ORDINANCE NO: 380

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE NO: 358 OF THE
 CITY OF PICAYUNE SO AS TO RECLASSIFY CERTAIN
 AREA IN SAID CITY

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council of the City of Picayune by orders adopted at their regular meeting on December 3, 1974 declared their intention to rezone or reclassify certain area of said City as therein described, and

WHEREAS, notice was given for public hearing on the question of such rezoning or reclassification according to law and according to said orders, proof of publication of said notices now being on file in the office of the Clerk of said City, to be held January 7, 1975, at which hearing no objection was made to such rezoning or reclassification of said area, and

WHEREAS, it has been heretofore, and is hereby, adjudicated and determined by the Mayor and Council of said City that such rezoning and reclassification of said area is not detrimental to the general welfare of said City and that all things required to be done as conditions precedent to such rezoning and reclassification have been done, and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Council of the City of Picayune as follows:

SECTION 1. That the following area in the City of Picayune be and it is hereby reclassified and zoned as I-1 Light Industrial

Lot 1, Block A, Greenview Addition Number One to the City of Picayune, Pearl River County, Mississippi, a corner lot bounded on the East by Airport Road and on the North by Palestine Road.

SECTION 2. The City Engineer be and is hereby ordered and directed to amend the City Zoning Map to reflect the herein above change.

SECTION 3. That this Ordinance shall be in effect after due publication be made hereof and after 30 days shall have passed from the date hereof.

That the 1973 Edition of Southern Standard Building Code with 1974 Revisions, a copy of which has this day been exhibited to and approved by the Mayor and Council of the City of Picayune, be and the same is hereby adopted and declared operative as of the 7th day of January, 1975, and binding within the corporate limits of said City of Picayune, and the police jurisdiction thereof.

SECTION 2. That the 1971 Edition of Southern Standard Plumbing Code with 1974 Revisions, a copy of which has this day been exhibited to and approved by the Mayor and Council of the City of Picayune, be and the same is hereby adopted and declared operative as of the 7th day of January, 1975, and binding within the corporate limits of said City of Picayune, and the police jurisdiction thereof.

SECTION 3. That the 1975 Edition of National Electrical Code, a copy of which has this day been exhibited to and approved by the Mayor and Council of the City of Picayune, be and the same is hereby adopted and declared operative as of the 7th day of January, 1975, and binding within the corporate limits of said City of Picayune, and the police jurisdiction thereof.

SECTION 4. That the 1973 Edition of Southern Standard Housing Code, a copy of which has this day been exhibited to and approved by the Mayor and Council of the City of Picayune, be and the same is hereby adopted and declared operative as of the 7th day of January, 1975, and binding within the corporate limits of said City of Picayune, and the police jurisdiction thereof.

SECTION 5. That the American Insurance Association Fire Prevention Code, 1970 Edition with 1974 Revision, a copy of which has this day been exhibited to and approved by the Mayor and Council of the City of Picayune, be and the same is hereby adopted and declared operative as of the 7th day of January, 1975, and binding within the corporate limits of said City of Picayune, and the police jurisdiction thereof.





 PEARL RIVER COUNTY, MISSISSIPPI 82-1146-00-004-10

This agreement entered into this day by and between CITY OF PICAYUNE hereinafter referred to as the COMPANY, and the State Highway Commission of Mississippi, hereinafter referred to as the COMMISSION, for the adjustment of the transmission and/or distribution facilities of the COMPANY necessitated by the construction of a highway under the Mississippi Federal Aid Program.

1. That the Commission will submit a project for highway construction, being a section of the highway @ Hoblochitto Creek known as State Route No. 43 Spur in Pearl River County, and to be designated as 82-1146-00-005-10 and will recommend its approval by the Federal Highway Administration for construction with funds apportioned to the State under Federal Aid allotment; and,
2. That right of way for the proposed new road will pass over and include certain property interests of the COMPANY as defined by Paragraph 3.a.(1) of Federal Highway Administration Policy and Procedure Memorandum 30-4 upon which is has heretofore constructed and is now maintaining its water and gas facilities, which property interest will be more particularly described and located according to plans agreeable to both parties; and,
3. That, the proposed highway construction will necessitate certain adjustments, removals and/or alterations of the existing facilities of the COMPANY as shown by the COMPANY'S plans and estimate of cost attached hereto and made a part of this agreement by reference; and,
4. That the proposed adjustment will not result in a credit for expired service, life of the Company's system; and,
5. That the COMPANY will make the necessary adjustments, removals or alterations in its facilities at a total estimated cost of approximately \$18,269.20 as shown by the COMPANY'S estimate. That the total estimated cost to the COMMISSION for actual nonbetterment work will be approximately \$18,269.20 and that the total estimated cost of the work to be done at the expense of the COMPANY will be approximately \$ -0-; and,
6. That the COMPANY will perform the work provided for in this agreement by the method checked below:

X BY COMPANY'S REGULAR FORCES: The COMPANY proposes to use their regular construction or maintenance crews and personnel at its standard schedule of wages and working hours and working in accordance with the terms of its agreement with such employees.

7. That the method used by the COMPANY in developing the relocation costs shall be in accordance with Paragraph 7-h of Policy and Procedure Memorandum 30-4; and,
8. That the COMPANY shall make the most economical type adjustments, removal, and/or alteration of its facilities as will satisfactorily meet the same service requirements of the old facility; and,

9. That the COMMISSION will reimburse the COMPANY the cost of work done here under, as hereinbefore provided for, but the total liability of the COMMISSION shall not exceed the amount approved for payment by the Federal Highway Administration; and,

10. That all cost records of the COMPANY pertaining to the project will be subject at any time to inspection by representatives of the COMMISSION and the Federal Highway Administration; and,

11. It is understood that the project herein contemplated is to be financed from funds appropriated by the Federal Government and expended under Federal regulation; that all plans, estimates of cost, specifications, awards of contracts, acceptance of work and procedure in general are subject at all times to all Federal laws, rules, regulations, orders and approval applying to it as a Federal Project; and that the COMMISSION shall reimburse the COMPANY as provided above for only such items of work and expense and in such amounts and forms as are proper and eligible for payment according to Policy and Procedure Memorandum 30-4, dated October 15, 1966, and subsequent amendments, and which have received approval by proper Federal Authority; and,

12. It is understood and agreed by and between the parties hereto that adjustments, removals, and/or alterations of the facilities to be made shall be made according to the plans and estimates attached hereto, which plans and estimates are hereby approved as to sufficiency thereof, and are incorporated herein and made a part hereof, and the COMMISSION shall pay the cost hereof according to the terms of this agreement, subject only to the provisions of paragraph 9 above. For the same consideration to be paid herein, the COMPANY does hereby agree to subordinate unto the COMMISSION such surface rights, subsurface rights or air rights, as the case may be, in and to the property interest covered by this agreement, to the full extent of the needs and demands of the COMMISSION in its use thereof for the purposes of this agreement. Further, should the COMMISSION find it necessary or desirable to change the design, construction, and/or maintenance plans to an extent that will require additional adjustments, removals, and/or alterations in the facilities covered hereby, which remained within the existing easement or other property interest of the COMPANY, the COMPANY will make such further adjustments, removals, and/or alterations as may be necessary according to the methods hereinabove set out, and the COMMISSION will pay therefore such sums as may be mutually agreed upon, subject only to the provisions of paragraph 9 above. However, should the COMPANY for its own purposes need or desire to expand, alter, adjust, remove, relocate, service or maintain the facilities covered by this agreement, the COMPANY agrees to make application to the COMMISSION for a proper permit to cover such changes, and any such changes made shall be at the expense of the COMPANY.

ORDINANCE NO. 386
AN ORDINANCE REGULATING TRAFFIC AND USE OF THE
SECTION OR SECTIONS OF STREET OR STREETS IN THE
CITY OF PICAYUNE, MISSISSIPPI
DESCRIBED AS FOLLOWS:

Beginning at Station 28+71 on Project S-1146(3)A which is coincident with the South end of a bridge across Hobolochitto Creek and thence South along Beech Street and ending at a point 1071 feet or Station 8+00 on above project.

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council of the City of Picayune desire to cooperate with the Mississippi State Highway Department inasmuch as said Department has taken over for maintenance the section of streets as above described in the City of Picayune;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Council of the City of Picayune, Mississippi, as follows:

1. No person, persons, firm, corporation, or association shall have, construct, reconstruct, erect, build, or have constructed, reconstructed, erected, or built any obstruction, sign or billboard, building improvement, fence, garage, filling station, barn, restaurant, or other structure on any part of said section of streets without permission from the City of Picayune.

2. No person, persons, company, or corporation shall construct or have constructed a pipe line, communication line, or an electric power line on, over, or under any part of said section of streets before the following requirements have been complied with:

(a) The standard application and plan form as used by the Mississippi State Highway Department must be signed and executed by the applicant and filed with the Mayor of the City of Picayune for approval by the Mayor and Council.

(b) When the application and plans have been approved by the Mayor and Council of the City of Picayune, a copy of such application and plans will be sent to the State Highway Department, Engineer of Maintenance, or the Chief Engineer of said Department, and upon the approval of either or both of said engineers, a copy of the approved plans will be mailed the applicant as his authority to proceed with the construction. However, written notice shall be given the State Highway Department twenty-four (24) hours in advance of the time actual work is begun.

3. Private or public roads or driveways will not be permitted to intersect with any portion of said section of streets unless permission is secured in accordance with the provisions of Item 2, above, and the construction is done in strict accordance with the plans approved by the State Highway Department.

