WHEREAS, the City of Picaune (herein called the "Local Issuing Agency") has previously adopted a resolution titled "RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE SALE, ISSUANCE AND DELIVERY OF PROJECT NOTES AND THE EXECUTION OF REQUISITION AGREEMENTS" on the 6th day of February, 1973; and

WHEREAS, the Local Issuing Agency and the United States of America (herein called the "Government") recognize the desirability of the Local Issuing Agency obtaining funds for the purpose described in the aforementioned resolution from sources other than the Government despite the existence of abnormally high interest rates which presently prevail in the private money markets; and

WHEREAS, the Government proposes to enable the Local Issuing Agency to continue to obtain loan funds from sources other than the Government by the Government making payment of a placement fee, where necessary, to the purchaser or purchasers of the Local Issuing Agency's Project Notes (herein called the "Notes") hereafter awarded:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Local Issuing Agency as follows:

Section 1. The Urban Renewal Director after receiving Government approval of a recommended award of the Notes is hereby authorized and directed on behalf of the Local Issuing Agency to award the Notes at the lowest interest rate or rates, not in excess of six percent (6%) per annum, offered in the proposals, without reference to premiums; Provided, however, that as among proposals specifying the same lowest interest rate and specifying a premium, the award shall be made on the basis of the highest premium per dollar principal amount of the Notes specified in such proposals: Provided further, that in the event every proposal relating to all or any part of the Notes specifies a placement fee to be received by the purchaser as compensation for the placement of such Notes, then the award of the Notes to which such proposals relate shall be made on the basis of the lowest placement fee specified per dollar amount of such Notes.

Section 2. Each proposal submitted for all or a part of the Notes shall be substantially in the form of HUD-9402 which is incorporated herein by reference, and which is hereby approved by the Local Issuing Agency.

Section 3. The Local Issuing Agency hereby authorizes the Government to pay to any purchaser of the Notes a placement fee as compensation for services required in placing the Notes.

Section 4. Any and all prior resolutions of the Local Issuing Agency are hereby amended to the extent necessary to enable the carrying out of the actions authorized herein.

Section 5. This Resolution shall take effect immediately.



NATIONAL FLOOD INSURANCE ACT

WHEREAS, certain areas of the City of Picaune are subject to periodic flooding from the Hobolochitto Creek causing serious damages to residential properties within these areas; and

WHEREAS, relief is available in the form of flood insurance as authorized by the National Flood Insurance Act of 1968 as amended; and

WHEREAS, it is the intent of this Mayor and Council to comply with land use and management criteria regulations as required in said act; and

WHEREAS, it is also the intent of this Mayor and Council to recognize and duly evaluate flood hazards in all official actions relating to land use in the flood plain areas having special flood hazards; and

WHEREAS, the Code Citation of any State enabling legislation and of any resulting county, city, town or village ordinance that authorizes this City of Picaune to adopt land use and control measures is Section 3590 MCA 1942 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that this Mayor and Council hereby assures the Federal Insurance Administration that it takes the following legislative action:

- (1) Appoints the City Engineer with the responsibility, authority, and means to:
- (a) Delineate or assist the Administrator, at his request, in delineating the limits of the areas having special flood hazards on

available local maps of sufficient scale to identify the location of building sites

(b) Provide such information as the Administrator may request concerning present uses and occupancy of the flood plain.

(c) Maintain for public inspection and furnishing upon request, with respect to each area having special flood hazards, information on elevations (in relation to mean sea level) of the lowest floors of all new or substantially improved structures; and

(d) Cooperate with Federal, State, and local agencies and private firms which undertake to study, survey, map, and identify flood plain, and cooperate with neighboring communities with respect to management of adjoining flood plain areas in order to prevent aggravation of existing hazards.

(e) Submit on the anniversary date of the community's initial eligibility, an annual report to the Administrator on the progress made during the past year with the community in the development and implementation of flood plain area management measures.

