager; A. L. Franklin, City Clerk; and M. T. Thigpen, City Attorney.

It being determined that a quorum was present, the Mayor proclaimed the meeting open and the following proceedings were had and done:

ORDINANCE NO. 328  
AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ARTICLE 10, SECTION 10.01,1,  
OF ORDINANCE NO. 281 BY REDUCING THE COMBINED SIDE  
YARD WIDTH REQUIRED FOR DWELLINGS IN INDUSTRIAL  
DISTRICTS

WHEREAS, it has been heretofore determined and is hereby adjudicated by the Mayor and Council of the City of Picayune, Mississippi that the amendment of Section 10.01,1, Article 10 of Ordinance No. 281 of said City reducing the combined width of both side yards for residences in industrial district to ten (10) feet is not detrimental to the general welfare of said City, and should be made, same being recommended by the Planning Commission of said City, and

WHEREAS, the governing authorities of said City have at their regular December 1965 meeting adopted an order declaring the intention to adopt such amendment, publishing notice of a public hearing to be held on said proposed order on January 11, 1966 at the City Hall in said City at 7:00 P. M., and

WHEREAS, on said date and at said time and place the said public hearing was held, there being no objections voiced by anyone, notice having been given according to law,

NOW, THEREFORE, Be It Ordained by the Mayor and Council of the City of Picayune, Mississippi as follows, to-wit:

Section 1. That Article 10, Section 10.01, Sub-section 1, of Ordinance No. 281 of the City of Picayune, Mississippi be and it is hereby amended so as to reduce the combined side yard width from fifteen feet to ten feet as to residential development in industrial areas, by adding to said Article 10, Section 10.01, Sub-section 1, Ordinance No. 281 of the following, to-wit:

"except that as to residential development the combined side yard width shall be ten feet."

Section 2. That this Ordinance being for the public welfare and benefit and it being in the interest of said City and the citizens thereof that it be effective immediately, shall be in full force and effect as of its passage.

The foregoing ordinance was first reduced to writing, considered and passed section by section, then as a whole with the vote on each section and upon said ordinance as a whole resulting as follows:







It being determined that a quorum was present, the Mayor Pro-tem proclaimed the meeting open and the following proceedings were had and done:

ORDINANCE NO. 329  
AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ARTICLE 1, SECTION 1.02 OF ORDINANCE  
NO. 281 OF THE CITY OF PICAYUNE, BY SUBSTITUTING IN LIEU OF  
THE OFFICIAL ZONING MAP A NEW ZONING MAP

WHEREAS, the zoning within the City of Picayune, Mississippi is regulated by Ordinance No. 281 of said City, which Ordinance has been in effect for several years, and

WHEREAS, considerable additional territory has been added to the said City since the adoption of the original zoning map, and

WHEREAS, within the last three years, there has been a large influx of population in the said City and areas immediately adjacent thereto have become thickly populated, so that it has been necessary to regulate the uses of all of these properties, and

WHEREAS, the governing authorities of the City of Picayune has employed Southern Consultants, Inc., to prepare a complete zoning map of the City of Picayune, and

WHEREAS, the Planning Commission of the City of Picayune has approved the zoning map prepared by Southern Consultants, Inc. and recommended its adoption and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council of the City of Picayune at its December, 1965 meeting adopted an order declaring the intention of said governing authorities to amend Ordinance No. 281, Article 1, Section 1.02, by substituting a new official zoning map, pursuant to which order notice according to law was given of a public hearing held by said governing authorities at 5:00 P. M. on January 18, 1966 at the City Hall in said City to determine whether Article 1, Section 1.02 of Ordinance No. 281 should be so amended as to adopt an entirely new official zoning map, and substituting for the said sub-section the language set forth in said order and in said notice, and

WHEREAS, at said time and place the said public hearing was held, there being no objections or protest by any interested party,

NOW, THEREFORE, Be It Ordained by the Mayor and Council of the City of Picayune, Mississippi as follows:

Section 1. That Article 1, Section 1.02 of Ordinance No. 281 of the City of Picayune be, and it is hereby amended so as to strike said sub-section entirely and to substitute in place of the contents thereof the following:

"The official zoning map shall be identified by the signature of the Mayor, attested by the City Clerk and bearing the following words: "This is to certify that this is the official zoning map referred to in Article 1, Section 1.02 of Ordinance No. 281 of the City of Picayune, such official zoning map having been adopted on January 18, 1966."