4. No part of said section of streets shall be used by any person, firm, or corporation for the purpose of servicing automobiles, trucks, tractors, or any other motor driven vehicles, nor shall any portion of said section of streets be used for any other commercial purpose; provided, however, that this shall not apply in cases of emergency where any such vehicle has run out of gasoline, oil, grease, or water, or suffered any other accident or casualty so as to make it necessary that such service be rendered on such section of said streets in order for said vehicle to reach a garage or filling station.

5. No person, firm, or corporation may use any portion of said section of said streets for any purpose other than that for which it was designed and dedicated.

6. It shall be unlawful for any person to throw or deposit or cause to be deposited garbage or rubbish on any section of said streets.

7. A violation of this ordinance by any person, firm, or corporation shall constitute a misdemeanor and upon conviction such person, firm, or corporation shall be fined not less than the sum of \$10.00 nor more than \$50.00 for each offense, and each and every day that any of the terms, conditions, or provisions of this ordinance are not complied with shall be considered a separate offense.

8. That all ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith be and the same are hereby repealed.

9. That, public necessity requiring it, this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its adoption.

The above ordinance having been first reduced to writing was introduced by Granville E. Smith who moved its adoption. It was seconded by Aaron L. Russell. 

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING MAYOR TO EXECUTE GRANT OFFER OF ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION AGENCY

WHEREAS, the City of Picayune, acting through its Mayor, did apply to the Environmental Protection Agency for a Step 1 grant for the 201 Facilities Plan as provided under Title 11 of the Federal Water Pollution Control Act amendment of 1972 in the amount of \$56,812.00, and

WHEREAS, the Environmental Protection Agency has offered to fund the project by their notice of April 7, 1975, and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council of the City of Picayune desires to accept the grant offer,

NOW THEREFORE, IT IS RESOLVED that the Mayor be and he is hereby authorized to execute the grant offer in the amount of \$56,812 on behalf of the City of Picayune, and further he is authorized to provide three certified copies of this resolution to the Environmental Protection Agency.







MAYOR AUTHORIZED TO SIGN AGREEMENT
WITH MISSISSIPPI STATE HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT

Upon motion of Aaron L. Russell, seconded by Granville E. Smith, and unanimously carried, S. G. Thigpen, Jr., Mayor, is hereby authorized and directed to sign the following agreement with the Mississippi State Highway Department:

FEDERAL-AID URBAN SYSTEM AGREEMENT

This AGREEMENT made by and between the CITY OF PICAYUNE, Pearl River County, Mississippi, hereinafter referred to as the CITY, and the STATE HIGHWAY COMMISSION of the State of Mississippi, hereinafter referred to as the COMMISSION for the purpose of establishing the agreed conditions under which the CITY may utilize Urban Funds of the Federal-aid Highway Act of 1973.

WHEREAS: It is understood that conditions presented herein are general in nature with details and specific requirements contained in Standing Operating Procedures of the COMMISSION and Federal Highway Administration Federal-aid Highway Program Manuals, and

WHEREAS: the CITY proposes to construct, reconstruct and/or improve traffic services on certain CITY streets by the utilization of Urban Funds of the Federal-aid Highway Act of 1973 as allocated to the CITY by the COMMISSION, and

WHEREAS: The Federal-aid Urban System shall be the system of streets selected by the CITY with the concurrence of the COMMISSION and the Federal Highway Administration as set forth in Section 109 of the Federal-aid Highway Act of 1973 (Subsection (d) of Section 103 of Title 23, United States Code), and

WHEREAS: The COMMISSION has allocated a specific amount of Urban Funds to the CITY in accordance with the formula for distribution to Urban Areas throughout the State of Mississippi and intends to allocate additional Urban Funds as these funds become available, and

WHEREAS: The Allocated funds may be used for funding approved projects on a 70 percent Federal - 30 percent CITY funding ration with the total dollar amount of each allocation to the CITY not to be exceeded, and in the event a 70 percent Federal participation in an approved project or a group of projects indicates an amount greater than the total allocation, the Federal participation in that project or group of projects will be reduced accordingly so that the total allocation will not be exceeded, and

WHEREAS: The selection of projects on the Urban System for utilization of the allocated Urban Funds will be made by the CITY and will be subject to the concurrence of the Highway Department and the Federal Highway Administration.

NOW THEREFORE, it is mutually agreed that:

The CITY will for Each Project:

ARTICLE I: Select the project proposed for the construction, reconstruction and/or traffic operations improvement on a street on the approved Urban System and formally request approval of the Highway Department by furnishing the District Engineer of the Highway Department the following: a description of the work proposed, the termini of the work and a program estimate of the cost of construction, including construction engineering.

ARTICLE II: Advise the Highway Department in the initial request for approval if the work is to be accomplished by contract or by force account by utilization of CITY forces and equipment.

ARTICLE III: Prepare draft environmental study, conceptual relocation plan, preliminary plans and displays as required for, advertise opportunity for, and conduct public hearings, when required; prepare location and design study reports; coordinate with plans of other agencies; and all related preliminary requirements, the total cost of which is to be borne by the CITY.

ARTICLE IV: Submit Location and Design Study Reports to the Highway Department with request for location and design approval by the Highway Department and Federal Highway Administration.

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ARTICLE V: After notification of program approval, make necessary field surveys, prepare plans, specifications, construction estimates, proposals and all other contract documents required, the total cost of which is to be borne by the CITY.

ARTICLE VI: Using CITY forces or consultants prepare plans, maps and deeds; abstract titles; make right of way appraisals; make appraisal review; acquire all right of way as required for construction of each project; relocate or adjust utilities or enter into agreements for the relocation or adjustment of utilities; enter into agreements for any railroad work required; prepare right of way stage relocation plan; provide relocation assistance to all families, farms or business enterprises, etc. that are required to relocate as a result of each project, the total cost of which is to be borne by the CITY.

ARTICLE VII: If right of way is required for the construction of a project, the CITY shall acquire the necessary right of way in accordance with Title II - Uniform Relocation Assistance and Title III - Uniform Real Property Acquisition of Public Law 91-646, 91st Congress, and the procedures set forth in "Minimum Right of Way Requirements" published by the state.

ARTICLE VIII: Furnish two (2) sets of review plans and two (2) draft copies of the specifications and proposal documents to the Highway Department for review by the Department and Federal Highway Administration prior to completion of plans and specifications.

ARTICLE IX: Participate in a joint field inspection of the proposed project with preliminary plans prepared by the CITY in company with representatives of the Highway Department, the Federal Highway Administration, and the Consulting Engineer, if one has been retained by the City for the preparation of plans.

ARTICLE X: Furnish three (3) copies of the construction estimate; three (3) copies of the right of way certification as outlined in Volume 6, Chapter 4, Section 2, Subsection 1 of the Federal-aid Highway Program Manual entitled Physical Construction and Authorization Issued August 6, 1974 and subsequent revisions as issued by the Federal Highway Administration.

ARTICLE XI: Upon notification of authority to advertise for receipt of bids, proceed with the advertisement, receipt of bids, and opening of bids in accordance with Highway Department and Federal Highway Administration requirements as contained in Federal-aid Highway Program Manual, Volume 6, Chapter 4, Section 1, Subsection 6.

ARTICLE XII: After opening of bids, if it is the intention of the CITY to recommend award of a contract, furnish the Highway Department three (3) copies of a tabulation of bids received; three (3) certified copies of all bid sheets; three (3) copies of a non-collusion affidavit; and three (3) copies of the recommendation of award with documentation of the basis of the recommendation should the bid vary more than ten percent (10%) above the engineer's estimate. If the CITY rejects bids and intends to readvertise for bids on the project, the CITY must request authority from the COMMISSION to readvertise for bids.

ARTICLE XIII: After the concurrence by the COMMISSION and the Federal Highway Administration in the award of the contract, the CITY will execute the contract with the contractor and issue a notice to proceed with the work; and furnish one (1) certified and six (6) other copies of the contract to the COMMISSION for distribution.

ARTICLE XIV: Employ or retain a registered professional engineer as the City Engineer to act for and behalf of the CITY to perform construction engineering services. Other competent technical assistance will be employed by the CITY as deemed necessary to assist the City Engineer. Should the CITY desire Federal-aid Urban participation in construction engineering, methods and rates of compensation for construction engineering services performed will be established in the form of an agreement with the approval of the Highway Department and the Federal Highway Administration.

ARTICLE XV: Should the CITY desire Federal-aid Urban participation in construction engineering, properly document by individual hourly time charges to the project for construction engineering work performed by each CITY employee and furnish monthly statements to the Highway Department of these charges with the clear understanding that Federal participation in these charges can be only with these hourly time charges having been made and, further, the total of such charges for Federal participation cannot exceed fifteen percent (15%) of the total construction cost.

ARTICLE XVI: Provide for the sampling and testing of all materials to be used in the construction prior to the incorporation in the work and certify to the Highway Department that all materials used meet the requirements of the plans and specifications.

ARTICLE XVII: Prepare and certify monthly estimates of the work completed and make monthly payments to the contractor based on the value of the work completed, less retainage. Allowable costs shall be determined in accordance with provisions of Subpart 1-15, Federal Procurement Regulations dated December, 1970, and applicable established local policies not in conflict with these Regulations.

ARTICLE XVIII: Prepare and certify a final estimate of the completed work based on final checked quantities, and make final payment to the contractor.