(2) Take such other official action as may be reasonably necessary to carry out the objectives of the program.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that this Mayor and Council hereby appoints the City Engineer with the overall responsibility, authority, and means to implement all commitments made herein.

RESOLUTION  
TO AMEND SOUTHERN STANDARD BUILDING CODE

WHEREAS, The City of Picayune had adopted and is enforcing the Southern Standard Building Code, and

WHEREAS, Section 101.3 of the Southern Standard Building Code as adopted by the City of Picayune prohibits any person, firm or corporation from erecting, constructing, enlarging, altering, repairing, improving, moving or demolishing any building or structure without first obtaining a separate building permit for each building or structure from the Building Inspector, and

WHEREAS, the Building Inspector must examine all plans and specifications for proposed construction when application is made to him for a building permit, and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor and City Council of the City of Picayune as follows:

1. That the Building Inspector for the City of Picayune when reviewing applications for building permits, including the plans and specifications for the proposed construction, will review all building permit applications to determine if the proposed construction is consistent with the need to minimize flood damage.

2. That the Building Inspector shall review all building permit applications to determine if the site of the proposed construction is reasonably safe from flooding and to make recommendations for construction in all locations which have flood hazards;

3. That the Building Inspector in reviewing all applications for construction in flood hazard locations within the City of Picayune shall require that any such proposed construction must:

- a. Be designed and anchored to prevent the flotation, collapse or lateral movement of the structure or portions of the structure due to flooding.
- b. Use of construction materials and utility equipment that are resistant to flood damage.
- c. Use of construction methods and practices that will minimize flood damage.
- d. Provide adequate drainage in order to reduce exposure to flood hazards.
- e. Locate public utilities and facilities on the site in such a manner as to be elevated and constructed to minimize or eliminate flood damage, such utilities and facilities including sewer, gas, electrical and water systems.

4. It is further resolved that the Building Inspector in reviewing all subdivision applications shall make findings of fact and determine if:

- a. All such proposed developments are consistent with the need to minimize flood damage.
- b. Adequate drainage is provided so as to reduce exposure to flood hazards.
- c. Adequate drainage is provided so as not to increase the exposure to flood hazards of adjacent lands.



ORDINANCE NO: 374

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE NO: 285  
TO SPECIFY ANNUAL RENEWAL DATE FOR LICENSE  
TO REDUCE ANNUAL LICENSE FEE FOR REGISTRATION  
AND TO SPECIFY VACCINE TO BE USED FOR RABIES.

WHEREAS, the City of Picayune has an ordinance regulating the ownership and keeping of dogs within the City of Picayune and requiring registration and licensing thereof, and

WHEREAS, the State of Mississippi has prescribed an annual expiration date for the statewide inoculation of dogs for rabies, and it would be in the best interest of the citizens of the City of Picayune that the annual expiration date for licensing of dogs within the City of Picayune be coordinated with the statewide rabies control act, and

WHEREAS, the license fee under existing Ordinance No: 285 is \$3.00 for each dog, however, it is in the best interest of the citizens of the City of Picayune that

said registration fee be reduced to \$2.00 as an inducement to the individual dog owner to achieve full compliance with the statewide inoculation of dogs for rabies and registration program, and

WHEREAS, there are several vaccines upon the market used with varying degrees of success for the inoculation of dogs against rabies, and it would be in the best interest of the citizens of the City of Picayune that a vaccine be utilized that will assure protection from rabies for a full twelve month period of time without the necessity of booster shots or other treatment during said twelve month period, and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Council of the City of Picayune as follows:

Section 1. Ordinance No: 285, Section 3, is hereby amended to read as follows: "Section 3. All dogs within the said city shall be vaccinated at least once each calendar year for rabies, such vaccination to be performed by a qualified veterinarian or a person approved by the Mayor and Council of the City of Picayune, and otherwise qualified by law, with vaccine Norden, or equivalent, and it shall be unlawful for any person to own, to bring, or to keep, within said City

any dog that has not been so vaccinated within a period of twelve months, and each day that a dog shall remain unvaccinated as provided herein shall constitute a separate offense hereunder."