Section 2. That this Ordinance, being for the public welfare and being in the best interest of the City of Picayune and its citizens be in full force and effect from and after its passage.

The foregoing ordinance was first reduced to writing, considered and passed section by section, then as a whole with the vote on each section and upon said ordinance as a whole resulting as follows:







ORDINANCE NO. 330  
ORDINANCE REGULATING SPEED AND PARKING OF TRAINS WITHIN  
THE CITY OF PICAYUNE, MISSISSIPPI

WHEREAS, trains operated on the tracks of the New Orleans and Northeastern Railroad have been proceeding through the City of Picayune and across the grade crossings therein at high and dangerous rates of speed, and

WHEREAS, the flashing light signals at such grade crossings operated during hours when railroad cars are being parked and switched within the railroad yards, so that the traveling public have learned that the operation of such signals does not necessary indicate an approaching train, the signals also being at times apparently out of order and operating continuously at times when no trains are on the tracks, so that the use of such signals as traffic warnings is no longer as effective as it should be, and

WHEREAS, it has long been the habit of the said railroad company to park strings of railroad cars on its tracks near the Canal Street crossing and the Third Avenue crossing in said City thus obstructing the view of the traveling public and making it difficult if not impossible to see approaching trains, thus constituting an additional hazard to the traveling public, and

WHEREAS, the safety and welfare of the citizens of said City demand that the governing authorities of said City adopt reasonable parking regulations and speed limitation governing the operation and use of railroad trains and rolling stock,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PICAYUNE, MISSISSIPPI AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That it shall be unlawful for any railroad locomotive or railroad train to enter into, upon or across any grade level crossing of any street or other public way of the City of Picayune, Mississippi at a speed in excess of forty miles per hour.

Section 2. That it shall be unlawful for any railroad locomotive, railroad car, or railroad rolling stock of any kind to be parked and left unattended within 100 feet of any grade level crossing of any street or other public way of the City of Picayune.






BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Council of the City of Picayune, Mississippi as follows:



Williams, Mayor, is hereby authorized to sign a contract with Mississippi Power Company for lights at the colored recreation grounds and for sewer pumping stations located at Circle Drive and Loftin Avenue.

CONTRACT WITH DIXIE UTILITIES, INC.

This agreement made and entered into on the day hereinafter set out, by and between the City of Picayune, Mississippi, a municipal Corporation, hereinafter called City, and Dixie Utilities, Inc., hereinafter called Dixie, witnesseth that in consideration of the covenants and agreements hereinafter set forth to be kept and performed by the parties hereto, it is agreed by and between said parties as follows:

## I

Subject to the terms, conditions and limitations hereof, City agrees to sell and deliver or cause to be delivered to Dixie and Dixie agrees to purchase and receive from City and pay City for natural gas as follows: All of Dixie's requirements for general service, resale and distribution through the distribution system of Dixie serving the area of Pearl River County, Mississippi described as

Beginning at the Southwest Corner of SW $\frac{1}{4}$  of SW $\frac{1}{4}$  of Section 17, Township 6 South, Range 17 West, in Pearl River County, Mississippi, thence run West along the South line of Sections 17 and 18 to the intersection of Ferris Slough, thence run Northwesterly along the North bank of Ferris Slough to the East bank of Pearl River, thence run North along the East bank of Pearl River to the intersection of said river bank with the Northern boundary of Township 5 South, Range 18 West, thence run East along said Township line to the Western boundary of Interstate Highway #59 right of way, thence run Southerly along said right of way boundary to Mill Creek, thence run Westerly along the meanderings of said Mill Creek to West Hoblochitto River to the Northern boundary of Township 6 South, Range 17 West in Pearl River County, Mississippi, thence run West to the Northwest corner of NE $\frac{1}{4}$  of NW $\frac{1}{4}$  of Section 5, Township 6 South, Range 17 West, thence run South three miles to the place of beginning.

