A petition having previously been filed with the City Manager by residents living near the American Legion Hut now being examined by the Mayor and City Council and discussing the complaints in said petition with representatives who were present from the American Legion, upon motion of H. NOW COMES Mr. Mansfield Downes representing Pearl River County Fish and Wildlife Conservation Club asking for the City to endorse the efforts of said club in obtaining facilities in each Beat of the County for the disposal of solid waste. Mr. Downes pointed out that an order was passed in November, 1969 by the Board of Supervisors of Pearl River County pledging its cooperation in the establishment of solid waste disposal areas;

WHEREUPON, upon motion of Councilman L. Arnold Stockstill, seconded by Councilman F. G. Macdonald, Jr., the following resolution was adopted:

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, there is an urgent need for the establishment of solid waste disposal areas in each Beat of our County so that the practice of dumping rubbish, including garbage, along our county roads can be eliminated and,

WHEREAS, Pearl River County Fish and Wildlife Conservation Club is encouraging the establishment of said solid waste disposal areas and has heretofore appeared before the supervisors of our county requesting the establishment of same, and

WHEREAS, the City of Picayune maintains a city garbage disposal system including an incinerator and land fill disposal which is used by not only city citizens but the surrounding areas of both Pearl River and Hancock Counties which has burdened said operation,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor and Council of the City of Picayune that said city join in the request of said conservation club and ask that the Board of Supervisors take immediate action in the establishment of waste disposal areas in convenient locations in each of the five beats of said county, and the city further pledges its full cooperation in the operation of its own waste disposal areas in such a manner as to relieve the practice of dumping garbage and rubbish along our county roads.

SEPTIC TANKS

WHEREAS, the Mississippi State Board of Health through circular letter #164 issued March 15, 1971, changed the policies relating to residential sewage disposal systems where community disposal systems do not exist, making it possible for septic tanks to be installed on lots as small as 17,500 square feet, both inside and outside municipalities, and

WHEREAS, this City up until some twenty odd years ago attempted to operate its sewage disposal through septic tanks on lots of the same approximate size, which ultimately resulted in the entire city being polluted with raw sewage running down side ditches into canals and finally into our streams, and

WHEREAS, this city finally went all out to correct said unsanitary conditions by issuing bonds in the approximate amount of \$3,000,000, constructing sanitary sewage collection lines and an up to date, modern, and efficient sewage disposal system, and have eliminated the use of septic tanks in said city, and

WHEREAS, with the provisions as outlined in circular letter #164 of the Mississippi State Board of Health it is evident that subdivisions can be established all around said city and anywhere in our county and adjoining counties where septic tanks will be permitted on such small areas that the danger of pollution of our streams which all flow in the direction of Picayune would be very possible,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor and City Council of the City of Picayune that they do hereby go on record as opposing any leniency toward sewage disposals in the form of septic tanks on any size parcel of land less than three acres in any part of Pearl River County, and that the State Board of Health be requested to change the policies as described in Circular Letter #164 so as to eliminate any risk whatsoever of further pollution of our ditches, canals, and streams in Pearl River County.

The foregoing resolution was introduced by motion of Councilman L. Arnold Stockstill, seconded by Councilman H. V. Carr, and passed by unanimous vote.

APPROVE NEIGHBORHOOD ANALYSIS

Upon motion of F. G. Macdonald, Jr., seconded by R. E. Hobgood, and unanimously carried, it is hereby ordered that the Neighborhood Analysis of Picayune, Mississippi, as previously approved by the Picayune Planning Commission of said City and as prepared by Urban Consultants, Inc. in the year 1969, be, and the same is, hereby approved and adopted by this Mayor and City Council.

3. The City Clerk shall be authorized to investigate and audit all books of accounts of the Superintendent at any and all times. Transactions with the depositories and with the various tax collecting agencies which involve school funds shall be with the superintendent of the municipal separate school district, subject to the audit of the City Clerk.

4. The Mayor and City Council shall cause all the books and accounts of the Superintendent to be audited at the close of each fiscal year of such school district by a certified public accountant licensed to practice in the State of Mississippi which audit shall be conducted and handled in all respects as in the case of audits of municipality. All financial records, books, vouchers, cancelled checks and other financial records required by law to be kept and maintained in the case of municipalities shall be faithfully kept and maintained in the office of the superintendent under the same provisions and penalties provided by law in the case of municipal officials.

5. Provided however, notwithstanding anything herein, or elsewhere contained, to the contrary, the Mayor and City Council specifically reserve unto themselves the exclusive duty and responsibility for the administration of funds for capital improvements and funds derived from the sale of municipal bonds.

6. This resolution shall take effect from and after its passage.

1. County road equipment may now be utilized within the city limits of municipalities upon request of the governing authorities of municipalities and upon approval of such use by the Board of Supervisors.





COOPERATION AGREEMENT

This Agreement entered into this _____ day of _____, 19____, by and between The Housing Authority of the City of Picayune, Mississippi (herein called the "Local Authority") and The City of Picayune (herein called the "Municipality"), witnesseth:

In consideration of the mutual covenants hereinafter set forth, the parties hereto do agree as follows:

1. Whenever used in this Agreement:

(a) The term "Project" shall mean any low-rent housing hereafter developed as an entity by the Local Authority with financial assistance of the United States of America acting through the Secretary of Housing and Urban Development (herein called the "Government"); excluding, however, any low-rent housing project covered by any contract for loans and annual contributions entered into between the Local Authority and the Government, or its predecessor agencies, prior to the date of this Agreement.

(b) The term "Taxing Body" shall mean the State or any political subdivision or taxing unit thereof in which a Project is situated and which would have authority to assessor levy real or personal property taxes or to certify such taxes to a taxing body or public officer to be levied for its use and benefit with respect to a Project if it were not exempt from taxation.

(c) The term "Shelter Rent" shall mean the total of all charges to all tenants of a Project for dwelling rents and nondwelling rents (excluding all other income of such Project), less the cost to the Local Authority of all dwelling and nondwelling utilities.

