WHEREAS, the City of Picayune has been negotiating with the said railroad company and the two have now reached an agreement,



MODEL TRAFFIC ORDINANCE

AN ORDINANCE REGULATING TRAFFIC UPON THE PUBLIC

ARTICLE V. Speed Regulations, Section 90 (d) is amended to read as follows, to-wit:

"(d) Speed in school, hospital and church zones. No person running or operating or causing to be run or operated a motor vehicle, shall pass a public school on days when school is held, between the hours of Seven-Thirty o'clock ante meridian and four o'clock post meridian, or pass a building of worship on the Sabbath day, Sunday, during the usual hours of service, or pass a hospital at any time, at a greater rate of speed than twenty (20) miles per hour."



The foregoing ordinance was first reduced to writing, considered and passed section by section, then as a whole with the vote on each section and upon said ordinance as a whole resulting as follows:



In view of the overall situation on gas supply, which is receiving considerable publicity in the newspapers and trade publications almost daily, United Gas Pipe Line Company has regretfully come to the conclusion that we cannot commit ourselves to the sale of additional volumes of gas for industrial use. This decision applies not only to prospective new customers, but to existing customers.

We have likewise been forced to the conclusion that we will make no increases in our commitment to city gate customers to cover any type of resale other than to domestic customers.

We urge that you and all of our other distributor customers refrain from obligating yourselves for any new industrial business unless it can be handled on an interruptible basis within the limit of your contractual coverage currently in effect with United.

Regretting the necessity for our reaching this decision and trusting changing conditions may enable us to change our position before too long, I am



ORDINANCE NO. 353
AN ORDINANCE ADOPTING THE PROVISIONS OF HOUSE BILL 943
REGULAR SESSION 1970, MISSISSIPPI LEGISLATURE, TO IM-
POSE A TAX ON PERSONS OWNING OR OPERATING SLOT AMUSE-
MENT MACHINES; TO PROVIDE FOR COLLECTION OF THE TAX
AND ISSUANCE OF THE LICENSE; TO IMPOSE PENALTIES FOR
VIOLATIONS OF THE ORDINANCE AND TO PROVIDE FOR
ENFORCEMENT THEREOF

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PICAYUNE, MISSISSIPPI:

SECTION 1. Title. This Ordinance shall be cited as "Slot Amusement Machine Tax Ordinance."

SECTION 2. Definitions. The words, terms, and phrases, when used in this Ordinance, shall have the meaning ascribed to them herein.

(a) "Slot Amusement Machine" or "machine" means any mechanical device or contrivance which is operated played, worked, manipulated, or used by inserting or depositing any coin, slug, token, or thing of value, in which may be seen any picture or heard any music, or wherein any game may be played, or any form of diversion had.

(b) "Person" means and includes any individual, firm, partnership, joint venture, association, corporation, estate, trust, or other group or combination acting as a unit and includes the plural as well as the singular in number.

MUNICIPAL MINUTES, CITY OF PICAYUNE

SECTION 3. Tax Levied. There is hereby levied and imposed one-half (1/2) of the hereinafter described tax as authorized by House Bill 943, Regular Session, 1970 Mississippi Legislature, upon each person engaging in the business of owning or placing on location for the purpose of operation any slot amusement machine, annual license taxes according to the following schedule:

(a) For each machine wherein may be seen any picture or heard any music, a license tax for each such machine the sum of Eighteen Dollars (\$18.00).

(b) For each machine (not elsewhere specifically taxed in this section) wherein or whereby any game may be played or any form of diversion had, a license tax for each such machine the sum of Thirty Dollars (\$30.00).

(c) For each machine (not elsewhere specifically taxed in this section) wherein or by means of which children may obtain a ride upon a "hobby horse" or the figure of any animal, or upon the figure of a boat, airplane, rocket, or other such machine, a license tax of Twelve Dollars (\$12.00) for each machine.

The measure of the tax shall be the amount of money required to operate or play any machine one (1) time.

SECTION 4. License. Every person engaged in the business of owning or placing on location for the purpose of operation any slot amusement machine shall first, before commencing the same, apply for, pay for, and procure from the City Tax Collector a privilege license authorizing him to engage in the business or exercise the privilege specified therein.

The tax levied shall be due and payable annually on January 1, and all licenses issued under the provisions of this Ordinance shall expire annually on December 31. A license may be renewed without penalty during the month of January. The amount of the license tax to be paid for a period of less than twelve (12) months shall be that proportionate amount of the annual license tax that the number of months, or fractional part thereof, remaining until January 1 next bears to twelve (12) months.