Section 2. Ordinance No: 285, Section 4, is hereby amended to read as follows: "Section 4. All dogs within the said City of Picayune shall be registered with the Clerk of said City in April, and prior to May first of each calendar year. An annual registration fee of \$2.00 for each dog shall be paid and the owner of each such dog shall be furnished with a registration tag which shall be worn on the collar or harness of the dog for which it is secured. Puppies shall not be required to be registered until they are three months of age, and the burden of proof as to the age of any such dogs shall be on the owner thereof. As to any dogs brought into the said City, the owners thereof shall have a period of ten days after the arrival of such dogs in said City within which to register them. As to any newly born dogs or dogs newly brought into said City, the registration fee shall be prorated for the remainder of the year of such registration. It shall be unlawful for any person to own, or to keep within said City any dog which has not been so registered and/or which does not have fastened to its collar or harness such registration tag. Each day during which any such dog shall remain in said City without being so registered shall constitute a separate offense hereunder."

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ORDINANCE NO: 377  
LOCAL EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS  
ORDINANCE OF CITY OF PICAYUNE

1. SHORT TITLE

This ordinance may be referred to or cited as the Emergency Preparedness and Civil Defense Ordinance of the City of Picayune, Mississippi.

2. INTENT AND PURPOSE

A. Due to the existing and everpresent possibility of occurrence of calamities or emergencies resulting from enemy action, natural and man-made disasters, and in order that adequate preparations to deal with such disasters be made, and generally to provide for the common defense and to protect the public peace, health and safety, and to preserve the lives and property of the people, it is hereby found and declared necessary:

1. To create a City Emergency Preparedness Council that will insure the effective and efficient utilization of all of the City's resources to prepare for and combat emergencies arising from the forenamed disasters.
2. To invest the Emergency Preparedness Council with the responsibility of coordinating all disaster planning and operation by joint efforts with each department having an emergency role or responsibility; the Disaster Plan or Basic Plan will be the instrument through which the Mayor and Councilmen may exercise the authority and discharge the responsibilities vested in them by the Mississippi Civil Defense Act of 1952, as amended, and this ordinance. The Basic Plan with its annexes shall become a part of this ordinance when approved by the governing body;
3. To confer upon the executive heads or governing bodies of the municipality the emergency powers provided herein;
4. To provide for rendering of mutual aid between the municipalities and counties of the state, the state, and with the federal government with respect to the carrying out of emergency preparedness functions;
5. To authorize the establishment of and Emergency Preparedness Council and the taking of such steps as are necessary and appropriate to carry out the provisions of this ordinance.

B. It is further declared to be the purpose of this ordinance and the policy of the City that all emergency preparedness functions to be coordinated with the comparable functions of the federal and state governments, including their various departments and agencies, and of private agencies of every type, to the end that the most effective preparation and use may be made of the City's manpower, resources, and facilities for dealing with any disaster,

3. DEFINITIONS

The following words, whenever used in this ordinance shall, unless a different meaning clearly appears from the context, have the following meanings:

- A. "Emergency Preparedness or Civil Defense Council" shall be used interchangeably and shall mean the organization authorized to coordinate emergency functions.
- B. "Emergency Preparedness" shall mean the preparation to carry out the basic governmental functions of maintaining the public peace, health and safety during emergencies and to prevent, minimize and repair injury and damage resulting from disasters as defined in this section. These functions include written plans and without limitations, fire fighting, law enforcement, emergency medical and health services, rescue, warning, communications, radiological, chemical services and other special weapons defense, evacuation of persons from

stricken areas, emergency welfare and transportation services, plant protection, temporary restoration of public utility services and other functions related to civil defense, together with all other activities necessary or incidental to the preparation for and carrying out of the foregoing functions. It shall not, however, include any activities that are the primary responsibility of the military forces of the United States.