(d) The term "Slum" shall mean any area where dwellings predominate which, by reason of dilapidation, overcrowding, faulty arrangement or design, lack of ventilation, light or sanitation facilities, or any combination of these factors, are detrimental to safety, health or morals.

2. The Local Authority shall endeavor (a) to secure a contract or contracts with the government for loans and annual contributions covering one or more Projects comprising approximately 200 units of turnkey housing and (b) to develop and administer such Project or Projects, each of which shall be located within the corporate limits of the Municipality. The obligations of the parties hereto shall apply to each such Project.

3. (a) Under the constitution and statutes of the State of Mississippi, all Projects are exempt from all real and personal property taxes and special assessments levied or imposed by any Taxing Body. With respect to any Project, so long as either (i) such Project is owned by a public body or governmental agency and is used for low-rent housing purposes; or (ii) any contract between the Local Authority and the Government for loans or annual contributions, or both, in connection with such Project remains in force and effect, or (iii) any bonds issued in connection with such Project or any monies due to the Government in connection with such Project remain unpaid, whichever period is the longest, the Municipality agrees that it will not levy or impose any real or personal property taxes or special assessments upon such Project or upon the Local Authority with respect thereto. During such period, the Local Authority shall make annual payments (herein called "Payments in Lieu of Taxes") in lieu of such taxes and special assessments and in payment for the public services and facilities furnished from time to time without other cost or charge for or with respect to such Project.

(b) Each such annual Payment in Lieu of Taxes shall be made after the end of the fiscal year established for such Project, and shall be in an amount equal to either (i) ten percent (10%) of the Shelter Rent actually collected but in no event to exceed ten percent (10%) of the Shelter Rent charged by the Local Authority in respect to such Project during such fiscal year or (ii) the amount permitted to be paid by applicable state law in effect on the date such payment is made, whichever amount is the lower.

X (c) The Municipality shall distribute the Payments in Lieu of Taxes among the Taxing Bodies in the proportion which the real property taxes which would have been paid to each Taxing Body for such year if the Project were not exempt from taxation bears to the total real property taxes which would have been paid to all of the Taxing Bodies for such year if the Project were not exempt from taxation; Provided, however, that no payment for any year shall be made to any Taxing Body in excess of the amount of the real property taxes which would have been paid to such Taxing Body for such year if the Project were not exempt from taxation.

(d) Upon failure of the Local Authority to make any Payment in Lieu of Taxes, no lien against any Project or assets of the Local Authority shall attach, nor shall any interest or penalties accrue or attach on account thereof.

4. The Municipality agrees that, subsequent to the date of initiation (as defined in the United States Housing Act of 1937) of each Project and within five years after the completion thereof, or such further period as may be approved by the Government and in addition to the number of unsafe or insanitary dwelling units which the Municipality is obligated to eliminate as a part of the low-rent housing project(s) heretofore undertaken by the Local Authority and identified as Project No. (s) Miss-66-1,2,3,4,5,6

there has been or will be elimination, as certified by the Municipality, by demolition, condemnation, effective closing, or compulsory repair or improvement, of unsafe or insanitary dwelling units situated in the locality or metropolitan area in which such Project is located, substantially equal in number to the number of newly constructed dwelling units provided by such Project; Provided, That, where more than one family is living in an unsafe or insanitary dwelling unit, the elimination of such unit shall count as the elimination of units equal to the number of families accommodated therein; and Provided, further, That this paragraph 4 shall not apply in the case of (i) any Project developed on the site of a Slum cleared subsequent to July 15, 1949, and that the dwelling units eliminated by the clearance of the site of such Project shall not be counted as elimination for any other Project or any other low-rent housing project, of (ii) any Project located in a rural nonfarm or Indian area.

5. During the period commencing with the date of the acquisition of any part of the site or sites of any Project and continuing so long as either (i) such Project is owned by a public body or governmental agency and is used for low-rent housing purposes, or (ii) any contract between the Local Authority and the Government for loans or annual contributions, or both, in connection with such Project remains in force and effect, or (iii) any bonds issued in connection with such Project or any monies due to the Government in connection with such Project remain unpaid, whichever period is the longest, the Municipality without cost or charge to the Local Authority or the tenants of such Project (other than the Payments in lieu of taxes) shall:

(a) Furnish or cause to be furnished to the Local Authority and the tenants of such Project public services and facilities of the same character and to the same extent as are furnished from time to time without cost or charge to other dwellings and inhabitants in the Municipality;

(b) Vacate such streets, roads, and alleys within the area of such Project as may be necessary in the development thereof, and convey without charge to the Local Authority such interest as the Municipality may have in such vacated areas; and, insofar as it is lawfully able to do so without cost or expense to the Local Authority or to the Municipality, cause to be removed from such vacated areas, insofar as it may be necessary, all public or private utility lines and equipment;

(c) Insofar as the Municipality may lawfully do so, (i) grant such deviations from the building code of the Municipality as are reasonable and necessary to promote economy and efficiency in the development and administration of such Project, and at the same time safeguard health and safety, and (ii) make such changes in any zoning of the site and surrounding territory of such Project as are reasonable and necessary for the development and protection of such Project and surrounding territory;

(d) Accept grants of easements necessary for the development of such Project; and

(e) Cooperate with the Local Authority by such other lawful action or ways as the Municipality and the Local Authority may find necessary in connection with the development and administration of such Project.

6. In respect to any Project the Municipality further agrees that within a reasonable time after receipt of a written request therefor from the Local Authority:

(a) It will accept the dedication of all interior streets, roads, alleys, and adjacent sidewalks within the area of such Project, together with all storm and sanitary sewer mains in such dedicated areas, after the Local Authority, at its own expense, has completed the grading, improvement, pavings, and installation thereof in accordance with specifications acceptable to the Municipality;

(b) It will accept necessary dedications of land, for and will grade, improve, pave, and provide sidewalks for, all streets bounding such Project or necessary to provide adequate access thereto (in consideration whereof the Local Authority shall pay to the Municipality such amount as would be assessed against the Project site for such work if such site were privately owned); and

(c) It will provide, or cause to be provided, water mains, and storm and sanitary sewer mains, leading to such Project and serving the bounding streets thereof (in consideration whereof the Local Authority shall pay to the Municipality such amount as would be assessed against the Project site for such work if such site were privately owned).