ARTICLE XIX: Furnish certified copies of all estimates of completed work to the Highway Department for payment of the Federal share up to seventy percent (70%) of the total dollar amount allocated to the project and upon completion of the contract furnish a Statement of Materials and Supplies (Form PR-47), a Labor Certificate, and a copy of the release by the bonding company to pay all monies to the contractor.

ARTICLE XX: Maintain proper accounting records, payrolls, documents, papers, and other necessary data to support the cost incurred for services provided, and make such records available at all reasonable times during the contract period and for three (3) years from the date of payment of the final estimate. These records, documents, and data will be available for inspection by the Highway Department, the Federal Highway Administration, and any other authorized representative of the Federal Government, and copies thereof will be furnished if requested.

ARTICLE XXI: Maintain the completed project with CITY maintenance crews and not permit any changes to be made in the provisions for parking which would affect traffic and/or traffic control at the completed improvement without the prior approval of the Highway Department.

ARTICLE XXII: Understand that failure to fulfill its responsibilities in regard to maintenance of the improvement, its operation or regulations will disqualify the CITY for Federal-aid funds in the future.

ARTICLE XXIII: Comply with the provisions of Title VI of the 1964 Civil Rights Act, and as these stated provisions apply to a contractor they will also apply to the CITY for force account work. Required Contract Provisions (Form PR-1273) and Special Provisions (FHWA Order Interim 7-2(1)) dated March 16, 1979, are attached and made a part of the Agreement, and as these stated provisions apply to a contractor they will also apply to the CITY for force account work.

ARTICLE XXIV: Assume all responsibility for and same the COMMISSION harmless from any suits, action or claims of any character, brought for or on account of any injuries or damages, received or sustained by any person, persons or property, growing out of any action or omission to act in the conduct of this work.

The Highway Department will for Each Project:

ARTICLE I: Review the proposed project selection of the CITY and, if the work proposed meets design standards for existing and probable future traffic and is otherwise satisfactory, submit a program request to the Federal Highway Administration.

ARTICLE II: On request from the CITY furnish guidance in accomplishing all requirements of the preliminary engineering and right-of-way phase, including all public hearing requirements and environmental requirements.

ARTICLE III: Assist in scheduling and participate in the field inspection of the proposed project with preliminary plans for adaptation to field requirements.

ARTICLE IV: Review and assemble the Plans, Specifications, and Estimate and, on approval, forward this assembly to the Federal Highway Administration for authorization.

ARTICLE V: Notify the CITY when the project has been authorized by the Federal Highway Administration and advise the CITY of the Highway Department and Federal requirements for advertising and receiving bids.

ARTICLE VI: Review the recommendations and tabulation of bids furnished by the CITY and make recommendations to the Federal Highway Administration concerning the award of a contract.

ARTICLE VII: Advise the CITY of the concurrence (or non-concurrence) in the award of the contract and, with concurrence, enter into a project agreement with the Federal Highway Administration based on contract prices and authorize the CITY to proceed with work.

ARTICLE VIII: Review and authorize payment to the CITY of the Federal share of the value of the completed work on monthly and final estimates that have been checked and certified by the CITY and are within the total dollar amount allocated to the project.

ARTICLE IX: Review and authorize payment to the CITY of the Federal share of the monthly statements of hourly time charges to the project by CITY employees who perform construction engineering work within the overall limit of fifteen percent (15%) of total construction cost.

ARTICLE X: Make inspections of the work and engineering supervision during the life of the contract and advise the CITY of any deficiencies noted.

ARTICLE XI: Assist the CITY in the preparation of Change Orders and/or Supplemental Agreements to the Contract found to be necessary during the life of the contract.





MAYOR AUTHORIZED TO SIGN CONTRACT
LAYNE CENTRAL DIVISION OF THE SINGER COMPANY

Upon motion of Granville E. Smith, seconded by Richard W. Cook, and unanimously carried, S. G. Thigpen, Jr., Mayor, is hereby authorized to execute a contract with the Layne Central Division of the Singer Company:

This contract, made and entered into this 4th day of September, 1975, by and between the Layne Central Division of the Singer Company, a corporation organized under the laws of the State of New Jersey, with offices located in Memphis, Tenn., Cleveland, Miss., Jackson, Miss., Pensacola, Fla., hereinafter designated as the "CONTRACTOR" and the City of Picayune, a body corporate under the laws of the State of Mississippi, with executive offices located in the City of Picayune, State of Mississippi, hereinafter designated as the "PURCHASER."

September 2, 1975

Witnesseth

That for and in consideration of the covenants and agreements to be performed by this contract the respective parties here, it is agreed by and between the said parties as follows:

"A" CONTRACTOR AGREES:

1. To make, if necessary, one or more test holes on Purchaser's property in search of water bearing formation and if such be found of character suitable, in the Contractor's opinion, to meet the contract requirements.
2. To proceed with the installation of a Layne Well Water System, same when completed to be capable of producing a water supply not less than 1,000 U.S. gallons per minute, as shown by test; said water supply to be delivered at 70 (psig) pounds per square inch gauge, and shall be procured from not less than One well and pumping unit installed on Purchaser's property at Meadow Green Blvd., approximately 300 yards North of Highway 11. the exact location of each to be mutually agreed upon.
3. To perform all work and install all equipment in a thorough and workman-like manner, commencing operations as promptly as possible and diligently prosecuting the same until completed to conform to all terms of this agreement; to maintain Workmen's Compensation, Public Liability and Property Damage insurance and to hold Purchaser harmless from any liens for labor or material furnished by Contractor in connection with the work herein contemplated.
4. To furnish all equipment, labor, materials and machinery needed, and required to complete the necessary number of scientifically constructed Layne Gravel Wall Wells, each equipped with vertical turbine pump, directly connected to electric motor, all as more particularly set forth hereinafter.
5. Well Construction: Each well completed shall be of the Layne Gravel Filter, large diameter caisson type, installed either by the clay seal, rotary-hydraulic process, reverse circulation or by the hydraulic-bailing method, depending on formations encountered. All casings shall be as specified and shall be of such diameter and installed to such depth as the formations encountered may justify and as in the Contractor's opinion best meet the conditions.
 - (a) Outer Casing: A large casing of suitable diameter shall be installed from the surface of the ground down to a sufficient depth or to the water bearing formation to permit the installation of the permanent pump so that the pump proper shall be submerged below the water level in the well under operating conditions.
As Per Plans and Specifications.
 - (b) Inner Casing: A casing of suitable diameter and of material as specified extending into the outer casing such distance to maintain a gravel seal and reservoir for the gravel wall with the annular space between the two casings and to the water bearing formation or directly connected to the outer casing.
As Per Plans and Specifications.
 - (c) Screen: Into the water bearing formation at which the inner casing is stopped shall be installed the scientifically constructed well screen, of material specified, either directly connected to the casing immediately above, or overlapping up into the same a suitable distance. The openings of the screen shall be determined by the Contractor according to the character of the water bearing formation.
As Per Plans and Specifications.
 - (e) Seal: The bottom of the well shall be sealed by back pressure valve, cementing cone or other approved methods to prevent foreign material from entering.
 - (f) Gravel Filter: From the immediate area surrounding the screen there shall be removed, by special hydraulic process a considerable amount of the finer portions of the water bearing formation, which shall be replaced with clean graded and well rounded gravel of such size and quality as will create a gravel filter about the well screen of sufficient diameter to insure a low velocity of water leaving the water bearing formation and entering the well.
6. Preliminary Test: As each well is completed adequate equipment shall be installed for the purpose of thorough development and making of a preliminary test to determine hydraulic conditions.
7. Pump: After such preliminary test to determine hydraulic conditions of the well, it shall be equipped with a permanent vertical turbine pump, complete in every detail with directly connected type pump head, and with sufficient discharge column to submerge pump below operating water level in well; said pump to be capable of discharging the water supply against the pressure at pump outlet stipulated in Part "A", Clause 2.
8. Motor: The pump shall be directly connected to a vertical hollow shaft squirrel cage motor, complete with starter of suitable size to operate pump at rated capacity and pressure, Motor shall be of either General Electric, Westinghouse, or

U.S. Electrical manufacture, or equal standard acceptable to Purchaser, having electrical characteristics:

As per Plans and Specifications

9. Official Test: When the system is completed, with wells and permanent pumping equipment installed by Contractor, all as set forth herein, and necessary adjustments and connections made, Contractor shall notify Purchaser he is ready to make the official test of the complete Layne Well Water System to determine its total production. Purchaser agrees to have representative present on the date set to witness said test and otherwise to cooperate in making test. The water measurement shall be made through venturi, or other mutually agreed upon meter, directly into Purchaser's pipeline, or through orifice measuring device furnished by Contractor, that whatever method is used shall be mutually acceptable. The pressure of the Water discharge, stipulated in Part "A", Clause 2, shall be maintained during test, by valve control if necessary, which pressure it is understood meets contract requirements and is to be the minimum maintained under permanent operating conditions. The test shall be continuous for eight hours, although a stop not exceeding one hour may be allowed if necessary to make adjustments of equipment, meter etc. The average water measurement by hourly readings during test shall be considered the official rated production of the water system and the basis for payment at the unit figures set forth in Part "B", Clauses 1-b, 1-c, provided however, that the water production is equal to or in excess of, the minimum supply stipulated in Part "A", Clause 2.