The license shall entitle the owner or the person placing the machine on location for the purpose of operation to operate a machine of the type specified until December 31 next. If a machine for which a license has been issued should be destroyed or traded, the privilege of operation for the remaining time covered by the license may be transferred to another machine of the same type by procedure to be specified by the Tax Collector. Where a slot is changed to require additional coins or money to operate a machine, an additional license shall be obtained and a tax paid at the rate hereinabove set out to be prorated for the months remaining on the original license, and the licensee shall be allowed credit for the tax paid for the months remaining on the original license.

When ownership of a machine upon which a valid license is attached is transferred to another person, no additional tax shall be required.

No refund shall be allowed for failure or inability to exercise the privilege granted after the license has been issued.

SECTION 5. Penalties. Any person engaged in the business of owning or placing on location for the purpose of operation any slot amusement machine without the payment of the tax imposed herein shall be liable for the amount of the tax and fifty percent (50%) of the amount of the tax as penalty.

Any person who has paid the tax for the operation of a machine, but who has failed to affix the license to the machine shall also be liable for fifty percent (50) of the amount of the tax as penalty.

SECTION 6. Exemptions. This Ordinance shall not apply to any machine operated for gambling purposes, to any machine kept at a regular place of business of distributors or manufacturers for sale or lease without being operated, or to any pool table operated in a place of business commonly known as a pool hall or billiard parlor when the gross income from the operation of such pool table is taxable under the Mississippi Sales Tax Law.

SECTION 7. License tax in addition to other taxes. The license tax levied by this Ordinance shall be in addition to all other taxes levied by law.

SECTION 8. Administration and Enforcement. All of the general provisions of Chapter 137, Laws of 1944 (Section 9696-01 et seq), insofar as they apply to municipalities, shall apply to and are hereby adopted as the means by which the provisions of this Ordinance may be enforced and the taxes and penalties imposed may be collected.

SECTION 9. Records to be kept. It shall be the duty of every person taxable under this Ordinance to keep and preserve for a period of three (3) years adequate records showing the location on which each machine is placed for the purpose of operation, type of machine and the size coin required to operate the machine one (1) time.

SECTION 10. Ordinance Repealed. The ordinance adopted by the Council of the City of Picayune, Mississippi under the provisions of Section 9418 (e), Mississippi Code of 1942, Recompiled, is hereby repealed. PROVIDED, HOWEVER, that any license heretofore procured under the provisions of said Ordinance may be used for the balance of the 12-month period for which said license was issued. PROVIDED FURTHER that if any liability has accrued or any action begun under the provisions of said Ordinance, said Ordinance shall remain in full force and effect as to all such liabilities and actions. Nothing herein contained shall abrogate any tax or penalty that may have heretofore accrued under the provisions of the Ordinance, nor shall any claim or suit therefor be abated by this Ordinance.

SECTION 11. Constitutionality. If any of the provisions of this Ordinance, or the application thereof to any person or circumstances, are held to be invalid or unconstitutional, either as to any section, paragraph, sentence, or clause hereof, the remainder of this Ordinance, and the application thereof, shall not be affected thereby.

SECTION 12. This Ordinance shall be in effect after due publication be made hereof and after 30 days shall have passed from the date hereof.

RESOLUTION OF THE MAYOR AND BOARD OF COUNCILMEN OF THE CITY OF PICAYUNE, STATE OF MISSISSIPPI, APPROVING THE APPLICATION OF CROSBY CHEMICALS, INC., A MISSISSIPPI CORPORATION, FOR AD VALOREM TAX EXEMPTION ON CERTAIN PROPERTY LOCATED IN THE CITY OF PICAYUNE, MISSISSIPPI

The Mayor and Councilmen of said city further find that said new expansion enterprise will create new jobs and payrolls for Pearl River County, Mississippi, will stimulate sales and business development, increase the market for the sale of locally manufactured products and encourage the growth of the City of Picayune, Mississippi; that applicant qualifies for ad valorem tax exemption pursuant to the provisions of said Section 9706.5 and Section 9703 of the Mississippi Code of 1942, as amended; and that said application should be approved and ad valorem tax exemption should be granted upon said industrial expansion for a period of ten (10) years computed of and from January 1, 1971; and that the said Mayor and Councilmen being of such opinion and so finding;

IT IS, THEREFORE, HEREBY RESOLVED AND ORDERED by the Mayor and Board of Councilmen of the City of Picayune, Mississippi, that the application of Crosby Chemicals, Inc., a Mississippi corporation, made and filed with said body seeking exemption from ad valorem taxation, except taxation by the State of Mississippi, with respect to its new manufacturing expansion enterprise be and the same is hereby approved for the period of ten (10) years, said period to be computed of and from January 1, 1971, upon the property described in said application and set forth in this order, together with the repairs, replacements and/or substitutions to and for the same.