7. If by reason of the Municipality's failure or refusal to furnish or cause to be furnished any public services or facilities which it has agreed hereunder to furnish or to cause to be furnished to the Local Authority or to the tenants of any Project, the Local Authority incurs any expense to obtain such services or facilities then the Local Authority may deduct the amount of such expense from any Payments in Lieu of Taxes or to become due to the Municipality in respect to any Project or any other low-rent housing projects owned or operated by the Local Authority.

8. No Cooperation Agreement heretofore entered into between the Municipality and the Local Authority shall be construed to apply to any Project covered by this Agreement.

9. No member of the governing body of the Municipality or any other public official of the Municipality who exercises any responsibilities or functions with respect to any Project during his tenure or for one year thereafter shall have any interest, direct or indirect, in any Project or any property included or planned to be included in any project, or any contracts in connection with such Projects or property. If any such governing body member or such other public official of the Municipality involuntarily acquires or had acquired prior to the beginning of his tenure any such interest, he shall immediately disclose such interest to the Local Authority.

10. So long as any contract between the Local Authority and the Government for loans (including preliminary loans) or annual contributions, or both, in connection with any Project remains in force and effect, or so long as any bonds issued in connection with any Project or any monies due to the Government in connection with any Project remain unpaid, this Agreement shall not be abrogated, changed, or modified without the consent of the Government. The privileges and obligations of the Municipality hereunder shall remain in full force and effect with respect to each Project so long as the beneficial title to such Project is held by the Local Authority or by any other public body or governmental agency, including the Government, authorized by law to engage in the development or administration of low-rent housing projects. If at any time the beneficial title to, or possession of, any Project is held by such other public body or governmental agency, including the Government, the provisions hereof shall inure to the benefit of and may be enforced by, such other public body or governmental agency, including the Government.



RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, by resolution adopted this 6th day of July, 1971, the City Council of the city approved an Urban Renewal Plan proposed herein for the City of Picayune known as the Bruce Street Urban Renewal Area, and

WHEREAS, said Plan contemplates the acquisition and clearance by the Urban Renewal Agency of the Project Area as shown in said Urban Renewal Plan, and the reuse and/or sale of various portions thereof for the uses indicated, all of which uses have been determined by the City to be in accordance with the general plan for the City as a whole and in accordance with certain definite local objectives as to appropriate land uses, improved traffic, public transportation, public utilities, and other public improvements, as in said Plan and resolutions set forth; and

WHEREAS, in order for the Urban Renewal Agency to effectuate said Plan the assistance of both the Federal Government and the City is required; namely, of the Federal Government by lending funds needed to defray the gross cost of the Project, and upon completion of the project and repayment of such loan, by contributing three-fourths (3/4) of the net cost of the project; and of the City by making certain local grants-in-aid (as specified by Title I of the Housing Act of 1949, as amended) as hereinafter provided, in a total amount equal to at least one-fourth of the net cost of the Project; and

WHEREAS, the City has applied to the Federal Government for financial assistance under said Title I and it now devolves upon itself to take certain actions and to provide certain grants-in-aid which are estimated, on the basis of surveys and plans heretofore made by the Urban Renewal Agency, to be required in the amount of \$141,772.

NOW, THEREFORE, Pursuant to and in consideration of the benefits to accrue to the City and its citizens from the Urban Renewal Project, and of the covenants hereinafter set forth, the Urban Renewal Agency and the City do agree as follows:

SECTION 1. (a) Site Improvements. To construct or cause to be constructed in accordance with a mutually agreeable schedule, and as required in the execution of the urban renewal plan, the following site improvements. Eligible Estimated Cost \$156,404.

Provided, however, that in the event said construction has not been started by the time the respective improvements are needed to permit the timely execution of said Urban Renewal Plan, the City will then pay to the Project the estimated total cost of each improvement as respectively indicated above, so as to prevent delay in the execution of said Urban Renewal Plan.

(b) It is understood and agreed that the City's obligation hereunder is to make cash or non-cash grants-in-aid in a total amount equal or not less than one-fourth (1/4) and actual net cost of the Project, and that the amounts payable by the City to the Project as hereinabove set forth are based on estimates and that if the total actual net cost of the Project (as determined by the LPA, in accordance with the contract with the Federal Government) is greater or less than the total estimated net cost of the Project, the amount of cash payments to be made by the City to the Project as provided above in Section 1, shall be appropriately adjusted.

SECTION 2. Area for Public Use. There are no areas designated for public use during the action year.

SECTION 3. The City Agrees that at no expense to the Project and upon the LPA's request, the City will, insofar as it can lawfully do so, vacate the streets, roads, alleys and other public ways, to be eliminated in preparing the Project Area for its new uses, as shown in the Urban Renewal Plan.

SECTION 4. The Project will convey to the City free of charge any land acquired by the Project and required for street purposes under the Urban Renewal Plan.

SECTION 5. The city agrees to act with the LPA by taking such other lawful actions as may be determined by the City and the LPA to be necessary and desirable in connection with the undertaking and carrying out of the Project.

SECTION 6. The City recognized that Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 and the regulations and policies of the Department of Housing and Urban Development effectuating the Title prohibit discrimination on the ground of race, color, or national origin in the policies and practices of any public facility, educational institution, or hospital responsible for proposed credit to the locality's share of the cost of an urban renewal project receiving financial assistance from the United States. The City hereby assures the United States and the Department of Housing and Urban Development Administrator that the proposed public facilities to be provided under Section 1 above, will be available to serve all persons without regard to race, color, or national origin.

It is further understood and agreed that in order for the City to receive non-cash credits under Item 1(d) above, the LPA shall obtain and submit with each application for such non-cash credit satisfactory assurances that each such public facility proposed as a Non-Cash Local Grant-in-Aid and each institution on whose behalf Section 112 Credits are claimed (if any) will be operated on a non-discriminatory basis.

SECTION 6. The City agrees to hold the project harmless with respect to any claims for personal injury and/or death or property damage arising from any operations carried on by the City in connection with the Project.