10. Water Production Warranty: To assure Purchaser that water production as shown by official test of the Layne Well Water System is not due to any temporary condition, or forced draft on the water bearing formations, Contractor agrees that at any time during a period of one year from official test of said system as provided in Clause 9, if Purchaser is of the opinion that the water production of the said system has become reduced below the official rated production paid for, and a repetition of said official test made jointly by Purchaser and Contractor, shows such to be the case, then Contractor shall, at his own expense, either promptly undertake to do whatever he may deem necessary to cause the said water system to produce not less than the rated production of water determined on official test (and shall show by further test he has done so) or he may and shall refund monies received under this agreement to the water deficiency in gallons per minute multiplied by the contract rate per gallon paid by Purchaser, as provided under Part "B", Clause 1, Section b and c.

11. Material Warranty: Contractor warrants all workmanship, material, and machinery entering into the construction of the water system herein set forth against inherent defects, and agrees to replace any part or parts which may prove defective within one year from completion of installation.

12. Patents: The Contractor warrants that he does not infringe on the patent rights of any person or persons or corporations whomsoever in the construction of either wells or the pumps contemplated herein, and hereby agrees as a part consideration hereof, to defend and save the purchaser harmless from any and all damages, costs and expenses by reason of claims or suits from infringement, resulting from the purchase or use of the same or any part or parts thereof.

13. Other Equipment - Material:

- 1. Each chlorinator unit with fiberglass housing, booster pump and controls, and all other as set forth in the Plans and Specifications.

"B" PURCHASER AGREES:

1. Payments: In consideration of the things to be done by the Contractor as herein provided, Purchaser agrees to pay Contractor as follows:

- (a) For test drilling or test wells _____ (Payments under this clause, however, to be made only should conditions found not justify Contractor in undertaking to develop the water supply herein stipulated).
- (b) For the minimum production of 1,000 gallons per minute, Seventy-Five Thousand Four Hundred Ninety-Four and No/100 Dollars (\$75,494.00) Base Bid Add for over 1150' of depth \$26.00 per ft. Deduct for less than 1150' depth \$14.00 per ft.
- (c) For up to an additional _____ gallons per minute, at the rate of \$_____ per gallon per minute, or not to exceed _____ additional.

2. TERMS: Payment shall be as specified in a, b, c, () d (x) or e ().

(d) On the 25th day of each month a payment estimate shall be submitted for work performed during the month, and payment will be made on or before the 10th of the following month, or in accordance with the terms set in specifications. Final estimate to include unpaid balance and retainage.

3. Purchaser also agrees to provide, free of cost to Contractor, ingress to site of work for Contractor's men and equipment, a sufficient clear space at each well site during drilling operations, water for drilling and testing operations, sufficient power delivered to the well site, discharge pipe and electric lines connected to each pump and motor for permanent operation, and pump house, also take care of the disposal of all water, sand and debris during drilling and testing operations. Purchaser agrees to do these things promptly as required, so as not to delay Contractor in his work.

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"C" BOTH PARTIES AGREE:

1. That the essence of this contract is the development of a well water supply by the installation of one or more scientifically constructed wells, including pumping units to deliver same for service, all as hereinbefore set forth, and referred to as the Layne Well Water System, and it is mutually agreed that the Contractor assumes no liability for damage to Purchaser, or others, in the production, or attempt to produce, any water supply herein contemplated. Any payments made by Purchaser to Contractor prior to the production of water supply contemplated are made contingently and shall be refunded promptly in full (except payment provided for test borings) if the official test, as provided in Part "A", Clause 9, does not show at least the minimum water production as stipulated herein. The Contractor may and shall refund to Purchaser all monies paid on the Contract price, if at any time during construction operations following test boring investigation, or after completion of the system, Contractor is of the opinion, and so notifies Purchaser in writing, that the water bearing formations are insufficient to produce the quantity of water herein provided for, or if he is of the opinion that he cannot fulfill some other contract obligation herein provided. That in the event of any of these contingencies Contractor shall have the right, after refunding monies to Purchaser, as provided to remove from the premises as his own property, without prejudice to his rights and without incurring liability for damage to Purchaser, any and all tools, equipment, materials, casings, screens, and pumping units furnished by Contractor.

2. That should Purchaser undertake to develop any new water supply from the same source as that drawn on by the Layne Well Water System during a period of one year after completion of the said system, except through new or supplementary agreement with Contractor, the Contractor shall be relieved of the responsibility for any reduction in the production capacity of the Layne Well Water System covered by this agreement.

3. That all materials and equipment furnished or installed under this contract are and shall remain the property of Contractor, regardless of their mode of attachment, and shall not be deemed turned over to Purchaser for use, until full payment has been made by Purchaser in accordance with the terms hereof. The retention of such title, however shall not be in lieu, or in any limitation of, Contractor's other remedies at law or in equity for the enforcement of the payment terms herein provided.

4. That neither party is liable for any failure or delay caused by fire, strikes, Acts of God or for any other cause not within the reasonable control of the party in default.

5. That there are no understandings or agreements relative to this contract or its subject matter that are not fully expressed herein and it is not effective until signed by the Purchaser and approved by an executive officer of the Contractor.





RESOLUTION FIXING LEVIES FOR 1975

WHEREAS, Section 23 of Chapter 492 of the Mississippi Laws of 1950, Section 3 Chapter 497 of Mississippi Laws of 1950, and Section 4 of House Bill No. 6 of Mississippi Laws of 1958, all as amended, provide that the governing authorities of each municipality in the State of Mississippi shall levy the municipal ad valorem taxes for each taxable year, said levy or levies to be expressed in mills or decimal fractions of a mill, and such levy or levies shall determine the advalorem taxes to be collected upon each dollar of valuation on the assessment rolls of the Municipality; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council of the City of Picayune, Pearl River County, Mississippi, have completed the revision and equalization of the assessment rolls for taxes for the taxable year 1975, have approved the assessments of motor vehicles in said City and in the Picayune Municipal Separate School District by resolution adopted at a public meeting held on August 5, 1975 and have approved the real property and personal property assessment rolls of said City and of said Municipal Separate School District for said year by a resolution adopted at a public meeting held on August 5, 1975, these resolutions being in Minute Book 13, pages 233 through 235; and

WHEREAS, the assessment of public utilities has been approximately at \$1,585,000.00; and

WHEREAS, the Budget of Expenditures of Picayune Municipal Separate School District for the current fiscal year was filed on August 5, 1975 by the Board of Trustees of said School District, and which said Budget of Revenues and Expenditures is on file in the office of the City Clerk; and

WHEREAS, the Budget of Revenues and Expenditures of the City of Picayune for the fiscal year beginning October 1, 1975 and ending September 30, 1975 was adopted by the said Mayor and City Council on September 16, 1975 and is recorded in these minutes in Minute Book 13, pages 249 through 252, and

WHEREAS, the Budget of Revenues and Expenditures of the Margaret Reed Crosby Memorial Library for the current fiscal year was filed on August 19, 1975 by the Trustees of said Library, which said budget was approved by the Mayor and Council and is now on file in the office of the City Clerk, and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED AND ADJUDGED by the Mayor and Council of the City of Picayune, Pearl River County, Mississippi, that in accordance with the Budget of Expenditures and the assessments of taxable property within the City of Picayune and Picayune Municipal Separate School District, the following ad valorem tax rate or levies be and the same are hereby imposed and levied for the fiscal year 1975-1976 upon the assessed value of all taxable property in the City of Picayune, and the Picayune Municipal Separate School District, Pearl River County, Mississippi, as the property is now assessed and listed or as may hereafter be assessed and listed upon the assessment rolls of said City and District as of January 1, 1975, subject to the exempt value of homes to the extent exempt by the Homestead Exemption Act for Municipal Separate School District, also homes exempted by Senate Bill Number 2566, Mississippi Laws of 1974, the said rates expressed in mills or a decimal fraction of a mill, being levied and imposed upon each dollar of assessed valuation appearing upon the assessment rolls of said City and Municipal Separate School District in accordance with the provisions of the statutes of the State of Mississippi to which reference is made hereinabove, the said rates or levies are for the following finds or purposes:

1. For the purpose of raising a fund to support the Minimum School Program as requested by the State Board of Education and as provided by Section 2 of Chapter 261 of the Mississippi Laws of 1954, as amended (6518-01)..... 2.75 Mills
on the dollar to be levied upon property within the City Limits and upon Picayune Municipal Separate School District property outside the City Limits.
2. For the purpose of raising a fund for general school district maintenance purposes as provided by Section 6 of Chapter 261 of the Mississippi Laws of 1954 as amended (6518-06) and other amendatory statutes;..... 22.25 Mills
on the dollar to be levied upon property both within the City Limits and upon Picayune Municipal Separate School District property outside the City Limits.
3. For the purpose of raising a fund for the retirement of bonds issued to finance alterations and additions to building and to purchase heating plant fixtures and equipment and purchase land for school purposes and for the payment of interest thereon as provided by Chapter 30 of the Mississippi Laws of 1953 Extraordinary Session..... .25 Mills
on the dollar to be levied upon property both within the City Limits and upon Picayune Municipal Separate School District property outside the City Limits.
4. For the purpose of raising a fund for the retirement of bonds issued for the purpose of financing construction and equipping of an annex to the Picayune Memorial High School Building and

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making alterations of said high school building and also of construction and equipping of an auditorium and class rooms as provided by Chapter 231 of the Mississippi Laws of 1950 as amended and for the payment of interest thereon..... .00 Mills on the dollar to be levied upon property both within the City Limits and upon Picayune Municipal Separate School District property outside the City Limits.