Delivery of natural gas by City to Dixie shall be made at the outlet of City's facilities at a point as designated near Westchester Heights Subdivision and at any additional point or points which may be in the future mutually agreed upon by the parties and added by revising this agreement.

Such gas shall be delivered hereunder at line pressure which may vary from time to time according to the load, it being understood however, that the base pressure to be used shall be four ounces with atmospheric pressure of 14.70 pounds. Dixie agrees to take and receive gas hereunder at the pressure as herein provided and thereafter to regulate and control said gas to the extent necessary for its operation.

## II

All gas delivered hereunder shall be at a price of five cents above the cost of said gas to City, or at this time Thirty-eight (\$.38) Cents per thousand cubic feet with adjustments made annually after City's cost is determined on an annual basis. It is understood that gas is being furnished by United Gas Pipeline Company to City and that, if United should raise or lower the rate to City, then the rate to Dixie shall be adjusted up or down accordingly. It is further understood and agreed that the conditions of the contract between City and United Gas Pipeline Company are incorporated herein, and this contract, is made subject to such conditions. All natural gas shall be measured by a positive gas meter or meters equipped with a volume and pressure gauge with charts to be changed weekly. These charts shall remain in possession of City, but Dixie will have the right to examine said charts at the City Hall of City.

## III

It is further understood and agreed that in the event City should extend its corporate limits into any territory being served by Dixie, City is hereby granted the right and option to purchase the system operated by Dixie or the portion thereof located within such extension of City Limits at a negotiated price to be mutually agreed upon between the parties, and in the event the parties are not able to mutually agree upon a price, then such price shall be determined by arbitration, in which event City shall appoint one arbitrator and Dixie shall appoint one arbitrator and these two arbitrators shall appoint a third arbitrator and the decision of a majority of such board of arbitration shall be final and governing and binding on the parties.

## IV

It is understood that in the event City shall voluntarily sell or exchange its gas system, then City agrees to cause the person, firm or corporation so acquiring such facilities to take and hold same subject to this agreement, and subject to the obligation to fully and faithfully perform all of the obligations created by this agreement. However, in the event City shall involuntarily lose control of such system, then City shall no longer be bound by the terms of this agreement.

## V

It is mutually agreed that payment for all gas delivered to Dixie shall be made by the tenth day of the calendar month following the calendar month in which such delivery is made. It is further mutually agreed by and between the parties hereto that City shall be, and is hereby, granted a lien on the entire natural gas transmission system or systems in Mississippi owned and to be owned and/or operated by Dixie and furnished with gas by City to secure payment for any and all gas delivered to Dixie by City; in the event any portion of the amount due for any calendar month shall not have been received within a period of 30 days after the maximum due date as above provided then, in such event, City is hereby granted the right, without prior notice and without legal process, to immediately take over the said natural gas transmission system, to have full access to books and records and to operate same for such period as shall be necessary to earn a net profit in an amount sufficient to pay all amounts owed to City plus an amount equal to double the receipts of the last and next preceding month's operation by said City, such overage to stand as additional security for future and subsequent deliveries. It is further agreed that, in the event such system is taken over for operation by the City according to the terms hereof, Dixie shall be entitled, upon furnishing to City a good and valid surety or performance bond, in a surety or bonding company authorized to do business in Mississippi, in an amount equal to double the average monthly sales price of natural gas previously furnished by City to Dixie, to take back over the operation of such natural gas transmission system; however, such bond shall not in any way supersede or eliminate the lien heretofore granted City nor the right on the part of City to take over said system for and subsequent defaults. It is understood and agreed that the failure on the part of City to exercise its option to take over the said system, for any such default, at any time or times, shall not be construed as a waiver of the right on the part of City to exercise such option at any subsequent time or times for the same or any subsequent default or defaults. Should it become necessary for City to take over such system and while operating same should add any new lines and/or customers, the cost thereof shall be borne by Dixie.

