ORDINANCE #360  
AN ORDINANCE DECLARING NULL AND VOID PRIOR  
ZONING MAP OF THE CITY OF PICAYUNE AND ADOPT-  
ING A NEW ZONING MAP FOR THE CITY OF PICAYUNE

WHEREAS, at the regular December, 1971, session the Mayor and Council declared their intention to declare null and void and without merit the existing zoning map for the City of Picayune, and in its place and stead to adopt and constitute a new zoning map which reclassifies, designates and zones some portions of the City of Picayune, and

WHEREAS, this intention was duly spread upon the minutes of the regular December, 1971, session of the Mayor and Council, and

WHEREAS, notice of public hearings was given in the Picayune Item newspaper upon December 15, 1971, and said public hearing was had at the time, date and location mentioned in said notice, and

WHEREAS, there was no objection filed or expressed to the intention of the Mayor and Council to declare null and void and without further merit the existing zoning map for the City of Picayune, and in its place and stead to adopt and constitute a new zoning map which reclassifies, designates and zones some portions of the City of Picayune, and

NOW, THEREFORE, Be It Ordained by the Mayor and Council as follows:

## MUNICIPAL MINUTES, CITY OF PICAYUNE

SECTION 1. The existing zoning map for the City of Picayune is hereby declared null and void and without further merit, provided however, that any construction which was permitted and completed in conformity with the zoning of said zoning map shall not be affected by any change in zoning which is brought about by this Ordinance, provided further, that the City Clerk is authorized and directed to secure and make provisions for the storage of said old zoning map such that it will be kept as a permanent record of the City of Picayune.

SECTION 2. There is hereby designated and constituted an official zoning map for the City of Picayune identified as bearing the title "OFFICIAL ZONING MAP FOR THE CITY OF PICAYUNE, MISSISSIPPI" and further identified as bearing the following certification "This is to certify that this is the official zoning map referred to in Article 1, Section 1.01, of Ordinance No. 358, of the City of Picayune, Mississippi adopted on October 5, 1971" signed by the Mayor and attested herein by reference.

SECTION 3. The Official Zoning Map for the City of Picayune, Mississippi, shall be maintained at the office of the City Engineer of said City, and shall not be changed or altered in any respect or manner without the expressed order and ordinance of the Mayor and Council of the City of Picayune.

SECTION 4. This ordinance shall be in force one month after its passage.





ORDINANCE NO. 361  
AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 358 SECTION  
3.3 BEING THE ZONING ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF  
PICAYUNE

WHEREAS, at the regular December, 1971 session of the Mayor and Council declared their intention to amend Section 3.3 of Ordinance No. 358, and

WHEREAS, this intention was duly spread upon the minutes of the regular December, 1971, session of the Mayor and Council, and

WHEREAS, Notice of public hearings was given in the Picayune Item newspaper upon December 15, 1971, and said public hearing was had at the time, date and location mentioned in said notice, and

WHEREAS, there was no objection filed or expressed to the intention of the Mayor and Council to declare null and void and without further merit the existing zoning map for the City of Picayune, and in its place and stead to adopt and constitute a new zoning map which reclassifies, designates and zones some portions of the City of Picayune, and

NOW, THEREFORE, Be It Ordained by the Mayor and Council as follows:

SECTION I. Section 3.3 of Ordinance No. 358 is hereby amended to read as follows:

- a. Any use permitted on review in an R-1 single family dwelling district but subject to the requirements thereof.
- b. Multiple family dwellings, including town houses, rooming and boarding houses, but excluding tourist homes, subject to the requirements thereof contained in Section 4.

SECTION II. The above and foregoing ordinance will go into effect One (1) Month after its passage.