- 5. For the purpose of raising a fund for the retirement of bonds and interest thereon issued for the purpose of financing the erection of a Junior High School Building and equipping same, and purchasing land therefor, for repairing, equipping, remodeling and enlarging the buildings and related facilities of said district, providing necessary water, lights, heating and sewerage facilities therefor, and purchasing land therefor as provided by Chapter 30 of the Mississippi Laws of 1953 Extraordinary Session..... 2.00 Mills on the dollar to be levied upon property both within the City Limits and upon Picayune Municipal Separate School District property outside the City Limits.
- 6. For the purpose of raising funds for the retirement of bonds and interest thereon issued for the purpose of financing the erection of a Vocation and Technical Training School and purchase fixtures and equipment for same..... 1.75 Mills on the dollar to be levied upon property both within the City Limits and upon Picayune Municipal Separate School District property outside the City Limits.
- 7. For the purpose of raising funds for the retirement of bonds issued for the purpose of financing the construction of a fire incinerator and for the payment of interest thereon, improvement, and air conditioning on the City Hall building of said City and for the retirement of bonds issued to construct a new Fire Station and for the payment of interest thereon..... .35 Mills on the dollar to be levied only against property within the City Limits.

RESOLUTION AND ORDER APPROVING PETITION
OF ALLIED STEEL CORPORATION
FOR AD VALOREM TAX EXEMPTION

WHEREAS, Allied Steel Corporation a Louisiana Corporation domiciled in the City of Picayune, Pearl River County, Mississippi, submitted a Petition to the Mayor and Councilmen of the City of Picayune, Mississippi, for ad valorem tax exemption for the construction of new facilities under Section 27-31-101, 27-31-107, and 27-31-115 of the Mississippi Code of 1972, as amended; and

WHEREAS, it appears to the satisfaction of the Mayor and Councilmen that Petitioner is a Louisiana Corporation domiciled in the City of Picayune engaged in the business of fabrication of metal for the purpose of resale and use in construction, and

ORDINANCE NO: 391
AN ORDINANCE REGULATING THE OPERATION OF AMBULANCES,
AMBULANCE DRIVERS AND ATTENDANTS; PROVIDING FOR A
CERTIFICATE OF PUBLIC CONVENIENCE AND NECESSITY;
PROVIDING FOR PENALTIES FOR VIOLATION THEREOF;
AND RELATED PARTICULARS

Be It Ordained by the Mayor and Council of the City of Picayune as follows:

WHEREAS, the City of Picayune is duly authorized and empowered to regulate and control the use of its streets, alleys and thoroughfares by the exercise of such police power delegated to it by the State of Mississippi as is necessary to insure the health, safety, convenience and general welfare of its citizens; and

WHEREAS, to allow the operation of ambulances without regulation, supervision and control would be injurious to the public welfare; and

WHEREAS, in view of the growth of the City of Picayune, necessary steps must be taken in the interest of the safety and general welfare of its citizens to regulate, coordinate and supervise ambulance service throughout the City, and that the public convenience and necessity requires a sufficient number of ambulances in operation to provide the necessary services but that excessive numbers of ambulances produce unnecessary economic and traffic problems; and

WHEREAS, periodic inspection of vehicles in operation must be required in order to insure the safety of the users of ambulances, protection of pedestrians, and the promotion of the general welfare;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PICAYUNE, MISSISSIPPI:

SECTION 1. DEFINITIONS. The following words and phrases shall have the following prescribed meanings, except where the context clearly indicates a different meaning:

- (a) Ambulance. Any motor vehicle that is specially designed or constructed and equipped, and is intended to be used for and is maintained or operated for the transportation of patients, including funeral coaches or hearses which otherwise comply with the provisions of this ordinance and all state and federal regulations as to design of ambulances.
- (b) Attendant. A trained and/or qualified individual responsible for the operation of an ambulance as to the care of the patients duly qualified under applicable state and federal regulations.
- (c) Attendant-driver. An individual who is qualified as the driver of an ambulance.
- (d) Call; run. The act of progressing with an ambulance to the scene of need and transporting a patient to his destination.
- (e) Certificate. Certificate of public convenience and necessity issued by the City Council licensing a person, firm or corporation to operate an ambulance business.
- (f) Council. The City Council of the City of Picayune.
- (g) Dispatcher. The person whose presence is available at all times to receive requests for ambulance service and dispatch ambulances and advise necessary agencies of the city government and medical facilities of any impending emergency.
- (h) Central Police Dispatcher. The person designated by the City of Picayune Police Department to receive requests for emergency ambulance service and to dispatch ambulances and advise the necessary medical facilities of any impending emergency.
- (i) Driver. Any person driving an ambulance.
- (j) Emergency. The operation of an ambulance to the scene where a person is in dire need of medical attention and the transporting of the patient to a medical facility.
- (k) First-Aid. This term shall mean a standard recognized prescribed first-aid course.

(l) Owner. Any person to whom a certificate of public convenience and necessity for the operation of an ambulance or ambulances has been issued.

(m) Patient. Any person being transported to medical attention or from medical attention in an ambulance.

(n) Person. Any individual, partnership, association, corporation or other organization owning or operating or proposing to operate an ambulance or ambulances within this city.

(o) Radio. Mobile radio units and base transmitting radio units.

(p) Rates; fares. Charges for transporting and other services provided.

(q) Trip record. A record of each person transported.

SECTION 2. CERTIFICATE OF PUBLIC CONVENIENCE AND NECESSITY REQUIRED

That the business of operating ambulance service for hire is a public convenience and necessity, requiring public regulation and supervision for the purpose of securing and maintaining an adequate ambulance service within the City of Picayune, Mississippi.

SECTION 3. OPERATION FORBIDDEN WITHOUT CERTIFICATE.

(a) No person, either as owner, agent or otherwise be engaged in or profess to be engaged in the business or service of the transportation of patients upon the streets, alleys, or any public way or place of the city unless he holds a currently valid Certificate of Convenience and Necessity issued pursuant to this ordinance by the City Clerk of the City of Picayune.

(b) No ambulance shall be operated on the streets, alleys or any public way or place of the city unless it shall be under the immediate supervision and direction of a person who is holding a currently valid license as an attendant-driver or attendant issued pursuant to this ordinance.

(c) Provided, however, that no such certificate or license shall be required for an ambulance, or for the driver, attendant or attendant-driver of an ambulance which is rendering assistance to licensed ambulances in the case of a major catastrophe or emergency with which the licensed ambulances of the city are insufficient or unable to handle.

SECTION 4. APPLICATION FOR CERTIFICATE. An application for Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity shall be filed with the City Clerk of the City of Picayune, Mississippi, and said application shall be verified under oath and shall furnish the following information:

(a) The name and address of the owner, and in the event that the owner be a corporation, a certified copy of the Articles of Incorporation.

(b) The number of vehicles actually owned and the number of vehicles actually operated by such owner on the date of such application, if any.

(c) The net worth of the owner or applicant over and above all debts, judgments, claims and demands whatsoever.

(d) Whether there are any unsatisfied judgments of record against such owner, and if so, the title of all actions and the amounts of all judgments unsatisfied.

(e) The make, type, year of manufacture, serial number and equipment therein for each ambulance owned or operated or proposed to be operated by the applicant for a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity.

(f) Court record, if any, of applicant; provided, that if applicant is a corporation, the court record, if any, of the officers, directors and supervising employees thereof, including general manager or director.

(g) Whether there are any liens, mortgages or other encumbrances on such ambulances, and if so, the amount and character thereof.

(h) The training and experience of the applicant in the transportation and care of patients.

(i) The location and description of the place or places from which it is intended to operate.

(j) The color scheme, insignia, name, monogram and other distinguishing characteristics to be used to designate applicant's vehicles.

(k) Such other information as the Chief of Police of the City of Picayune, Mississippi may require.

SECTION 5. HEARING ON ISSUE OF CERTIFICATE. Upon the filing of an application with the City Clerk, the said application shall be immediately referred to the Chief of Police who shall fix a time and place for a hearing thereon. Not less than five days notice shall be given to the applicant and to all persons to whom certificates of public convenience and necessity had theretofore been issued.

SECTION 6. ISSUANCE OF CERTIFICATE. Upon the completion of the hearing provided for in the preceding section, the Chief of Police shall make the following findings:

(a) Whether further ambulance service in the City of Picayune, Mississippi, is required by public convenience and necessity.

(b) Whether the applicant is fit, able, and otherwise qualified to perform such ambulance service and to conform with the provision of this ordinance.

In making the above findings, the Chief of Police shall take into consideration the number of ambulances in operation, whether existing facilities are adequate, the effect of increased service on traffic conditions, the experience and responsibilities of the applicant, and the condition of the applicant's equipment. Such findings should be reported to the City Council within ten (10) days, with the recommendation of the Chief of Police whether the certificate should be granted or not. Such findings shall be reviewed by the City Council at its next succeeding regular meeting and the certificate issued or denied during such meeting. The certificate when issued constitutes a contract between the holder thereof and the City and said certificate continues in full force and effect until and unless thirty (30) days written notice is given to or by the City Council.

SECTION 7. LICENSE FEES. No certificate shall be issued or continued in operation unless the holder has paid an annual license fee of \$25.00. Said license shall become due on the first day of July each year, and shall be in addition to any other license fees or charges established by proper authority and applicable to said holder of the vehicle or vehicles under his operation and control. The purpose of this license fee is not to raise revenue, but to defray expenses incurred in enforcement of this ordinance.