- C. "Enemy Attack or Action" shall mean a direct or indirect assault against any city, county, state of this country or the nation itself by the forces of a hostile nation or the agents thereof, including but not limited to assault by bombing, radiological, chemical or biological warfare, or sabotage.
- D. "Disaster" shall mean occurrence or imminent threat of widespread or severe damage, injury or loss of life or property resulting from any natural or man-made cause, including but not limited to fire, flood, earthquake, windstorm, wave action, chemical spill, or other water contamination requiring emergency action to avert danger or damage, volcanic activity, epidemics, air contamination, blight, drought, infestation, explosion, riot, civil disturbance or hostile military or paramilitary action.
- E. "Riot or Unlawful Assembly" shall mean any use of force or violence disturbing the public peace, or any threat to use such force and violence, if accompanied by immediate power of execution, by two or more persons acting together and without authority of law.
- F. "Chief Administrative Officer" shall mean the mayor of any municipality and/or the President of any county Board of Supervisors. Any municipality or county, however, may by ordinance specially designate any official as Chief Administrative Officer for purpose of this ordinance.
- G. "Coordinator or Director" shall be the executive head of the Emergency Preparedness Council under the direction and control of the Chief Administrative Officer.
- H. "Volunteer" shall mean contributing a service, equipment, or facilities to the disaster preparedness organization without remuneration and shall also mean any person duly registered, indentified and appointed by the Coordinator of the Emergency Preparedness Council and to participate in the disaster preparedness activities.
- I. "Emergency Forces" shall mean the employees, equipment and facilities of all City departments, agencies, boards, institutions and commissions; and in addition, it shall include all volunteer personnel, equipment and facilities contributed by, or obtained from volunteer persons or agencies.
- J. "Regulations" shall include plans, programs and other emergency procedures deemed essential to disaster preparedness and operations.
- K. "County" shall mean the unincorporated area that lies outside the City or Town limits of municipalities geographically located within said County.
- L. "City" shall mean the incorporated area that lies inside the city of Picayune.
- M. "Curfew" shall mean a prohibition against any person or persons walking, running, loitering, standing, sitting, lying or motoring upon any ally, street, public property or vacant premises except persons officially designated to duty with reference to said emergency or those lawfully on the streets as defined hereinafter.

#### 4. ORGANIZATION AND APPOINTMENT

- A. The Mayor is hereby authorized to create an organization for disaster preparedness and operations utilizing to the fullest extent the existing agencies within the City. The Mayor, as Chief Administrative Officer shall be responsible for the organization, administration and operation of the disaster preparedness emergency forces of the City. The Mayor and Councilmen will designate a line of succession for that body to insure that the necessary responsibility for direction and control can be exercised in event of absence or inability of the Chief Administrative Officer to act.
- B. The Council shall consist of the following:
  1. An office of Disaster Preparedness under the direction and control of the Chief Administrative Officer. This shall be the primary control center to serve as a command post or emergency operation center during disasters.
  2. There shall be an executive head of the Office of Disaster Preparedness who shall be known as the Coordinator, and such assistants and other employees as are deemed necessary for the proper functioning of the council.
  3. All employees, equipment and facilities of the City departments, agencies, boards and commissions will participate in disaster preparedness activities. Duties assigned to an element shall be the same or similar to the normal duties of that element.
  4. Volunteer persons and agencies offering manpower, services or equipment, or supplies and which are accepted by the council.
- C. A Coordinator will be appointed by the Chief Administrative Officer with the advice and approval of the city Councilmen. The Coordinator shall be well versed and trained in planning and operations before or immediately following appointment so that the most effective program to protect the public health, safety, and welfare may be established without delay. The Coordinator will act as an advisor to the Chief Administrative Officer during emergencies.
- D. The Chief of Police who is the Chief Law Enforcement Officer of the City will serve as principal advisor to the Chief Administrative Officer on the implementation

of the provisions of emergency powers under this ordinance during non-wartime emergencies or disasters.