SECTION 7. This Agreement shall be executed in 6 counterparts, each of which shall be deemed to be an original and such counterparts shall constitute one and the same instrument.



A NEIGHBORHOOD DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM APPLICATION FOR
PROGRAM NO. ND - A4

WHEREAS, it is necessary and in the public interest that the Urban Renewal Agency of the City of Picayune Mississippi avail itself of the financial assistance provided by Title I of the Housing Act of 1949, as amended, to commence a Neighborhood Development Program in the urban renewal area hereinafter referred to as the "Program", and

WHEREAS, it is recognized that the Federal contract for such financial assistance pursuant to said Title I will impose certain obligations and responsibilities upon the Local Public Agency and will require among other things (1) the provisions of local grant-in-aid; (2) a feasible method for the relocation of individuals and families displaced from the urban renewal areas comprising the Program; and (3) other local obligations and responsibilities in connection with the undertaking and carrying out of the Program; and

WHEREAS, Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 prohibits discrimination on the basis of race, color or national origin under any program or activity receiving Federal financial assistance, and Executive Order 11063 prohibits discrimination on basis of race, color, creed or national origin in sale, lease, or other disposition of residential property (including land intended for residential use) or in the use or occupancy thereof; and

WHEREAS, in those areas where clearance is proposed, the objectives of the Program cannot be achieved through more extensive rehabilitation of the urban renewal areas comprising the Program.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Commissioners of the Urban Renewal Agency of the City of Picayune, Mississippi.

1. That the United States of America and the Secretary of Housing and Urban Development be, and they hereby are, assured of full compliance by the Urban Renewal Agency with regulations of the Department of Housing and Urban Development effectuating Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 and applicable Executive Orders.

2. That an application on behalf of the Urban Renewal Agency for a loan under Section 102 (a) of said Title I in the amount of \$696,116 and for a program capital grant, a relocation grant, and a Federal grant for the making of a rehabilitation grant to the full amount available for undertaking and financing the first increment of such Program is hereby approved, and the Chairman is hereby authorized and directed to execute and to file such application with the Department of Housing and Urban Development, to provide such additional information and to furnish

RESOLUTION OF THE URBAN RENEWAL AGENCY OF THE CITY OF PICAYUNE, MISSISSIPPI APPROVING THE URBAN RENEWAL PLAN AND THE FEASIBILITY OF RELOCATION FOR NEIGHBORHOOD DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM NO. ND - A4

WHEREAS, under the provisions of Title I of the Housing Act of 1949, as amended, the Secretary of Housing and Urban Development is authorized to provide financial assistance to Local Public Agencies for undertaking and carrying out Neighborhood Development Programs; and

WHEREAS, it is provided, in such Act that contracts for financial aid thereunder shall require that the Urban Renewal Plan for the respective urban renewal areas comprising the Neighborhood Development Program be approved by the governing body of the Locality in which the areas are situated and that such approval include findings by the governing body that: (1) the financial aid to be provided in the contract is necessary to enable the Program to be undertaken in accordance with the Urban Renewal Plan; (2) the Urban Renewal Plan will afford maximum opportunity, consistent with the sound needs of the locality as a whole, for the rehabilitation or re-development of the urban renewal areas by private enterprise; (3) the Urban Renewal Plan conforms to a general plan for the development of the locality as a whole; and (4) the Urban Renewal Plan gives due consideration to the provision of adequate park and recreational areas and facilities, as may be desirable for neighborhood improvement, with special consideration for the health, safety, and welfare of children residing in the general vicinity of the sites covered by the Plan; and

WHEREAS, it is desirable and in the public interest that the Urban Renewal Agency of the City of Picayune, Mississippi (herein called the "Local Public Agency") undertake and carry out the Neighborhood Development Program (herein called the "Program") identified as "Neighborhood Development Program ND-A4 and encompassing the area or areas bounded as described on the attached pages in the City of Picayune, State of Mississippi (herein called the "Locality"); and

WHEREAS, the Local Public Agency has applied for additional financial assistance under such Act and proposes to enter into an additional contract or contracts with the Department of Housing and Urban Development for the undertaking of, and for making available additional financial assistance for, the Program; and

WHEREAS, the Local Public Agency has made studies of the location, physical condition of structures, land use, environmental influences, and social, cultural and economic conditions of the urban renewal area or areas comprising the Program and has determined that the areas are blighting areas and that they are detrimental and a menace to the safety, health, and welfare of the inhabitants and users thereof and of the Locality at large, because of building deficiencies, overcrowding or improper location of structures on the land, deficient streets, inadequate public facilities and the members of this Governing Body have been fully apprised by the Local Public Agency and are aware of these facts and conditions; and

WHEREAS, there has been prepared and referred to the Urban Renewal Agency of the Locality (herein called the "Governing Body") for review and approval an Urban Renewal Plan for the urban renewal areas, dated April 26, 1971 and consisting of 19 pages and no exhibits and 3 maps; and

WHEREAS, the Urban Renewal Plan has been approved by the Governing Body of the Local Public Agency, as evidenced by the copy of said Body's duly certified resolution approving the Urban Renewal Plan, which is attached thereto; and

WHEREAS, a general plan has been prepared and is recognized and used as a guide for the general development of the Locality as a whole; and

WHEREAS, the Planning Commission, which is the duly designated and acting official planning body for the Locality, has submitted to the Governing Body its report and recommendations respecting the urban renewal plan for the urban renewal areas comprising the Program and has certified that the Urban Renewal Plan conforms to the general plan for the Locality as a whole, and the Governing Body has duly considered the report, recommendations and certification of the Planning Body; and

WHEREAS, the Local Public Agency has prepared and submitted a program for the relocation of individuals and families that may be displaced as a result of carrying out the Program in accordance with the Urban Renewal Plan; and

WHEREAS, there have also been presented to the Governing Body information and data respecting the relocation program which has been prepared by the Local Public Agency as a result of studies, surveys, and inspections in the areas comprising the program and the assembling and analysis of the data and information obtained from such studies, surveys, and inspections; and