SECTION 8. TRANSFER OF CERTIFICATE. No certificate of public convenience and necessity may be transferred, sold, encumbered or assigned, except by approval of the City Council.

SECTION 9. SUSPENSION AND REVOCATION OF CERTIFICATE.

(a) A certificate issued under the provisions of this ordinance may be revoked or suspended by the City Council upon recommendation of the Chief of Police if the holder thereof has:

(1) Violated any of the provisions of this ordinance.

(2) Discontinued operations for more than thirty days.

(3) Discriminated in providing services to any person on the basis of race, creed or color.

(4) Violated any ordinances of the City of Picayune, Mississippi, or laws of the United States, or the State of Mississippi, the violation of which reflects unfavorably on the fitness of the holder to offer public ambulance service.

(b) Prior to suspending or revoking such certificate, the holder shall be given thirty days written notice of the proposed action to be taken by the City Council and shall, upon request therefore, be entitled to a hearing before the entire Council. If upon such hearing, the Council shall find that the certificate holder has corrected any deficiencies and brought himself into compliance with the provisions hereof, such certificate shall not be suspended or revoked.

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SECTION 10. APPLICATIONS FOR DRIVER'S, ATTENDANT'S AND ATTENDANT-DRIVER'S LICENSES. Applications for driver's, attendant's and attendant-driver's licenses hereunder shall be made to the City Clerk upon such forms as may be provided by the City of Picayune and shall contain:

(a) The applicant's full name, current residence, places of residence for five years previous to moving to his present address and length of time he has resided in the city.

(b) The applicant's age, marital status, height, color of eyes and hair and general education.

(c) Whether he has ever been convicted of a felony or misdemeanor, and if so, when and where and for what cause.

(d) The applicant's training and experience in the transportation and care of patients, including special training and Red Cross courses in first aid completed, and whether he has previously been licensed as a driver, chauffeur, attendant or attendant-driver, and if so, when and where, and whether his license has ever been revoked or suspended in any jurisdiction and for what cause.

(e) Affidavits of good character from two reputable citizens of the United States and residents of the city who have personally known such applicant and observed his conduct during one year next preceding the date of his application, or affidavits otherwise acceptable to the licensing officer for the Council.

(f) An examination by a reputable physician of Picayune, Mississippi, which examination shall include:

(1) Heart action, evidence of fainting attacks and epilepsy.

(2) History of narcotic or alcoholic addiction.

(3) Minimum requirement of 20/20 in one eye and 20/50 in the other eye, standard eyesight test, correctable with glasses; field of vision at least 60 degrees temporally; normal for color vision.

(4) Normal hearing.

(g) Two recent photographs of the applicant, of a size designated by the City Clerk, one of which shall be attached by the City Clerk to the license.

(h) Such other information as the Chief of Police of the City of Picayune shall deem reasonably necessary to a fair determination of compliance with this ordinance.

(i) An accompanying license fee of One Dollar (\$1.00).

(j) Notwithstanding these provisions, upon the recommendation of a holder, the Chief may issue a 15-day temporary driver's license upon application being made by driver.

(k) Copy of license or certificate issued by state and federal authority.

SECTION 11. INVESTIGATION AND ISSUANCE OF DRIVERS, ATTENDANTS, AND ATTENDANT-DRIVERS LICENSES.

(a) The City Clerk shall, upon receipt of an application as provided for herein, refer same to the Chief of Police who shall cause an investigation to be made of the facts set forth in said application, and shall not approve the issuance of a license to any person whose general reputation for integrity and responsibility or whose previous record as a law violator is such as to render the applicant unfit for such occupation, or who is not physically fit to drive or operate an ambulance in the City of Picayune. Every applicant must be at least 18 years of age, and have resided in Picayune for at least six months next preceding the date of filing of such application. The Chief of Police shall also cause each applicant for a license to be examined as to his knowledge of the provisions of this section and the traffic regulations and street names and location in the city, and if the applicant fails to show a reasonable knowledge of such matters, he shall be refused a license.

(b) Applicant must have adequate training in the application of first aid, i.e., training which is at least equivalent to the training provided by the standard Red Cross courses. Training "equivalent" to the standard Red Cross training courses includes service training and experience acquired in military service, successful completion by the individual of a comparable first aid course furnished by or under the sponsorship of State or local authorities, an educational institution, a fire department, a hospital, a professional organization (such as the National Ambulance Training Institute), or other such qualified organization. On-the-job training involving the administration of first aid under the supervision of or in conjunction with trained first aid personnel for a period of time of not less than three (3) months may also be considered as "equivalent" training as may such other trainings as is required by state and federal law.

(c) If, upon due inquiry, the Chief of Police is satisfied as to the qualifications of the applicant, he shall thereupon authorize the granting of a license which shall be delivered to the applicant. The license shall contain a photograph of the operator, to be furnished by the Police Department, and shall be displayed in a prominent place on the inside of the ambulance in such a way that it shall be immediately visible from within such vehicle. The said license shall have impressed on the face thereon the seal of the City of Picayune, affixed by the City Clerk in such a manner that a portion of both photograph and card shall be covered by the seal. If the application is rejected, the applicant may request a personal appearance before the City Council to offer evidence why his application should be reconsidered. This license shall be in force and effect for a period of one year from the date of issuance, but may be renewed annually upon submission and approval of a physical examination as provided above.

SECTION 12. SUSPENSION AND REVOCATION OF LICENSE. The Chief of Police is hereby given the authority to suspend or revoke a driver's license issued under this ordinance for a driver's failing or refusing to comply with the provisions of this ordinance. A suspension shall not exceed a period of thirty (30) days. The Chief of Police is also authorized to suspend or revoke a driver's license if the driver is found guilty of violation of any of the following offenses:

- (a) Driving an ambulance while under the influence of intoxicating liquor.
- (b) Reckless driving.
- (c) Knowingly transporting intoxicating liquor.
- (d) Carrying concealed weapons in violation of the law.
- (e) Any person who has been found guilty of excessively violating any of the traffic regulations of the City of Picayune.
- (f) Contributing to the delinquency of a minor.
- (g) Addiction to drugs.
- (h) Conviction of felony.
- (i) Convicted of sexual perversion of any type.

After such suspension or revocation, the holder shall have an opportunity to be heard before the City Council.

SECTION 13 AMBULANCE SPECIFICATIONS. All vehicles used as ambulances shall conform to the following specifications and requirements:

(a) General Construction.

(1) All bodies shall have five doors, two leading into the driver's compartment, two leading into the front of the patient's compartment and one leading into the rear of the ambulance, so constructed that all doors may be opened from the inside and outside.

(2) All upholstery covering or interior lining in any ambulance shall be of leather or other non-absorbent and washable material.

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(b) Equipment.

- (1) Four-wheel brakes capable of stopping ambulance within twenty-two feet (22') at twenty miles per hour.
- (2) Parking brake.
- (3) Front and rear bumper.
- (4) Heater and defroster sufficient to heat interior of ambulance in cold weather.
- (5) Right and left side rear view mirrors and one in driver's compartment.
- (6) Speedometer exposed to view and no ambulance to be operated with broken or disconnected speedometers.
- (7) Dual windshield wipers.
- (8) Tires must have a minimum of 4/32 inch tread.
- (9) Alternator with minimum of 60 amperes output.
- (10) Cot holder.

(c) Lights.

- (1) Each ambulance shall be equipped with a minimum of one revolving red light on top of ambulance.
- (2) Standard headlights with low and high beam approved by motor vehicle laws of the state.
- (3) Back-up lights.
- (4) Rear compartment light.
- (5) White light to illuminate license plate.
- (6) Hand-light either attached or unattached to body.

(d) Warning devices. Each ambulance shall be equipped with a rotary siren or an electronic siren with a minimum of 100 watts output.

(e) Communications.

- (1) Each ambulance shall be equipped with a two-way radio licensed by the Federal Communications Commission and in operative condition at all times.
- (2) Each owner shall maintain a dispatcher twenty-four hours every day at his base of operation for the purpose of communication with the public and with the ambulances.
- (3) Each owner must provide direct communications with the City's communication center from his base of operation.
- (4) All emergency ambulance dispatching shall be done only by the City's Central Police Dispatcher.

(f) First-aid equipment. Each ambulance shall be equipped with the following:

- (1) Hinged half-ring lower extremity splint with web straps for ankle hitch.
- (2) Two or more padded boards 4 1/2 feet in length and 3 inches wide, and two or more similar padded boards 3 feet in length and 3 inches wide, of material comparable to four-ply wood, for coaptation splinting of fracture of leg or thigh.
- (3) Two or more padded 15 inch by 3 inch wood or cardboard splints for fractures of the forearm.
- (4) Short and long back boards with 2 inch webbing straps

for extrication of victims with spine injuries.

(5) Oxygen tanks and masks of assorted sizes for administration of oxygen.

(6) Hand operated bag-mask resuscitation unit with adult, child and infant size masks (unit capable of being attached to oxygen supply preferred).

(7) Simple suction apparatus with catheter (available types listed in March-April 1965 Bulletin, A.C.S.)

(8) Mouth-to-mouth, two-way resuscitation airways for adults and children.

(9) Oropharyngeal airways.

(10) Mouth gags made of three tongue blades taped together and padded.