VI

No modification of the terms and provisions of this agreement shall be, or become effective, other than by the execution in writing of a superseding service agreement, or by a written amendment hereto, it being specifically understood and agreed that no verbal or other agreements which are not embodied in a mutually signed and executed instrument shall be binding, and further, that no practices or customs shall be allowed to become a part of this contract unless embodied in a written contract between the parties.



RESOLUTION OF THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PICAYUNE  
DECLARING THEIR INTENTION TO ISSUE AND SELL \$40,000.00 NE-  
GOTTABLE NOTES OF THE PICAYUNE MUNICIPAL SEPARATE SCHOOL  
DISTRICT TO FINANCE PURCHASES OF FIXTURES AND EQUIPMENT FOR  
BUILDINGS

WHEREAS, a duly certified copy of resolution of the Board of Trustees of Picayune Municipal Separate School District, adopted by said Board on August 16, 1966, declaring the necessity of a loan to said District in the amount of \$40,000.00 to finance the purchase of fixtures and equipment and installation of same in the buildings of said School District, such purchases and improvements being necessary, said resolution certifying that there are no funds available for such purposes from the school funds of said District or from any other source, that amount being necessary for said purposes, the said loan to be evidenced by negotiable notes of said School District bearing interest from date at a rate not to exceed four (4) per centum per annum, payable annually and falling due at the rate of Eight Thousand (\$8,000.00) Dollars per year for a period of five (5) years, on the principal, and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council of the City of Picayune have maturely considered said resolution and do now find and adjudicate that all facts set forth therein are true and correct as hereinabove set out, and

WHEREAS, after due investigation, the Mayor and Council of said City do hereby find, adjudge and determine as follows, to-wit:

## MUNICIPAL MINUTES, CITY OF PICAYUNE

(a) That the Picayune Municipal Separate School District in Pearl River and Hancock Counties, Mississippi is a duly and lawfully created, organized and existing Municipal Separate School District under the Laws of the State of Mississippi.

(b) That the total assessment of all taxable property in said School District, according to the last completed assessment roll, being for the taxable year 1965, is the sum of \$19,237,615.77, exclusive of motor vehicles.

(c) That the issuance of the negotiable notes of the said School District in the sum of \$40,000.00, when added to its present bonded indebtedness, will not result in the imposition on any of the property in said District of a debt for school purposes of more than fifteen (15) per centum of the assessed valuation of the property within said District according to the last completed assessment, that the issuance of said notes will not require an annual tax levy in excess of two (2) mills on the dollar for the payment of all notes issued under the provisions of Chapter 30 of the Laws of Mississippi for the Extraordinary Session of 1953 (commencing November 3, 1953 and ending December 28, 1953) and all notes issued under the statutes repealed by said Chapter 30 of the Laws of 1953 and any amendments thereto, and that no bonds or notes have been issued under the provisions of said statute by or on behalf of said District within the period of more than one year prior to the date of August 1, 1966;

(d) That the total bonded indebtedness of the Picayune Municipal Separate School District, exclusive of the amount herein provided, is the sum of \$1,191,600.00,

NOW, THEREFORE, Be It Resolved that the Mayor and Council of the City of Picayune, Pearl River County, Mississippi do hereby declare their intention and purpose at the regular October, 1966 meeting of said Mayor and Council to be held on the 4th day of October, 1966 at 7:00 P. M. at the City Hall in said City to authorize said loan to the said School District and to issue the negotiable notes of said School District to evidence said loan, the proceeds thereof to be used for the purpose of purchasing fixtures and equipment and installing same in and for the school buildings of said District, and for no other purposes, said notes to be dated October 1, 1966, to be in the total sum of Forty Thousand (\$40,000.00) Dollars, to be in denominations of Four Thousand (\$4,000.00) Dollars each, and numbered one to ten, both inclusive, said notes to bear interest from date at a rate not to exceed four (4) percentum per annum payable annually, and to mature at the rate of Eight Thousand (\$8,000.00) Dollars annually over a period of five (5) years. ORDINANCE NO. 333  
ORDINANCE PROHIBITING THE LITTERING OF THE STREETS OF THE CITY  
OF PICAYUNE WITH PAPER, TRASH, GLASS, AND OTHER DEBRIS, AND  
PROVIDING PENALTY FOR VIOLATION

BE IT ORDAINED By the Mayor and Council of the City of Picayune, Mississippi as follows, to-wit:

Section 1. That the placing, in any manner, of paper, glass, metal, rubber, and other debris of any and all kinds on the streets, public alleys, public ways, and other common areas of the City of Picayune is hereby prohibited and declared to be a misdemeanor.