WHEREAS, Title VII of the Housing Act of 1961, as amended, provides for the making of grants by the Secretary of Housing and Urban Development to States and local public bodies to assist them in the acquisition and development of permanent interests in land for open-space uses where such assistance is needed for carrying out a unified or officially coordinated program for the provision and development of open-space land as part of the comprehensively planned development of the urban area; and

WHEREAS, the City of Picayune, Mississippi (herein sometimes referred to as "Applicant"), desires to develop certain land known as Beech Street Park commencing at the Southeast corner of the Northeast quarter of the Southeast quarter of Section 16, Township 6 South, Range 17 West, Pearl River County, Mississippi; thence West 30 feet and North 150 feet to the place of beginning; thence West 765 feet, more or less to the West right of way of the Pearl River Valley Railroad right of way; thence North 17 degrees East along said right-of-way 1090 feet; thence East 435 feet, more or less, to the West right-of-way of Beech Street; thence South along said right of way 1035 feet, more or less, to the place of beginning, containing 14 acres, more or less, in the Northeast quarter of Southeast quarter of Section 16, Township 6 South, Range 17 West, Pearl River County, Mississippi.

WHEREAS, Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, and the regulations of the Housing and Urban Development effectuating that Title, provide that no person shall be discriminated against because of race, color, or national origin in the use of the land acquired and/or developed; and




Section 2. That this Ordinance being for the immediate and temporary preservation of the public peace, health and safety, and for other good cause, shall be effective from and after its passage.

The City Manager explained that two of our local industries have completed the work of building a pre-treatment plant as approved by the Mississippi Water and Air Pollution Control Commission and that the effluent from said two plants be taken into the sewage treatment plant and the charge per month to said industries and any and all other industries who may hereafter turn their effluent into the city's sewage treatment plant be determined by the cost of treating same together with the estimated volume thereof. This cost to include maintenance of the plant and a reasonable figure for depreciation of equipment.

AUTHORIZE PLACING OF TRASH CANS

The DeLitter Company, Inc. of Denham Springs, Louisiana has requested permission to distribute garbage cans in the business and commercial area of the City without any cost to the City itself but with request that the City empty the garbage cans at least weekly and more often if necessary. The DeLitter Company reserves the right to sell advertisement to be placed on said cans but agree to keep the cans in good working condition.

Begin at the Northeast corner of Section 26, Township 6 South, Range 17 West, Pearl River County, Mississippi; thence South 1320 feet; thence West 220 feet, more or less, to the East right of way of a county road; thence Northerly along said right of way 1320 feet, more or less, to the North line of said Section; thence East 100 feet, more or less, to the place of beginning, containing 4.8 acres, more or less, in the Northeast quarter of the Northeast quarter of Section 26, Township 6 South, Range 17 West, Pearl River County, Mississippi.

The City will extend police protection and fire protection and natural gas service into the annexed area.

RESOLUTION OF THE URBAN RENEWAL AGENCY OF THE CITY OF

WHEREAS it is necessary and in the public interest that the Urban Renewal Agency of the City of Picayune, Mississippi avail itself of the financial assistance provided by Title I of the Housing Act of 1949, as amended, to carry out the urban renewal project described as the Bruce Street Urban Renewal Area and bounded generally by (see attached description), hereinafter referred to as the "Project" and

WHEREAS it is recognized that the Federal contract for such financial assistance pursuant to said Title I will impose certain obligations and responsibilities upon the Local Public Agency and will require among other things (1) the provision of local grants-in-aid; (2) a feasible method for the relocation of individuals and families displaced from the project area; and (3) other local obligations and responsibilities in connection with the undertaking and carrying out of urban renewal projects; and

WHEREAS, the Urban Renewal Agency of the City of Picayune, Mississippi (herein called the "Local Public Agency") has entered into planning contract for financial assistance under such Act with the United States of America, acting by and through the Secretary of Housing and Urban Development, pursuant to which Federal funds were provided for the urban renewal project (herein called the "Project") identified as "Bruce Street Urban Renewal Area, Miss. R-67" and encompassing the area bounded by (See Attached Description) in the City of Picayune, State of Mississippi (herein called the "Locality"); and