WHEREAS, the members of the Governing Body have general knowledge of the conditions prevailing in the urban renewal areas and of the availability of proper housing in the locality for the relocation of individuals and families that may be displaced by the Program and, in the light of such knowledge of local housing conditions, have carefully considered and reviewed such proposals for relocation; and

WHEREAS, it is necessary that the Governing Body take appropriate official action respecting the relocation program and the Urban Renewal Plan for the Program, in conformity with the contract for financial assistance between the Local Public Agency and the United States of America, acting by and through the Secretary of Housing and Urban Development; and

WHEREAS, the Governing Body is cognizant of the conditions that are imposed in the undertaking and carrying out of urban renewal activities and undertaking with Federal financial assistance under Title I, including those prohibiting discrimination because of race, color, creed, or national origin.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Urban Renewal Agency of the City of Picayune, Mississippi, as follows:

1. That it is hereby found and determined that the urban renewal areas comprising the Program are blighting areas and qualify as eligible areas under Section 7342.05 Mississippi Code of 1942, as Amended and Recompiled.
2. That the Urban Renewal Plan for the Program, having been duly reviewed and considered, is hereby approved, and the City Clerk-Treasurer be and is hereby directed to file said copy of the Urban Renewal Plan with the minutes of this meeting.
3. That it is hereby found and determined that where clearance is proposed that the objectives of the Urban Renewal Plan cannot be achieved through more extensive rehabilitation of portions of the urban renewal areas comprising the Program.
4. That it is hereby found and determined that the Urban Renewal Plan for the Program conforms to the general plan of the Locality.
5. That it is hereby found and determined that the financial aid provided and to be provided pursuant to the contract for Federal financial assistance pertaining to the Program is necessary to enable the Program to be undertaken in accordance with the Urban Renewal Plan for the areas comprising the Program.
6. That it is hereby found and determined that the Urban Renewal Plan for the urban renewal areas comprising the Program will afford maximum opportunity, consistent with the sound needs of the Locality as a whole, for the renewal of the areas by private enterprise.

7. That it is hereby found and determined that the Urban Renewal Plan for the urban renewal areas gives due consideration to the provision of adequate park and recreational areas and facilities, as may be desirable for neighborhood improvement, with special consideration for the health, safety, and welfare of children residing in the general vicinity of the sites covered by the Plan.

8. That it is hereby found and determined that the Program for the proper relocation of individuals and families displaced in carrying out the Urban Renewal Plan in decent, safe, and sanitary dwellings in conformity with acceptable standards is feasible and can be reasonable and timely effected to permit the proper prosecution and completion of the Plan; and that such dwellings or dwelling units available or to be made available to such displaced individuals and families, are at least equal in number to the number of displaced individuals and families, are not generally less desirable in regard to public utilities and public and commercial facilities than the dwellings of the displaced individuals and families in the areas comprising the Program, are available at rents or prices within the financial means of the displaced individuals and families, and are reasonably accessible to their place of employment.

That, in order to implement and facilitate the execution of the Urban Renewal Plan hereby approved, it is found and determined that certain official action must be taken by this Body with reference, among other things to changes in zoning, the vacation and removal of streets, alleys, and other public ways, the establishment of new street patterns, the location and relocation of sewer and water mains and other public facilities, and other public action, and accordingly, this Body hereby (a) pledges its cooperation in helping to carry out the Urban Renewal Plan, (b) request the various officials, departments, boards, and agencies of the Locality having administrative responsibilities in the premises likewise to cooperate to such end and to exercise their respective functions and powers in a manner consistent with the Urban Renewal Plan, and (c) stands ready to consider to take appropriate action upon proposals and measures designed to effectuate the Urban Renewal Plan.

WHEREAS, the Mississippi Power Company has requested the City of Picayune, Mississippi to cause a franchise to be issued to it for a period of twenty-five (25) years, which proposed franchise ordinance would provide for the payment to the City of Picayune a sum equal to the greater of 3% of total revenue from retail sales of electric energy within the City of Picayune or \$300.00 per annum, according to the terms and conditions of the proposed franchise ordinance; and

WHEREAS, said proposed ordinance was introduced by Councilman H. V. Carr and read by the Clerk of the City of Picayune, Mississippi in the following form:

ORDINANCE NO. 356
AN ORDINANCE GRANTING AN ELECTRIC FRANCHISE
TO MISSISSIPPI POWER COMPANY, ITS SUCCESSORS
AND ASSIGNS IN THE CITY OF PICAYUNE, MISS.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Council, herein called "governing body", of the City of Picayune, Mississippi:

SECTION 1. In consideration of the benefits that will accrue to the City of Picayune, Mississippi, and the inhabitants thereof, (herein called "Municipality"), and of the payment by Mississippi Power Company (herein called "Grantee") to the Municipality of a sum of money equal to three percentum (3%) per year of the total revenue of the Grantee from the sales of electric energy, excepting therefrom sales for resale and sales in interchange of energy with others, within the corporate limits of the Municipality, or the sum of Three Hundred Dollars (\$300.00) per year, whichever is the greater, payable quarterly on or before thirty days following the close of each calendar quarter during such period as the Grantee operates in said Municipality, but not to exceed twenty-five (25) years from the effective date of this Ordinance, Municipality does hereby grant to and vest in the Grantee, its successors and assigns, the right, authority, easement, privilege and franchise to construct, erect, suspend, install, renew, repair, maintain, operate and conduct in the Municipality as it now exists or may hereafter be extended, a plant or plants and system for the generation, transmission, and distribution of electric energy for all purposes whatsoever.

SECTION 2. 