Section 2. That the placing of each separate article or item prohibited by Section 1 hereof on the streets, other public ways and common areas of said City shall be a separate offense and punishable hereunder.

Section 3. That each violation of this ordinance shall be a misdemeanor and punishable by a fine of not less than \$5.00 and not more than \$100.00, except that the placing of broken glass on the said streets, other public ways and common areas of said City shall be punishable by a fine of not less than \$10.00 and not more than \$200.00.

Section 4. This ordinance being for the immediate and temporary preservation of the public peace, health and safety of the citizens of said City, being made necessary because of the indiscriminate and unsanitary littering of the public ways of said City and the dangers resulting therefrom, shall be, and it is hereby made, effective immediately from and after its passage and approval by said governing authorities.



WHEREAS, there was filed with the Mayor and Council of the City of Picayune, Mississippi, on August 26th 1966, a certified copy of a resolution of the Board of Trustees of the Picayune Municipal Separate School District said resolution having been adopted by the said Board of Trustees on August 16th, 1966, declaring the necessity for said school district to borrow the sum of Forty Thousand (\$40,000.00) to finance the purchases of fixtures and equipment for buildings and installation of same, in said district, for school purposes, all of said purchases and work being necessary, and for no other purposes, said resolution being set out herein as follows, to-wit:

"WHEREAS, the crowded condition of the schools of the Picayune Municipal Separate School District make it necessary and require that fixtures and equipment be made to the West Side Elementary School of said District, that land for school purposes be purchased adjacent to the Carver High School property in the NW $\frac{1}{4}$  of SW $\frac{1}{4}$  of Section 15, Township 6 South, Range 17 West in Pearl River County, Mississippi, and that fixtures and equipment for the building of said district be purchased, requiring an expenditure, to finance same, of Forty Thousand (\$40,000.00) Dollars, in addition to any funds to be secured from the State Educational Finance Commission, which said sum is not available in the school funds of said district or from any other source with which to make such alterations, additions and purchases, as aforesaid, so that it is necessary that said sum be borrowed pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 30 of the Laws of Mississippi of 1953 as amended, (Sections 6533-01 through 6533-10, inclusive of the Mississippi Code of 1942, as amended), the indebtedness to be evidenced by negotiable notes of the Picayune Municipal Separate School District payable at the rate of Eight Thousand (\$8,000.00) Dollars per year, plus interest from date, not to exceed 4% per annum, principal and interest payable annually over a period of five years.

NOW, THEREFORE, Be It Resolved by the Board of Trustees of the Picayune Municipal Separate School District as follows, to-wit:

That it be, and is hereby, adjudicated and declared that it is necessary that the said fixtures and equipment and purchases as aforesaid be made, and that said sum of money be borrowed as hereinbefore set out, and that the borrowing of such money will not require a levy on the taxable property of said district in excess of two mills per year to repay same, including the payment of all notes previously issued under said Chapter 30 of the Laws of Mississippi of 1953 as amended (Sections 6533-01 through 6533-10, inclusive, of the Mississippi Code of 1942 as amended). That no funds are available from the school funds of said district or from any other source to finance the performance of said alterations and additions and the making of such purchases of heating plants, fixtures, equipment and land for school purposes as hereinabove set out. That the President and Secretary of this Board be, and they are hereby authorized and directed to take any and all necessary steps in order to secure funds for the purposes as herein set out, and to certify to the Mayor and Council of the City of Picayune a copy of this resolution. WHEREAS, the aforesaid resolution of said Mayor and Council was duly published in the way and manner provided by law in the Picayune Item, a public and legal newspaper published in Picayune, Pearl River County, Mississippi, and having a general circulation in said school district and in Pearl River County, Mississippi, which said newspaper has been in existence and in publication and general circulation for more than one year next preceding the date of publication of said resolution in the issues of said newspaper dated the 15th and 22nd days of September, 1966.