WHEREAS, the Local Public Agency has applied for additional financial assistance under such Act and proposes to enter into an additional contract or contracts under the Department of Housing and Urban Development for the undertaking of, and for making available financial assistance for, the Project; and

WHEREAS the Local Public Agency has made detailed studies of the location, physical condition of structures, land use, environmental influences, and social, cultural and economic conditions of the Project area and has determined that the area is a slum area and that it is detrimental and a menace to the safety, health, and welfare of the inhabitants and users thereof and of the locality at large, because of conditions of various factors that contribute to the health, safety, and welfare of the community, and the members of this Governing Body have been fully apprised by the Local Public Agency and are aware of these facts and conditions; and

WHEREAS, there has been prepared and referred to the Mayor and City Council of the City of Picayune, Mississippi (herein called the "Governing Body") for review and approval an Urban Renewal Plan for the Project Area, dated April 19, 1972, and consisting of 20 pages and 3 maps supported by the following supplementary material, data and recommendations are not a part of the Urban Renewal Plan: Project Area Report, Report on Planning Proposals, Report on Minority Group Considerations, Land Acquisition Report, Project Improvements Report, Cost Estimates and Financing Report and certain Legal Data; and

WHEREAS, the Urban Renewal Plan has been approved by the Governing Body of the Local Public Agency, as evidenced by the copy of said Body's duly certified resolution approving the Urban Renewal Plan, which is attached hereto; and

2. That the Urban Renewal Plan for the Project, having been duly reviewed and considered, is hereby approved, and the City Clerk be and is hereby directed to file said copy of the Urban Renewal Plan with the minutes of this meeting.
3. That it is hereby found and determined that the objectives of the Urban Renewal Plan cannot be achieved through rehabilitation of the Project Area.
4. That it is hereby found and determined that the Urban Renewal Plan for the Project area conforms to the general plan of the Locality.
5. That it is hereby found and determined that the financial aid provided and to be provided pursuant to the contracts for Federal financial assistance pertaining to the Project is necessary to enable the Project to be undertaken in accordance with the Urban Renewal Plan for the Project Area.
6. That it is hereby found and determined that the Urban Renewal Plan for the Urban Renewal Area will afford maximum opportunity, consistent with the sound needs of the Locality as a whole, for the urban renewal of the Area by private enterprise.

That it is hereby found and determined that the Urban Renewal Plan for the Urban Renewal Area gives due consideration to the provision of adequate park and recreational areas and facilities, as may be desirable for neighborhood improvement, with special consideration for the health, safety, and welfare of children residing in the general vicinity of the site covered by the Plan.



AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE CITY OF PICAYUNE, MISSISSIPPI  
AND THE URBAN RENEWAL AGENCY OF THE CITY OF PICAYUNE  
MISSISSIPPI

THIS AGREEMENT, entered into this 14th day of July, 1972, by and between the Urban Renewal Agency of the City of Picayune, Mississippi, a body corporate and politic under the laws of the State of Mississippi (herein referred to as the Authority) and the City of Picayune, Mississippi, a municipal corporation of the State of Mississippi (herein referred to as the "City").

WHEREAS, by resolution adopted on July 14, 1972, the Mayor and City Council of the City approved an Urban Renewal Plan proposed by the Authority for the City of Picayune, known as the Bruce Street Urban Renewal Area Project No. Miss. R-67.