ORDINANCE NO. 358

AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING COMPREHENSIVE ZONING REGULATIONS FOR THE CITY OF PICAYUNE, MISSISSIPPI, AND PROVIDING FOR THE ADMINISTRATION, ENFORCEMENT, AND AMENDMENT THEREOF, IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE PROVISIONS OF SECTIONS 3590, 3591, 3592, 3592, 3594, 3595, 3596, and 3597, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1942, AS AMENDED, AND THE REPEAL OF ORDINANCES NOS. 187, 211, 237 and 269

WHEREAS, Mississippi Code of 1942, Sections 3590-3597, empower Mississippi municipalities to enact a Zoning Ordinance and to provide for its administration, enforcement, and amendment, and

WHEREAS, the Picayune City Council deems it necessary for the purpose of promoting health, safety, morals, or the general welfare of the community to enact such ordinance, and

WHEREAS by the adoption of a resolution on September 15, 1959 the Picayune City Council created a Planning Commission to recommend the boundaries of the various districts and the appropriate regulations to be enforced therein, and

WHEREAS, the Planning Commission has divided the city into districts and has prepared regulations pertaining to such districts in accordance with a comprehensive plan designed to lessen congestion in the streets, secure safety from fire, panic, and other dangers; to provide adequate light and air; to prevent the overcrowding of land; to avoid undue concentration of population; and to facilitate the adequate provision of transportation, water, sewerage, schools, parks, and other public requirements, and

WHEREAS, they have been made with reasonable consideration, among other things, to the character of each district and its peculiar suitability for particular uses, and with a view to conserving the value of buildings and encouraging the most appropriate use of land throughout the city, and

WHEREAS, the City Council held a public hearing thereon as provided by Section 3593, Mississippi Code of 1942, as amended, and

WHEREAS, all requirement of Sections 3590-3597, Mississippi Code of 1942, with regard to the preparation of the report of the Planning Commission and the subsequent action of the City Council, have been met;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ENACTED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PICAYUNE, MISSISSIPPI this 5th day of October, 1971:

Section 1.2 Identification of Zoning Map. The Official Zoning Map shall be identified by the signature of the Mayor, attested by the City Clerk, and bearing the following words: "This is to certify that this is the Official Zoning Map referred to in Article 1, Section 1.01 of Ordinance Number 358 of the City of Picayune, Mississippi, adopted on October 5, 1971."

Section 1.3 Changes in the Zoning Map Changes made in the district boundaries or other matter portrayed on the Official Zoning Map in accordance with the provision of this ordinance shall be made on the Official Zoning Map promptly after the amendment has been approved by the City Council of Picayune. It will be the duty of the City Clerk to file with the Building Inspector a copy of the ordinance amending the Official Zoning Map within five days after such an amending ordinance is adopted by the City Council. It will be the duty of the Building Inspector to record the district boundary change on the Official Zoning Map, together with the number of the amending ordinance and the date of its passage, within five days after the amending ordinance has been transmitted to the building inspector by the City Clerk. Any amendment involving changes in the district boundaries or involving a change in the zoning classification of the land within the city shall not become effective until after such an entry has been made on said map. Regardless of the existence of maps purported to be copies of the Official Zoning Map, the final authority as to the current zoning status of lands, buildings, and other structures shall be the Official Zoning Map which shall be located in the office of the Building Inspector.

Section 1.4 Changes in the Zoning Text When an ordinance is adopted which amends the text of the Zoning Ordinance it will be the duty of the City Clerk to prepare an addendum to the Zoning Ordinance text and to transmit a suitable number of copies of such an addendum to the Building Inspector for the purpose of distribution to interested parties. It will be the duty of the Building Inspector to make an entry in the copies of the zoning text reserved for distribution to the general public calling attention to the particular article and section which has been amended.

Section 1.5 Replacement of Official Zoning Map In the event that the Official Zoning Map becomes damaged, destroyed, lost, or difficult to interpret because of the nature or number of changes and additions, the City Council by resolution, adopt a new Official Zoning Map. The new Official Zoning Map, may correct drafting or other errors or omissions in the prior Official Zoning Map, but no such correction shall have the effect of amending the original Official Zoning Map or any subsequent amendment thereof. The new Official Zoning Map shall be identified by the signature of the Mayor and the City Council, attested by the City Clerk, and bearing the seal of Picayune under the following words: "This is to certify that this Official Zoning Map supersedes and replaces the Official Zoning

Map adopted November 7, 1961 as part of Ordinance No. 280 of Picayune, Mississippi. Unless the prior Official Zoning Map has been lost or totally destroyed, the prior map or any significant parts thereof remaining shall be preserved, together with all available records pertaining to its adoption or amendment.

Section 1.6 Rules for Interpretation of District Boundaries Where uncertainty exists as to the boundaries of districts as shown on the Official Zoning Map, the following rules shall apply:

1. Boundaries indicated as approximately following the center lines of streets, highways, alleys or railroad tracks shall be construed to follow such center lines of streets, highways or alleys, or the center lines of main railroad tracks or rights-of-way.
2. Boundaries indicated as approximately following platted lot lines shall be construed as following such lot lines.
3. Boundaries indicated as approximately following city limits shall be construed as following such city limits.
4. Boundaries indicated as following shore lines shall be construed to follow such shore lines, and in the event of change in the shore line shall be construed as moving with the actual shore line; boundaries indicated as approximately following the center lines of streams, rivers, canals, lakes, or other bodies of water shall be considered as a change to the shore line and must conform to the regulations of the districts.
5. Boundaries indicated as parallel to or extensions of features indicated in subsections 1 through 5 above shall be so construed. Distances not specifically indicated on the Official Zoning Map shall be determined by the scale of the map.
6. Where physical or cultural features existing on the ground are at variance with those shown on the Official Zoning Map, or in other circumstances not covered by subsections 1 through 6 above, the Board of Adjustment shall interpret the district boundaries.
7. Where a district boundary line divides a lot which was in single ownership at the time of passage of this ordinance, the Board of Adjustment may permit, as a special exception, the extension of the regulations for either portion of the lot not to exceed 50 feet beyond the district line into the remaining portion of the lot.

Section 2 Definitions For the purpose of these Regulations certain terms and words are to be used and interpreted as defined hereinafter. Words used in the present tense shall include the future tense; words in the singular number include the plural and words in the plural number include the singular; the word "person" includes a firm or corporation as well as an individual, and the word "lot" includes the words "plot" and "parcel", except where the natural construction of the writing indicates otherwise. The word "shall" is always mandatory and not permissive. "Map" means the zoning map of Picayune, Mississippi.