WHEREAS, a sworn proof of publication of said resolution in due legal form has been duly filed with the City Clerk of the City of Picayune, Mississippi, a copy of which said resolution with proof of publication thereof being as follows, to-wit:

WHEREAS, after duly investigation, the Mayor and Council of said City at this regular October, 1966 meeting of said Mayor and Council, do hereby find, adjudge and determine as follows, to-wit:

(a) That the Picayune Municipal Separate School District in Pearl River County, Mississippi, and in Hancock County, Mississippi, is a duly and lawfully created, organized and existing Municipal Separate School District under the laws of the State of Mississippi, whose territorial limits include all of the territory comprising the City of Picayune, Pearl River County, Mississippi, together with additional adjacent territory lying in Pearl River and Hancock Counties, Mississippi.

(b) That the total assessment of all taxable property in said Picayune Municipal Separate School District according to the last completed assessment rolls, being for the taxable year 1965, is the sum of \$19,237,615.77, Dollars, exclusive of motor vehicles.

(c) That the issuance of the negotiable notes of the said School District in the sum of Forty Thousand (\$40,000.00) Dollars, when added to its present bonded indebtedness, will not result in the imposition on any of the property in such district of an indebtedness for school purposes of more than 15 per centum of the assessed valuation of the property within such district, according to the last completed assessment, that the issuance of said notes will not require an annual tax levy in excess of two mills on the dollar for the payment of all notes issued under the provisions of Chapter 30, of the Laws of Mississippi of the Extraordinary Session of 1953 (Commencing November 3, 1953 and ending December 28, 1953) and all notes issued under the statutes repealed by said Chapter 30 of the Laws of 1953, and any amendments thereto (Sections 6533-01 through 6533-10 inclusive of the Mississippi Code of 1942 as amended) and that no bond or notes have been issued under the provisions of said statute, by, or on behalf of, said District within a period of more than one year prior to the date of August 1, 1966;

(d) That the total bonded indebtedness of the Picayune Municipal Separate School District, exclusive of the amount herein provided is the sum of \$1,191,600.00 Dollars.

(g) That no petition has been filed with the said Mayor and Council of said City by twenty per centum or more of the qualified electors of said District requesting an election in accordance with law, and in fact, no protest or petition of any kind or character in opposition to the issuance of the said negotiable notes has been filed with or made to said Mayor and Council, and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council of the City of Picayune, Pearl River County, Mississippi, are authorized under the constitution and statutes of the State of Mississippi to issue the negotiable notes for said Picayune Municipal Separate School District for said purposes in the total principal sum of \$40,000.00, and

WHEREAS, the said Mayor and Council of said City do hereby find, determine and adjudicate that it is necessary and for the best interest of the Picayune Municipal Separate School District that said negotiable notes in the amount of \$40,000.00 for the purposes aforesaid be issued and sold;

NOW, THEREFORE, Be It Resolved by the Mayor and Council of the City of Picayune, Mississippi, as follows, to-wit:

Section 1. That for the purpose of financing the purchase and installation of fixtures and equipment for the buildings of the Picayune Municipal Separate School District, and for no other purpose there shall be issued and sold the negotiable notes of said Picayune Municipal Separate School District in the principal amount of \$40,000.00.