WHEREAS, said Plan contemplates the acquisition and clearance by the Authority of the Project Area as shown in said Urban Renewal Plan, and the reuse and/or sale of various portions thereof for the uses indicated, all of which uses have been determined by the City to be in accordance with the general plan for the City as a whole and in accordance with certain definite local objectives as to appropriate land uses, improved traffic, public transportation, public utilities, and other public improvements, as in said Plan and resolution set forth; and

WHEREAS, in order for the Authority to effectuate said Plan the assistance of both the Federal Government and the City is required; namely, of the Federal Government by lending funds needed to defray the gross cost of the Project, and upon completion of the project and repayment of such loan, by contribution of three-fourths (3/4) of the net cost of the project; and of the City by making certain local grants-in-aid (as specified by Title I of the Housing Act of 1949, as amended) as hereinafter provided, in a total amount equal to at least one-fourth (1/4) of the net cost of the project; and

WHEREAS, the Agency applied to the Federal Government for financial assistance under said Title I, and it

now devolves upon the City to take certain actions and to provide certain grants-in-aid which are estimated, on the basis of surveys and plans heretofore made by the Authority to be required in the total amount of \$615,859.

NOW, THEREFORE, pursuant to Sections 7342-01 and 7342-20 of the Code of Mississippi, 1940, and in consideration to the benefits to accrue to the city and its citizens from the urban renewal project, and of the covenants hereinafter set forth, the Authority and the City do agree as follows:

SECTION 1. In order to assist the Agency in the undertaking of the Project, the City agrees to make grants-in-aid as follows:

(a) Cash Grant-in-Aid: No cash grants-in-aid are required.

(b) Donational of Land: The City does not plan to donate any land in this project.

(c) Demolition and Removal Work: To perform or cause to be performed certain demolition and removal work as required under the urban renewal plan; provided, however, that if such work is not performed or undertaken by the city by the time it is needed to prevent delay in project execution, to then pay to the Urban Renewal Agency the sum of \$27,900 in cash, the estimated cost of such work. If, after completion of such demolition and removal work a profit to the City is realized, the net proceeds shall be remitted to the Authority for inclusion in the project expenditures account.

(d) Site Improvements: To construct or cause to be constructed in accordance with a mutually agreeable schedule, and as required in the execution of the urban renewal plan, the following site improvements:

Provided, however, that in the event said construction has not been started by the time the respective improvements are needed to permit the timely execution of said Urban Renewal Plan, the City will then pay to the Authority the estimated total cost of each improvement as respectively indicated above, so as to prevent delay in the execution of said Urban Renewal Plan.

(e) Supporting Facilities: To construct the following supporting facilities, essential to the project, in accordance with the mutually agreeable schedule, and as required by the Urban Renewal Plan, to which the following estimates are applicable:

The foregoing amounts of estimated local grants-in-aid shall be subject to adjustment at such time as sufficient progress has been made to determine the actual cost of the facility. The percentage of eligibility of each facility will be subject to change if significant facts on which the determination was based were in error, or there has been a change in (1) the Urban Renewal Plan, (2) the type, size, or capacity of the facility, or (3) the boundaries of the area to be served by the facility, (4) conditions in the service area outside the project, (5) planning criteria such as family size, number of rooms, etc.

It is understood and agreed that the city's obligation hereunder is to make cash or non-cash grants-in-aid in a total amount equal to one-fourth (1/4) the actual net cost of the project, and that the amounts payable by the City to the Authority as hereinabove set forth are based on estimates and that if the total actual net cost of the Project (as determined by the Authority, in accordance with its contract with the Federal Government) is greater or less than the total estimated net cost of the Project, the amount of cash payments to be made by the City to the Authority as provided above in Section 1, shall be appropriately adjusted.

SECTION 2. Area for Public Use There are no areas within the project designated for public reuse.

SECTION 3. The City agrees that at no cost or expense to the Authority and upon the Authority's request, the city will, insofar as it can lawfully do so, vacate the streets, alleys, roads, and other public ways, to be eliminated in preparing the project area for its new uses, as shown in the urban renewal plan.

SECTION 4. The Authority agrees that it will convey to the City free of charge any land acquired by the Authority required for street purposes under the Urban Renewal Plan.