5. EMERGENCY POWERS AND DUTIES

- A. The Chief Administrative Officer may exercise the emergency power and authority necessary to fulfill his general powers and duties under this ordinance and his judgement shall be the sole criteria necessary to invoke emergency powers provided in this ordinance and those invested by State Statutes. The City Councilmen may convene to perform its powers as the situation demands, and receive reports relative to disaster preparedness activities.
- B. The Chief Administrative Officer may promulgate such regulations, during any period when disaster threatens or when a disaster has struck, as he deems necessary to protect life and property and preserve critical resources. Example of those regulations but they need not be limited to those that follow are:
  - 1. Regulations to prohibit or restrict the movement of vehicles in order to facilitate the work of disaster forces or to facilitate the mass movement of persons from areas that are hazardous or vulnerable to disasters or critical areas within the council's jurisdiction.
  - 2. Enter into contracts, incur obligations, employ temporary workers, rent equipment, purchase supplies, levy taxes, appropriate and expend public funds without regard to time-consuming procedures and formalities normally prescribed by law.
  - 3. After determining that a civil emergency (disaster) exists and has been declared in writing and a copy filed with the City Clerk a curfew may be declared as authorized in State Statutes and may prohibit certain acts and activities as prescribed and authorized in the State Statutes. (closing liquor stores, discontinuance of sale of intoxicating liquor and/or beer, discontinuance of manufacture of, transfer, use, possession of Molotov cocktail or explosives, discontinuance of sale of firearms)  
The governing body by ordinance may provide that any person violating the provisions of this ordinance or the orders issued by the Chief Administrative Officer pursuant to this authorization during a proclaimed civil emergency (disaster) be guilty of a misdemeanor and be punished by fine not to exceed three hundred dollars (\$300.00) or six (6) months imprisonment, or both.
  - 4. Issue other such orders as are necessary for the protection of life and property.
- C. Under the supervision of the City Council through the Chief Administrative Officer, the Coordinator shall be responsible for, but not necessarily limited to the following duties:
  - 1. The Coordinator shall be responsible for all phases of disaster preparedness and operations activities, which shall be in the written form of a Basic Plan, with warning, alerting, and lines of succession for each department having an emergency responsibility. This plan will be a joint effort of the Coordinator and the head of each department. The Coordinator shall maintain liaison with the State and Federal authorities to insure the compatibility of the planning and programs in emergency preparedness. The Coordinator shall act as an advisor to the governing body and the Chief Administrative Officer in matters concerning emergency preparedness and operations.
  - 2. The recruitment of volunteer personnel and agencies to augment those of the political subdivision and areas not assigned to personnel and agencies of the political subdivision.
  - 3. Negotiating and concluding with the owners or persons in control of real estate or other property for use of such for sheltering the public during emergencies and/or disasters and to designate such as public shelters.
  - 4. Establish a public information program which will inform the people of the actions required for the protection of their persons and property in case of disaster.
  - 5. The Coordinator will be responsible for practice alerts, tests and exercises to insure the efficient operation of the council's disaster forces and the coordinating of all other public and private agencies activities engaged in any disaster preparedness activity.
  - 6. To assume any other such authority and conduct any such other activity as the governing body and/or the Chief Administrative Officer may direct to promote and execute the disaster preparedness program.
  - 7. To be prepared to give the governing body a status report of the degree of readiness of the council no less than annually or as directed by said body.
  - 8. Some of the duties ascribed to the Chief Administrative Officer may at his discretion be handled by the Coordinator, but the responsibility and authority stems from and remains with the Chief Administrative Officer.
- D. The Head of each department, agency, board, institution and commission having an emergency assignment shall prepare in coordination with the Coordinator that portion of the Basic Plan pertaining to his emergency assignment so that the most efficient and effective use may be made of the council's resources. Line of succession of three persons will be established and maintained. This line of succession will be in order with the best capable of carrying out all

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assigned duties and functions. Each head shall be responsible for maintaining their portion of the Basic Plan and the line of succession in a current state. Each department will prepare, and keep current a list of resources, and keep said list on file in the Emergency Preparedness Office.