Section 2. That said note shall be designated the 1966 Negotiable Notes for General Improvements, Picayune Municipal Separate School District, shall be dated October 1, 1966, shall bear interest from that date until the principal thereof shall be fully paid at the rate of 4% per annum, said interest to be payable annually. TO PROVIDE FOR THE SERVICING OF SAME AND OTHER  
PURPOSES

"WHEREAS, there came on for hearing this day at the regular meeting of the governing authorities of the City of Picayune, Mississippi, the petition of the Board of Trustees of the Picayune Municipal Separate School District of said City of Picayune, Mississippi, dated the 16th day of August, 1966, petitioning and requesting this Board to borrow the Sum of \$15,434.75 to be used by said board of trustees in purchasing three new motor vehicles and other school transportation equipment in which to transport to and from the public schools of said municipal separate school district the school children attending said schools, and to provide for the servicing and repair of such district owned motor vehicles, or other school transportation equipment, and to establish, erect, and equip school bus shops or garages, and purchase land therefor, and to issue negotiable notes or bonds for said municipal separate school district in evidence of said sum, said notes or bonds to be payable in six annual installments over a period of six years from the date of their issuance, (not exceeding six years if new transportation equipment is to be purchased, or two years if used transportation equipment is to be purchased), and to bear not exceeding four per cent (4%) interest per annum, principal and interest to be paid from the transportation funds of said district, all as provided by Chapter 15 and Chapter 18, Laws of Extraordinary Session of 1953.

"WHEREAS, the Board finds that on the 16th day of August, 1966, at a regular meeting of said Board of Trustees of said municipal separate school district, duly and legally called and held, the said Board of Trustees, by a majority vote of all its members, duly adopted an order or resolution finding and adjudging that it is necessary and advisable to purchase and operate for said district three motor vehicles or other school transportation equipment, and to provide for the servicing and repair of such district owned motor vehicles or other school transportation equipment, and to employ drivers for the operation thereof, and to establish, erect, and equip school bus

shops or garages, and purchase land therefor, in order to provide satisfactory school transportation service at a reasonable cost for the school children of said school district attending said public schools and that it is necessary to borrow said sum of \$15,434.75 with which to pay the purchase price of said motor vehicles, other equipment, shops or garages, or construction costs, and land, as shown by a certified copy of said resolution of the Board of Trustees attached to said petition; that said petition, with said resolution attached, was first submitted to the State Board of Education for its approval or disapproval, and that on the 28th day of September, 1966, the State Board of Education adopted and spread upon its minutes an order approving the said resolution and petition of said Board of Trustees of said municipal separate school district, as shown by a certified copy of said order of the State Board of Education attached to the said petition and resolution of the Board of Trustees; and,

"WHEREAS, the governing authorities further find and adjudge that there is no money at the present time in the transportation funds of said district, available for the purpose of paying any part of the purchase price of said motor vehicles and to provide for the servicing and repair of such district owned motor vehicles, or other school transportation equipment, and to establish, erect, and equip school bus shops or garages, and purchase land therefor, and that it is necessary to borrow \$15,434.75 required to pay the said costs, and that all the facts and recitals contained in said resolution of the Board of Trustees of said municipal separate school district are true and correct:

"NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED AND ORDERED BY THE GOVERNING AUTHORITIES OF THE CITY OF PICAYUNE, MISSISSIPPI, as follows:

SECTION 1. That, for the purpose of providing money for the purchase of motor vehicles and other school transportation equipment and to provide for the servicing and repair of such district owned motor vehicles or other school transportation equipment, and to establish, erect, and equip school bus shops or garages, and purchase land therefor, as requested in the resolution and petition of the Board of Trustees of the Municipal Separate School District of the City of Picayune, Mississippi, there shall be, and there are hereby authorized, ordered and directed to be issued the negotiable notes of the Picayune Municipal Separate School District of the City of Picayune, Mississippi, in the principal sum of \$15,434.75. The said notes shall bear date of November 1, and shall be numbered from one to twelve, and shall be payable, both as to principal and interest in lawful money of the United States of America at the office of the Municipal Clerk of the City of Picayune, Mississippi. ## MUNICIPAL MINUTES, CITY OF PICAYUNE

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, the City of Picayune and its trade territory has grown immensely in population with the refuse and garbage increasing proportionately which has forced the city to purchase an incinerator for the disposal of garbage and refuse, the maintenance and operation of which is estimated to cost \$15,000 per year, and

WHEREAS, a study has revealed that disposable garbage bags are more sanitary and healthy in the collection of garbage, and by using such methods the city will be in position to increase its pickup in both the residential and commercial areas. This study has also revealed that the cost of furnishing all citizens with disposable garbage bags will be approximately \$15,000, and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council deem it to be in the best interest of the City of Picayune and its citizens to fix and charge a garbage collection fee in said city.