The governing authorities of the City of Picayune, Mississippi, then took up for consideration the matter of issuing notes or bonds for the purchase of motor vehicles and other school transportation equipment, and the servicing of same, and other purposes, and Councilman F. G. Macdonald, Jr. offered the following resolution and order, which was duly seconded by Councilman L. Arnold Stockstill:

ORDER OF THE GOVERNING AUTHORITIES OF THE CITY OF PICAYUNE
MISSISSIPPI, TO BORROW \$18,510.00 WITH WHICH TO PURCHASE
SCHOOL TRANSPORTATION EQUIPMENT FOR THE PICAYUNE MUNICIPAL
SEPARATE SCHOOL DISTRICT, TO PROVIDE FOR THE SERVICING OF
SAME, AND OTHER PURPOSES.

"WHEREAS, there came on for hearing this day at the regular meeting of the governing authorities of the City of Picayune, Mississippi, the petition of the Board of Trustees of the Picayune Municipal Separate School District of said City of Picayune, Mississippi, dated the 12th day of May, 1970, petitioning and requesting this Board to borrow the sum of \$18,510.00 to be used by said board of trustees in purchasing three new motor vehicles and other school transportation equipment in which to transport to and from the public schools of said municipal separate school district the school children attending said schools, or other school transportation equipment, and to establish, erect, and equip school bus shops or garages, and purchase land therefor, and to issue negotiable notes or bonds for said municipal separate school district in evidence of said sum, said notes or bonds to be payable in six annual installments over a period of six years from the date of their issuance, (not exceeding six years if new transportation equipment is to be purchased, or two years if used transportation equipment is to be purchased), and to bear not exceeding six per cent (6%) interest per annum, principal and interest to be paid from the transportation funds of said district, all as provided by Chapter 15, Laws of the Extraordinary Session of 1953, and Chapter 18, Laws of Extraordinary Session of 1953, as amended by Senate Bill No. 1930, Laws of 1968.

"WHEREAS, the Board finds that on the 12th day of May, 1970, at a regular meeting of said Board of Trustees of said municipal separate school district, duly and legally called and held, the said Board of Trustees, by a majority vote of all its members, duly adopted an order or resolution finding and adjudging that it is necessary and advisable to purchase and operate for said district six motor vehicles or other school transportation equipment, and to establish, erect, and equip school bus shops or garages, and purchase land therefor, in order to provide satisfactory school transportation service at a reasonable cost for the school children of said school district attending said public schools and that it is necessary to borrow said sum of \$18,510.00 with which to pay the purchase price of said motor vehicles, other equipment, shops or garages, or construction costs, and land, as shown by a certified copy of said resolution of the Board of Trustees attached to said petition; that said petition with said resolution attached, was first submitted to the State Board of Education for its approval or disapproval, and that on the 25th day of May, 1970, the State Board of Education adopted and spread upon its minutes an order approving the said resolution and petition of said Board of Trustees of said municipal separate school district, as shown by a certified copy of said order of the State Board of Education attached to the said petition and resolution of the Board of Trustees; and,

"WHEREAS, the governing authorities further find and adjudge that there is no money at the present time in the transportation funds of said district, available for the purpose of paying any part of the purchase price of said motor vehicles, or other school transportation equipment, and to establish, erect, and equip school bus shops or garages, and purchase land therefor, and that it is necessary to borrow \$18,510.00 required to pay the said costs, and that all the facts and recitals contained in said resolution of the Board of Trustees of said municipal separate school district are true and correct:

AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT made and entered into this 4th day of August, 1970, by and between the CITY OF PICAYUNE, hereinafter called "CITY", and the LOCAL PUBLIC AGENCY, hereinafter called "AGENCY":

WITNESSETH:

THAT WHEREAS, the City is planning an Urban Renewal Project known as Project No. Miss. R-48 (GN) (A) UR Project, pursuant to a Contract for Planning Advance numbered Contract No. Miss. R-48 (GN) (A), dated the 4th day of August, 1970, (herein called "CONTRACT"); and