#### 6. PEACE OFFICERS

- A. With the approval of the chief of police of the city, the city may confer upon members of their civil defense auxiliary police units, the powers of peace officers, subject to such restrictions as shall be imposed.
- B. Any civil defense auxiliary policeman having these powers conferred upon him may arrest without a warrant any person violating or attempting to violate in the officers presence any order, rule or regulation made pursuant to this ordinance. This authority shall be limited to those rules and regulations which affect the public generally.
- C. Any person convicted of violating any provision of this ordinance or any rule, order or regulation made pursuant to this ordinance shall be punishable by a fine not to exceed five hundred dollars (\$500.00) or imprisonment for not exceeding six (6) months or both.
- D. Neither any agencies or this council, its employees, or representative engaged in any emergency preparedness activities, while complying with or attempting to comply with this ordinance or any rule or regulation promulgated pursuant to the provisions of this ordinance, shall be liable for the death of or any injury to persons, or damage to property, as a result of such activity, except in cases of willful misconduct.

#### 7. COUNCIL AND PRIVATE LIABILITY

- A. Neither the City nor agents and representatives of said city while acting in good faith without willful misconduct, complying with or attempting to comply with any order, rule or regulation promulgated pursuant to the provision of this ordinance, shall be liable for any damage sustained to persons or property as the result of said activity.
- B. Neither any person owning or controlling real estate or other premises who voluntarily and without compensation grants the City the right to license, inspect, designate or use of the whole or any part or parts of such real estate or premises for the purpose of sheltering persons during an actual, impending or practice enemy attack or during the occurrence of natural or man-made disasters, shall be civilly liable for death, injury to, any person on or about such real estate or premises by virtue of its use for civil defense purposes, or loss of, or damage to, the property of such person, except in case of willful misconduct.

#### 8. FUNDS, MATCHING FUNDS, GIFTS, GRANTS, DONATIONS, LOANS, SERVICES

- A. For the purpose of paying any expenses of its local emergency preparedness organization, the governing body of the City authorizes the expenditure of any available funds from the general funds of said jurisdiction.
- B. Any governing body of the emergency preparedness organization may enter into agreement with the federal government with the approval of the State Director of Civil Defense for matching funds which may be made available from the general funds or such other funds as may be available to the governing body, for the purchase of equipment by such city in conjunction with any federal matching program and funds for civil defense purposes.
- C.
  1. Whenever the federal government or any agency or officer thereof shall offer to this political subdivision services, equipment, supplies, material or funds by way of gift, grant or loan, for the purpose of emergency preparedness, the political subdivision acting with the consent of the Governor and through its governing body of such political subdivision, may authorize any officer of the political subdivision to receive such services, equipment, supplies, materials, or funds on behalf of the political subdivision, and subject to the terms of the offer and the rules and regulations, if any, of the agency making the offer.
  2. Whenever any person, firm or corporation shall offer to the political subdivision services, equipment, supplies, materials, or funds by way of gift, grant or loan, for the purpose of emergency preparedness the political subdivision, acting through its governing body may accept such offer and upon such acceptance the governing body of the political subdivision may authorize any officer of the political subdivision to receive such services, equipment, supplies, materials, or funds on behalf of the political subdivision and subject to the terms of the offer, if any.

#### 9. VIOLATION OF REGULATIONS

It shall be unlawful for any person to violate any of the provisions of this ordinance or of the regulations or plans issued pursuant to the authority contained herein, or to willfully obstruct, hinder or delay any member or members of the disaster forces in the performance of their emergency assignments.