SECTION 5. The City agrees to act with the Authority by taking such other lawful actions as may be determined by the City and the Authority to be necessary and desirable in connection with the undertaking and carrying out of the Project.

SECTION 6. The Mayor and City Council recognize that Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 and the regulations and policies of the Department of Housing and Urban Development effectuating the Title prohibit discrimination on the ground of race, color, or national origin in the policies and practices of any public facility, educational institution, or hospital responsible for proposed credit to the locality's share of the cost of an urban renewal project receiving financial assistance from the United States. The Mayor and City Council hereby assure the United States and the Department of Housing and Urban Development Administrator that the proposed public facilities to be provided under Section 1 above, will be available to and serve all persons without regard to race, color, or national origin.

It is further understood and agreed that in order for the City to receive non-cash credits under Items 1 (b), (c), (d) and (e) above, the Authority shall obtain and submit with each application for such non-cash credit satisfactory assurances that each such public facility proposed as a Non-cash Local Grant-In-Aid and each institution on whose behalf Section 112 credits are claimed, will be operated on a non-discriminatory basis.

SECTION 7. The City agrees to hold the Authority harmless with respect to any claims for personal injury and/or death or property damage arising from any operations carried on by the city in connection with the project.

SECTION 8. It is understood that pooling credits currently estimated to total \$none are considered as part of the city's one-fourth (1/4) share of the net project cost for this project and said amount is included in the last Whereas clause of this agreement.

SECTION 9. This agreement shall be executed in 10 counterparts, each of which shall be deemed to be of an original and such counterparts shall constitute one and the same instrument.

SECTION 10. The City agrees to buy all unbuildable parcels designated as Parcel 8-1 on the Land Disposal Map should adjacent owners refuse to buy.



REQUEST STATE HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT TO  
OPEN NEUTRAL GROUND

There came up for discussion at this time the confusion that exists on the new Highway 43 where Sycamore Road, Daniels Street and Millwood Road intersects with same. In the discussion, it was brought out that people entering Highway 43 from Millwood Road had access only to the south lane thereof and that a number of them were going against traffic thereby creating a hazard and that one wreck has already occurred and several more near collisions.

The City Manager explained that this situation had been discussed with both Mr. Pyron, our Highway Commissioner, and Mr. Brownlee, the District Engineer, both of which agreed that the existing hazard should be eliminated.







TRAINING SCHOOL AND PURCHASE FIXTURES AND EQUIPMENT FOR SAME

WHEREAS, a duly certified copy of a resolution of the Board of Trustees of Picayune Municipal Separate School District, adopted by said Board on the 22nd day of August, 1972, declaring the necessity of a loan to said District in the amount of \$200,000.00 to finance the erection of a vocation and technical training school and purchase fixtures and equipment and installation of same in the buildings of said School District, such purchases and improvements being necessary, said resolution certifying that there are no funds available for such purposes from the school funds of said District or from any other source, that amount being necessary for said purposes, the said loan to be evidenced by negotiable notes of said School District bearing interest from date at a rate not to exceed six (6) per centum per annum, payable annually and falling due at the rate of Thirty Thousand (\$30,000.00) Dollars, plus interest, the first annual installment; Forty Thousand (\$40,000.00) Dollars each, plus interest, the Second and Third installments; and Forty-Five Thousand (\$45,000.00) Dollars each, the Fourth and Fifth annual installments, plus interest; for five (5) annual installments, and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council of the City of Picayune have maturely considered said resolution and do now find and adjudicate that all facts set forth therein are true and correct as hereinabove set out, and

WHEREAS, after due investigation, the Mayor and Council of said City do hereby find, adjudge, and determine as follows, to-wit:

(a) That the Picayune Municipal Separate School District in Pearl River and Hancock Counties, Mississippi, is a duly and lawfully created, organized, and existing municipal Separate School District under the laws of the State of Mississippi,

(b) That the total assessment of all taxable property in said School District, according to the last completed assessment roll, being for the taxable year 1972, is the sum of \$24,031,550, exclusive of motor vehicles,