(11) Universal dressing, approximately 10 inches by 36 inches packaged folded to 10 inches by 9 inches.

(12) Sterile gauze pads.

(13) One, 2 and 3 inch adhesive tape on cylinder.

(14) Six-inch by 5 yard soft roller type bandages.

(15) Triangular bandages.

(16) Safety pins, large size.

(17) Bandage shears.

(18) Several pillows.

(g) Sanitation.

(1) Each ambulance shall store first-aid equipment free from dust, insects and rodents.

(2) The interior of each ambulance shall be cleaned and wiped with an approved antiseptic daily.

(3) Weather permitting, each ambulance must be cleaned on the exterior each day.

(4) In the event of transportation of a patient with a contagious or infectious disease, ambulance shall be cleaned and wiped with approved antiseptic.

(5) There shall be at all times freshly laundered linen on cots used to transport patients, changing linen after each patient carried.

(h) Inspection by owner. Each owner must inspect each ambulance every morning to ascertain cleanliness, mechanical and operational worthiness for transporting patients. Each ambulance shall be subject to inspection at all times by an authorized representative of the city.

(i) Maintenance. Any ambulance found, upon inspection, to be unsafe for ambulance operations shall have such repairs and alterations made as may be required and shall not operate or cause to be operated any such ambulances until all such repairs and alterations have been completed.

(j) Designation of Ambulances. Each ambulance operated within the City of Picayune shall bear the name of the owner and a unit number. All ambulances of each owner shall be of the same color scheme. All colors shall be of high visibility and easily distinguishable from the color scheme of ambulances of any other owner. Such trade name, design, color scheme or method of painting shall include the following matter:

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(1) The name of the owner or the trade name under which he does business prominently displayed on each side of the ambulance. Whenever the name of the owner or the trade name under which he does business does not include the word "Ambulance", then the word "Ambulance" shall be prominently displayed on each side of the vehicle.

(2) All mandatory numbering, lettering and wording, whether in a particular trade name, design, color scheme, lettering or otherwise as hereinbefore provided shall be at least two (2) inches in height and of such color as will contrast distinctly with the color of the body of the ambulance, and such other equipment or design capability as is required by state and federal law.

SECTION 14. DRIVERS AND ATTENDANTS: PROHIBITED ACTS. Any person employed or acting as a driver or attendant is hereby forbidden to commit or cause to be committed any of the following prohibited acts:

(a) To fail to comply with all reasonable and lawful requests of the patient as to first-aid treatment and as to destination.

(b) To smoke while inside an ambulance whether moving or standing.

(c) To transport any deceased person except through explicit instructions of the deceased's family, the coroner, or police to any place other than a local state-approved hospital.

(d) To move any patient where there is suspicion of foul play without first notifying the city police of such suspicion.

(e) To recommend to any one a particular funeral home to handle a deceased person.

(f) To administer, prescribe, employ or sell any drug, herb, medicine, plaster or belt or attempt the treatment of a disease.

(g) To make vaginal examinations for the purpose of determining pregnancy, nor attempt to mechanically break the bag of water or remove adherent placental tissue.

(h) In the event of a miscarriage, to transport any patient without first obtaining all placental membranes and transporting same with patient if found.

(i) To disregard any instruction from a licensed physician of this state as concerns the welfare of the patient.

(j) To disregard the instruction of any police officer during the administering of first aid, transporting, standing or enroute to destination.

(k) To permit any one to sit in the attendant's seat other than attendant, doctor, registered nurse, or medical student.

(l) To make an emergency ambulance trip without receiving clearance for such trip from City's Central Police Dispatcher.

SECTION 15. RULES GOVERNING GENERAL OPERATION. The following rules shall govern the general operation of ambulances under a certificate of public convenience and necessity:

(a) Operating rules.

(1) Registration. No person shall operate a motor vehicle as an ambulance unless such vehicle has been registered in accordance with the laws of the state, and all required licenses and permits have been obtained.

(2) Compliance with laws and ordinances. Every ambulance shall be operated in accordance with the laws and ordinances of this state and city governing the operation of emergency vehicles.

(3) Terminal required. Every ambulance operated under a certificate on the streets of the city shall have a headquarters terminal.

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(4) Emergency runs. Upon receipt of a request for an emergency run, the dispatcher shall clear through the city's communication center the nature of the emergency and the location thereof, and shall await such clearance before dispatching an ambulance to the scene of the emergency.

(5) Emergency procedure. Upon arrival at the scene of an emergency, determination shall be made immediately of the condition of the patient, necessary first aid treatment shall be administered, and thereupon the patient shall immediately be transported to medical attention, under emergency run conditions only if the patient's condition is such as to warrant immediate medical attention of a physician in order to conserve human life or relieve undue suffering.

(b) Records and reports.

(1) Record of dispatcher or owner. There shall be maintained for a period of three years, a record of all calls which shall show the patient's name, age, race, sex, address, time call received, time ambulance dispatched, time ambulance arrived at scene or address, time ambulance reached destination of hospital or medical attention, to what hospital or place of medical attention patient was transported, dispatcher's name, and whether call was emergency or not.

(2) Trip record. There shall be maintained for a period of three years a trip record showing all the information required above, and, in addition, the condition of the patient and whether or not first-aid treatment was administered; whether or not an emergency run was made; the names of the driver and attendant. The trip record shall be so designed as to provide the patient with a copy thereof containing all required information. A copy of the trip record may serve as a receipt for any charges paid.

(3) Daily log. The dispatcher and City's Central Police Dispatcher shall each maintain a daily log for the purpose of identifying persons transported in any one day, if required.

(4) Inspections. Every vehicle operating under this ordinance shall be periodically inspected by the Police Department at such intervals as shall be established by the Chief of Police to insure the continued maintenance of safe operating conditions. Records of such inspections shall be made and kept current by the Police Department and the owner notified in writing of any deficiencies noted at such inspection. The owner shall be required to correct such deficiencies within a reasonable time and shall furnish evidence of the correction thereof to the Police Department.

(c) Insurance required. Every owner operating ambulances under a certificate shall submit to the City Council evidence of public liability and property damage insurance in force with an insurance company licensed to conduct business in this state in the following amounts:

Bodily injury - \$100,000 per person
 Bodily injury - \$300,000 per accident
 Property damage - \$100,000 per accident

Such owner shall also show that the City is named as an insurer in such policies and copies thereof shall be furnished to the City.

SECTION 16. RATES AND CHARGES.

(a) No person owning, operating or controlling ambulances under a certificate of convenience and necessity shall charge other than the following rates for ambulance service:

(1) \$30.00 per emergency pick-up plus \$1.00 per mile while the patient is in the ambulance.

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(2) \$25.00 per transfer, pick-up plus \$1.00 per mile while the patient is in the ambulance.

(3) Oxygen - \$2.50/15 min. use.

(b) Rates to be posted. Every ambulance operated under this ordinance shall have the published rates set forth above conspicuously displayed in the passenger compartment thereof.

(c) Receipts. The driver of any ambulance shall, upon demand by the person entitled, render a receipt for the amount charged on which receipt shall appear the name of the patient, owner, date, amount and the signature of the driver.

(d) It shall be unlawful for any person to:

(1) Obtain or receive ambulance services, without intending at the time of obtaining or receiving such services, to pay the necessary charge.

(2) Knowingly and willfully summon an ambulance or report an ambulance is needed when such person knows that the services of an ambulance are not needed.

SECTION 17. CONFLICTING ORDINANCES REPEALED. That all ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith be and they are hereby repealed.

SECTION 18. PENALTIES. Any violation of this ordinance shall be deemed a misdemeanor, and upon conviction shall be punished by a fine not exceeding three hundred dollars (\$300.00), or by imprisonment not to exceed ninety (90) days, or by both such fine and imprisonment.

SECTION 19. SEVERABILITY. Each of the provisions of this ordinance are severable, and if any provision shall be declared to be invalid, the remaining provisions shall not be affected by shall remain in full force and effect.

SECTION 20. That this ordinance shall be in force and effect as provided by law.

The above and foregoing ordinance adopted on October 24, 1975 at 4:00 P.M. at a Special Call meeting of the Mayor and Council of said City, was first reduced to writing, considered and passed section and then as a whole, with the vote on each section and on said ordinance as a whole resulting as follows:

Smith, and unanimously carried, it is ordered that the Minutes of the meeting of the Mayor and Council held October 7, 1975 and recorded in Minute Book 13, Pages 259 through Page 266; the Minutes of the meeting of the Mayor and Council held October 21, 1975 and recorded in Minute Book 13 Pages 267 through 269; and the Minutes of the meeting of the Mayor and Council held October 24, 1975 and recorded in Minute Book 13 Pages 270 through 280 are hereby approved.

MAYOR AUTHORIZED TO SIGN AGREEMENT

Upon motion of Granville E. Smith, seconded by Aaron L. Russell, and unanimously carried, S. G. Thigpen, Jr., Mayor, is hereby authorized to execute an agreement with Mississippi State Tax Commission as follows:

REPAYMENT AGREEMENT

An agreement authorizing the City of Picayune, Pearl River County, Mississippi, to enter into a repayment agreement with the State Tax Commission by authority of Chapter 496, General Laws of Mississippi, Regular Session 1971, whereby the State Tax Commission, in accordance with a repayment schedule hereinafter set out, shall withhold monthly from the amount of sales tax the City is entitled to under Section 17-65-75, Mississippi Code of 1972, and pay the same to the Water Pollution Abatement Bond Fund.