WHEREAS, to finance the survey and planning stage, it is necessary that the City borrow funds from the United States of America, Department of Housing and Urban Development (herein called "GOVERNMENT"); and

WHEREAS, under the terms of the Contract, interest on such loans is established at the "going Federal rate" which is determined by the Secretary of Treasury periodically according to law; and

WHEREAS, under Mississippi law, the Local Public Agency is prohibited from paying more than six (6%) percent interest on its obligation but that such limitation does not apply to the City of Picayune; and

WHEREAS, the CITY desires to cooperate with the Local Public Agency and the GOVERNMENT and to assist in the undertaking of the urban renewal project in accordance with its obligations and for that purpose will make arrangements to assure the availability for payment of the interest required to be paid by the Local Public Agency to the GOVERNMENT pursuant to the terms of the Contracts between the Local Public Agency and the GOVERNMENT to the extent that such interest exceeds interest at the rate of six (6%) percent per annum:

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual benefits to each other, the Local Public Agency and the CITY do agree that:

1. In order to aid continuation of the aforesaid project, the City of Picayune does hereby agree as follows:

"In the event the interest rate provided for herein, is in excess of that rate the Local Public Agency is legally authorized to pay, when the same shall become due and payable, the City of Picayune hereby obligates, commits and agrees to pay to the United States, from funds allocated for such purposes, that amount of interest that is in excess of the rate the Local Public Agency is authorized to pay, said amount being currently estimated not to exceed Six and Three Eighths (6-3/8%) Percent."

RESOLUTION APPROVING APPLICATION FOR LOW-RENT HOUSING

WHEREAS, it is the policy of this locality to eliminate substandard and other inadequate housing, to prevent the spread of slums and blight, and to realize as soon as feasible the goal of a decent home in a suitable living environment for all of its citizens; and

WHEREAS, under the provisions of the United States Housing Act of 1937, as amended, the UNITED STATES OF AMERICA (herein called the "Government") is authorized to provide financial assistance to local public housing agencies for undertaking and carrying out preliminary planning of low rent housing projects and financial assistance in providing low rent housing by leasing dwelling units in existing privately owned structures, that will assist in meeting this goal; and

WHEREAS, the Act provides that there shall be local determination of need for low-rent housing to meet needs not being adequately met by private enterprise and that the Government shall not make any contract with a public housing agency for preliminary loans for surveys and planning in respect to any low rent housing projects unless the governing body of the locality involved has by resolution approved the application of the public housing agency for such preliminary loan; and

WHEREAS, Section 23 of the Act provides that the provisions thereof shall not apply to any locality unless the governing body of the locality has by resolution approved the application of such provisions to such localities; and

WHEREAS, the Housing Authority of the City of Picayune, Mississippi (herein called the "Local Authority") is a public housing agency and is applying to the Government for Turn-Key 3 housing.

NOW, THEREFORE, Be It Resolved by the City Council of the City of Picayune as follows:

1. There exists in the City of Picayune a need for such Turn Key 3 housing at payments within the means of low income families.
2. The application of the Local Authority to the Government for a preliminary loan in an amount not to exceed \$80,000.00 for surveys and planning in connection with Turn Key 3 housing projects of not to exceed approximately 200 dwelling units is hereby approved.
3. The application of provisions of Section 23 of the United States Housing Act of 1937, as amended to City of Picayune is approved.

Councilman R. E. Hobgood moved that all rules of the City of Picayune which, unless suspended, would prevent the final passage and adoption of said Resolution at this meeting be and the same are hereby suspended for the purpose of permitting the consideration, adoption, and final passage of said Resolution at this meeting and that unanimous consent of all members present be given for the immediate consideration of said Resolution. ORDINANCE NO. 354
AN ORDINANCE PROHIBITING OBSCENE PUBLICATIONS IN THE CITY OF PICAYUNE,
PEARL RIVER COUNTY, MISSISSIPPI

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PICAYUNE, PEARL RIVER COUNTY, MISSISSIPPI, in regular session, that:

SECTION I. Every person who, with knowledge of its contents, sends of causes to be sent, or brings or causes to be brought, into this city for sale or commercial distribution, or in this city prepares, publishes, sells, exhibits or commercially distributes, or gives away or offers to give away, or has in his possession with intent to sell or commercially distribute or to exhibit or to give away or to offer to give away any obscene printed or written matter or material, is guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction thereof, shall be punished by a fine of not less than FIFTY (\$50.00) DOLLARS, nor more than TWO HUNDRED (\$200.00) DOLLARS, or be imprisoned not exceeding thirty (30) days, or both fine and imprisonment.