(c) That the issuance of the negotiable notes of the said School District, in the sum of \$200,000.00, when added to its present bonded indebtedness, will not result in the imposition on any of the property in said District of a debt for school purposes of more than fifteen (15) per centum of the assessed valuation of the property within said District according to the last completed assessment, that the issuance of said notes will not require an annual tax levy in excess of two (2) mills on the dollar for the payment of all notes issued under the provisions of Chapter 30 of the Laws of Mississippi for the Extraordinary Session of 1953 (commencing November 3, 1953, and ending December 28, 1953) and all notes issued under the statutes repealed by said Chapter 30 of the Laws of 1953 and any amendments thereto,

(d) That the total bonded indebtedness of the Picayune Municipal Separate School District, exclusive of the amount herein provided, is the sum of \$843,000.00,

NOW, THEREFORE, Be It Resolved that the Mayor and Council of the City of Picayune, Pearl River County, Mississippi, do hereby declare their intention and purpose at the regular meeting of said Mayor and Council to be held on the 3rd day of October, 1972, at 9:00 A. M. at the City Hall in said City to authorize said loan to the said school district and to issue and execute negotiable notes of said School District to evidence said loan, the proceeds thereof to be used for the purpose of erecting a vocational and technical training school and purchasing fixtures and equipment and installing same in the buildings of said School District, and for no other purposes, said notes to be dated November 1, 1972, to be in the total sum of Two Hundred Thousand (\$200,000.00) Dollars, to be in denominations of Thirty Thousand (\$30,000.00) Dollars, Forty Thousand (\$40,000.00) Dollars, and Forty Five Thousand (\$45,000.00) Dollars, and numbered one to five, both inclusive, said notes to bear interest from date at a rate not to exceed six (6) per centum per annum payable annually over a period of five (5) years. It is further adjudicated that the issuance of said notes will not result in the violation or exceeding of any statutory limitation on the issuance of notes and bonds by said District.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this resolution shall be published in a legal newspaper having a general circulation in said Picayune Municipal Separate School District in accordance with the provisions of Section 3, Chapter 30 of the General Laws of Mississippi for the extraordinary session of 1953, as amended, (to be published once each week for two consecutive weeks) with the first publication thereof to be made not less than fifteen (15) days prior to said date of October 3, 1972, and that if twenty (20) percent or more of the qualified electors of said School District shall file a petition requesting an election in accordance with law on the question of incurring said indebtedness, then an election shall be called on such question as provided by law; but that if such petition shall not be presented within the time as aforesaid, the said notes shall be issued as herein provided.



The City of Picayune is hereby authorized to file with the Government requisitions together with necessary supporting documents, in accordance with the Loan and Capital Grant Contract, requesting payments to be made on account of the Project Temporary Loan, Project Definitive Loan and Project Capital Grant provided for in the Loan and Capital Grant Contract, and to perform all other acts required to be performed in order to obtain such payments.

SECTION 5. This Resolution shall take effect immediately.

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE

WITH URBAN RENEWAL PROJECT NO. MISS.  
R-67

WHEREAS, the City of Picayune (herein called the "Local Public Agency") is duly authorized and proposes to undertake and carry out a certain urban renewal or redevelopment project (designated Project No. Miss. R-67) of the character authorized by law with financial aid by the United States of America (herein called the "Government"), in the form of a Project Temporary Loan under Title I of the Housing Act of 1949, as amended (42 U.S.C. 1450 et seq.), which may be made by the Government to the Local Public Agency with respect to said Project in accordance with a certain Loan and Grant Contract (herein called the "Contract"), by and between the Local Public Agency and the Government; and

WHEREAS, in order to enable the Local Public Agency to obtain such financial aid, it is necessary for the Local Public Agency to authorize and, from time to time, issue certain obligations in the form of Project Loan Notes, as hereinafter provided:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Local Public Agency as follows:

SECTION 1. Whenever the following terms, or any of them, are used in this Resolution the same, unless the context shall indicate another or different meaning or intent, shall be construed, are used, and are intended to have meanings as follows:

- (1) The term "Resolution" shall mean this Resolution.
- (2) All other terms used in this Resolution and which are defined in the Contract shall have the respective meanings ascribed thereto in the Contract.