#### 10. PENALTY

Any person, firm or corporation violating any provision of this ordinance, upon conviction, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and be punished by a fine or imprisonment or both as provided by in Section

11. SEVERABILITY

Should any provision of this ordinance be declared invalid for any reason, such declaration shall not affect the validity of the other provisions.

12. CONFLICTING ORDINANCES

This ordinance shall supersede all existing ordinances insofar as the latter may be inconsistent therewith.

13. EFFECTIVE DATE

This ordinance being an ordinance for the immediate and temporary preservation of public peace, health and safety shall become effective from this date July 2, 1974 after the passage of the governing body.

RESOLUTION FIXING LEVIES FOR 1974

WHEREAS, Section 23 of Chapter 492 of the Mississippi Laws of 1950, Section 3, Chapter 497 of Mississippi Laws of 1950, and Section 4 of House Bill No. 6 of Mississippi Laws of 1958, all as amended, provide that the governing authorities of each municipality in the State of Mississippi shall levy the municipal ad valorem taxes for each taxable year, said levy or levies to be expressed in mills or decimal fractions of a mill, and such levy or levies shall determine the ad valorem taxes to be collected upon each dollar of valuation on the assessment rolls of the Municipality; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council of the City of Picayune, Pearl River County, Mississippi, have completed the revision and equalization of the assessment rolls for taxes for the taxable year 1974, have approved the assessments of motor vehicles in said City and in the Picayune Municipal Separate School District by resolution adopted at a public meeting held on September 3, 1974 and have approved the real property and personal property assessment rolls of said City and of said Municipal Separate School District for said year by a resolution adopted at a public meeting held on September 3, 1974, these resolutions being in Minute Book 13, pages 99 through 101; and

WHEREAS, the assessment of public utilities has been approximately at \$1,585,000.00; and

WHEREAS, the Budget of Expenditures of Picayune Municipal Separate School District for the current fiscal year was filed on September 3, 1974 by the Board of Trustees of said School District, and which said Budget of Revenues and Expenditures is on file in the office of the City Clerk; and

WHEREAS, the Budget of Revenues and Expenditures of the City of Picayune for the fiscal year beginning October 1, 1974 and ending September 30, 1975 was adopted by the said Mayor and City Council on September 17, 1974, and is recorded in these minutes in Minute Book 13, pages 104 through 107, and

WHEREAS, the Budget of Revenues and Expenditures of the Margaret Reed Crosby Memorial Library for the current fiscal year was filed on September 3, 1974 by the Trustees of said Library, which said budget was approved by the Mayor and Council and is now on file in the office of the City Clerk, and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED AND ADJUDGED by the Mayor and Council of the City of Picayune, Pearl River County, Mississippi, that in accordance with the Budget of Expenditures and the assessments of taxable property within the City of Picayune and Picayune Municipal Separate School District, the following ad valorem tax rate or levies be and the same are hereby imposed and levied for the fiscal year 1974-1975, upon the assessed value of all taxable property in the City of Picayune, and the Picayune Municipal Separate School District, Pearl River County, Mississippi, as the property is now assessed and listed or as may hereafter be assessed and listed upon the assessment rolls of said City and District as of January 1, 1974, subject to the exempt value of homes to the extent exempt by the Homestead Exemption Act for Municipal Separate School District, also homes exempted by Senate Bill Number 2566, Mississippi Laws of 1974, the said rates expressed in mills or a decimal fraction of a mill, being levied and imposed upon each dollar of assessed valuation appearing upon the assessment rolls of said City and Municipal Separate School District in accordance with the provisions of the statutes of the State of Mississippi to which reference is made hereinabove, the said rates or levies are for the following finds or purposes:

201 FACILITIES PLAN AND ANALYSIS OF WASTE  
WATER TREATMENT AND DISPOSAL FACILITIES  
AND DESIGNATING CITY AS LEAD APPLICANT