SECTION II. The possession of three (3) or more copies of any single item of printed or written matter or material, or the possession of a combined total of any six (6) copies of any items of printed or written matter or material shall create a presumption that they are intended for sale or commercial distribution, exhibition or gift, but such presumption shall be rebuttable.

SECTION III. The following words, terms and phrases used in this ordinance shall, for the purposes of this ordinance, have the meanings respectively ascribed to them in this section:

"Obscene" means that to the average person, applying contemporary community standards, the dominant theme of the material taken as a whole appeals to prurient interest.

"Person" means any individual, partnership, firm, association, corporation or other legal entity.

"Printed or written matter or material" means any book, pamphlet, magazine, periodical, newspaper, picture magazine, comic book, story paper or other printed or written matter. It does not include written or printed matter or material used by or in any recognized religious, scientific or educational institution.

SECTION IV. It shall be unlawful for any person knowingly to sell or loan for monetary consideration to a minor:

(a) Any picture, photograph, drawing, sculpture, motion picture, film, or similar visual representation or image of a person or portion of the human body which depicts nudity, sexual conduct or sadomasochistic abuse and which is harmful to minors, or

(b) Any book, pamphlet, magazine, printed matter however produced, or sound recording which contains any matter enumerated in paragraph (a) above, or explicit and detailed verbal descriptions or narrative accounts of sexual excitement, sexual excitement, sexual conduct or sadomasochistic abuse and which, taken as a whole, is harmful to minors.

(c) Definitions pertaining to Section III:

1. "Minor" means any person under the age of seventeen (17) years.

2. "Nudity" means the showing of the human male or female genitals, pubic area or buttocks with less than a full opaque covering, or the showing of the female breast with less than a fully opaque covering of any portion thereof below the top of the nipple, or the depiction of covered male genitals in a discernibly turgid state.

3. "Sexual conduct" means acts of masturbation, homosexuality, sexual intercourse, or physical contact with a person's clothed or unclothed genitals, pubic area, buttocks, or, if such person be a female, breast.

4. "Sexual excitement" means the condition of human male or female genitals when in a state of sexual stimulation or arousal.

5. "Sado-masochistic abuse" means flagellation or torture by or upon a person clad in undergarments, a mask or bizarre costume, or the condition of being fettered, bound or otherwise physically restrained on the part of one so clothed.

6. "Harmful to minor" means that quality of any description of representation, in whatever form, of nudity, sexual conduct, sexual excitement, or sado-masochistic abuse, when it:

(a) Predominantly appeals to the prurient, shameful or morbid interest of minors, and
 (b) Is patently offensive to prevailing standards in the adult community as a whole with respect to what is suitable material for minors, and

(c) Is utterly without redeeming social importance for minors.

7. "Knowingly" means having general knowledge of, or reason to know, or a belief or ground for belief which warrants further inspection or inquiry of both:

(a) The character and content of any material described herein which is reasonably susceptible of examination by the defendant, and,

(b) The age of the minor, provided, however, that an honest mistake shall constitute an excuse from liability hereunder if the defendant made a reasonable bona fide attempt to ascertain the true age of such minor.

(c) It shall be unlawful for any person knowingly to exhibit for a monetary consideration to a minor or knowingly to sell to a minor an admission ticket or pass or knowingly to admit a minor for a monetary consideration to premises whereon there is exhibited a motion picture, show or other presentation which, in whole or in part, depicts nudity, sexual conduct or sado-masochistic abuse and which is harmful to minors.

(d) Violation of Section IV hereof is a misdemeanor and, upon conviction said person shall be punished by a fine of not less than FIFTY (\$50.00) DOLLARS nor more than TWO HUNDRED (\$200.00) DOLLARS, or be imprisoned for more than thirty (3) days, or both.

SECTION V. That all ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith be, and they are hereby repealed.

SECTION VI. If any provision, clause, sentence, paragraph, section, phrase or part of this ordinance, or the application thereof to any person or circumstances is held invalid, that invalidity shall not affect any other provisions, clauses, sentences, paragraphs, sections, phrases, parts or applications of this ordinance which can be given effect without the invalid provision, clause, sentence, paragraph, section, phrases and parts of this ordinance are declared to be severable.

SECTION VII. The above and foregoing ordinance will go into effect ONE (1) MONTH After its passage.