1. **ACCESSORY BUILDING AND USES:** A subordinate building or a portion of the main building, the use of which is incidental to that of the main building or land not used for a place of habitation or a living room, kitchen, dining room, parlor, bedroom, or library. An accessory use is incidental to the main use of the premises.
2. **ALLEY:** A minor right-of-way dedicated to public use which gives a secondary means of vehicular or pedestrian access to the back or side of properties otherwise abutting a street, and which may be used for public utility purposes.
3. **APARTMENT HOUSE OR MULTIPLE - FAMILY DWELLING:** Any single detached dwelling unit designed for and occupied by three or more families living independently of each other as separate housekeeping units, including apartment houses, apartment hotels and flats, but not including auto or trailer courts or camps, hotels, motels, or resort-type hotel.
4. **APARTMENT HOTEL:** A building designed for or containing both apartment and individual guest rooms or suites of rooms and apartments, wherein is maintained an inner lobby through which all tenants must pass to gain access to the apartments, and catering to permanent and not transient tenants, and which may furnish services ordinarily furnished by hotels, such as drug store, barber shop, cigar and new stands, dining rooms, when such uses are located entirely within the building with no entrance from the street nor visible from any sidewalk, and having no sign display visible from the outside of the building indicating the existence of such use.
5. **BILLBOARD:** See Signs, Advertising.
6. **BOARD OF ADJUSTMENT:** The City of Picayune Board of Adjustment.
7. **BOARDING HOUSE:** Any dwelling unit other than a hotel where, for compensation and by pre-arrangement for definite periods, meals or lodging and meals are provided for three (3) or more persons.
8. **BUFFER AREA:** An area which acts as a separation area between two or more noncompatible districts.
9. **BUILDABLE WIDTH:** Width of the building site left after the required yards have been provided.
10. **BUILDING:** Any structure intended for shelter, housing or enclosure of persons, animals or chattel.
11. **BUILDING ALTERATION OF:** Any change or rearrangement in the supporting members (such as bearing walls, beams, columns, or girders) of a building any addition to a building or movement of a building from one location to another.
12. **BUILDING, FRONT LINE OF:** A line intersecting the foremost portion of a building and parallel and/or concentric to the street line.
13. **BUILDING HEIGHT:** The vertical distance measured from the average elevation of the grade at the front of the building to the highest point of the coping of a flat roof to the mean height level between eaves and ridge for gable, hip and gambrel roofs and to the deck line of a mansard roof.
14. **BUILDING SETBACK LINE:** The distance required by the ordinance to be maintained between a given lot line, easement or right-of-way line and any structure - front, rear, or side as specified.
15. **BUILDING MAIN:** A building in which is conducted the principal use of the lot on which it is situated.
16. **BUILDING SITE:** A single parcel of land occupied or intended to be occupied by a building or structure, and appropriate accessory buildings or uses.
17. **CAFETERIA:** A restaurant at which patrons serve themselves at a counter and take the food to the tables to eat.

18. **CAMP, FISHING:** A camp providing fishing facilities and overnight accommodations for guests but which does not include permanent residential dwellings, other than that of the owner or operator.
19. **CARPORT:** A canopy or shed, attached to the main building, open on two or more sides, for the purpose of providing shelter for one or more vehicles.
20. **CLUB, PRIVATE:** Buildings and facilities owned and operated by a corporation, association, person or persons for a social, educational or recreational purpose, but not for profit to render a service which is normally carried on as a business.
21. **CONFORMING USE:** Any lawful use of a building or lot which complies with the provisions of this ordinance.
22. **CITY INSPECTING OFFICER:** The officer appointed by the City Council to enforce the regulations set forth in this ordinance.
23. **COVERAGE:** The percentage of the lot area covered by the building area.
24. **DISTRICT:** Any zoning district established by this ordinance.
25. **DWELLING:** Any building, or portion thereof, which is designated or used as living quarters for one or more families.
26. **DWELLING, SINGLE-FAMILY:** A dwelling designed to be exclusively occupied by one family.
27. **DWELLING, TWO-FAMILY:** A dwelling designed to be occupied by two families living independently of each other.
28. **DWELLING, MULTIPLE-FAMILY:** A dwelling for occupancy for three or more families living independently of each other.
29. **DWELLING UNIT:** A room or group of rooms occupied or intended to be occupied as separate living quarters.
30. **EASEMENT:** A grant by the property owner to the public, a corporation, or persons, of the use of a strip of land for specific purposes.
31. **FAMILY:** One or more persons, related by blood or marriage, living together and occupying a single house-keeping unit, with single culinary facilities, or a group of not more than four persons living together by mutual agreement and occupying a single housekeeping unit.
32. **FARM:** Any parcel of land which is used for gain in the raising of agricultural products, livestock, poultry, and dairy products. It includes necessary farm structures within the prescribed limits and the storage of equipment used. It excludes the raising of fur-bearing animals, riding academies, livery or boarding stables, and dog kennels.
33. **FLOOR AREA:** The square feet of floor space within the outside line of walls and including attic or cellar spaces.
34. **GARAGE, APARTMENT:** A dwelling unit erected above a private garage.
35. **GARAGE, PARKING:** A building, land or portion thereof designed or used for the temporary storage of motor-driven vehicles, with or without the retail dispensing, sale, or offering for sale of motor fuels, lubricants, and tires, or indoor car washing, minor motor adjustment, and flat tire repair when such operations are incidental to the storage of motor-driven vehicles.
36. **GARAGE, PRIVATE:** An accessory building or a part of a main building used for storage purposes for one or more automobiles.
37. **GARAGE, PUBLIC:** Any building other than a private or parking garage, available to the public for the care, servicing, repair, or equipping of automobiles or where such vehicles are parked or stored for remuneration, hire or sale.
38. **GASOLINE, SERVICE OR FILLING STATION:** Any area of land, including structures thereon, that is used for the retail sale of gasoline or oil fuels, and installation of other minor automobile accessories, and which may or may not include facilities of lubricating, washing, or cleaning.
39. **GOVERNING AUTHORITY:** The City Council of Picayune, Mississippi.
40. **HOME OCCUPATION:** An accessory use of a service character customarily conducted within a dwelling by the resident thereof, which is clearly secondary to the use of the dwelling for living purposes and which does not change the character thereof or have any exterior evidence of such secondary use other than a small name plate and in connection therewith there is not involved the keeping of a stock in trade; and provided that in no case shall more than fifteen (15) percent of the floor area of any apartment in such dwelling exclusive of any accessory building be used for such home occupation. The office of a physician, surgeon, dentist, or other professional person, who offers skilled services to clients and is not professionally engaged in the purchase or sale of economic goods, including violin, piano, or other individual musical instrument instruction limited to a single pupil at a time, shall be deemed to the Home Occupations; and the occupations of dressmaker, milliner, or seamstress, each with not more than one paid assistant shall also be deemed to the Home Occupations. The following shall not be interpreted to be Home Occupations: dancing instruction, band instrument, instruction in groups, tea rooms, tourist homes, beauty parlors, real estate offices, convalescent homes, mortuary establishments, and stores, trades, or business of any kind not herein excepted.
41. **HOSPITAL:** A building or portion thereof designed or used for the diagnosis, therapeutic treatment, or other care of ailments, of patients who are physically or mentally ill.
42. **HOTEL OR MOTEL:** A building or buildings containing sleeping rooms occupied, intended or designed to be occupied as the more or less temporary abiding place of persons who are lodged with or without meals for compensation.
43. **INSTITUTION:** A building or group of buildings designed or used for the non-profit, charitable, or public service purposes of providing board, lodging, health care for persons aged, indigent, or infirm, or for the purpose of performing educations or religious services and offering board and lodging to persons in residence.
44. **JUNK YARD, OPEN STORAGE:** The use of more than two hundred (200) square feet of the area of any lot, whether inside or outside a building, or the use of any portion of that half of any lot that joins any street, for the storage, sale, keeping or abandonment of junk, including scrap metals or other scrap materials, or the dismantling, demolition, or abandonment of automobiles or other vehicles or machinery or parts thereof.