WHEREAS, under the provisions of Public Law No. 92-500 of the United States, hereafter referred to as the "Act", the analysis, planning and construction of cost effective, environmentally sound waste water treatment and disposal facilities for given geographical areas within these United States is required and said geographical areas are designated by the Air and Water Pollution Control Commission of the various states without regard to and irrespective of the governmental subdivisions heretofore or hereafter established as States, counties, parishes, cities, municipalities, or other like governmental subdivision; and,

WHEREAS, said Act provides for federal fiscal assistance in the promulgation of said analysis, plans, and construction of said sewer facilities when such is done in compliance with the provisions of said Act, as more completely defined therein; and,

WHEREAS, one of the areas designated by the Mississippi Air and Water Pollution Control Commission, in which said analysis planning and construction of environmentally sound waste water disposal facilities must be determined, includes the City of Picayune, Pearl River County, Mississippi, and an adjacent area surrounding of approximately 38 square miles within Pearl River County, Mississippi, and required a joint effort and cost sharing on the part of such City and Pearl River County to accomplish compliance with said Act; and,

WHEREAS, it is reasonably determinable that the City of Picayune contains 15.3 square miles of the 38 square miles contained within the designated area; and, that the City of Picayune has a population of approximately 11,519 people of approximately 13,148 people within said study area; and,

WHEREAS, it is reasonable determinable that the cost of participation to the City of Picayune and that portion of Pearl River County which lies within the planning area as aforesaid, is approximately \$20,000.00, as calculated by a study of the requirements necessary to establish a feasible facility plan under the provisions of Section 201 of the Act, as reviewed by the Mississippi Air and Water Pollution Control Commission and found reasonable; and,

WHEREAS, it is necessary that one of said governmental subdivisions be designated as the "lead applicant" and a specific individual be designated as the official representative for the City of Picayune and Pearl River County, Mississippi, with authority to execute such necessary documents to effect said analysis, planning and construction,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the City of Picayune, Mississippi, be, and the same is hereby designated as the "lead applicant" and the Mayor of said City be, and he is hereby designated as the official representative of the Picayune-Pearl River County, Mississippi, area to execute such necessary documents as required to effect the implementation of a 201 facilities plan and the analysis, planning, and construction of a cost effective environmentally sound waste water treatment and disposal facilities for said geographical area.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the City of Picayune, Mississippi, and the County of Pearl River, Mississippi, acting by and through their respective governing authorities shall participate in the planning and study of the feasibility of the construction of a cost effective environmentally sound waste water disposal facility for a geographic area to incorporate the City of Picayune, Mississippi, and such adjacent geographical territory within Pearl River County, Mississippi, as may be feasible to effect compliance with the provisions of the Act, and will act to seek federally funded grants for the analysis, planning and construction of said facilities and will participate in the cost thereof upon a proportionate share basis.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the proportionate share of cost participation of the City of Picayune and Pearl River County, Mississippi, shall be such that the City of Picayune, Mississippi, shall share and pay the costs of 88 percent of the local share cost participation and that Pearl River County, Mississippi, shall share in proportionate costs and pay 12 percent of said local share cost participation.



WHEREAS, the Client seeks to secure grant funds under PL 92-500 for a Step 1, 201 Facilities Plan which will plan and program future wastewater treatment facilities for the City of Picayune and parts of adjoining Pearl River County, and:

WHEREAS, a 201 Facilities Plan is a prerequisite to securing grant funds for the detailed design and construction of wastewater treatment facilities; and

WHEREAS, the Client desires to engage the services of the Consultant to render certain technical services and assistance in the preparation of a 201 Facilities Plan for the City of Picayune and parts of adjoining Pearl River County.

NOW, THEREFORE, the parties hereto do mutually agree as follows:

A. SCOPE OF SERVICES

The section of this application entitled "Scope of Services" hereby made a part of this contract and specifies the technical services to be rendered by the Consultant.