SECTION 2. The Contract entered into between the Local Public Agency and the Government for the above identified Project is hereby declared to be a part of this Resolution and all applicable provisions thereof shall be deemed incorporated herein to the same extent as if the provisions thereof were expressly set forth in full herein.

SECTION 3. In order to evidence payments made by the Government on account of the Project Temporary Loan pursuant to the Contract with respect to the Project and to refund, renew, extend or substitute for any Note by this Resolution authorized to be issued (or any such Note by any other resolution authorized to be issued and which is outstanding, or on deposit for delivery pending payment therefor, as of the date this Resolution becomes effective), there are hereby authorized to be issued, from time to time, Project Loan Notes of the Local Public Agency in an aggregate principal amount outstanding at any one time (whether authorized by this Resolution or any other resolution authorizing the issuance of Project Loan Notes) not in excess of the amount of the Project Temporary Loan available under the Contract.

SECTION 4. The City of Picayune is hereby authorized to file with the Government from time to time as funds are required, requisitions, together with the necessary supporting documents, requesting payments to be made on account of the Project Temporary Loan available under the Contract, and the proper officers of the Local Public Agency shall prepare, execute and deliver to the Government Notes hereinafter authorized and shall accept payment therefor from the Government in the form of cash or other Notes issued by the Local Public Agency, and such officers are authorized to do and perform all other things and acts required to be done or performed in order to obtain such payments. Cash proceeds from the issuance of all Project Loan Notes shall be deposited and disbursed only in accordance with the provisions of the Contract.

SECTION 5. Each Project Loan Note shall bear interest and be payable in the form and manner prescribed by the Contract and this Resolution; shall be signed in the name of the Local Public Agency by the Mayor; and shall have the official seal of the Local Public Agency impressed thereon and attested by the City Clerk; and shall otherwise be in substantially the form of HUD-9107 which is incorporated herein by reference.





RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF PICAYUNE PROVIDING  
ASSURANCES PURSUANT TO THE UNIFORM RELOCATION  
ASSISTANCE AND REAL PROPERTY ACQUISITION POLI-  
CIES ACT OF 1970

WHEREAS, the Uniform Relocation Assistance and Real Property Acquisition Policies Act of 1970, P. L. 91-646, (hereinafter referred to as the "Act") establishes uniform policies for the fair and equitable treatment of persons displaced as a result of Federal and federally assisted programs, as well as uniform policies on real property acquisition practices with respect to such programs; and

WHEREAS, the Act has application to programs and projects receiving financial assistance under Title I of the Housing Act of 1949, as amended; and

WHEREAS, the Local Public Agency has made application for financial assistance under Title I of the Housing Act of 1949 for an Urban Renewal project or program designated as follows: The Bruce Street Urban Renewal Area; and

WHEREAS, the activities for which such assistance is sought will involve displacement and/or land acquisition occurring after January 2, 1971, the effective date of the Act; and

WHEREAS, Sections 210 and 305 of the Act require the provision of certain assurances before the head of a Federal Agency can approve any grant to, or contract or agreement with, a State agency, under which Federal Financial assistance will be available to pay all or part of the cost of any program or project which will result in displacement or real property acquisition subject to the requirements of the Act.

NOW, THEREFORE, Be It Resolved by the governing body of the local Public Agency: That the United States of America and the Secretary of Housing and Urban Development be, and they are hereby, provided through the adoption of this resolution, with the following assurances regarding conduct by the Local Public Agency of the project or program for which Federal financial assistance under Title I of the Housing Act of 1949 is sought.