ORDINANCE NO. 334  
ORDINANCE REGULATING THE PLACING AND HANDLING OF TRASH  
AND GARBAGE AND THE COLLECTION THEREOF IN THE CITY OF  
PICAYUNE

BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Council of the City of Picayune, Mississippi as follows, to-wit:

Section 1. That a garbage collection fee be and the same is hereby fixed for all residential places at \$1.00 per month; that the City of Picayune shall furnish each such resident a sufficient number of garbage bags for using two each week.

That a fee of \$2 - \$4 and \$6 per month be charged to the business places, \$2 for small stores, \$4 for average stores and \$6 for large stores. It is assumed that the largest stores will not require more than two hours for each pickup. These fees are based on that assumption. Should it require more time, then the City reserves the right to adjust these fees proportionately.

Section 2. That each private residence, apartment house, commercial establishment, and any other place of business or residence shall maintain on its premises in a suitable holder standard disposable paper garbage bags of not less than 20-gallon capacity with means for closing or covering same at all times, for the storage of trash and garbage, for use as follows:

(a) The above mentioned container, on collection days as designated by said City through its City Manager, same to be not less than once each week, shall be placed on the outside of the building at the curb or at a place which is readily accessible to the City garbage collector.

(b) It shall be the duty of every owner or occupant of each private residence, apartment house, commercial establishment and any other house of business or residence to use the disposable paper garbage system for trash and garbage storage and collection. After the first day of January, 1967, said City shall refuse to collect trash and garbage from any private residence, apartment house, commercial establishment and any other-place of business or residence failing to employ the said disposable paper garbage bag system.

(c) It shall be the duty of every owner or occupant of each private residence, apartment house, commercial establishment and any other place of business or residence, who fails to employ said disposable paper garbage bag system for trash and garbage storage and collection, to provide an independent system of collecting trash and garbage not less than once weekly.

(d) The above mentioned provisions shall not be applicable to special trash collections by the city, such as trees, shrubbery trimmings, straw and leaves.

Section 3. It shall be unlawful for any person to deposit anywhere in said City uncovered items or piles of trash, garbage, junk, tin cans, bottles, carcasses of dead fowl or animals, filth, sawdust, shavings, litter or other refuse. All deposits of such matter and refuse shall be carried to the city incinerator or buried at least two (2) feet below the surface of the ground within twenty four (24) hours from the date of such deposits, or burned in properly constructed incinerators, or destroyed by some other accepted method. Any uncovered litter or other refuse is hereby declared to be a nuisance. It shall be unlawful for carpenters, contractors, or house repairmen to place old lumber, roofing or other such refuse along the streets or sidewalks. Each such contractor or carpenter shall be required to haul away all of his trash.

## MUNICIPAL MINUTES, CITY OF PICAYUNE

Section 4. It shall be unlawful for any owner or occupant of a private residence, apartment house, commercial establishment or any other place of business or residence, who fails to employ the said disposable paper garbage bag system to allow garbage to be stored in any manner, other than buried, burned or destroyed as provided in Section 3 hereof, for a period longer than one week.

Section 5. Each violation of this ordinance or any Section or subsection thereof shall be a misdemeanor and punishable by a fine of not less than \$5.00 nor more than \$100.00 for each offense, it being provided that each day such violation continues shall constitute a separate violation and offense hereunder and shall be punishable as such.


Section 6. It appearing and being hereby adjudicated by the said governing authorities of said city that violations of good practice and of the provisions of this ordinance are now constituting a menace and hazard to the health and safety of the people of said city, this ordinance is for the immediate and temporary preservation of the public peace, health and safety of the citizens of said City, and shall be, and is hereby made, effective immediately from and after its passage and approval by said governing authorities.