WHEREAS, the City desires to construct a waste disposal plant which is to be approved by the Mississippi Air and Water Pollution Control Commission and is to receive a grant from the State in the amount of \$9,469.00 for said purpose by pledging the City's part of the sales tax reimbursement to which it is entitled under Section 27-65-75, Mississippi Code of 1972, as may be required to meet the repayment schedule hereby adopted by the State Tax Commission, which repayment schedule is as follows:

The monthly repayments to be made by the State Tax Commission to the Water Pollution Abatement Bond Fund from the City of Picayune, Pearl River County, Mississippi, sales tax reimbursement under Section 27-65-75, Mississippi Code of 1972, are hereby determined to be \$39.45 for a period of 240 months for the repayment of the \$9,469.00 grant made to said City.

The general repayment schedule heretofore adopted by the State Tax Commission on May 31, 1971, and recorded in Minute Book 6 at Page 192 is included as a part of this repayment schedule by reference.

AND WHEREAS, the City desires to authorize the State Tax Commission to withhold monthly from the amount of sales tax the State Tax Commission is to remit to it under Section 27-65-75 for repayment of said grant to the Water Pollution Abatement Bond Fund under the terms of said repayment schedule, and the State Tax Commission is agreeable to withhold monthly from the amount of sales tax to be remitted to the City the sum of \$39.45 and pay the sum so withheld to the Water Pollution Abatement Bond Fund under the terms of said repayment schedule, the first withholding to be made during the month next following the availability of funds and payment of the grant;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF PICAYUNE, PEARL RIVER COUNTY, STATE OF MISSISSIPPI, AND ORDERED AND ADJUDGED BY THE STATE TAX COMMISSION:

That the City of Picayune hereby authorizes the State Tax Commission to withhold \$39.45 monthly from the amount of sales tax it is to remit to the City under Section 27-65-75, Mississippi Code of 1972, for repayment of the \$9,469.00 grant to the Water Pollution Abatement Bond Fund under the terms of said repayment schedule, the first withholding to be made during the month next following the availability of funds and payment of the grant;

That the State Tax Commission hereby adopts the foresaid repayment schedule and agrees to withhold \$39.45 monthly from the amount of sales



ORDINANCE NO: 392
AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE
SOUTHERN STANDARD BUILDING CODE 1973 EDITION WITH 1974 REVISIONS,
1971 EDITION OF SOUTHERN STANDARD PLUMBING CODE WITH 1974 REVISIONS
AND 1975 EDITION OF NATIONAL ELECTRICAL CODE

BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Council of the City of Picayune,

Section 1. That the 1973 Edition of the Standard Building Code also known as Southern Standard Building Code with 1974 Revisions, Section 1302.3 (b) be amended to read as follows:

"(b) Footings shall be proportioned to sustain the applied loads and induced reactions without exceeding the allowable stresses specified in this code. Minimum exterior footing shall be 12 inches wide, 12 inches below undisturbed natural grade, a minimum of 8 inches above grade with three #4 rebars."

Section 2. That the 1975 Edition of the National Electrical Code, Article 110-2 be amended to read as follows:

"110-2 Approval The conductors and equipment required or permitted by this Code shall be acceptable only when approved. Aluminum conductors are not approved for domestic or commercial installation."

Section 3. That the 1975 Edition of the National Electrical Code, Article 440-2 (a) be amended to read as follows:

"(a) These provisions are in addition to, or amendatory of, the provisions of Article 430 and other Articles in this Code, which apply except as modified in this Article. Any central air-conditioning unit installed requires a minimum #8AWG wire. The unit must be placed on a concrete slab, minimum four (4) inches thick and all wiring must be inclosed in rigid metal conduit."

Section 4. That the 1971 Edition of the Southern Standard Plumbing Code with 1974 Revisions, Section 506 be amended to read as follows:

"506--LIMITATION OF USE ON MATERIALS LISTED IN TABLE 505

Only Cast-iron pipe and fittings are acceptable for use under concrete slab. For use for sewer connections only cast-iron pipe, clay pipe and plastic pipe schedule 40 (225 psi) or better are acceptable. For use as water pipe feeder line, only black steel pipe, stainless steel pipe, galvanized (coated) pipe and plastic pipe (160 psi) are acceptable. Minimum size shall be 3/4 inch."

Section 5. That the 1971 Edition of the Southern Standard Plumbing Code with 1974 Revisions, Section 1212.1 be amended to read as follows:

"1212.1--MATERIALS

(a) Above Ground--Material for water-distribution pipes and tubing shall be copper water tube, minimum type "L".

(b) Under-Ground--Inaccessible water-distribution piping under floor slabs shall be minimum type "K" copper tubing with no joints."

Section 6. That the 1971 Edition of the Southern Standard Plumbing Code with 1974 Revisions, Section 1213.1 be amended to read as follows:

"1213.1--MINIMUM SIZE

The sizing of the water-distribution system shall conform to good engineering practice. All water-supply lines to fixtures must be adequate in size. See Section 1213.3 for minimum size of fixture-supply pipe and Section 1213.4 for minimum pressure at the fixture outlet. In no case shall more than two fixtures be supplied from any 1/2 inch distribution line."

Section 7. That the 1971 Edition of the Southern Standard Plumbing Code with 1974 Revisions, Section 1215.1 be amended to read as follows:

"1215.1--WATER PRESSURE RELIEF VALVES AND TEMPERATURE RELIEF VALVES REQUIRED

All water heaters shall be provided with an approved self-closing (levered) water pressure relief valve and temperature relief valve or combination thereof. Such valves shall be installed in the shell of the water heater tank or may be installed in the hot water outlet, provided the thermo-bulb extends into the shell of the tank, and in all cases installed at the highest practical point. For

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installations with separate storage tank, said valves shall all be installed on the tank and there shall not be any type of valve installed between the water heater and the storage tank. Where, in the opinion of the Plumbing Official, safety valves are required they shall be installed in accordance therewith. Pressure relief valves shall be a minimum of 3/4 inch."

Section 8. That the 1971 Edition of the Southern Standard Plumbing Code with 1974 Revisions, Section 1301.4 be amended to read as follows:

"1301.4--UNDERGROUND PIPING WITHIN BUILDINGS

All underground drains within buildings shall be cast-iron pipe or type "K" Copper."

Section 9. That the 1971 Edition of the Southern Standard Plumbing Code with 1974 Revisions, Section 1302.1 be amended to read as follows:

"1302.1--SEPARATE TRENCHES

The building sewer, when installed in a separate trench from the water-service pipe, shall be cast-iron sewer pipe, vitrified clay sewer pipe or plastic piping schedule 40 or better (225 psi). Joints shall be watertight and rootproof and all material shall be installed according to the manufacturer's recommendations. (See Appendix A). All pipe and fittings shall bear the manufacturer's name or trademark."

Section 10. That all ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith be and they are repealed.

Section 11. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication according to law.

This agreement made and entered into upon this the 8th day of December, A. D., 1975 by and between the City of Picayune, a municipal corporation hereinafter referred to as City and Lucius Olen Crosby Memorial Hospital, a nonprofit making corporation hereinafter referred to as Hospital.

WHEREAS, the City of Picayune for many years was provided with ambulance service by two private ambulance service enterprises; however, recently both private ambulance services discontinued service and for a period of time the City was totally without ambulance service, and

WHEREAS, temporary ambulance service provided upon an emergency basis by use of converted fire department equipment and manned by Hospital personnel was found not to meet minimum state and federal standards as to vehicle design or have required life support equipment, and

WHEREAS, the City thereupon found that adequate public ambulance service was not available to its citizens, and

NOW, THEREFORE, in order that the citizens of this community may have available for their immediate use and benefit adequate public ambulance service, and in consideration of the mutual covenants herein contained, the City contracts and agrees with Hospital, and Hospital contracts and agrees with City, as follows, to-wit:

1. The City will purchase two new ambulances of a type acceptable under all current state and federal regulations pertaining to vehicle design, and equipped with all necessary life support equipment required under all current state and federal regulations pertaining to such equipment, and

2. The City by execution of this agreement has and does by these presents hereby lease, let and deliver unto Hospital both said

ambulance units purchased as aforesaid and being more particularly described as follows, to-wit:

- a) One (1) 1975 Chevrolet, Serial No. CGY 355UI38660
- b) One (1) 1975 Chevrolet, Serial No. CGY 335UI38634

3. The lease rental for said units shall be at the rate of One (\$1.00) Dollar, per year, per vehicle, payable upon the anniversary date of this instrument in advance.

4. The Hospital by execution of this agreement has and does by these presents hereby lease, take and accept delivery of the above described vehicles for the exclusive purpose of providing adequate public ambulance service to the citizens of this community, and covenants with City to maintain said vehicles for the purpose intended during the term, or any continuation hereof, of this lease.

5. The Hospital further covenants that the Hospital will at all times maintain in full force and effect casualty and liability insurance in connection with the operation of these ambulance units of at least the minimum required amount under all state and local regulations, ordinances or statutes.

6. The City recognizes that the Hospital will charge for the usage of such ambulance units; however, the Hospital covenants that the amount of such charge will be commercially reasonable and in line with similar service in other localities of similar population; further, that all maintenance necessary upon these ambulance units shall be provided by Hospital and that such expense shall likewise be taken into consideration in establishing the cost of service.

7. The Hospital shall be responsible for payment of all operational expenses incidental or convenient to the operation of such ambulance service.