45. **KENNEL:** The keeping of more than three (3) dogs or other animals that are more than six (6) months old and are offered for sale, or where care for animals is solicited.
46. **LAUNDROMAT:** A business providing for the hire and use of the premises of home-type washing, drying and/or ironing machine.
47. **LIGHT MANUFACTURING:** The manufacturing or processing of materials employing electricity or other unobjectionable machinery or processes, and free from any objectionable odors, fumes, dirt, vibration, or noise.
48. **LOT:** Any plot of land occupied or capable of being occupied for any use as defined in this ordinance.
49. **LOT AREA:** The total area included within the front, side and rear lot lines.
50. **LOT, CORNER:** A lot located at the intersection of and abutting on two (2) or more streets.
51. **LOT DEPTH:** The average horizontal distance between the front lot and the rear lot line.
52. **LOT, DOUBLE FRONTAGE:** A lot, other than a corner lot, which has frontage on more than one street.
53. **LOT, FRONTAGE:** That dimension of a lot or portion of a lot abutting on a street.
54. **LOT, INTERIOR:** A lot other than a corner lot.
55. **LOT LINES:** The lines bounding a lot as defined herein.
56. **LOT WIDTH:** The width of a lot at the front lot line.
57. **LOT OF RECORD:** A lot, the plat or deed or act of sale of which has been recorded in the office of the Tax Assessor of Picayune prior to the official adoption of this Zoning Ordinance.
58. **MARINA:** A boat basin, harbor or dock, with facilities for launching, berthing and servicing boats.
59. **MEDICAL AND DENTAL FACILITIES:** (a) Convalescent, Rest, or Nursing Home: A facility where persons are housed and furnished with medical and/or nursing care. (b) Dental Office or Doctor's Office: A facility for the examination and treatment of patients. (c) Hospital: An institution providing comprehensive health services. (d) Public Health Center: A facility primarily utilized by a health unit for provisions of public health services. (e) Clinic: An establishment used by physicians, surgeons, dentists, physiotherapists, psychiatrists, or practitioners in related specialties or a combination of persons in these professions where patients who are not lodged overnight are admitted for examination and treatment.
60. **MOBILE HOME:** A portable or mobile dwelling used for permanent occupancy.
61. **MOBILE HOME PARK:** A parcel of land in which land spaces are rented or leased for placement of two or more mobile homes.
62. **NONCONFORMING USE:** A structure and/or land use lawfully occupied by a use that does not conform to the regulations of the district in which it is situated at the time of the passage of this ordinance or subsequent amendments.
63. **PARKING LOT:** An open area which is used for the temporary parking of motor vehicles but is not a required off-street parking facility.
64. **PARKING SPACE:** A space located on private or public property sufficient in size to store one (1) automobile.
65. **PLANNING COMMISSION:** The Picayune Planning Commission.
66. **RESTAURANT:** A retail establishment offering food or beverages or both, for consumption on the premises. Restaurants do not include barrooms, night clubs, or lounges.
67. **RETAIL MANUFACTURING:** Baking, confectionery, dressmaking, dyeing, laundry, dry cleaning, printing, tailoring, upholstering, and similar establishments, and businesses of a similar and no more objectionable character subject to the following provisions: (a) All goods or products manufactured or processed shall be sold at retail on the premises. (b) All such manufacturing or processing shall be done on the premises and not more than ten persons shall be employed at any one time.
68. **SCHOOL, BUSINESS:** Privately-owned schools offering instruction in accounting, secretarial work, business administration, the fine or illustrative arts, trades, dancing, music and similar subjects.
69. **SCHOOL, PRIVATE:** Privately owned schools having a curriculum essentially the same as ordinarily given in a public elementary or secondary school (grades 1 through 12). The term includes day nurseries and kindergartens.
70. **SCHOOL, PUBLIC:** Any institute for the education of students in elementary or secondary grades (1 through 12) which is publicly owned. The term includes day nurseries and kindergartens.
71. **SCHOOL, TRADE OR INDUSTRIAL:** An establishment, public or private, offering training to students in skills required for the practice of trades and industry.
72. **SHOPPING CENTER:** A group of retail stores, planned and designed for the site upon which they are built.