1. Fair and reasonable relocation payments and assistance shall be provided to or for displaced persons, as are required to be provided by a Federal agency under Sections 202, 203, and 204 of the Act;
2. Relocation assistance programs offering the services described in Section 205 of the Act shall be provided to such displaced persons;
3. Within a reasonable period of time prior to displacement, decent, safe, and sanitary replacement dwellings will be available to displaced persons in accordance with Section 205(c)(3) of the Act;

4. Persons to be displaced will be adequately informed of the benefits, policies and procedures provided in P. L. 91-646 and the regulations implementing that law;

5. The relocation process will be carried out in such a manner as to provide displaced persons with uniform and consistent services and replacement housing under the provisions of P. L. 91-646 and implementing regulations will be available and the same range or choices with respect to such housing will be offered to all displaced persons regardless of race, color, religion or national origin pursuant to Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 (42 U.S.C. 2000D), Title VIII of the Civil Rights Act of 1968 (42 U.S.C. 3501 et seq.) and Executive Order 11063 (27 F.R. 11527);

6. In acquiring real property, it will be guided, to the greatest extent practicable under State Law by the land acquisition policies in Section 301 and the provisions of Section 302 of the Act;

7. Property owners will be paid or reimbursed for necessary expenses as specified in Sections 303 and 304 of the Act; and


8. Costs of providing payments and assistance will be shared by the City of Picayune in the manner and to the extent required by Sections 211(a) and (b) of the Act.





WHEREAS, by Ordinance No. 308 of the City of Picayune, Cable Video, Inc., was granted the right or permit to use the streets and public ways of said City and to operate therein a TV Community Antenna System in accordance with the provisions of said Ordinance; and

WHEREAS, Cable Video, Inc., sold its Community Antenna System in the City of Picayune, to Uniloy Community Antenna of Mississippi, Inc., and said Uniloy Community Antenna of Mississippi, Inc., has sold its interest acquired from Cable Video Inc., in the Community Antenna System to Picayune Cablevision, Inc; and Uniloy Community Antenna of Mississippi, Inc., and Picayune Cablevision, Inc. have made application and request to the City of Picayune for the approval of the transfer of said system and for approval of the transfer to Picayune Cablevision, Inc. of the right, permit or franchise originally granted by said Ordinance No. 308 to Cable Video, Inc., and

WHEREAS, the governing authorities of the said City of Picayune, Mississippi, have fully investigated and determined, and do hereby adjudicate, that Picayune Cablevision, Inc., as the purchaser of the said Community TV Antenna System, is in a position to give better service to the people of said city, so that it is for the best interest of said city, and the citizens thereof, that such approval be granted, and that such transfer be made;

NOW, THEREFORE, Be It Ordained by the Mayor and Council of the City of Picayune, Mississippi, as follows:

SECTION 1. That the right, permit or franchise granted by the City of Picayune, to, Cable Video, Inc., by Ordinance No. 308 of said City and transferred to Uniloy Community Antenna of Mississippi, Inc., by Ordinance dated November 26, 1965, be and the same is hereby transferred to Picayune Cablevision, Inc., a Mississippi Corporation, subject to all terms and conditions stated therein, and SECTIONS 1, 2, 4 and 5 of Ordinance No. 308 of said City are hereby amended by striking out the name of "Uniloy Community Antenna of Mississippi, Inc." as Licensee therein, and substituting in lieu thereof, the name "Picayune Cablevision, Inc.", a Mississippi Corporation; provided further, however, that Picayune Cablevision, Inc., is hereby granted authority to mortgage or pledge its TV Community Antenna System for the purpose of securing loans, and in the event any such lender shall foreclose any such mortgage or security instrument, then the rights held by Picayune Cablevision, Inc., hereunder, shall be transferred to any such purchaser at such foreclosure.




